# THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937. Belmout Road Board.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that a local authority may by by-law define localities in the district within which the keeping of swine or pigsty is forbidden: And whereas the Belmont Road Board, being a local health authority in respect of the Health District of Belmont Park, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-1937, deems it desirable and expedient to define the localities in the district within pedient to define the localities in the district within which the keeping of swine or pigsty is forbidden: And whereas the Belmont Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, by a resolution published in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of July, 1930, adopted with certain amendments series "A" of the Model By-laws prepared pursuant to section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1926, as published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927, and has amended such by-laws by resolution published in the Government Gazette from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Belmont Road Gazette from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Belmont Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, acting pursuant to section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that the said by-laws be amended by inserting in section C of Part IX thereof, after by-law 1, as contained in the said Section C, a new by-law to stand as by-law 1A as follows: law, to stand as by-law 1A as follows:-

Prohibited Area for Keeping of Swine or Pigsty. 1A. No person shall keep any swine or pigsty in that locality of the district bounded by lines starting from the Swan River at its intersection with Orrong road and thence along the northern boundary of Orrong road to its intersection with Fulham street; thence along both sides of Fulham street to its intersection with Hardy road; thence in a westerly direction along both sides of Hardy road to its intersection with Belvidere street; thence along both sides of Belvidere street to its intersection with Kanowna avenue; thence in an easterly direction along both sides of Kanowna avenue to its intersection with Fourth street; thence along both sides of Fourth street to its intersection with Coolgardie avenue; thence westerly along both sides of Coolgardie avenue to its intersection with Mc-Culloch avenue; thence along both sides of Mc-Culloch avenue to the Board's northern boundary, the junction of Swan Locations 28 and 27; thence along said boundary to the Swan River.

## THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Amendment of By-laws.

M.H.D. 2373/21.

WHEREAS under the provision of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a local health authority may make or adopt by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Bunbury Municipal Council, being a local health authority within the meaning of the said Act, and having adopted with certain additions and amendments the Model Bylaws published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927, and from time to time thereafter, doth hereby, for its purposes as the local health authority aforesaid, amend such adopted by-laws as follows:—

By-law 24 of Part 1 (General Sanitary Provisions) of the said Model By-laws, relating to the transport of offensive material, be amended by adding to paragraph (a) at the end thereof, after the figures and letters 10 a.m. the words, figures and letters:—''from any part of the Municipality of Bunbury north of the southern side of Stirling street, nor between 8.30 a.m. and 8.30 p.m., from any part of the Municipality of Bunbury south of Stirling street.''

# Municipality of Cottesloe. THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Amendment of By-laws.

P.H.D. 2624/18. WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a local health authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Municipality of Cottesloe, being a local health authority, and having adopted the Model By-laws published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927, doth hereby amend its by-laws as follows:—

# Part 1 By-law No. 26-Stables.

Delete Clause "a" and insert in lieu thereof the following new clause "a":—

(a) It shall not be at any less distance than 40ft. of any dwelling-house, nor less than 50ft. from the milk shed or milk room of any dairy. Part 1, By-law No. 28—Keeping of Horses, Cows, Sheep and Goats.

Delete by-law No. 28 and insert in lieu thereof the following new by-law:—

- 28 (a) The occupier of any premises shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any paddock, yard, or other place forming portion of such premises, and the owner of any yard, paddock, or other place shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any such yard, paddock, or place unless and until due provision is made to prevent such horse, cow, sheep, or goat from approaching, in the case of such horse, cow or sheep to within forty feet, and in the case of such goat to within one hundred feet of any dwelling, shop, factory, bakery, or other place where food is manufactured, stored, or exposed for sale.

    (b) The occupier of any premises to which any such yard, paddock or other place is appurtenant, and in which yard, paddock, or other place any horse, cow, sheep, or goat is kept, and where such yard, paddock or other place is not appurtenant to any premises, then the owner thereof shall at all times maintain the same in a clean state and condition, and shall provide a receptacle of brick, iron, or other impervious material with a close-fitting cover in such yard, paddock, or place, and shall once at least in each day cause all droppings from such horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be cleaned up from such yard, paddock, or place and deposited in such receptacle, and shall at all times, save when in actual use, cause the said receptacle to be covered with such tight-fitting cover, and shall cause such receptacle to be emptied once in each week, or oftener if required by the inspector, and shall, after each emptying, cause such receptacle to be cleaned out, and shall take such precautions against allowing the breeding of flies, as the inspector shall from time to time direct.

Part 1, By-law No. 29—Keeping of Poultry or Pigeons.

Delete Clauses "b" and "d" and insert in lieu thereof the following new clauses:—

(b) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any pigeons or fowls within twenty feet or any other poultry within forty feet of any dwelling-house; and, where pigeons are kept, except in the case of bona fide registered homing pigeons, let out solely for exercise, they shall be continually confined.

(d) The occupier of any premises whereon any other animals are kept shall at all times maintain all enclosures or structure of any description whereon such animals are confined in a clean condition and at any time, when so directed by an inspector, shall immediately cleanse and disinfect any such enclosure or structure.

Insert the following new clause:-

(e) The owner or occupier of any premises wherein or whereon pigeons are in the habit of nesting or perching shall, when ordered by an inspector, take such steps as directed to prevent the same.

- By-laws for the Management and Use of the Road Board Hall and other Buildings under the Control of the Board
- Interpretation clause.—In the construction of these by-laws:
  - (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Marble Bar District Road Board;
    (b) The word "Building" shall mean and include
  - any hall, room, or corridor of any such hall under the control of the Board.
- 2. Applications for the hire of any building, furniture, or crockery shall be made in writing to the secretary of the Board, not less than 24 hours before the time that such building, furniture, or crockery is required, and shall state the purpose for which the building, furniture, or crockery is required.
- 3. The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring any building, furniture, or crockery shall be given in the application for the use of such building, furniture, or crockery.
- 4. The rent of the building, furniture, or crockery shall be paid with the application, and shall be as set out in the schedule hereunder.
- 5. The hours for which any building, furniture or crockery may be hired shall be:—(a) Day—9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.; (b) evening—7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight; (c) extension of time may be granted upon payment of prescribed fees, at the discretion of the Board or the secretary of the Board.
- 6. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of the engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of the engagement.
- The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building, furniture, or crockery to any applicant for the hiring of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.
- 8. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building, furniture, or crockery.
- 9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building, furniture, or crockery for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire shall be granted.
