1. To inquire into the available supplies of native coal in the Collie Coal Field and the development thereof for future requirements;
2. To examine and report upon the various matters inquired into by you in accordance with this Commission; and
3. To make such recommendations as to you may seem meet in relation to any matters found by you as the result of your said inquiry.

AND I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission, be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you, the said Richard Cunliffe Wilson shall be Chairman of the said Royal Commission and shall have the powers of a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof under the Act.

AND I hereby request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit (*inter alia*) the taking of any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of every year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the aforesaid powers and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever in those portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto during the periods from the 1st March to the 31st December, 1940, both dates inclusive, from the 1st January to the 31st December in each of

the years, 1941, 1942, 1943, 1944, and from the 1st January to the 28th February, 1945, both dates inclusive.

Schedule.

The whole of the waters of that part of Five-Mile Brook, or Big Brook, in the vicinity of Pemberton, between Thomson's Bridge, on the road from Pemberton to Northcliffe to the dam approximately a quarter of a mile above the Hydro Electric Power Company's plant, also the whole of the waters known as the Pemberton Swimming pool.

under the said Act, and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council, exempt such employer or group of employers from the operation of the said section 10 of the said Act: And whereas the Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Ltd., a duly incorporated company, whose Registered Office is situate at Occidental House, St. George's terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that such Company as such employer aforesaid has established a fund for insurance against liability under the said Act, and has deposited at the Treasury securities approved by the Minister in accordance with the regulations under the said Act, and charged with all payments to become due by the said Company as such employer under the said liability: And whereas the Minister has recommended that by reason of the premises, the said Company shall for a period of one year be exempted from the operation of section 10 of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act doth hereby exempt the said the Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Ltd., an employer within the meaning of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, from the operation of section 10 of the said Act, for a period of one year from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*.

During ordinary working hours—2s. per hour.

Outside ordinary working hours—2s. 6d. per hour.

(2) In this regulation the expression "ordinary working hours" means the ordinary working hours mentioned in clause 4 of Award No. 13 of 1935.

THE ROADS DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1938.

Coolgardie Road Board.

P.W. 1706/26.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1938, the Board of any Road District is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: Now, therefore, the Coolgardie Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

Interpretation.

1. In the construction of these by-laws:—

- (a) "District" means the district controlled by the Coolgardie Road Board.
- (b) "Hawker" includes any person who trades or travels on foot or with any vehicle or animal from one town to another town, or from place to place, or to other men's houses, carrying with him any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, drink, eatables, or any articles of merchandise, for the purpose of selling the same, or exposing or offering the same for sale, and also includes any person who sells any such commodity, or exposes or offers the same for sale by outcry or some similar form of advertisement, in

or near any public reserve or common or street or way, or on the foreshore of any river, or the sea: and "Hawk," includes every act done by a person which would cause him to be regarded as a hawker as defined above.

- (c) "Fish" shall include fresh, salted, smoked, or dried fish, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns and shrimps.

Hawkers.

2. Any person who desires to hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, drink, eatables, or any article of merchandise within any part of the district shall first apply for a license from the Board by completing and signing an application, in Form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

3. The Board may either—

- (a) Grant the application, or
- (b) Refuse to grant the same, for any of the following reasons:—
 - (i) if in the opinion of the Board the applicant is not a fit and proper person to hold a license;
 - (ii) if the applicant has not been a *bona fide* resident and ratepayer of the district for a period of at least one year expiring on the date of his application;

- (iii) if the commodities which the hawker intends to hawk will not be produced in the district;
- (iv) if in the opinion of the Board the granting of a license or hawking by the applicant may prejudice the interests of any *bona fide* resident and ratepayer of the district;
- (v) if the Board does not desire hawkers to operate in the portion of the district in which the applicant wishes to hawk.

4. If the Board grants the application, it shall issue to the applicant a license, in Form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, and also a badge, with a number and the year of issue displayed, upon the licensee paying to the Board a fee of 20s. for his license, and 2s. 6d. for his badge.

5. Every license shall be granted subject to the conditions:—

- (a) that the licensee shall not hawk any commodity which was not produced in the district, unless no such commodity is being produced in the district at the time such commodity is hawked;
- (b) that the licensee shall not hawk any commodity other than those specified in his license;
- (c) that the licensee shall not hawk any commodity in any portion of the district other than that portion which is specified in his license;
- (d) that the licensee shall not commit any offence, rendering him liable to prosecution and conviction summarily or after indictment.

These conditions shall be printed on the back of every license.

6. The Board may cancel any license by notice in writing, if the licensee commits a breach of any of the conditions mentioned in clause 5, whereupon the licensee shall surrender his license and badge to the Board.

7. Unless cancelled as provided in clause 6, every license shall remain in force for one year from the date of issue thereof.

8. Every licensee shall display his badge upon demand when hawking.

9. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, drink, eatables, or display any article of merchandise within the districts, unless he is the holder of a current Hawker's License from the Board.

DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT, 1922-1939.

Department of Agriculture,
Perth, 6th March, 1940.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 25 of the Dairy Industry Act, 1922-1939, has been pleased to amend in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder the regulations made under the said Act as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 23rd day of June, 1933, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter.

Schedule.

The above-mentioned regulations are amended as follows:—

(1) New regulations are inserted after regulation 1 as follows:—

Consent of Governor to erection of New Dairy
Produce Factory, Store, or Depot.

1A. (1) Every application for the consent of the Governor under section 2A of the Act to the erection or utilisation of a building as a dairy produce factory, store, or depot, shall be made in writing, signed by the applicant, in the Form No. 25 in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The application shall be lodged with the Under Secretary for Agriculture and shall be accompanied by a consent fee of £1.

(3) If the application be refused, the consent fee paid therewith shall be refunded to the applicant.

(4) When the application is granted, a certificate of consent, in the Form No. 26 in the Schedule to these regulations, shall be issued to the applicant.

1B. (1) Every person requiring the approval of the Minister to the utilisation of a dairy for the manufacture of dairy produce pursuant to paragraph (ii) of the proviso to subsection (1) of section 2A of the Act, as evidence that the consent of

the Governor to the utilisation of such dairy as aforesaid is not necessary, shall make application for such approval, in writing, signed by him, in the Form No. 27 in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The application shall be lodged with the Under Secretary for Agriculture and shall be accompanied by an approval fee of £1.

(3) If the application be refused the approval fee paid therewith shall be refunded to the applicant.

(4) When the application is granted a certificate of approval, in the Form No. 28 in the Schedule to these regulations, shall be issued to the applicant.

(2) A new regulation is inserted after regulation 3, as follows:—

3A. Where pursuant to section 5 of the Act application is made for registration of premises intended to be used as a dairy produce factory, store, or depot, an inspector shall not approve of such premises as being fit for the use intended as aforesaid where—

(a) the said premises are intended to be used as a butter factory but are not equipped with all the necessary appliances for the manufacture of butter and for completely controlling the temperature of dairy produce at each stage of the process of manufacture of butter, and which are not provided with impervious water-tight floors, efficient drainage, and a good water supply; and

(b) the said premises are intended to be used as a cheese factory but are not equipped with all the necessary appliances for the manufacture of cheese, and are not provided with maturing room accommodation, suitable shelving for at least fourteen days' make of cheese, and with impervious water-tight floors, efficient drainage and a good water supply.

(3) A new regulation is inserted after regulation 4, as follows:—

Cancellation of Registration.

4A. (1) The registration of premises registered in accordance with section 5 of the Act shall not be cancelled, as provided for in the proviso to subsection (2) of the said section, until after a report in writing has been made to the Minister by the Under Secretary for Agriculture that the registration of the said premises is liable to cancellation.

(2) Upon receipt of such a report the Minister shall cause to be served upon the manager of the said premises a notice in writing calling upon such manager to show cause why the registration of the said premises should not be cancelled, and appointing a day, time, and place on and at which such manager will be heard.

(3) The manager who has received such notice may, before the time appointed therein, by writing under his hand sent to the Minister, show cause as aforesaid, or on the day and at the time and place appointed by the notice, may appear before the person then present, being either the Minister or some other person appointed by the Minister for the purpose, either in person or by his solicitor or agent and show cause as aforesaid.

(4) After the manager has shown cause as aforesaid, the Minister shall consider the representations made by the manager, and thereafter shall determine whether the registration of the said premises shall or shall not be cancelled.

(5) Where the Minister decides that the registration shall be cancelled, a memorandum of such cancellation shall be entered in the register, and notice of the cancellation shall be served upon the manager aforesaid, in the Form No. 29 in the Schedule to these regulations.

(4) Regulation 39A (*Gazette*, 23rd July, 1937) is amended by deleting from paragraph (1) thereof the figures "30" in line two of the said paragraph and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "50."

(5) Regulation 48A (*Gazette* 29th March, 1934) is amended by adding thereto a further paragraph, as follows:—

(5) All margarine which may be manufactured or sold in Western Australia shall not contain any butter-fat.

(6) New regulations are inserted after regulation 60, as follows:—

Notice of intention to Transfer Supply of Cream from one Factory to another.

60A. (1) Notice of intention to transfer the supply of cream from one dairy produce factory to another as provided for in section 11A of the Act shall be given by the supplier to the manager of the dairy produce factory from which the supply of cream is about to be transferred, in accordance with Form No. 30 in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Upon receipt of the notice referred to in paragraph (1) hereof the manager receiving such notice shall complete and sign the detachable form at the foot of such notice, detach the same from the notice, and send or deliver the same to the Superintendent of Dairying, or to such other person as the Superintendent of Dairying may by writing appoint for the purpose.

60B. Not later than the fourteenth day in each and every month, the manager of every dairy produce factory shall furnish to the Superintendent of Dairying, in writing, in the Form No. 31 in the Schedule to these regulations, a return setting forth the names and addresses of suppliers of cream to his factory who have ceased to supply or who have commenced to supply milk or cream to his factory during the immediately preceding month.

(7) New regulations are inserted after regulation 69F (*Gazette* 11th August, 1939), as follows:—

Dairy Produce Improvement Fund.

69G. (1) The contributions payable to the Dairy Produce Improvement Fund by the manager of each and every dairy produce factory, in accordance with section 24B of the Act, shall be paid monthly to the Under Secretary for Agriculture not later than the 14th day of the month next following the month in respect of which the contributions are payable.

(2) As and when, in accordance with paragraph (1) hereof, contributions are paid to the Under Secretary for Agriculture, the manager paying such contributions shall furnish to the Under Secretary for Agriculture, in writing signed by him, a return in the Form No. 32 in the Schedule to these regulations, setting out the quantity and value of the milk or cream paid for during the month in respect of which the said contributions are paid.

(3) Where deferred payments or bonuses in respect of milk or cream supplied to a dairy produce factory are paid at the end of any trading period, the contributions payable by the manager of such dairy produce factory shall be deducted by such manager from the amount of such deferred payments or bonuses before such deferred payments or bonuses are made available to the suppliers.

(4) When payment of contributions to the Dairy Produce Improvement Fund are paid by cheque, the cheque shall be made payable to the "Dairy Produce Improvement Fund" and shall be crossed.

(5) The rate of contributions payable by managers of dairy produce factories to the Dairy Produce Improvement Fund shall be at the rate from time to time declared by the Governor in accordance with section 24B of the Act and notified in the *Government Gazette*.

Duties and Powers of Special Dairy Instructors.

69H. Special Dairy Instructors appointed as such under section 24C of the Act shall have and may exercise the same powers and shall carry out and perform the same duties as are conferred or imposed upon the inspectors appointed under and generally for the purposes of this Act.

(8) The Schedule to the regulations is amended by adding thereto, after Form No. 24 (*Gazette* 11th August, 1939), new forms, as follows:—

THE DAIRY INDUSTRY ACT, 1922-39.

Application for the Consent of the Governor in Council to Erect a Factory.
(Regulation 1A.)
