AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 6th day of March, 1940, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1337/37.
WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments: And whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Departments of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department) should be vested in G. Cock, and that the power vested in J. C. Hutchinson should be revoked: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieuten-int-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in G. Cock, and any person appointed to act temporarily in his place, the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages: And doth hereby revoke the power placed in J. C. Hutchinson.

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

		(e) The form of proposal for the writing down and suspension of the debts of the farmer is given in Form 6 in the schedule, and any proposal under the Act may be in such form or as near thereto as the circumstances of the case may require.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Conneil has been pleased, under the provisions of the Forests Act, 1918, and on the recommendation of the Conservator of Forests, to approve of the amendment of the Forest Regulations, 1935, by inserting after regulation 138 the following new regulations:-

Appointments and Promotions of Officers to the General Division.

139. Except as hereinafter provided in these regulations, no person shall be appointed or promoted to the position of "C" Grade Assistant Forester unless he has passed written and practical tests in:—

- (a) elerical efficiency to the standard necessary for handling the work of a
- (b) Elementary forestry, with particular application to jarrah forest regions, timber inspection, and compass survey;
- (c) The application of the Forests Act, 1918, the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and the regulations thereunder:

Provided that any person seeking appointment or promotion in forest regions other than jarrah, or on plantation work, may be given special tests, having particular application to the forest types concerned, but the successful passing of such tests shall not qualify such officer for appointment or promotion to vacancies occurring in jarrah forest districts.

- 140. No officer of the Department who prior to the commencement of these regulations was classified as "C" Grade Assistant Forester or "C" Grade Forester shall be eligible for promotion until such time as he has passed the tests required under regulation 139, but failure to pass such tests shall not affect the continued employment of any officer on his existing classification.
- 141. The Conservator may exempt any officer from tests in any class of work on which such officer has been regularly employed for a period of more than twelve months and has given satisfactory service.

- 142. Tests will be held in the mouth of August each year, and persons desirous of submitting themselves for such tests shall apply in writing not later than June the 30th in any year.
- 143. The Conservator may refuse permission to any officer to submit himself for the tests prescribed in regulation 139-
 - (a) if he has not served three years in the Department on his existing classification;
 - (b) if within the preceding two years he has submitted himself for but has failed to pass the prescribed tests.
- 144. An officer, on successfully passing the prescribed tests, shall be listed as eligible for promotion as suitable vacancies occur, subject to good and diligent conduct and capacity to take responsibility and handle men to the extent required in any vacant position.
- 145. An applicant for a vacant position carrying the classification of Forester "A". Grade may be required to pass more advanced tests in the subjects specified in regulation 139, as determined by the Conservator.
