## Morawa Road Board.

By-laws for the Management and Use of the Morawa Town Hall and any other Buildings moder the Control of the Board.
P.W. 1092/28.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make bylaws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act and whereas the Morawa Road Board, in pursuance of the powers rested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of any other authority enabling it in that behalf, do hereby make the following by-laws:-

1. Interpretation clause:-In the construction of hese by-laws:-
(a) the word "Board's shall mean the Morawa Road Board;
(b) "secretary"' means secretary for the time being of the Morawa Road Board;
(c) the word "Building" shall mean and include any hall, ronm, or corridor, or stairway, or amnexe of any such hall or room under the control of the Board.
2. Applications for the hire of any building and furniture shall he made in writing to the secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such building and furniture are required, and shall state the purpose for which the building and furniture is required.
3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any building and furniture slall be given in the application for the use of the building and furniture. The hirer of any building under the attached Schedules slaall not be entitled to the use of the Bio Room.
4. The rent of the main hall, lesser hall, room, and furniture (inclusive of the use of the crockeryware) shall be paid with each application and shall be as follows:-

Main Hall-to 12 midnight, $£ 2$; after midnight, 5 s . per hour, or portion.
Main Hall and Lesser Hall-E2 10s.
Lesser Hall and Kitchen-Dance to 12 midnight, £1; after midnight, $2 / 6 \mathrm{per}$ hour, or portion.
Main Hall-Pictures, £2.
Main Hall-Travelling shows, $£ 3$.
Political meetings, day or night-fi 1s.
Supper Room and Kitchen, for wendings or private parties-£1.
Supper Room, local meetings, day-bs.
Supper Room, local meetings, night-10s.
Church Bazaar, day and night-£2 10s.
Lesser Mall for Church (day)-Free.
5. The hours for which any building and fmonture may be hired shall be:-Day, 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.; night, 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 midnight, after which 5 s . per hour shall be paid in addition to the ordinary fees.
6. Any person or persons having hired the hall or any room shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon and shall leave the hall or any room, crockery, and appliances clean and fit for other oecupation or use, and the furniture in good condition and in its normal position.
7. No decoration will be permitted in the building until the consent of the Board has been obtained. Any application for permission to decorate slall state the nature of the decoration to be used. Subject to snch permission being olotained, no person shall drive a nail into any part of the hall, window, floor, doors, etc., or otherwise deface the hall. All decorations used in comection with any entertainment must be removed from the premises and disposed of to the satisfaction of the secretary or earetalser within twenty-four (24) hours from the commencement of the hiring period; movided that, with the consent of the secretary first had and obtained, such decorations may be permitted to remain.
8. Hirers shall make their own arrangements for the safety of anything left in the cloak rooms or any part of the hall, and the Board will accept no liability.
9. The Board may grant to any person or company a lease for the exclusive right to hire the hall for showing sound or other pictures for any period on such nights weekly as may be required.
10. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer slall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that miglit cocur during the term of engagement.
11. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building and furniture to any applicant for the hiring of the same without assigning any reason for such refusal.
12. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building and furniture.
13. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building and furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building and furniture shall be granted.
14. The hirer of any building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainment Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hirings and use of the building.

If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts abovementioned, or any other Acts in force, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building.

The hirer must accept full responsibility in the event of any dispute arising in comnection with the compliance of the provisions necessary under this by-law.
15. In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the hire had been duly
fulfilled, and the Board shan not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.
16. No spirituons liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, or perry shall be brought into or consumed in my building, except when permitted by the Board in writing.
17. No refreshments or eatables whatsoever shall be brought into, serred, or consmmed in the Main Fall.
18. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any main hall during any ball or public entertaiment, or at any gathering of persons in the said building, whether such persons have been atmitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet, smoke social, or private entertainments.

18A. No furniture shall be removed, except under the supervision of the caretaker or other person appointed by the Board.
19. No person shall, in any part of the building-
(a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
(b) use protone or improper language;
(c) be guilty of any misbehnviour whatsoever;
(d) Camage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building (any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damages in addition to any penally imposed by these by-laws).
(e) Stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the entrance halls, exits, or pas sageways of any buildings: (Any person so doing shall immediatcly disperse, on being requested to do so by the secretary or other person duly authorised by the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.)
20. No person shall remove the piano from the stage of the Main Hall to the floor, or vice versa, without the permission of the Board.
21. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything ealeulated to produce a distmbance, riot, or breach of peace, shall be permitted in any building.

21A. The hirer of any hall or room shall maintain and keep good owder and decent behaviour in such hal or room and shall be solely and cntirely responsible for the carrying out of these by-laws, and for any damage done to the buildings, fixtures, fittings, furmture, or crockeryware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockeryware not accomted for or in broken or cracked condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.
22. The secretary of the Board, or any other person duly authorised by the Board, or police constable, shall be permitted free ingress to the building or any part thercof, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these by-laws.
23. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or conmits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be decmed guilty of an offence against these bylaws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Wheat Prodnets (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938, that the Governor may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee as constituted by the said Act, by Proclanation fix minmum and maximnm prices at which substances included in the definition of Hour, or in the definition of wheat products, may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State, by any person, and that the Governor may from time to time revoke or vary any Proclamation under the said section by a subsequent Proclamation: And whereas the Governor, by a Proclamation dated the 31st day of August, 1939, and published in the Government Gazetto on the same day, fixed certain prices in relation to flour. bread, and other substances therein specified at which flour, bread, and the other substances aforesaid might be sold by any person in the various parts of the State therein specified: And whereas the Governor by a further Proclamation dated the 30 th day of November, 1939, and published in the Government Gacette on the same day, raried the first herembeforementioned Proclanation in the manner set forth in the last hereinbefore-mentioned Proclamation: And whereas it is now deemed necessary and expedient to cancel and revoke the two Proclamations aforesaid and in lien thereof to issne this present Proclamation fixing, in relation to flom, bread, and the other substances hereinafter mentioned the prices at which flour, bread, and the other substances aforesaid may be sold by any person in the various parts of the State levcinafter specified: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Execu-
tive Council and in accordance with the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee aforesaid, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred npon me by the said Act, do hereby cancel and revoke the said herembefore mentioned Proclamations dated respectirely the 31st day of August, 1939, and the 30th day of November, 1939, and published in the Government Gazette respectively on the 31st day of August, 1939, and the 30th day of November, 1939, as aforesaid, and also do by this present Proclamation, but, subject as hereinafter provided, fix the prices at which flonr, bread, and the other substances hereinafter specified, being wheat prodncts within the meaning of the said Act, may be sold by any person in the varions parts of the State specified heremnder, in accordance with the various prices set forth hereunder in relation to flour, bread, and the other substances aforesaid respectively: Provided that this Proclamation shall not apply in the case of sales of flour, bread, and the other substances aforesaid under contract to public charitable institutions or to Govermment institntions:-

1. The prices (both minimum and maximum) in relation to best bakers' flour, bran, pollard, flaky bran, and semolina are fixed as follows:-
(A) Best bakers' flour, whicl expression includes whole-wheatmeal, standard wheatmeal, and every other flour similar in quality to best bakers' flonr, but does not include any flom which is of a special quality supe rior to that of best bakers' flour, the cost of the manufacture whereof is greater than the cost of mannfacture of best bakers' flour, and which is declared by the Wheat Products Prices Committee to be superior to best bakers' flour:-
(i) when sold for delivery in the area served by the railway from Soutl Beach, Fremantle, to Midland Junction, and by the railway from Perth to Camnington, and delivered on buy ers' premises in bags or other containers of approximately 150 lis. weight-m12 8s. 6 d . per toll of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$;
(ii) when sold for delivery in the area served by the railways aforesaid and delivered to buyers elsewhere than on buyers' premises in bags of approximately 1.50 ll s. weight-f 12 ss. 6 d . per ton of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$;

(i) when delivered at mill door, at mill siding or ex mill store- 85 5s. 0d. per ton of 2,000 lbs.;
(ii) when delivered on rails at railway stations, the appropriate price per ton of $2,000 \mathrm{lhs}$. as fixed by the Schedule hereunder.
(D) Semolina-the prices as fixed for best bakers' four, plus $£ 1$.
(E) Flaky bran-the prices as fixed for bran, plus 10 s.
2. The minimm price in relation to flow other than best bakers' flour as lereinbefore defined shall, in accordance with that part of the State in which it is sold for delivery, be the sane as the minimum price fixed for best bakers' flour when sold for delivery in the same place.
3. The prices as fixed for flom delivered ex mill or ex mill store or on bnyer's premises are so fixed on the basis of sales of six long tons ( $2,240 \mathrm{lbs}$.), the prices as fixed for bran or pollard delivered ex mill or ex mill store are so fixed on the basis of sales of six long tons ( $2,240 \mathrm{lbs}$.) or of fon tons of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$. each, if the latter be part of a total consignment of six long tons of any mill products, and the prices as fixed for flour, bran, or pollard delivered on rails at railway other than on mill siding are so fixed on the basis of sales of six long tons ( $2,240 \mathrm{lbs}$.). Therefore, where in any salc a quantity less than that used as the basis for fixing the price as aforesaid is sold and by reason thereof the net profit to the seller will be reduced as a consequence of the corresponding increase in the expense of cartage from mill to siding, or in the expense of freight from siding to siding in relation to such less quantity charged against the seller, the seller shall charge against the bnyer, in addition to the fixed price, a further amount equivalent to such reduction in net profit.

Provided that-
(i) for the purpose of calculating the expense incurred by the seller for freight, the freight deemed to be payable by the seller shall be the freight which would be payable if the goods had been supplied from the mill nearest to the buyer's railway station and not from the mill actually delivering the goods, and
(ii) the term ' the mill nearest to the biryer's railway station', means that mill whose goods could be landed at the railway station nearest to the buyer's place of delivery most cheaply after adding to the mill door price the cost of freight from such mill to such railway station.
4. The prices fixed as aforesaid for flour, bram, pollard, semolina, and flaky bran are so fixed mpon the basis that such price shall be payable forthwith on sale. Therefore, where in any sale of any of the mill produets aforesaid other than flour, the quantity sold is not less than the quantity mentioned in paragraph 4 hereof as the basis upon which the price of grods sold is fixed, or where in any sale of flon the quantity sold is not less than one ton of $2,000 \mathrm{lbs}$, and the buyer does not pay cash forthwith on sale or within the times respectively fixed in the table hereunder, that is to say, within-
(a) seren days, where the place of delivery is within twenty miles of the mill or store; or
(b) ten days, where the place of delivery is within one lundred miles of the mill or store; or
(c) fonrteen days, where the place of delivery is more than one lundred miles from the mill or store;
the seller shall charge against the buyer, in addition to the fixed price, a further price of five shillings per ton: Provided that, where goods sold are shipped for delivery at any port north of Carnarvon, the satid additional price of five slillings per ton may only be charged against the buyer as aforesaid when the buyer fails to make payment of the purchase price by the first postal mail following the receipt by him of the goods.
5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained elsewhere in this Proclamation, where flomr, bran, pollard, semolina, or flaky bran is ordered by a purchaser and the vendor accepts the order on the basis that the pmrchase price shall become payable only as and when in accordance with the order the goods are deliverable by the rendor to the purchaser, and such delivery cannot be made or is not to be made until after the expiration of three elear working days from the date of the acceptance of the order by the vendor then in snch case the purchase price payable by the purehaser for the goods shall be that price which is fixed and in operation, whether moder this or another Proclamation, at the time of the delivery of the goods, although the price fixed for such goods under this Proclamation at the date of the acceptance of the order by the vendor may not have been the same as that fixed and in operation at the time of the delivery of the goods.
6. The prices fixed for bread are fixed in respect of sales within the Metropolitan Area as hereinafter de. fined, as follows:-
(A) White bread, whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread, and brown bread sold as No. 2 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938:-
(i) Retail:

Tickets-51\%d. per loaf.
Cash-6d. per loaf.
Booked-61\%d. per loaf.
(ii) Wholesale-5s. 6d. per dozen loaves.
(B) Vieuna bread sold as No. 1 Viema loaves and No. 2 Viema loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938-
(i) Cash-Bd. per No. 1 loaf; Gd. per No. 2 loaf.
(ii) Wholesale-2s. 6d. per dozen No. 1 loaves; 5s. per dozen No. 2 loaves.
(C) Rolls (white, wheatneal, or brown)-
(i) Retail-for rolls weighing not more than 2 ozs. 9 d. per dozen; for rolls weighing more than 2 ozs. but less than 4 ozs.--1s. per dozen.
(ii) Wholesale-for rolls weighing not more than 2 ozs.-6娄d. per dozen; for rolls weighing more than 2 ozs. but less than $40 z \mathrm{~s} .-81 / 2 \mathrm{~d}$. per dozen.
(D) Vienna Rolls-
(i) Retail-1s. 3d. per dozen.
(ii) Wholesale-1s. 1d. per dozen.
7. In respect of sales of the goods specified in para graph 6 hereof at Rottnest Island, the various prices specified in the said paragraph 6 are incrased in each and every case by one half-penny respectively.
8. The prices for bread as fixed under paragraphs 6 and 7 of this Proclamation inchde any charge which may be made for or in respect of any contaner, band, badge, label, or wrapper in which or with which the bread is sold.
9. Fancy breads are not inchaded in any of the goods specified in paragraph 6 aforesaid.
10. For the purposes of this Proclamation-
(a) "Metropolitan Area"' means that portion of the State comprised in an inaginary circle laving a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office at Pertli
"Brown bread"' means bread made wholly from wheatmeal or from white flour mixed with wheatmeal, bran or molasses or a mixture of any or all thereof. This term shall not include standard wheatmeal bread.
"Dozen'" means twelve, notwithstanding any custom, usage, or monderstanding to the contrary.
"Fancy bread" includes any bread designated as fancy bread by its trade name, the formula for which is registered with the

Wheat Products Prices Committee and approved by that Committee as fancy bread:

Provided that all fancy bread when sold shall have attached to it or associated with it a band, badge, label, or ticket on which is stated, in a mamer approved by the said Committee. those ingredients used in its manufacture which canse it to be different from ordinary bread sold as No. 1 and No. 2 loaves within the meaning of the Bread Act, 1903-1938, and in letters not less than 24 points high, its trade name, and in letters not less than 10 points ligh, the name and address of the baker thereof
"'Public charitable institution'" means a public hospital, a public benevolent institntion, or a religions organisation, and includes any public organisation which the said Committee is satisfied is established and maintained for the relief of unemployed persons:

Provided that, where any religious organisation condnets a college or boarding school, the exmption given by this Proclamation in respect of sales to public charitable institutions shall not inclnde sales to such religious organisation of any of the snbstances hereinbefore specified in relation to the fixation of prices for nse in such college or boarding school.
"Standard wheatmeal"' means wheatmeal milled or compounded so as to contain the gristed produce of cleaned and sound wheat mixed with wheaten flom in the proportion of 30 parts of the latter to 70 parts of the former.
'Standard wheatmeal bread'' means bread made from standard wheatmeal withont the addition of any other flour.
"Viema bread'' means Vienna bread within the meaning of the Bread Act, 19031938.
"White bread" includes any bread other than whole-wheatmeal bread, standard wheatmeal bread, brown bread, fancy or Vienna bread.
"Whole-wheatmeal" means the prodnet made by grinding sonnd wheat and which contains in their natural proportions all the constituents of the clean grain.
"Whole-wheatmeal bread" ineans bread made from whole-wheatmeal withont the addition of any other meal or flomr.
"Wholesale,'" as applied to sales of bread, means the sale by the baker of not less than one hundred and twenty No. 2 loaves (whether the ordinary or Vienna) within the meming of the Bread Act, 1903-1938, per week to the one purchaser, and when for resale, means the sale by the purchaser thereof from the baker of not less than thirty of such loaves per week to the one purchaser:
(b) (i) Rolls may be white, wheatmeal, brown, fancy, or Vienma, but include only rolls (other than fancy or Vienna) when sold as spocitied in paragraph 6 (c) (i)) and if (c) (ii) of this Proclamation.
(ii) In computing quantities in relation to prices wholesale two No. 1 ordinary loaves shall be equivalent to one No. 2 ordinary loaf and two No. 1 Vienna loaves shall be equivalent to one No. 2 Viemna loaf.
(iii) Tickets or tokens in relation to sale of bread shall be sold in half dozen lots or in muntiples of half dozens.
(iv) Unless otherwise provided by this Proclamation, the price of two No. 1 ordinary loaves sold to the one purchaser shall be the same as the price fixed for a No. 2 ordinary loaf and the price of two No. 1 Viemni loaves sold to the one purchaser shall be the same as the price for a No. 2 Viemna loaf.
(v) In respect of the prices fixed in this Proclamation in relation to bread and rolls mender paragraph 6, the term "cash"' or "cash payment', shatl include payment regnlarly at weekly or fortnightly or lialf-monthly payment periods as well as payment at time of sale or delivery.

TRAFFIG ACT, 1919-1939.

HIS Excellency the Lientenant-Governor in Conncil, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 46 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935, has been pleased to amend the Traffe Regnlations, 1936, made under and for the purposes of the said Act, and published in the Government Gazatte on the 26 th day of August, 1936, and amended by notice published in the Government Gazette from time to time thereafter, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

## Schedule.

The Traffe Regulations, 1936, are amended by inserting after regulation 80 a new regulation, to stand as regulation 80A, as follows:-

## Traffic Lanes.

80A. (1) Subject to the provisions of regnlations 81 and 288 the provisions of the succeeding paragraphs of this regulation shall apply to drivers driving any vehicle upon any road the pavement of which has been divided into traffie ianes.
(2) (a) The driver of a velicle upon any road, the pavement of which has been divided into traffic lanes by a longitndinal line placed at or near the centre of such pavement, shall kecp such velicle to the left-hand side of such line:

Provided, however, that the driver of such vehicle may, when it is safe to do so, laving regard to all the circumstances of the case:-
(i) drive the vehicle to or on the right-hand side of such line when he is abont to overtake or is overtaking or passing another veliche proceeding in the same direction;
(ii) drive the vehiche across such line for the purpose of turning to the right into another road or street or when crossing from the left-land side of such pavement to the other side.
(b) When the driver of such vehicle has driven the vehicle to or on the righthand side of such line for the purpose mentioned in paragraph (i) of the proviso to subparagraph (a) of this paragraph he shall, as soon as it is practicable, go back to the left-hand side of such line after he has overtaken or passed the other teliche proceeding in the same direction in which he is proceeding.
(3) (a) Whenever the parement of any road has been divided into three traffe lanes by marks, lines, or other indications placed thereon, the driver of a rehicle shall keep such vehicle within the lane on the left-hand side of the parement:

Provided, however, that the driver of snch vehicle may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case:-
(i) drive the vehicle along the centre lame of such trame lanes when he is about to overtake or is overtaking or passing another velicle proceeding in the same direction;
(ii) drive the vehicle across or into the centre lane of such trathe hines and the trafic lane on the right-hand side of such pavement tor the parpose of turning to the right into another road or street or for the purpose of erossing from the lefthand side of shel pavement to the other side.
(b) When the driver of snch vehicle has driven the vehicle along the said centre lane for the purpose mentioned in paragraph (i) of the proviso to subparagraph (a) of this paragraph he shall, as soon as it is practicable, go back to the traffe lane on the left-hand side of such pavement after he las orertaken or passed the other vehicle proceeding in the same direction in which he is procceding.
(4) The driver of a vehicle upon any road the pavement of which has been divided by double longitudinal lines placed at or near the centre of sueh pavement slatl keep such velicle to the left-hand side of such lines.

Provided, however, that the driver of such vehicle may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the eircumstances of the ease, drive the vehicle across such lines for the purpose of turning to the right into another rond or strect or when crossing from the left-hand side of such pavement to the other side.
(5) Whenever the pavement of any road has been marked by a double longitudinal line at or near the centre of such pavement and single longitudinal fines on either side thercof, thus dividing the pavement into four traffic lanes, two in each direction, the driver of any velicle shall keep such vehicle within the left-hand or outer lane of the pavement:

Provided, however-
(i) that the driver of such vehicle may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the casc, drive the velicle along the inner lane of such traffic lanes when he is about to overtake or is overtaking or passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction;
(ii) that when the driver has driven the vehicle into the inner lane lie slafl, as soon as it is practicable after he has overtaken or passed the other vehicle, go back to the left-hand or outer lane;
(iii) that the driver of such velicle may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the ease, drive the veliele across the inner lane of such traffic laues across the donble line and the right-hand traffic lanes for the purpose of turming to the right into another road or strect, or for the purpose of crossing from the left-land side of such pavement to the other side.
(6) Any person who commits a breach of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
