FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

Standing Orders.

P.W. 955/38.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Road Districts Act, 1919-39, the Perth Road Board do hereby repeal all by-laws heretofore made in reference to the several matters dealt with in the by-laws hereinafter set out and do make and order the following by-laws:—

1. The proceedings and business of the Board shall be conducted according to the following regulations, which shall be called the Standing Orders.

Chairman.

2. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word chairman shall include the vice-chairman, deputy or acting chairman and the member chosen to preside at any meeting of the Board.

3. The chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board, and in his absence, or if, after being present, he retires, the vice-chairman shall preside; but if at any time neither of them is present, then the members present may choose out of their number a member, who shall preside and exercise, for the purposes of that meeting and until the conclusion or adjournment thereof, the powers of the chairman.

Quorum.

4. At any meeting of the Board a quorum shall consist of the major part of the number of members for the time being assigned to the Board. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the notice as there shall be a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Adjournment in absence of Quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within half an hour of the time appointed for such meeting, the majority of the members present, or member, if there is only one present, or the secretary, if no member is present, may adjourn such meeting to another day, and notice of such adjourned meeting shall be given to each member.

Count Out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Board a member shall call the attention of the chairman to the fact that a quorum is not present, the chairman shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the chairman shall adjourn it to some future date.

Record of Members Present.

7. At all meetings at which there is not a quorum present, or at which the Board is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the minute book.

Open Doors.

8. The business of the Board shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Board shall by resolution otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved without notice.

Reporters.

9. At all meetings accredited newspaper reporters shall be permitted to attend in such part of the Board Room as may be appropriated for their accommodation, but they shall withdraw, upon a vote of the Board so requiring, during any portion or the whole of the meeting.

Disturbance by Visitors.

10. The admission of citizens, reporters, and visitors to the Board Room shall be under and subject to the regulations that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation, or interruption to the proceedings of the Board shall take place, and in the event of any breach of this regulation, the chairman may at his discretion, and without a vote of the Board, require the person or persons so offending to withdraw, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the Board Room.

Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Board, who interrupts the orderly conduct of the business of the Board, who does not, immediately upon being called upon by the chairman so to do, withdraw from the Board Room, may by order of the chairman be removed from the Board Room forthwith.

BUSINESS AT BOARD MEETINGS.

Order of Business.

12. The order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Confirmation of minutes.
- (2) Announcement by the chairman, without discussion.
- (3) Questions of which due notice has been given, without discussion.
- (4) Correspondence.
- (5) Petitions and memorials.
- (6) Tenders.
- (7) Reports of Committees.

- (8) Orders of the day, including considering and ordering upon any business left over from the previous meeting, and any business the chairman may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Board and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (9) Motions of which previous notices have been given.
- (10) Notices of motions for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Order at Special Meetings.

13. The order of business at any special meeting of the Board shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Minutes.

14. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Board, in order to obtain their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the chairman, as by section 140 of the Act required.

Questions.

15. Any member desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Board shall give notice thereof in writing to the secretary at least four hours before the hour fixed for the meeting.

16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Notices of Motion.

17. Any member may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the secretary, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than three clear days before such last-mentioned meeting.

Motion to Lapse.

18. Every such motion shall lapse unless the member who gave the notice thereof, or some other member authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

Deputations.

Reception of Deputations.

19. Deputations wishing to be received by the Board shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the secretary shall bring the memorial before the Committee concerned, which shall be authorised, if it see fit, to receive the deputation and to report to the Board. If the Committee is of the opinion that the memorial is one which should be brought before the Board, the Committee shall so report, and, if the Board shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

Number of Deputation.

20. A deputation shall not exceed ten in number, and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Board or a Committee of the Board, except in reply to questions from members of the Board or Committee, and the matter shall not be further considered by the Board or the Committee until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

Conduct of Debate.

Members to address the Chair—Point of Order.

21. Any member moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted, unless upon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the member raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed.

Nature of Motion to be stated.

22. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Board thereon, and, if so required by the chairman, shall put the same in writing.

Motions to be Seconded—Enforcement of Standing Orders.

23. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Board unless it be seconded, but a member may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Board by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of Titles.

24. At meetings of the Board, speakers in referring to others present thereat shall designate them by their respective titles of chairman or member, as the case may be.

Priority of Speakers.

25. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Chairman to Speak.

26. Whenever the chairman rises during a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Board is to be silent, so that the chairman may be heard without interruption.

Member not to speak Twice.

27. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply, upon any original motion of which he may be the mover or as the mover of an amendment last carried; and no member shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply.

Calling to Order for speaking Twice.

28. The chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover or Seconder to be held to have Spoken.

29. A member moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

No speaking after Notice put.

30. No member may speak to any question after the same has been put from the Chair.

Time Limit.

31. No member shall speak or address the Board upon any motion or amendment before the Board, or in reply, for a longer period than ten minutes, without the consent of the Board, which shall be signified without debate.

Speaking in Reply.

32. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of complicated Resolutions.

33. The chairman, at his discretion, may, or the Board may by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of several resolutions.

Withdrawal of Motion.

34. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the Board, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

Production of Documents.

35. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Board relating to the question or matter under discussion.

Reflection upon Vote of Board.

36. No member shall reflect upon any vote of the Board, except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

All Members to Vote

37. At all meetings of the Board, save where it is otherwise provided, all the members present shall vote, and the questions there considered shall be decided by open voting, and by the majority present. Each member, including the chairman, shall have one vote only, and, in the case of an equality of votes on any question, such question shall pass in the negative.

Digression from subject—Personal reflections.

38. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives to any other member, and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

Record of words used by a Member.

39. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

Chairman's Ruling.

40. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall give his decision, and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

Withdrawal of offensive Expression.

41. Any member who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the chairman reflects offensively on any member of the Board, shall, when required by the chairman, unreservedly withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the Chair, and, if he decline, or neglect to do so, the chairman may refuse to hear such member further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Board, or may direct the offending member to withdraw from the Board Room for the remainder of the then sitting of the Board.

Disturbance—Conversing aloud.

42. No member shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud whilst any other member is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

Continued Irrelevance.

43. The chairman may call the attention of the Board to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a member, and may direct such member, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such member shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

Crossing Board Room.

44. When the chairman is putting any question, no member shall walk out of or across the Board Room, nor shall any member, whilst any other member is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

Chairman may call to Order.

45. The chairman shall preserve order, and may on his own motion call any member to order whenever in his opinion there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

46. Every member shall be entitled to direct the attention of the chairman to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other member.

Definition of Order.

47. Any member who shall do anything or behave in any manner which is forbidden by any section of this by-law shall be deemed to be out of order.

Decision of Chairman on Point of Order—Member to apologise when called upon.

48. Whenever it shall have been decided by the chairman that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Board is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in a meeting by any member shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such member shall be called upon by the chairman to make such explanation, retraction or apology, as the case may require.

Member to withdraw from Board Room.

49. Any member who shall persist in any line of conduct which the chairman shall have decided or which by any section of this by-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction, or apology required by the chairman as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the chairman, withdraw from the Board Room for the remainder of the then sitting of the Board.

Removal of Member from Board Room.

50. In the event of any member refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the Board Room when requested or directed by the chairman so to do, the chairman may order such member to be removed from the said Board Room, and to be excluded therefrom, during the remainder of the then sitting of the Board.

Disorder.

51. If disorder should arise at any meeting of the Board, the chairman, acting in his discretion, may as a matter of right quit the Chair, and announce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, when the Board shall reassemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceeded with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the Chair and decided without debate by a majority of the members present.

*Order in Debate.**Motions and Amendments.*

52. When a motion is under debate at any meeting of the Board, no further motion shall be received, except the following:—

- (1) That the motion be amended.
- (2) That the Board do now adjourn.
- (3) That the debate be adjourned.
- (4) That the question be now put.
- (5) That the Board do proceed with the next business.
- (6) That the Board do resolve into Committee of the Whole.

*1.—That the Motion be Amended.**Relevancy of Amendment.*

53. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

To be Read.

54. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.

55. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

Substantive Motion.

56. Upon the adoption of any amendment such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

*2.—That the Board do Now Adjourn.**Time to Move.*

57. A member may at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Board do now adjourn: provided that the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally seconding, and the mover of the question (if any) under debate, on the motion for adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for five minutes, but no further debate shall be allowed.

No discussion—Procedure before further Motion.

58. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Board, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

Question adjourned to next Meeting.

59. On a resolution for adjournment, the question (if any) under debate when the motion for adjournment was made shall stand adjourned to the next meeting.

One Motion only.

60. At the same sitting no member may move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Board.

3.—That the debate be Adjourned.

Time to Move.

61. Any member may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other member, move without previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

No Discussion.

62. No discussion shall be allowed upon a motion for the adjournment of a debate.

Mover to speak First.

63. On resuming an adjourned debate, the member who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

One Motion only.

64. At the same sitting no member shall move or second more than one motion for adjournment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate after Count Out.

65. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Board being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

4.—That the Question be Now Put.

Time to move—Put without Debate.

66. A member may, at the conclusion of the speech of another member, move without notice that the question under consideration be now put, and upon such motion being seconded the same shall be immediately put without debate.

Two-thirds Majority.

67. A motion that the consideration of the question be now put shall not be decided in the affirmative or take effect without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the members present.

Speaking in Reply.

68. Whenever it is decided by the Board that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put.

Motion to be put at Once.

69. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under debate shall be put at once.

Question includes Amendment.

70. Whenever it is decided by the Board that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the Chair shall be construed and taken to mean and include the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

5.—That the Board do proceed to the next Business.

Time to Move.

71. It shall be competent for any member at the close of the speech of any other member to move without notice that the Board do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be Dropped.

72. When a motion be carried that the Board do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

Further Motion.

73. During the same debate, a second motion that the Board do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour.

6.—That the Board resolve into Committee.

Decision of Board.

74. The Board may determine that any question shall be considered in Committee of the Whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice.

Matters to be considered by Committee.

75. Such Committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Board.

Conduct of Committees.

76. In Committee of the Whole the Standing Orders of the Board shall apply, except that members may speak more than once to the same question.

Adoption of Committee's Resolutions.

77. The Chairman shall report the resolutions arrived at in Committee of the Whole to the Board at its next ordinary meeting, or upon the resumption of the Board, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Board may think fit.

Confidential Business.

78. All matters dealt with or brought before the Board in Committee, or before any Committee of the Board, shall be treated as strictly confidential, and unless and until the Board or a Committee appointed by the Board otherwise determine, no information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be disclosed to any person outside the Board prior to the issue of the business paper containing the items to be submitted to Board for confirmation.

Rescission of Resolutions—Rescission.

79. No resolution of any meeting of the Board shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered at any subsequent meeting held during the financial year, except in manner provided in section 136 of the Act.

Repetition of negatived Motion.

80. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Board shall again be entertained within a period of three months, unless with the consent of at least six members of the Board.

Suspension of Standing Orders—How Moved.

81. In cases of urgent necessity any Standing Order or Orders of the Board may be suspended, on motion duly made and seconded without notice.

Provided:

(a) that such motion shall be made and seconded only after all business appearing in the Notice Paper has been disposed of; and

(b) that such motion shall be carried by a majority of not less than three of the members present.

Objects of Suspension to be Stated.

82. Any member moving the suspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

Voting—Method of Taking Votes.

83. The chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary, to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

Division.

84. The Board shall vote by a show of hands, but any member may call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats; all division lists shall be entered on the minutes.

Committees.

Standing Committees.

85. In addition to such special Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be two Standing Committees appointed from among the members, namely:—a Finance, General Purposes and Staff Committee, and a Works, Parks and Reserves and Health Committee, each of which shall consist of not less than five members. Such Committees shall be appointed each year at the first meeting of the Board which shall be held after the annual election.

Election of Committees.

86. The members of the said Committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot.

Powers and Duties of Committees.

87. The powers and duties of Committees shall be as under:—

Finance, General Purposes and Staff Committee:—

1. To examine and check all accounts and generally supervise the collection and expenditure of Board revenue.
2. To inquire into and report to the Board from time to time upon all matters which they may consider to affect or be likely to affect the finances of the Board, or which the Board may by resolution direct them to inquire into and report upon.
3. To have control of all matters affecting the staff of the Board.
4. To exercise all powers conferred on the Board in respect to expenditure under section 219 of the Act.

Works, Parks and Reserves and Health Committee:—

1. To have the general direction of all works ordered or sanctioned by the Board, and of all streets, roads, ways, drains, bridges, and other public places under the care and management of the Board.
2. To have the management and general direction of sweeping and watering, the resumption of land for the formation of new streets, and widening of existing streets, and the general administration of the building by-laws.
3. To inquire into and report to the Board from time to time upon such improvements and repairs as they may think necessary, or which the Board may by resolution direct them to inquire into and report upon.
4. To have the control of all parks, reserves, and tree-planting and of the Town Hall and other Road Board buildings.
5. To supervise the carrying out of the provisions of any Act of Parliament or by-laws affecting public health.
6. To deal with petitions and complaints from persons affected by these Acts or by-laws.
7. To deal with all matters relating to the collecting of nightsoil and refuse, the supervision of places of amusement, the sale of foods and drugs, the licensing of noxious trades, private hospitals, lodging houses, morgues, etc., and generally control all matters affecting the health of the citizens.

Special Committees.

88. Special Committees may consist of any number of members, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a Committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Board, a special Committee ought to be appointed. No Standing Committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any Special Committee. The appointment of a Special Committee

shall be made by resolution of the Board, which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Special Committee, and may either state the number of members to be elected by ballot, or shall name the members whom it is proposed shall constitute such Committee. Every Standing Committee shall hold office until the third Saturday in April following its appointment.

Convening Committee Meetings.

89. The secretary shall call a meeting of any Committee when requested so to do by the chairman or any two members of such Committee.

Standing Orders.

90. The Standing Orders of the Board shall be observed and apply in Committees, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking, and except as to Committees being conducted with open doors.

Quorum.

91. At a meeting of a Committee a quorum shall consist of not less than three members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated or there shall be a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Minutes.

92. Each Standing Committee shall keep a book, to be called the minute-book, in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the following meeting, and signed by the chairman thereof.

Miscellaneous.

Penalty.

93. Any member who shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law shall be liable on conviction before a Court of summary jurisdiction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Enforcement of By-laws.

94. Whenever any member shall have committed an offence under this by-law, the chairman may forthwith lay, or cause to be laid, an information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending member, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

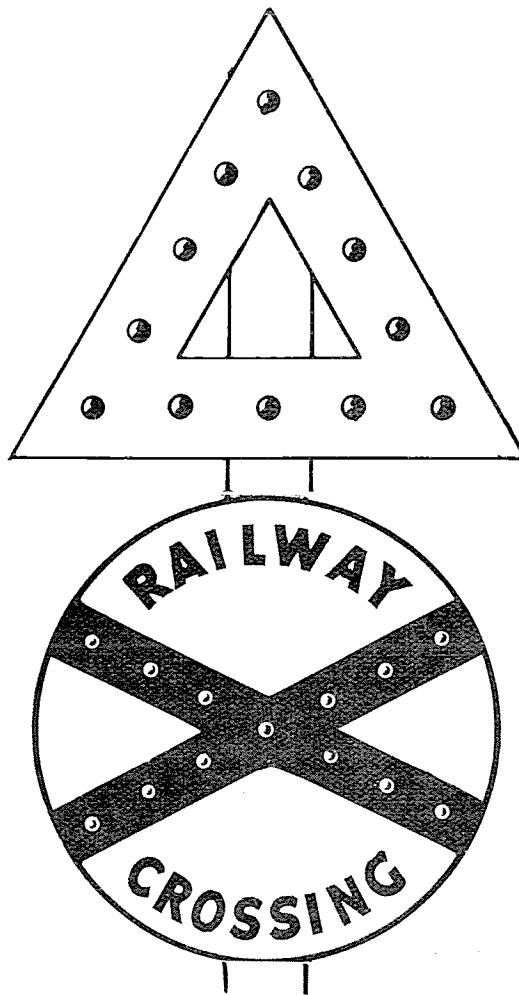


FIGURE 12.—RAILWAY CROSSING SIGN.

THE WATER BOARDS ACT, 1904.

Yarloop Water Area By-laws.

DIVISION I.

Interpretations.

1. (a) In the construction and for the purposes of these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms "Cesspool," "Drain," "Earth closet," "House," "Land," "Owner," "Person," "Public house," "Piggery," and "Slaughter-house" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in section 3 of Health Act, 1911.

(b) The words "Authorised," "By-laws," "District," "Fittings," "Local authority," "Occupier," "Owner," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Ratepayer," "Rateable land," "Road," "Reservoir," "Stream," "Water area," "Water works," "Watercourse," and "Works" shall have meaning severally attached to them in the Water Boards Act, 1904, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act or any amending Act and the by-laws made thereunder.

(c) "Reservoir" shall mean any reservoir, dam, tank, cistern, or well.

(d) "High-water mark" shall mean the level of full supply of any reservoir or feeder thereto.

(e) "Feeder" shall mean any watercourse, creek, stream, or other channel, with either perennial or intermittent flow, whereby water can be conveyed to any reservoir.

(f) "Catchment area" shall mean all land over, through, or under which any water flows, runs, or percolates directly or indirectly into any reservoir created or used by the Board in connection with any water supply, prescribed in or proclaimed under any Act.

(g) "Board" shall mean the Yarloop Water Board acting in pursuance of the Water Board Act, 1902.

(h) "Inspector" and "Local officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Yarloop Water Board for the purposes of these by-laws or to administer the said by-laws.

(i) "Domestic supply"—A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply for cattle or for horses, or for any steam engine, or for washing carriages, where such horses or carriages are kept for hire or are the property of any dealer, or for any hotel,

inn, trade, manufacturer, or business whatever, or for watering gardens, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose.

(j) "Private service," for the purpose of these by-laws:—"Private service" includes all the pipes and fittings, and all connections and apparatus of whatsoever nature or kind, and whether used temporarily or otherwise on any part of the premises of the owner or occupier of any premises supplied with water, whether by meter or otherwise, and includes any pipes or fittings the property of the consumer, which are used for conveying water from the mains of the Board, whether situated on the premises of the consumer or otherwise.

DIVISION II.

Licensing of Plumbers.

Plumbing Work shall be done by Licensed Plumbers.

2. Any person shall not do or cause to be done any work within the Water Area in connection with the water supply of any premises, or in connection with the fittings or apparatus connected therewith, unless he shall have first duly been admitted by the Board as a Licensed Water Supply Plumber.

Description and Scope of Licenses.

3. The condition upon which licenses will be issued by the Board are:—

(a) The Board will grant water supply plumbers' licenses, operative only in the area to which these by-laws apply, to water supply plumbers, upon the applicants satisfying the Board that they are competent water supply plumbers, and that they are fit and proper persons to hold such licenses, and the applicants may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work;

(b) On condition that the certificate of the Department's examiners has been obtained, the prescribed payments made, and, provided the Board is satisfied that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold such license, the Board will grant water supply plumbers' licenses, operative in all areas administered by the Board, excepting the metropolitan area, and excepting areas open for sewerage connections; and will also grant water supply and sanitary plumbers' licenses, operative in all areas administered by the Board.

Annual Fee for License.

4. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license, except when a license is granted after the tenth day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

Renewal of License.

5. Licenses issued by the Board under the by-laws and regulations shall be current only from the 1st January to the 31st December of the year of issue, and water supply plumbers shall apply for a renewal and pay the necessary fee before the expiry of the year for which their existing license is current.

List of Licensed Plumbers shall be Published.

6. A list of licensed water supply plumbers shall from time to time be published at the Office of the Board.

Breaches of By-laws by Plumbers.

7. Any licensed water supply plumber offending against any by-law or regulation of the Board, or who shall refuse to give any useful or proper information required by an officer of the Board, either by himself or those employed by him, or who fails to complete any contract with the Board, or with a private owner within the time specified, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds, and he shall also show cause why his license shall not be suspended or cancelled. Any person who has been removed from the list shall not be readmitted as a licensed water supply plumber until he shall have served the suspension order or paid such fine, not exceeding twenty pounds, as the Board may determine.

Delay in Work.

8. Plumbers shall execute any work they undertake with reasonable despatch, and any inconvenience to the public caused by licensed water supply plumbers by unnecessary delay in carrying out work will be rigorously dealt with by the Board.

Accidents to Pipes shall be Reported.

9. Accidents caused by licensed water supply plumbers to water, gas, or other pipes shall be at once reported, and immediate steps taken to have repairs effected, and the cost of same shall be defrayed by such plumbers.

Deposit and Declaration.

10. Prior to issue of the license, the person to whom the same is to be issued shall deposit with the Board a sum of five pounds, which shall be retained during the currency of the license, as a security for the proper performance of all work done by him, and shall sign a declaration that he accepts such license subject to and in conformity with the conditions thereof and with the by-laws of the Board, and that he will conform and comply therewith.

Deductions from Deposit.

11. The Board may deduct from such deposit any fine inflicted or the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed water supply plumber or his workmen, and as often as any amount is so deducted the licensed water supply plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of five pounds, and, in default, his license will be cancelled.

Change of Address to be Notified.

12. Every licensed water supply plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change in his address, give notice in writing thereof to the Board.

DIVISION III.

Water Supply Plumbing.

Specification of Pipes and Fittings for Private Services.

13. In connection with the laying down, maintenance, alteration, or repair of every private service, the following regulations shall be observed by the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such service is:—

(a) All pipes and fittings shall be of lead, galvanized, wrought, or malleable iron.

(b) Where lead pipes are used they shall be of drawn lead of equal thickness throughout and of at least the respective weights following, viz:—

(c) Where wrought iron tubes are used they shall be of butt-welded or solid drawn, of regular section, with British standard thread and of the following weights:—

1 $\frac{1}{4}$ in.	2.32 " " "

(d) The minimum weight of wrought and malleable iron fittings shall be fixed from time to time by the Board, and no malleable fittings, unless of approved brand, shall be used.

(e) Tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplets, plugs, etc., shall be of the best manufacture, true in section, regular, and of equal thickness, properly and truly cut, with the British standard thread, perfectly sound and new, and free from all defects.

The tees, bends, tubes, etc., shall be capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(f) All joints between pipes, tees, bends, thimbles, couplings, elbows, and cocks, etc., shall be made with red lead and flax or other approved jointing material. All joints on lead pipes shall be of the kind known as "wiped joints," and all connections between lead and iron water pipes shall be made with brass couplings and wiped joints.

(g) No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid through any sewer drain, ashpit, cistern, or manurebin, or through, in, or into any place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unsonnd, the water conveyed through such pipe would be liable to be polluted or to escape without observation, unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior cast-iron pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to the same, and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection.

(h) All taps, stopcocks, ballcocks, valves, service boxes, waste-not regulators, bath taps, or valves or other fittings used in connection with the supply of water shall be of approved type, and capable of withstanding a pressure of 300 lbs. per square inch, and shall be tested and stamped by the duly authorised officer of the Board before being fixed. The Board will test and stamp the same and charge the following fees for testing and stamping:—

Bib and stopcocks	2d. each.
Ballcocks or valves	2d. each.
Waste-not regulators	6d. each.

(i) Every cistern and tank shall be provided with an equilibrium ball valve, and the overflow pipe shall be laid and fixed in a suitable manner, so as to discharge in some conspicuous place open to inspection and in a position approved by the Board.

(j) No service pipe shall communicate directly with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rain-water, or made or used below the surface of the ground.

(k) No part of any service shall communicate directly with the water in any steam boiler or other apparatus used for the generation of steam, but the feed water shall be supplied in such a manner that none of the water in the boiler or such other apparatus can return into the main or service pipe.

(l) Every water-closet fitting shall be approved of by the Board, and shall be supplied from the service pertaining to the tenement, through a proper cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall communicate directly with a basin or trap, or otherwise than with a cistern of a water closet.

(m) In every bath the outlet will be distinct from and unconnected with the inlet, or inlets, and the inlet or inlets shall be placed at least one inch above the highest water level of the bath. The outlet of every bath shall be provided with a perfectly watertight plug. The Board will not supply any bath unless the same shall be constructed as to prevent a waste of water.

(n) Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall communicate directly with any urinal.

Maintenance of Private Services.

14. (a) The owner or occupier for the time being of any premises supplied with water shall, at his own risk and expense, and subject to the provisions of these by-laws, arrange with a licensed plumber to lay down his private service and keep it in good order and repair and so that the same shall at all times be in accordance with the by-laws for the time being.

(b) The service pipe, being the property of the owner or occupier of the land supplied by such service, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe required repairing, immediately arrange with a licensed plumber to repair the same, subject to the provisions of these by-laws, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of two pounds for each day after receipt of notice, and the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe, or otherwise, as the Board may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

(c) Without prejudice to the right of the Board to proceed for any penalty for the breach or non-observance of any of the provisions of this by-law, the Board may cut off the supply of water to any premises whereon the private service or any part thereof is not at

all time laid, fixed, used, or maintained in all respects in accordance with the provisions of the said by-laws, and may keep the same cut off until such provisions have been fully observed.

Interference within three feet of Meter.

15. Licensed plumbers or other persons shall not under any circumstances disconnect the joints from the meter, or, after the meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within three feet of such meter. Such work shall be done only by the servants of the Board.

DIVISION IV.

16. Applications for water services shall be made on the printed form, procurable at the Office of the Board, and shall be lodged not less than seven days before the service is required. Full information, as indicated on the prescribed form, shall be supplied, and the full amount of rates or other charges due on the premises to which a service is required shall be paid on or before application and before the work is commenced.

Supply to non-rated Premises.

17. Any person or persons requiring a water service to any non-rated property may be supplied, on payment of a minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Board in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these by-laws, as applying to rate-paying consumers, shall apply to minimum charge-paying consumers.

Supply of Water not Compulsory.

18. It shall be at the discretion of the Board to supply water to any individual consumer or to any land, whether rate or not.

Separate Services Required.

19. Except with the written permission of the Board not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Board may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the subservices shall be so arranged that the supply to the remaining houses shall be controlled by a stopcock on such subservices.

Sizes of Service Pipes.

20. The size of the service pipe shall in each case be fixed at the discretion of the Board.

Notice of Intention to Build.

21. The owner or occupier of any land supplied with water within a Water Area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, before the commencement of same, give notice thereof to the Board.

Locking of Taps, etc.

22. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no occupier, the owner, shall cause proper means to be taken, by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Board, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the said premises.

22A. No service pipe shall communicate directly with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of water other than water obtained from the Board's mains.

Misuse of Water.

23. Any person entitled to a supply of water for domestic purposes only, or entitled only to a supply of water for any other specified purpose, shall not use such water for any other purpose except that specified.

Illegal Taking or Selling Water.

24. Any person, whether entitled to receive water from the Board or not, shall not, without the written permission of the Board, take, carry away, or allow to be taken or carried away, such water from his premises, or sell the same to any other person.

Turning Off when Repairing and Tapping.

25. The Board may from time to time when necessary for the purpose of tapping and repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of a Water Area.

Reward—Reporting Leakage.

26. The Board may in its discretion adequately reward any person (not being the person in fault) who shall communicate timely information to the Board of any leakages or waste of water, whether the same be accidental, negligently or wilfully occasioned or suffered, or who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of any person or persons who shall steal or cause to be stolen or improperly appropriated the water of the Board.

Waste of Water.

27. Any person supplied with water by the Board, whether by meter or otherwise, shall not allow the same to run to waste.

Fixing of Meters.

28. Any officer appointed by the Board for the purpose may fix a meter on any service, and shall determine the size and class of meter in each case. Meters will be supplied by the Board and may be open or enclosed, at the discretion of the Board.

Repairs and Maintenance of the Meters.

29. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Board shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his charge. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Board, and the expenses incurred by the Board in so doing shall on demand be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and, if not paid on demand, shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

Notice of Damage or Non-Registration of Meter shall be given.

30. Any person supplied by the Board with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the Office of the Board.

Interference with Meters.

31. Any person shall not break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on the meter through which water is supplied by the Board, or turn or attempt to turn any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or introduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter, or any pipe or fittings attached thereto.

Period for Reading.

32. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

Averaging of Consumptions.

33. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Board, or any officer appointed by the Board, may at his option estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity of water consumed during such previous periods, as the Board may determine, and the quantity so ascertained will be paid for by the consumer.

Testing of Meters.

34. If any consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and be desirous of having the meter tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Board or its officer within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water, and if upon such testing it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer that the meter registered more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it at such testing, then the Board shall bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and shall

also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the meter upon such testing shall not register more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it, then the consumer shall pay to the Board all the expenses of and incidental to such testing: providing that the expense of every test shall be fixed by the Board, subject to a minimum charge of ten shillings for each test: provided also, that the consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the meter for any period other than the period of registration next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid.

Authority to Enter Premises.

35. Any officer acting under the Board's authority may at all reasonable times enter any house or premises connected or intended to be connected with the water mains, in order to examine whether the water pipes and fittings in such house or premises are in proper order. Any person refusing such admission or in any way hindering such officer in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter prescribed.

Gratuities Prohibited.

36. Officers, workmen, or agents of the Board shall not solicit or receive any fee or gratuity whatever.

Standard Drawings and Fittings.

37. Approved standard fittings and type drawings will be exhibited at the Board's office. Due consideration will be given by the Board to the claims of any other fittings which may be presented for approval, and, if considered satisfactory, the same may be placed among and become one of the approved standard fittings. The Board may from time to time amend, alter, or cancel any or all of the standard fittings or drawings, and replace them by such other fittings or drawings as they may approve of.

Junction or Interference with Pipes or Fittings.

38. Any person shall not make any connection or interfere with any pipe or fittings of the Board, or with any water pipe or fittings communicating therewith, at any other place than shall be approved of by the Board, and the mains shall only be tapped by the workmen of the Board.

Inspection of Works.

39. Work shall not be undertaken in connection with water supply, or in the extension or alteration thereof, until such time as the necessary printed permit is obtained. Two days' notice shall in all cases be given by the licensed plumber before work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer of the Board duly appointed to issue permits expressly accepts shorter notice. In no case shall any water pipes or apparatus in connection with water supply be used until the said work shall have been and, if necessary, tested by the said officer and certified by him on the prescribed form. No underground or enclosed work shall be covered up or concealed from view until the same shall have been duly inspected and passed by the inspector, and for this purpose the person to whom the permit has been issued shall immediately report any work which is ready for inspection or test, and every facility shall be afforded to such officer for making such inspection or test.

DIVISION V.**Rates and Charges.****Rating.**

40. (a) With the Yarloop Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding three shillings in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land: provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding one pound per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed piece of land.

(b) The Board may allow a discount of not exceeding twenty per cent. per annum upon any rates paid within three months of the date upon which such rates become payable, but such discount shall not apply to minimum rates and fees which shall be paid in full.

(c) In making rates a distinction may be made between occupied and vacant land, and, in the event of a dispute as to whether or not land shall be regarded as vacant, the decision of the Board shall be final in every case.

Rates—How Payable.

41. Rates shall become due and payable yearly in advance on the first day of January. Provided that, in all cases where a rate is made after the first day of January in any year, the notice of the order for making and levying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper, as provided by section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rates shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

Allowance for Rate.

42. Subject to the provisions of these by-laws every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed piece of land of which he is the owner or occupier which, if calculated at the price specified in the Schedule I. hereto as being that at which water is supplied in return for the rate in the area in which such property is situated would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on each property: provided that such water is taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

Payment for Excess Water.

43. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate shall pay for the excess in accordance with prices set forth in the Schedule I. hereto.

Fees—State or Commonwealth Government Department.

44. For each water service for purpose of any State or Commonwealth Department there shall be payable, as a minimum annual fee in lieu of water rate, the sum of not less than one pound (£1), when the service is metered, and of not less than two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.), when the service is non-metered.

It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not a meter shall be fixed in each case.

This by-law shall not apply to water for railway purposes.

Fees for additional Services.

45. In any case where the owner or occupier of any separate piece of land requires more than one service to be installed for supplying water to such land, such additional service or services shall, at the discretion of the Board, be installed on such occupier or owner paying in advance the cost of installation, and a fee of not less than one pound per annum, in addition to meter rent, for each additional service. In return for such fee an equivalent quantity of water will be given in each year, in the same way as water is given in return for water rates.

Meter Rates.

46. Every person supplied with water by measure shall pay meter rent in advance, according to the following scale:—

Reconnection Fee.

47. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges, or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or

when, in the opinion of the Board or local officer necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reasons, a minimum fee of five shillings shall be charged for disconnection and reconnection: provided that, where the cost exceeds the minimum fee, the actual cost of disconnection and reconnection, as determined by the Board, shall be charged, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being, on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee has been paid.

Private Fire Services.

48. Private fire service will be allowed, but every such service shall be sealed, except in cases where the Board may decide that sealing is unnecessary. For each such service there shall be paid the actual cost of installation, and a fee equivalent to five per centum on cost per annum shall be paid in advance as rental, subject to a minimum fee for each service of ten shillings per annum. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion, except for extinction of fire. In the event of the seal having been broken in case of fire or by accident, or otherwise, the occupier shall give notice and pay the cost of resealing.

Building Fees.

49. Where water is required for building purposes the Board may permit the supply thereof at prices as set forth in Schedule I. hereto and on the following terms:—

(a) The aforementioned prices shall apply only to water supplied to buildings intended for use as ordinary dwellings.

(b) In the case of buildings other than ordinary dwellings, the supply shall be on such terms as may be agreed upon by the Board, subject to a minimum fee of one pound for each service.

(c) All fees shall be paid in advance. If any work is done other than mentioned at the time of applying to the Board, the same shall be paid for in advance, or the whole supply will be forthwith cut off.

(d) It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not in any case a supply of water shall be classed as a supply for building purposes and as to whether or not the supply shall be measured by meter.

(e) Applications for water under this by-law shall be in writing, stating the nature of the work to be done and the purpose for which water is required.

When Accounts Due and Payable.

50. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or otherwise, payment for same shall become due and payable within fourteen days after due service of the account, unless otherwise agreed upon.

DIVISION VI.

51. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws to which no specific penalty is attached, or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such by-law, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and, in case of continuing offence, a further penalty not exceeding five pounds for each day after notice of such offence shall have been given by the Board to such offender.

By-law *re* Offensive Noises.

P.W. 662/38.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-38, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie hereby make a by-law, to be numbered 133, as follows:—

1. In this by-law "Offensive noise" means any noise, whether made by the human voice or by any gramophone amplifier, wireless appliance, bell or other instrument or appliance which causes or is likely to cause a nuisance or inconvenience in the nature of a nuisance to occupier of neighbouring premises, or to persons using any street or public place.

2. No person shall on any land or on or in any building cause or permit to be caused any offensive noise for advertisement purposes.

3. No person shall in any street, way, or public place cause any offensive noise for advertisement purposes.

4. No person shall, without the written permission of the Town Clerk, address the public in any street, way, or public place for advertisement purposes, and whether such person shall be in a street, way, or public place or on premises adjacent thereto.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 5 of 1939.

Between the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tearoom, and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and J. H. Glowrey, S. W. Paxton, and G. Haek, proprietors of hotels licensed to sell fermented and spirituous liquors, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested that the Agreement, a memorandum of which is hereto annexed, be made an Award of the Court: And whereas the said Agreement has been certified by me pursuant to section 63 (2) of the Act and duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Court, which said Agreement, pursuant to section 63, shall have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Term.

This Award shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1940, and remain in force for a term of three (3) years.

3.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work.
 (b) If a worker is at liberty to leave the premises of the employer for any time, being not less than half an hour, but elects to remain thereon, the time he remains on the premises shall not be included in his or her working time.

4.—Spread of Shift.

(a) Daily spread of shift shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's starting time to the worker's finishing time for the day.

(b) Weekly spread of shift shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.

(c) The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed seventy-eight hours.

(d) Subject to clause 10, the longest spread of shift in any one day shall not exceed thirteen (13) hours.

5.—Breaks in Shift.

In addition to breaks of at least half an hour, but not more than one hour each for meals, there may be a break of at least two hours during each shift. Such break of at least two hours may include a meal break.

6.—Night Work.

Except for night porters, any work done after 12 o'clock midnight and before 5 o'clock a.m. shall be paid at treble time rates in the case of females and time and a half in the case of male workers.

7.—Wages.

The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to workers per week:—

8.—Definitions.

“Cellarman” shall mean a worker who is exclusively or principally engaged in the breaking down and bottling of spirituous liquors in the cellar of an hotel.

“Waiter” shall mean a worker who serves at table and attends to all the requirements of guests while having meals.

9.—Junior Workers.

Male workers under the age of twenty-one (21) years may be employed as junior workers in any of the occupations covered by this Award, in the proportion of one junior to every two or fraction of two adult workers employed in the same occupation, at the following rates:—

	Percentage of Male Basic Wage per Week.
Between 18 and 19 years of age ..	55
Between 19 and 20 years of age ..	75
Between 20 and 21 years of age ..	90

Provided that, where no adult is employed, one junior male may be employed, except in the kitchen.

10.—Overtime.

All work done outside the daily spread provided in clause 4, or beyond eight hours in any one day, or beyond forty-four hours in any one week, shall be deemed to be overtime.

Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of one-third in addition to the ordinary rate herein prescribed: provided that any overtime in excess of seven hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

11.—Holidays.

All workers (other than night porters) shall be entitled to receive one full day off duty in each week: provided always, that in the case of an employer employing not more than three (3) workers under the provisions of this Award, two half days may be granted by agreement between the employer and the worker in lieu of one full day. If no agreement can be reached as to whether two half days in lieu of one full day off shall be allowed, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

The half day off shall, if taken in the morning, terminate at 2 p.m., and, if taken in the afternoon, shall commence at 2 p.m. A worker shall not be required to work more than four (4) hours on the day on which his half day off occurs.

Night porters:—Night porters shall be entitled to one night off duty in each week: provided that, if work is performed by a night porter in lieu of his night off, he shall be paid one-third, in addition to his ordinary wage, for that night. This provision shall not be availed of more than on six nights in any one year. Any dispute arising out of this provision shall be referred to the Board of Reference.

All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

12.—Annual Holiday.

On completion of twelve (12) months' service each worker shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' holiday on full pay without any deduction for board and/or lodging.

The annual holiday shall be granted within three (3) months of its becoming due.

Provided that any worker who shall have served one month or over, and whose contract of service shall have been terminated by either party for any cause other than misconduct before the annual holiday became due, such worker shall be entitled to receive a proportionate allowance of holiday pay for the time actually served.

A worker dismissed for misconduct shall forfeit all right to holiday pay under this clause.

Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with the provisions of clause 27, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

13.—Meals.

(a) Where full board is provided, workers shall be provided with three meals per day, such as are daily served in ordinary family hotels. Such meals shall include a dinner consisting of at least three courses.

(b) Subject to clause 5, at least one half hour but not more than one hour, shall be allowed for each meal.

14.—Casual Workers.

(a) A casual worker shall mean a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service.

(b) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(c) Casual workers shall not be engaged for less than three (3) hours.

15.—Climbing Ladders.

No waitress shall be permitted or compelled to climb ladders for the purpose of cleaning electric fans, fan-lights, walls, or windows.

16.—Roster.

(a) A roster of the working hours shall be exhibited in the office of each establishment and in such other place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned.

(b) Such roster shall denote the hours to be worked by each worker, and shall be open for inspection by a

duly accredited representative of the Union in the office, at such time and place as the Record Book is so open for inspection.

(c) Such roster shall be drawn up in such manner as to show the hours of each worker for one week in advance of the date of the roster, and may only be altered on account of the sickness or absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee.

17.—Weekly Wage.

Wages shall be paid, at least, weekly.

Except for casual workers, the contract of service shall be on a weekly basis: provided, that one day's notice of termination of service may be given on either side.

18.—Board and Lodging.

(1) Females:

(a) Where board is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker the following amount:—

(c) Where a worker notifies the employer on the day immediately preceding her day off or half day off, as the case may be, that she does not desire a meal or meals to be provided on such day off or half day off, the foregoing deductions for board shall be reduced by a proportionate amount for each such meal.

(2) Males (other than night porters and kitchen staff):

(a) Boarding and/or lodging on the licensed premises of the employer shall be prohibited, unless by agreement between the employer and the Union, or, failing such agreement, by permission of the Board of Reference.

(b) Where by agreement or by decision of the Board of Reference:—

(i) lodging is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker 7/3½d. per week within a radius of 15 miles of the General Post Office, Perth, and 7/4d. per week outside a radius of 15 miles but within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office, Perth;

(ii) board is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker 16/5d. per week within a radius of 15 miles of the General Post Office, Perth, and 16/7½d. per week outside a 15-mile but within a 20-mile radius of the General Post Office, Perth.

(3) Male Kitchen Staff:

(a) Lodging on the licensed premises of the employer shall be prohibited, unless by agreement between the employer and the Union, or, failing such agreement, by permission of the Board of Reference.

(b) Where by agreement or by decision of the Board of Reference:—

lodging is provided, the employer may deduct from the wages of the worker the amount shown in subclause (2) (b) (i) of this clause.

(c) Where board is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker the amount set out in subclause (2) (b) (ii) of this clause.

(d) Where a worker notifies the employer on the day immediately preceding his day off or half day off, as the case may be, that he does not desire a meal or meals to be provided on such day off or half day off, the deduction for board shall be reduced by a proportionate amount for each such meal.

(4) Male night porters:

(a) Lodging on the licensed premises of the employer shall be prohibited, unless by agreement between the employer and the Union, or, failing such agreement, by permission of the Board of Reference.

(b) Where by agreement or by decision of the Board of Reference lodging is provided, the employer may deduct from the wages of the worker the amount shown in subclause (2) (b) (i) of this clause.

(c) Where meals are provided by the employer, a deduction proportionate to the amount shown in subclause (2) (b) (ii) of this clause may be made from the wages of the worker for each meal provided. In no case shall the employer be entitled to deduct for more than two meals provided in any one day.

(5) The board and lodging allowances prescribed by this clause shall vary proportionately with the rise or fall in the basic wage.

19.—Accommodation.

(a) An employer requiring a worker to sleep in shall provide suitable accommodation. If the worker shall consider the accommodation unsuitable, any party to this Award may refer the matter to the Board of Reference for decision, as provided in clause 29.

(b) Workers sleeping in shall be provided with a common sitting-room, apart from their bedrooms, and shall have access to a properly equipped bathroom.

20.—Laundering.

If an employer requires female employees to wear stiff white cuffs, collars, or white aprons, he shall pay to such employees the sum of one shilling (1s.) per week for the laundering of the same; otherwise he shall cause the same to be laundered at his own expense.

If an employer requires white coats to be worn by his male employees, he shall pay them one shilling (1s.) per week extra for the laundering of the same, or cause such white coats to be laundered at his own expense.

21.—Bar Work.

Any worker, other than a night porter, who performs the duties of a barman, that is, actually dispensing drinks across the bar, shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of sixpence (6d.) per hour in addition to his prescribed rate of wage for the time so employed.

22.—Head Bands.

The employer may require plain white head bands to be worn by female employees.

23.—Change and Rest Room.

Adequate Change and Rest Rooms shall be provided by the employer, in cases where the employees do not reside on the premises.

24.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

25.—Record.

(a) The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, at his business premises, or at each of them, if more than one, a Time and Wages Book, wherein shall be entered the name and occupation of each worker, and, in the case of junior workers, the age on his last birthday, the time each worker commences and finishes work each day, and the total hours worked each week, and the wages paid to each worker.

(b) The record shall be entered up from day to day.

(c) The word "book," for the purpose of this clause, shall include loose leaves, if bound together and numbered consecutively.

(d) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper daily entering of the record, which shall be initialed, if correct, by the worker, daily.

The hours shown as worked in the Record Book shall be *prima facie* evidence of the correctness thereof in any proceedings for the enforcement of this Award.

(e) The book shall be open to inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Union, at the office of the employer, on days other than Saturday and Sunday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (except from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.).

26.—Higher Duties.

Any worker performing work for more than two hours in any day in work carrying a higher prescribed rate of wages than that in which he is engaged shall receive such higher wage for the time so employed.

27.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

28.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—(1) Name in full; (2) age and date of birth; (3) name of each previous employer; (4) class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be indorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer, upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate.

29.—Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference.

The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court, and two other representatives, one to be appointed by each of the parties.

The Board is hereby assigned the following functions, in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by the Award:—

- (i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award, but so as not to contravene any of the provisions herein;
- (ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

30.—No Victimisation.

No employer shall dismiss any worker from his employment or injure him in his employment, or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the worker is a member of the Hotel, Club, Caterers', Tearoom and Restaurant Employees' Indus-

trial Union of Workers, or by reason of the fact that such worker is entitled to all the benefits of this Award.

I certify, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

No. 5 (a) of 1939.

Between the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tearoom, and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and A. H. Olley and Derward Hostel, Coffee Palace Proprietors, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested that the Agreement, a memorandum of which is hereto annexed, be made an Award of the Court: And whereas the said Agreement has been certified by me pursuant to section 63 (2) of the Act and duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Court, which said Agreement, pursuant to section 63, shall have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Term.

This Award shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1940, and remain in force for a term of three (3) years.

3.—Hours.

- (a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work.
- (b) If a worker is at liberty to leave the premises of the employer for any time, being not less than half an hour, but elects to remain thereon, the time he remains on the premises shall not be included in his or her working time.

4.—Spread of Shift.

- (a) Daily spread of shift shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's starting time to the worker's finishing time for the day.
- (b) Weekly spread of shift shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.
- (c) The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed seventy-eight hours.
- (d) Subject to clause 10, the longest spread of shift in any one day shall not exceed thirteen (13) hours.

5.—Breaks in Shift.

In addition to breaks of at least half an hour, but not more than one hour each for meals, there may be a break of at least two hours during each shift. Such break of at least two hours may include a meal break.

6.—Night Work.

Except for night porters, any work done after 12 o'clock midnight and before 5 o'clock a.m. shall be paid at treble time rates in the case of females and time and a half in the case of male workers.

7.—Wages.

The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to workers per week:—

8.—Definitions.

“Waiter” shall mean a worker who serves at table and attends to all the requirements of guests while having meals.

For the purpose of this Award, “Coffee palace” means a residential establishment, not being an hotel licensed to sell fermented or spirituous liquors nor a boarding-house, where (in addition to permanent or weekly boarders and/or lodgers, or where permanent or weekly boarders and/or lodgers are not necessarily catered for) boarders and/or lodgers are catered for, for pay or reward, for a period of less than (1) week at a time, or where, in addition to catering for lodgers, whether permanent or otherwise, a dining room is maintained which is open to the public.

Provided that the term “Coffee palace” shall not include an establishment where not more than eight (8) boarders and/or lodgers, not being members of the proprietor’s family, are received for pay or reward and which has no public dining room but such establishment shall be deemed to be a boarding-house for the purposes of Award No. 16 of 1931.

9.—Junior Workers.

(a) Male workers:

Male workers under the age of twenty-one (21) years may be employed as junior workers in any of the occupations covered by this Award, in the proportion of one junior to every two or fraction of two adult workers employed in the same occupation, at the following rates:—

portion of one junior to every two or fraction of two adult workers employed in the same occupation, at the following rates, in addition to board and lodging:—

Provided, that where no adult is employed, one junior female may be employed.

10.—Overtime.

All work done outside the daily spread provided in clause 4, or beyond eight hours in any one day, or beyond forty-four hours in any one week, shall be deemed to be overtime.

Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of one-third in addition to the ordinary rate herein prescribed: Provided that any overtime in excess of seven hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

11.—Holidays.

All workers (other than night porters) shall be entitled to receive one full day off duty in each week: Provided always, that in the case of an employer employing not more than three (3) workers under the provisions of this Award, two half days may be granted by agreement between the employer and the worker in lieu of one full day. If no agreement can be reached as to whether two half days in lieu of one full day off shall be allowed, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

The half day off shall, if taken in the morning, terminate at 2 p.m., and, if taken in the afternoon, shall commence at 2 p.m. A worker shall not be required to work more than four (4) hours on the day on which his half day off occurs.

Night porters.—Night porters shall be entitled to one night off duty in each week: Provided that, if work is performed by a night porter, in lieu of his night off, he shall be paid one-third, in addition to his ordinary wage, for that night. This provision shall not be availed of more than on six nights in any one year. Any dispute arising out of this provision shall be referred to the Board of Reference.

All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

12.—Annual Holiday.

On completion of twelve (12) months’ service each worker shall be entitled to two (2) weeks’ holiday on full pay, without any deduction for board and/or lodging.

The annual holiday shall be granted within three (3) months of its becoming due.

Provided that, any worker who shall have served one month or over, and whose contract of service shall have been terminated by either party for any cause other than misconduct before the annual holiday became due, such worker shall be entitled to receive a proportionate allowance of holiday pay for the time actually served.

A worker dismissed for misconduct shall forfeit all right to holiday pay under this clause.

Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with the provisions of clause 26, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

13.—Meals.

(a) Where full board is provided, workers shall be provided with three meals per day, such as are usually served in ordinary coffee palaces. Such meals shall include a dinner consisting of at least three courses.

(b) Subject to clause 5, at least one half hour but not more than one hour, shall be allowed for each meal.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—(1) Name in full; (2) age and date of birth; (3) name of each previous employer; (4) class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate.

28.—Board of Reference.

The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference.

The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court, and two other representatives, one to be appointed by each of the parties.

The Board is hereby assigned the following functions, in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by the Award:—

- (i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award, but so as not to contravene any of the provisions herein;
- (ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

29.—No Victimisation.

No employer shall dismiss any worker from his employment, or injure him in his employment, or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the

fact that the worker is a member of the Hotel, Club, Caterers, Tearooms and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, or by reason of the fact that such worker is entitled to all the benefits of this Award.

I certify, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.
