Pertli Road Board.
Standing Orders.
P.W. 95\%/38.

1N pursuance of the powers in that behalf contamed in the Road Districts Act, 1019-39, the Perth Road Boarl do lercoy repeal all by-laws licretofore made in reference to the several matters dealt with in the bylaws hercinafter set out and do make and order the following by-laws:-

1. The proceclings and husiness of the Board shall be conducted according to the following regulations, whel shall be alled the Standing Orders.

## Chairman.

2. In the construction of this by law, maless the context otherwise requires, the word chairman shall inchade the viceelamman, deputy or ating chaiman and the member chosen to preside at any meting of the Board.
3. The chamman shall, when present, preside at all mectings of the Board, and in his absence, or if, after being present, he retires, the vice-chaiman shall preside; but if at any time neither of them is present, then the mombers prescut may choose out of their monber a member, who shall preside and exereise, for the purposes of that mecting and until the conclusion or adjournment thereof, the powers of the chaiman.

## Quorum.

4. At any mecting of the Board a quorum shall consist of the major part of the number of members for the time being assigned to the Board. Every meeting shall procced to busimess so soon after the time stated in the notice ats there shall be a sufficient momber of members in attemane to constitute a quormm.

Adjoumment in absence of Quorum.
5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within hatif an hour of the time appointed for such mecting, the majority of the members present, or member, if there is only one present, or the secretary, if no member is present, may adjom such nuceting to another day, and notice of such adjoumed meeting shatl be given to ach member.

## Count Out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Board a member shall eall the attention of the chaiman to the fact that a quorm is not present, the chairman shall therenpon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not prescut at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the chairman shall adjourn it to some future date.

Fecord of Members Prescht
7. At all mectings at which there is not a quorum present, or at which the Board is counted ont for want of a quormm, the manes of the mombers then present shall be recorded in the mimate book.

## Oper Doors.

8. The !nsiness of the Board slall be conducted with open toors, exedpt upon sueh occasions as the Boand shall her resohtion otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved withont notice.

Reporters.
9. At all meetings acerelited mewspaper reporters shal be permitter to attend in such part of the Board Toom as may be appropriated for their accommodation, but they shall withdraw, upon a rote of the Board so requiring, during any portion or the whole of the meeting.

## Disturbance by Visitors.

10. The ahmission of eitizens, reporters, and visitors to the Board Room slall be under and subject to the regulations that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation, or interuption to the proceedings of the Boate shall take phese, and in the event of any breach of this regulation, the chairman may at his diseretion. and without a rote of the Board, require the person or persons so offending to withoma, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately witholaw from the Board Room.

## Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Board, who intermpts the ordery conduet of the business of the Board, who does not, immediately upon being called upon by the chairman so to do, withdraw from the board Room, may by order of the dhaiman be removed from the Board Room forthwith.

## business át board Mremings

## Order of Business.

12. The orter of business of an ordinary meeting shat be as follows, or as uear thereto as shat be practicable, but for the grater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thoreof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:-
(1) Confirmation of minutes.
(2) Amomecment by the ehammans withont dis cussion.
(:) Questions of whicli cluc notice las been given, without discussion.
(4) Correspondence.
(5) Petitions and memorials.
(6) 'I'enders.
(7) Reports of Committees.
(8) Orders of the day, including considering and ordering upon my business left over from the previous meeting, and any business the chairmin may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Board and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
(9) Motions of whieh previous notices have been given.
(10) Notices of motious for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

## Order at Special Meetings.

13. The order of business at any special meeting of the Board shall bo the order in which sneh business stands in the notice thereof.

## Minutes.

14. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Board, in order to obtain their confimation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minntes shall then be signed by the chairman, as by section 140 of the Aet required.

## Questions.

15. Any member desiring to ask a question at any mecting of the Board shall give notice thereof in writing to the secretary at least four hours before the hour fixod for the meeting.
16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shatl be allowed thercon.

## Notices of Motion.

17. Any member may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the secretary, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than three elear days before such hast-mentioned meeting.

## Motion to Lapse.

18. Every such motion shall lapse unless the member who gave the notice thereof, or some other member authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

## Deputations.

Reception of Deputations.
19. Depntations wishing to be received by the Board shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the secretary shall bring the memorial before the Committee concerned, which shall be authorised, if it see fit, to receive the deputation and to report to the Board. If the Committee is of the opinion that the memorial is one which should be bronght before the Board, the Committee shall so report, and, if the Board shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

## Number of Depatation.

20. A deputation shall not exceed ten in number, and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Board or a Committee of the Board, except in reply to questions from nembers of the Board or Committee, and the matter shall not be further considered by the Board or the Committee until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

## Conduct of Debate.

Menbers to address the Chair--Point of Order.
21. Any member moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, slanll rise and address the chairman, and shall not be intermipted, muless mpon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the member raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chilim may proceed.

## Nature of Motion to be stated.

29. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Board thereon, and, if so required by the chaiman, shall pat the same in writing.

Motions to be Seconded-Enforeement of Standing Orders.
23. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the rote of the Board unless it be seconded, but a member may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Board by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

## Use of Titles.

24. At meetings of the Board, speakers in referring to others present thereat shall designate them by their respective titles of ehairman or member, as the case may be.

Priority of Speakers.
25. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

## Chamman to Speak.

26. Whenever the chairman rises during a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak is to sit down, and the Board is to be silent, so that the chaiman may be heard without interruption.

## Member not to speak Twice.

27. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply, upon any original motion of which he may be the mover or as the mover of an amendment last carried; and no member shall speali to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply.

## Calling to Oreler for speaking Twice.

28. The chairman shall, without wating for the interposition of the Board, eall to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover or Seconder to be held to have Spoken.
29. A member moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

No speaking after Notice put.
30. No member may speak to any question after the same has been put from the Chair.

## Time Limit.

31. No member shall speak or address the Board upon any motion or amendment before the Board, or in reply, for a longer period than ten minutes, without the consent of the Board, which shall be signified withont debate.

## Speaking in Reply.

32. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introdnced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of complicated Resolutions.
33. The chairman, at his discretion, may, or the Board may by motion withont debate, order a complicated motion to be divirled and put in the form of several resolutions.

## Withdrawal of Motion.

34. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the Board, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any menber to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shitl have been refused.

## Production of Dceuments.

35. Any member may of right require the protuction of any of the documents of the Board relating to the question or matter mider discussion.

Reflection upon Vote of Bond
36. No member shall reffect mpon any vote of the Board, except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

## All Members to Vote

37. At all meetings of the Board, save where it is otherwise provided, all the members present shall rote, and the questions there considered shall be decided by open voting, and by the majority present. Each member, including the chamman, shall have one rote only, and, in the case of an equality of votes on any question, such question shall pass in the negative.

Digression from subject-Personal reflections.
38. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under diseussion, nor impute improper motives to any other momber, and all persomal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

Record of words used by a Member.
39. Any member may require the secretary to take down any partienlar words used by a member immediately upon the s:me being used.

## Chairntan's Ruling.

40. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall give his decision, and no argument or comment slall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that paticular case.

## Withdrawal of ofensive Expression.

41. Any member who shall use any expression which in the opinton of the ehamman refleets offensively on any member of the Board, shall, when required by the chairman, unreservedy withdraw sheh expression and make a sutisfactory apology to the Chair; and, if he decline, or neglect to do so, the chaman may refuse to hear such member further upoa the matter then under discussion and eall upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Board, or may direct the ofrending member to withdraw from the Board Room for the remander of the then sitting of the Board.

## Disturbance--Conversing :loud.

42. No member shatl make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converso aloud whilst any other member is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

## Continued Irelevance.

43. The chaiman may call the attention of the Board to continued irrelevance, tedions repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a member, and may direct such member, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon such member shall cease speaking and resume his seat.

## Crossing Board Room.

44. When the chamman is putting :ny question, no member shall walk out of or across the Board Room, nor shill my momber, whilst any other member is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

## Chairman may call to Order.

45. The chairman shall preserve order, and may on his own motion call any member to order whenever in his opinion there shall be eause for so doing.

## Infraction of Standing Orders

46. Every nember sh:ll be entitled to direct the attention of the chairman to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other member.

## Definition of Order.

47. Any member who shall do anything or behave in any manner which is forlidden by any section of this by-l:w shall be deemed to be out of order.

Decision of Chainman on Point of Order-Member to apologise when called upon.
48. Whenever it shall hare been deeided by the chaiman that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Board is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in a meeting by any member shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such nember shatl be called upon by the chairman to make such explanation, retraction of apology, as the case may require.

## Member to withdr:w from Board Room.

49. Any member who shall persist in any line of conduct which the chairman shail have decided or which by any section of this by-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction, or apology required by the chaimen as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the ehnirman, withdraw from the Boal Room for the remander of the then sitting of the Board.

## Removal of Member from Board Room.

50. Tn the erent of :ny member refusing or neglecting to withduar from the Board Roon when requested or directed by the chamm:u so to do, the chairman may order such nember to be removed from the said Board Room, and to be excluded therefrom, during the re. mainder of the then sitting of the Bourd.

Disorder.
51. If disorder should arise at any meeting of the Board, the charman, acting in his diseretion, may as a matter of right quit the Chair, and amounce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, when the Board shall reassemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceeded with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the Ghair and decided without delate by a majority of the members present.

## Order in Debate.

Motions and Amendments.
52. When a motion is under debate at :ay meeting of the Board, no further motion shall be received, except the following:-
(1) That the motion be amended.
(2) That the Board do now adjourn.
(3) That the debate be adjonmed.
(4) That the question be now put.
(5) That the Board do proceed with the next business.
(6) That the Boad do resolve into Committee of the Whole.
1.-That the Motion be Amended. Relevancy of Amendment.
53. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

To be Read.
54. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.
55. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any anemd. ment being earied it shall be competent for any member to more one other amendment thereon, but no more.

## Sulstantive Motion.

56. Upon the adoption of any amendment such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so earried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

## 2.-What the Board do Now Adiourn. <br> Time to Move.

57. A member max at the conclusion of the speech of amy other member, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Board do now atjourn: provided that the mover may spenk for not more than fire minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally secondirg, and the mover of the question (if any) under debate, on the motiou for adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for fire mimates, but no further debate shall be allowed.

No disenssion-Procedure before further Motion.
58. No diseussion shath be allowed on any motion for : moljoumment of the Board, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or my other that may be allowed precedence, shall be diseussed before amy subsequent motion for adjommment shall be entertaned.

Question aljourned to next Meeting.
59. On a resolntion for adjommment, the question (if any) under debate when the motion for adjoumment was made shall stand adjommed to the next meeting.

## One Motion only.

60. At the same sitting no member maty move or second more than one motion for the adjourmment of the Board.

## 3.-That the debate be Adjourned. Time to Move.

61. Any member may, at the conchusion of the speech of any other member, move withont previons notice that the debate be aljourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

## No Discussion.

6\%. No disenssion shall be allowed upon a motion for the adjomment of a debate.

## Mover to speak First.

63. On resuming an adjoumed debate, the member who moved its adfonmment shall be entitled to spak first.

One Motion only.
64. At the same sitting no member shat move or second more than one motion for adjourmment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate after Count Ont.
65. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Board being counted out, such debate may be resmoned at the next meeting at the point where it was so intermpted, on motion with notice.

## 4.- That the Question be Now Put.

Time to move-Pnt without Debate.
66. A member may, at the conchasion of the speech of another member, more without notice that the question under consideration be now put, and apon such motion being seconded the same shall be immediately put without debate.

## Wwothirds Majonity.

67. A motion that the consideration of the question be now put shall not be decided in the affirmative or take effect without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the members present.

## Speaking in Reply.

68. Wheneser it is idecided by the Boart that the question under consideration shall be pat, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued, and if otherwise entitled to do so, be pernitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the guestion is put.

Motion to be put at Once.
69. Shonld the motion be carrief, the motion or amendment under debate shall be put at onee.

## Question inchades Amendment.

70. Whencrer it is decided by the Board that the question muder consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the Chair shall be construch and taken to mean abd inchade the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

## 5.--That the Board do proced to the next Business. <br> Tiue to Move.

71. It shall be competent for any member at the close of the speech of any other member to more without notice that the Board do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be Dropped.
72. When a motion be carried that the Board do proceed to the next business, the question under discussion shatl be eousidered as dropped.

Further Motion.
73. During the same debate, a second motion that the Board do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one honr.

## 6.- Phat the Board resolve into Committee Decision of Board.

74. The Board may detormine that any question shall be considered in Committee of the Whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved withont previons notice.

Matters to be considered by Committee.
75. Such Committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Board.

## Conchact of Committees.

76. In Committee of the Whole the Standing Orders of the Board shall apply, except that members may speak more than once to the same question.

## Adoption of Committee's Resolations.

77. The Ciairman shall report the resolntions arrived at in Committee of the Whole to the Board at its next ordinary meeting, or upon the resumption of the Board, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Board may think fit.

## Confidential Business.

78. All matters dealt with or brought before the Board in Committee, or before any Committee of the Board, shall be treated as strictly confidential, and muless and motil the Board or a Committee appointed by the Board otherwise determine, no information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be diselosed to any person outside the Board prior to the issue of the business paper containing the items to be submitted to Board for confirmation.

## Rescission of Resolutions-Rescission.

79. No resolution of any meeting of the Board shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered at any subsequent meeting held during the financial year, except in manner provided in section 136 of the Act.

Repetition of negatived Motion.
80. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Board shall again be entertaned within a period of three months, unless with the consent of at least six members of the Board.

Susponsion of Standing Orders-How Moved.
81. Th eases of urgent necessity iny Standing Order or Orders of the Board may be suspended, on motion duly made and seconded without notice.

Provided:
(a) that such motion shall be made and secouded only after all business apparing in the Notice Paper has been disposed of ; aud
(b) that such motion shall be carried by a majority of not less than three of the nembers present.

## Objects of Suspension to be Stated.

82. Any member moring the suspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no diseussion shall take place thereon.

Voting-Method of Taking Votes.
83. The chaiman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary, to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party las the majority.

## Division.

84. The Board shall vote by a show of hands, but any member may call for a division upon any question, in which case the members roting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the neg:ative retain their seats; all dirision lists shall be entered on the minutes.

## Committees.

Standiug Committees.
85. In addition to sueln special Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there slall be two Standing Committees appointed from anong the members, namely:-a Finance, Genemal Purposes and Staff Committec, and a Works, Parks and Reserves and Health Committce, each of which sinall cousist of not less than five members. Such Committees shall be appointed each year at the first mecting of the Board which shall be held after the annual election.

## Election of Committees.

86. The members of the said Committees shall, in defanlt of agreement, be elected by ballot.

Powers and Duties of Committees.
87. The powers and dnties of Committees shall be as under:-

Finsnce, Gencral Purposes aud Staff Committee:-

1. To examine and check all accounts and generally supervise the collection and expenditure of Board revenne.
2. To inquire into and report to the Board from time to time upon all matters which they may consider to affect or be likely to affect the finances of the Board, or which the Board may by resolution direct them to inquire into and repont upon.
3. To have control of all matters affecting the staff of the Board.
4. To exercise all powers conferred on the Board in respect to expenditure under section 219 of the Act.
Works, Parks and Reserves and Health Committee:-
5. To have the general direction of all works ordered or sanctioned by the Board, and of all streets, roads, ways, drains, bridges, and other public places under the care and management of the Board.
6. To have the management ana general direction of sweeping and watering, the resumption of land for the formation of new streets, and widening of existing streets, and the general administration of the building by-laws.
7. To inquire into and report to the Board from time to time upon such improvenents and repairs as they may think mecessary, or which the Board may by resolntion direct then to inquire into and report upon.
8. To have the control of all parks, reserves, and tree-planting and of the Town Hall and other Road Board huildings.
9. To supervise the carying ont of the provisions of amy Act of Parlimment or by-laws affecting public health.
10. To deal with petitions and complants from persons affeeted by these Acts or by-laws.
11. To deal with all matters relating to the collecting of uightsoil and refuse, the supervision of places of ambsement, the sale of foods and druss, the lieensing of moxions trades, private hospitals, lodging honses, morgues, etc., and generally control all matters affecting the health of the ditizens.

## Speeial Committees.

88. Specin Committees may consist of any ummber of members, and may be :ppointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a Committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Board, a special Committec onght to be appointed. No Standing Committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any Special Committec. The appointment of a Speci:n Committee
shall be made by resolution of the Board, which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Special Committee, and may either state the number of members to be elected by ballot, or shall name the members whom it is proposed shall constitute such Committee. Rvery Standing Committee shan hold office until the thitd Saturday in April following its appointment.

## Convening Committee Meetings.

89. The secretary shall eall a meeting of any Committee when requested so to do by the chairman or any two members of such Committee.

## Standing Orders.

90. The St:unding Orders of the Board shall be observed and apply in Committees, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking, and except as to Committees being conducted with open doors.

## Quorum.

91. At a meeting of a Committee a quorum shall consist of not less than three members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated or there shall be a sufficient momber of members in attendance to constitute a quormo.

## Minutes.

92. Each Standing Committee shall keep a book, to be called the minte-book, in which shall be entered minntes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the following meeting, and signed by the chairman thereof.

## Miscellaneous. <br> Peualty.

93. Any member who shall be guilty of tun offeuce against this by-law shall be liable on conviction before a Cont of summary furisdiction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

## Enforecment of By-laws.

94. Whenever any member shan have committed an offence under this by-law, the chamman may forthwith hay, or canse to be had, an iuformation before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending member, and shan afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

## Coolgardie Road Board.

Yarloop Water Area By-laws. Division I.

## Thterpretations.

1. (a) Th the constrnetion and for the purposes of these by-laws, maless the context otherwise requires, the terms "'Cesspool," "Drain," "Eirth closet," "Honse," "Laud,'" "Owner," "Person," "Publie honse," "Piggery," and "Slmghter-honse", shatl have the meanings severally attached to them in section 3 of Mealth Act, 1911.
(b) The words "Authorised," "Bylaws," "Dis trict," "Fittings," "Local anthority," "Oceupier," "Owner," "Pipe," "Preseribed,"' "Ratepayer'," "Rateable lant,' "Road,'" "Reservoir," "Stream,"
"Water area,"' "Water works," "Watercomse," and
"Works'" shall have meming severally attached to them in the Water Boards Act, 1904, heremafter referred to as the principal Act or any amending Aet and the berlaws made theremoder.
(c) "Rescrvoir"' shall mean any reserroir, dam, tank, cistern, or well.
(d) "lligh-water mark'" shall mean the level of full supply of any reservoir or feeder thereto.
(e) "Peeler" shall mean :my watercourse, creek, stream, or other chamel, with either peremial or intermittent flow, whereby water ean be conveyed to any reservoir.
(f) "Catchment area" shall mean all land over, though, or mider which any water flows, runs, or percolates directly or indirectly into any reservoir crected or used by the Board in connection with any water supply, prescribed in or proclaimed mader any Aet.
(g) "Boatrl' shall mean the Yarloop Water Boarl acting in pursamee of the Water Board Act, 1902.
(h) "'huspector's and "Loeal officer"' respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Yarloop Water Boand for the purposes of these by-laws or to administer the said by-laws
(i) 'Domestic smpply''-A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply for eattle or for horses, or for any steam engine, or for washing earinges, where such horses or earriages are kept for line or are the property of any dealer, or for any hotel,
inn, tade, manafacturer, or business whatever, of for watering gardens, or for fountains, of for any omamental purpose.
(j) "Private service,' for the purpose of these by-Jaws:--"Private service" includes all the pipes and fittings, and all comections and apparatus of whatsoerer mature or kind, and whether used temporarily or otherwise on :any part of the premises of the owner or occupier of any premises supplied with water, whether by meter or otherwise, aud includes any pipes or fittings the property of the consumer, which are used for conreying water from the mains of the Board, whether situated on the premises of the consumer or otherivise.

## DIvision II

Licensing of Plumbers.
Plombing Work shall be done by Licensed Plumbers.
2. Any person slatl not do or cause to be slone any work within the Water Area in comection with the water supply of any premises, or in comection wibl the fittings or apparatus comected therewith, unless he shall hare first duly been admitted by the Board as a Lirensed Water Supply Plumber.

Description :und Scope of Licenses.
a. The condition upon which licenses will be issned by the Board are:-
(a) The Board will grant water supply plumbers' licenses, operative only in the area to which these bylaws apply, to water supply plumbers, upon the appliconts satisfying the Board that they ate competent water supply plumbers, and that they are fit and proper persons to hold such licenses, and the applie:nts may be required to submit to an examination in the fleory and practice of plumbing work;
(b) On condition that the certifiente of the Department's examiners has been obtained, the peseriberl pay. monts made, and, prorided the Board is satisfied that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold such license, the Board will grant water supply plumbers' licenses, operative in all areas admimistered by the Board, excopting the metropolitan area, and excepting areas open for sewemge comections; and will also grant water supply and sanitary phombers' hoenses, operative in all areas administered br the Board.

## Ammal Fee for License.

4. A fee of ten shillings shatl be payable tor every liconse, except when a lieense is granted after the tent day of July in any year, in which ease the fee shall be five shillings.

## Renewal of License.

z. Licenses issued by the Board under the by-lats and regulations shall be current only from the 1st January to the 31st December of the rear of issue, and water supply plumbers shall apply for a reuewal and pay the necessary fee before the expiry of the year for whieh their existing license is enrrent.

## List of Licensed Plumbers shall be Pubhished

6. A list of licensed water supply phombers shanl from time to time be published at the Office of the Board.

## Breaches of By-laws by Plambers.

7. Any licensed water supply plumber offending against any by-law or regulation of the Board, or who shall refuse to give any needful or proper information requred by an ofticer of the Bonrd, either by himself or those employed by him, or who fails to complete :my contract with the Board, or with a private owner within the time specified, shall be liable to a fine not exceedng twenty pounds, mad he shall also show canse why his license shall not be suspended or cancelled. Any person who has been temoved from the list shall not be readmitted as a licensed water supply plumber until he shall have serred the suspension order or paid such fine, not exceeding twenty pounds, as the Board may determine.

## Delay in Work.

8. Plumbers slall execute any work ther umdertake with reasomable despateli, and any inconvenience to the public eqused by licensed water supply plumbers by monecess:ury deay in curying ont work will be rigoronsly dealt with by the Board.

Accidents to Pipes shall be Reported.
9. Acridents aused by licensed water supply phumers to water, gas, or other pipes shall be at once reported, and immediate steps taken to have repairs effected, and the cost of same shall be defrayed by such plmmbers.

## Deposit and Declaration

10. Prior to issue of the license, the person to whom the same is to be issued shall deposit with the Board a sun of five pounds, which shall be retaned during the currency of the license, as a security for the proper performance of all work done by him, and shall sign a declaration that he accepts such license subject to and in conformity with the conditions thereof and with the br-laws of the Board, and that he will conform and comply therewith.

## Deductions from Deposit.

11. The Board may dednct from such deposit any fine inflicted of the expense of making good any bad work of the liceused water supply plumber or his workmen, and as often as any mount is so dedncted the licensed water supply plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of fire ponnds, and, in default, his hicense will be cancelled.

Ch:unge of Address to be Notified.
12. Ever licensed water supply plumber shall, within forty-cight hours of any change in his atdress, give notice in writing thereof to the Toord.

## Division III.

## Water Supply Plumbing

Specification of Pipes and Fittings for Private Services.
13. In comection with the laying down, mantenance, alteration, or repair of every private service, the following regulations shall be observed by the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such service is:-
(a) All pipes and fittings shall be of lead, galvanised, wrought, or malleable iron.
(b) Where lead pipes are used they shall be of drawn lead of equal thichess throughout and of at least the respectire weights following, viz:-

(c) Where wronght irou tubes we used they shall be of butt-welded or solid drawn, of regular section. with British standard thread and of the following weights:-

(d) The minimm weight of wronght and malleable iron fittings shall be fixed from time to time by the Board, and no malleable fittings, maless of approved braud, shall be used.
(e) Tees, thimbles, bends, redncing couplets, plugs, cte., shall be of the best manufacture, true in section, regnlar, and of equal thickness, properly and truly cut, with the British standard thread, perfectly somb and new, and free from all defects.

The tees, beuds, tubes, etc., shall be capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.
(f) All joints between pipes, tees, bends, thimbles, couplings, elbows, moll cocks, etc., shall be made with red lead and flax or other approved jointing material. All joints on lead pipes shall be of the kind known as "wiped joints," and all comections between lead and iron water pipes shall. be made with brass conplings and wiped joints.
(g) No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid throngh any sewer drain, ashpit, cistern, or mannrebin, or throngh, in, or into any place where, in the event of the pipe becoming misond, the water conveyed throngh such pipe would be liable to be polluted or to escape withont observation, mess such pipe or apparatns be lairl through an exterior cast-iron pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford dne protection to the same, and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection.
(h) All taps, stoproeks, balleocks, valves, service boxes, waste-not regulators, batli taps, or valves or other fittings used in connection with the supply of water shall be of approved type, and capable of withstanding a pressure of 300 lbs per square inch, and shall bo tested and stanped by the duly antloorised officer of the Board before being fixed. The Board will test and stamp the same and charge the following fees for testing and stamping:-

(i) Every eistern and tank shall be provided with an equilibrimm ball valve, and the overflow pipe shall bo faid and fixed in a snitable maner, so as to discharge in some conspicnons place open to inspection and in a position approved by the Board.
(j) No service pipe shall commmicate directly with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or nsed for the reception of rain-water, or made or msed below the surface of the gromid.
(k) No part of any service shall commonicate directly with the water in any steam boiler or other apparatus used for the generation of stean, but the feed water shall be snpplied in snch a manner that none of the water in the boiler or such other apparatus can return into the matn or service pipe.
(1) Every water-eloset fitting shall be approved of by the Board, and shall be supplied from the service pertaining to the tenement, throngh a proper cistern or service box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall commmicate directly with a basin or trap, or otherwise than with a cistern of a water closet.
(m) In every bath the outlet will be distinct from and meonnected with the inlet, or inlets, and the inlet or inlets shall be placed at last one inch above the highest water level of the bath. The outlet of every bath shall be provided with a perfectly watertight phig. The Board will not snpply any bath muless the same shall be constrincted as to prevent a waste of water.
(1) Every mrinal shall be supplied only throngh a cistern or service box, fitted with approved wastepreventing apparalus. No service pipe shall commonicate directly with any urinal

## Maintenance of Private Servies.

14. (a) The owner or ocenpier for the time being of any premises supplied with water shall, at his own risk and expense, and subject to the provisions of these by-laws, arrange with a licensed plumber to lay down his private service and keep it in goorl order and repair and so that the same shall at all times be in accordance with the by-laws for the time being.
(b) The serviec pipe, being the property of the owner or occupier of the land supplied by such service, the ocempier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe required repairing, immediately arrange with a licensed phmber to repair the same, smbiect to the provisions of these by-laws, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage whiel shall be cansed by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise ont of repair or broken, and in defant be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten ponnds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of two pounds for each day after receipt of notice, and the Poard may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by entting off the service pipe, or otherwise, as the Board may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.
(c) Without prejudice to the right of the Board to proceed for any penalty for the breach or nom-observance of any of the provisions of this by-law, the Board may cut off the supply of water to any premises whereon the private service or any part thereof is not at
all time laid, fixed, used, or maintained in all respects in accordance with the provisions of the said by-laws, and may keep the same cht off until such provisions have bern fully observed.

## Interferener within three feet of Meter.

15. Licensed phumbers or other persons shall not moler any circumstances theomect the joints from the meter, or, after the meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within three feet of snch meter. Such work shall be done only by the servants of the Board.

## Division IV

16. Applications for water services shall be made on the printed form, procnrable at the Office of the Board, and shall be lodged not less than seven days before the service is required. Pull information, as indicated on the preseribed form, shall be supplied, and the finl amome of rates or other charges due on the premises to which a serrice is required shall be paid on or before application and before the work is commenced.

## Supply to non-rated Premises.

17. Any person or persons requiring a water ser vice to any non-rated property may be supplied, on payment of a minimm charge, which shall be fixed by the Board in each case. The minimum charge shal then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these by-laws, as applying to rate-paying consumers, shall apply to minimm charge-paying consnlmers.

Supply of Water not Compulsory.
18. It slatl be at the discretion of the Board to supply water to any individual consmmer or to any land, whether rate or not.

## Separate Serviees Required.

19. Except with the written permission of the Board not more than one honse or tenement shall be smplied from a single water service. The Board may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such eases the subservices shall be so arranged that the supply to the remaining houses shall be controlled by a stopcock on sneh subservices.

Sizes of Service Pipes.
20. The size of the service pipe slatl in each case be fixed at the diseretion of the Board

## Notice of Tutention to Build.

21. The owner or ocenpier of any land supplied with water within a Water Area who shall erect on make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on snch land shall, before the commencement of same, give notice thereof to the Board.

## Locking of Taps, etc.

22. The ocenpier of any premises to which tho water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no ocenpier, the owner, shall canse proper means to be taken, by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the Board, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not comnected with the said premises.

22A. No service pipe shall commonicate directly with any cistem, tank, or ressel intended or nsed for the reception of water other than water obtained from the Board's mains.

## Misuse of Water.

23. Any person entitled to a supply of water for domestic purposes only, or entitled only to a supply of water for any other specified purpose, shall not use such water for any other purpose exeept that specified.

## Illegal Taking or Selling Water.

24. Any person, whether entitled to receive water from the Board or not, shall not, without the written permission of the Boart, take, carry away, or allow to be taken or carried away, such water from his premises, or sell the same to any other person.

Turning Off when Repairing and Tapping.
25. The Board may from time to time when mecessary for the purpose of tapping and repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of a Water Area.

## Reward-Reporting Leakage.

26. The Board uar in its discretion adequately reward any person (not being the person in fanlt) who shall commmicate timely information to the Board of ally leakages or waste of water, whether the same be aceidental, negligently or wilfully oceasioned or suffered, or who shall give such information as shall lead to the comviction of any person or persons who shall steal or canse to be stolen or improperly appropriated the water of the Board.

## Waste of Water.

27. Any person supplied with water by the Board, whether by meter or otherwise, shall not allow the same to rin to waste.

## Fixing of Meters.

28. Auy officer appointed by the Board for the purpose may fix a meter on any service, and shall determine the size and class of meter in each case. Meters will be supplied by the Board and may be open or encased, at the discretion of the Board.

## Repairs and Maintenance of the Meters.

29. Aur person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Board shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his elatrge. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Board, and the expenses incurred by the Board in so doing shall on demand be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and, if not paid on demand, shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

## Notice of Damage or Non-Registration of Meter shall be given.

30. Any persou supplied by the Board with water throngh a meter slaill, on fluding that meter is danaged or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the Office of the Board.

## Interference with Meters.

31. Auy person shall not break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on the meter through which water is supplied by the Board, or turu or attempt to turn auy serew, bolt, or mut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or introduce or atteupt to introduce any boly or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with ally portion of such meter, or any pipe or fittings at. tached thereto.

Period for Reading.
32. The quantity registered by a meter at ally time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

## Averaging of Consumptious.

33. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the comsumption of water, the Board, or any officer appointed by the Board, may at his option estimate the qualutity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity of water consumed fiming such previous periods, as the Board may determine, and the quantity so ascertained will be paid for by the consumer.

## Testing of Meters.

34. If any consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and be a lesiroms of having the meter tested, he shall give witten notice thereof to the Board or its officer within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the sairl meter shall be tested by passing though it a predetermined quantity of water, and if upou such testing it slall appear to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer that the meter registered more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that shall actually pass through it at such testing, then the Board shall bear the expense of and ineidental to such testing, and shall
also adjust the charge to the said consumer; but if the meter upon such testing shall not register more than five per cent. in excess of the quantity that slall actually pass through it, then the cousumer shall pay to the Board all the expenses of and incidental to such testing: providing that the expense of every test shall be fixed by the Board, subject to a minimum clarge of ten shillings for each test: provided also, that the consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the riglt to test the registration of the meter for any perion other than the period of registration next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid.

## Authority to Enter Premises.

35. Auy officer actiug under the Board's authority may at all reasomable times enter any honse or premises commected or intended to be comected with the water mains, in order to examine whether the water pipes and fittings in such house or premises are in proper order. Any person refusing such admission or in any way hindering suelt officer in the execution of his duty shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter prescribed.

## Gratuities Prohibited.

36. Officers, workmen, or agents of the Board slatl not solicit or receive auy fee or gratuity whatever.

## Standard Drawings and Fittings.

37. Approved standard fittings and type drawings will be exhibited at the Board's office. Due consideration will be given by the Board to the claims of any other fittings which may be presented for approval, and, if considered satisfactory, the same may be placed among aud become one of the approved standard fittings. The Board may from time to time amend, alter, or cancel aluy or all of the standard fittings or drawings, and replace them by sueh other fittings or drawings as they may approve of.

## Junction or Interference with Pipes or Fittings.

38. Any person slall not make any conncetion or interfere with any pipe or fittings of the Board, or with any water pipe or fittings commmicating therewith, at amy other place thatu shall be approved of by the Board, and the mains shall only he tapped by the workmen of the Board.

## Iuspection of Works.

39. Work shall not be mudertaken in comection with water supply, or in the extension or alteration thereof, mutil such time as the necessary printed permit is obtained. Thwo days' motice shall in all cases be given by the licensed plumber before work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer of the Board duly appointed to issue permits expressly aceepts shorter notice. In no case shall auy water pipes or apparatus in comection with water supply be used until the satid work shall have been and, if necessary, tested by the said officer and certified by him on the prescribed form No under* ground or enclosed work shall be covered up or concealed from view until the :ame shall have been duly inspected and passed by the inspector, and for this purpose the person to whom the permit has been issued shall inmediately report any work which is reaty for inspection or test, and every facility shall be afforded to such officer for makiug such inspection or test.

## Division V .

## Rates and Charges.

## Rating.

40. (a) With the Yarloop Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding three shillings in the pound per anmm upon the net ammal value of all rateable land: provided that a minimum rate of not exceediug one pound per anum shall be parable on each separately assessed piece of land.
(b) The Board maty allow a discomut of not exeeding twenty per cent. per anmon upon any rates paid within three months of the date upon which such rates become payable, but such disconnt shall not apply to minimun rates and fees which shall be paid iu full.
(c) In making rates a distinction may be made between occupied and racaut land, and, in the event of a dispute as to whether or not land shall be regarded as vacant, the decision of the Board shall be final in every ease.

## Rates-How Payable.

41. Rates shall become due and payable yearly in advance on the first day of Jamary. Provided that, in :lll cases where a rate is made after the first day of Jamary in any year, the notice of the order for making and levying of such rate, published in the Government Gazette and a newspaper, as provided by section 94 of the s:id Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rates shall be dine and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of suclı notice.

## Allowance for Rate.

42. Subject to the provisions of these by-laws every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed piece of land of which he is the owner or occupier which, if calcnlated at the price specified in the Schedule I. liereto as being that at which water is supplied in return for the rate in the area in which such property is situated would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on each property: provided that such water is taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

## Payment for Excess Water.

43. Every ratepaying consumer taking water in cxcess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate shall pay for the excess in accordance with prices set forth in the Scliedule I. hereto.

## Fees-State or Commonwealth Goverument. Department.

44. For each water service for purpose of any State or Comnonwealth Department there shall be payable, as a minimam :mman fee in lieu of water rate, the sum of not less than one pound (fl), when the service is metered, and of not less than two pounds five shillings ( $£ 2$ 5s.), when the service is non-metered.

It slall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not a meter slanll be fixed in each case.

This by-law slall not apply to water for railway purposes.

## Fees for additional Services.

45. In any case where the owner or occupier of any separate piece of land requires more than one service to be installed for supplying water to such land, such additional service or services shall, at the discretion of the Board, be installed on such occupier or owner paying in advance the cost of installation, and a fee of not less than one pound per anmm, in addition to meter rent, for each additional service. In return for such fee an equivalent quantity of water will be given in each year, in the same way as water is given in return for water rates.

## Meter Rates.

46. Every person supplied with water by measure slanl pay meter rent in adrance, according to the following seale:-


Recomnection Fee.
47. In every case in which the snpply of water slatl liave been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other clarges, or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the ocenpier or owner, or
when, in the opinion of the Board or local officer necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reasons, a minimm fee of five shillings slall be charged for discomection and reconnection: provided that, where the cost exceeds the minimm fee, the actual cost of discomection and reconnection, as determiner by the Board, shall be charged, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier tor the time being, on demand. The service shall not be restored mitil such foe has been paid.

## Private Fire Services.

48. Private fire service will be allowed, but every such service slall be sealed, except in cases where the Board may decide that sealing is unnecessary. For each such service there shall be paid the actual cost of installation, and a fee equivalent to five per centrm on cost per anum shall be paid in advance as rental, subject to a minimum fee for each service of ten shillings per ammon. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion, except for extinction of fire. Tn the event of the seal laving been broken in case of fire or by accident, or otherwise, the occupier slall give notice and pay the cost of resealing.

## Building Tees.

49. Where water is required for building purposes the Board may permit the supply thereof at prices as set forth in Scledule I. hereto and on the following terins:-
(a) The aforementioned prices shall apply only to water supplied to buildings intended for use as ordinary dwellings.
(b) In the case of buildings other than ordinary dwellings, the snpply shall be on snch terms as may be agreed upon by the Board, subject to a minimum fee of one pound for each service.
(c) All fees sliall be paid in advance. If any work is done other than mentioned at the time of applying to the Board, the same slall be paid for in advance, or the whole supply will be forthwith ent ofl.
(d) It shall be at the discretion of the Board as to whether or not in any case a supply of water shall be classed as a supply for building purposes and as to whether or not the supply shall be measured by meter.
(e) Applications for water under this by-law slatl be in writing, stating the nature of the work to be done and the purpose for which water is required.

## When Accounts Due and Pay:able.

50. Where water is supplied by me:asure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated moder the Act or otherwise, payment for same shall become dne and payable within fonteen days after due service of the accomut, muless otherwise agreed upon.

## Division VI.

51. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws to which no specific penalty is attached, or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such by-law, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, slall, npon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and, in case of continming offence, a finther penalty not exceeding five pounds for each day after notice of such offence shall have been given by the Board to sueh offender.

By-law re Offensive Noises.
P.W. 662/38.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Mmicipal Corporations Act, 1906-38, the Mayor and Councillors of the Mmicipality of Kalgoorlie hereby make a by-law, to be mmbered 133, as follows:-

1. In this by-law "Offensive noise" means any noise, whether made by the hmman voice or by any gramophone amplifier, wireless appliance, bell or other instrument or appliance which causes or is likely to cause a misance or inconvenience in the nature of a nuisance to oceupier of neighbouring premises, or to persons using any street or publie place.
2. No person shall on any land or on or in any building canse or permit to be caused any offensive noise for advertisement purposes.
3. No person shall in any street, way, or public place cause any offensive noise for advertisement purposes.
4. No person shall, without the written permission of the Town Clerk, address the public in any street, way, or public place for advertisement purposes, and whether such person shall be in a street, way, or pubic place or on premises adjacent thereto.

## No. 5 of 1939

Between the Totel, Chub, Caterers, Tearoom, and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and J. H. Glowrey, S. W. Paxton, and G. Hack, proprietors of hotels licensed to sel fermented and spirituous liquors, Respondents.
WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the aborenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was refered into Court for the purpose of learing and determination: And whoreas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested that the Agreement, a memorandum of which is hereto annexed, be made an Award of the Conrt: And whereas the said Agreement has been eertified by me pursuant to section 63 (2) of the Act and duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Court, which said Agreement, pursuant to section 63, shall hare the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:-

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

(Note:-Wherever the word "Award"' oceurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.')
1.-Area.

This Award sliall have effect over the area comprised within a radins of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.
2.-Term.

This Award shatl come into operation on the first day of April, 1940, and remain in force for a term of three (3) years.
3.-Hours.
(a) Porty-four hours shall constitute a week's work
(b) If a worker is at liberty to leave the premises of the employer for any time, being not less than half an homr, but elects to remain thereon, the time he remains on the premises shall not be included in his or her working time.

## 4.-Spread of Shift.

(a) Daily spread of shift shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's starting time to the worker's finishing time for the day.
(b) Weekly spread of shift shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.
(c) The weekly spread of slafts shall not exceed seventr-eight hours.
(d) Subject to clause 10 , the longest spread of shift in any one day shall not exceed thirteen (13) hours.

## 5.-Breaks in Shift.

In addition to breaks of at least half an hour, but not more than one hour each for meals, there may be a break of at least two hours during each shift. Such break of at least two hours may include a meal break.
6.-Night Work.

Except for night porters, any work done after 12 0 'elock midnigit and before 5 o'elock a.m. shall be paid at treble time rates in the case of females and time and a half in the case of male workers.

## 7.-Wages.

The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to workers per week:-


## 10.-Orertime.

All work done outside the daily spread provided in clause 4 , or beyond eight hours in any one day, or beyond forty-four hours in any one week, shall be deemed to be overtime.

Overtine shall be paid for at the rate of one-third in addition to the ordinary rate herein prescribed: prorided that any overtime in excess of seven hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

## 11.-Holidays.

All workers (other than night porters) shall be entitled to receire one full day off duty in each week: provided always, that in the case of an employer employ. hag not more than three (3) workers under the provisions of this Award, two half days may be granted by agrement between the employer and the worker in lieu of one full day. If no agrecment can be reached as to whether two half days in lien of one full day off shall be allowed, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.
The half day off shall, if taken in the morning, terminate at 2 p.m., and, if taken in the afternoon, shall commence at 2 p.m. A worker shall not be required to work more than four (4) hours on the day on which his hatf day off occurs.
Night porters:-Night porters shall be entitled to one night off duty in each week: provided that, if work is performed by a night porter in lieu of his night off, he shall be paid one-third, in addition to his ordinary wage, for that night. This provision shall not be arailed of more than on six nights in any one year. Any dispute arising out of this provision shall be referred to the Board of Reference.
All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

## 12.-Ammal Holiday.

On completion of twelve (12) months' service each worker shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' holiday on full pay without any deduction for board and/or lodging.

The amual holiday shall be granted within three (3) months of its beeoning due.

Provided that any worker who shall have served one month or over, and whose contract of service shall hare been terminated by either party for any cause other than misconduct before the annual holiday became due, such worker shall be entitled to receive a proportionate allowance of holiday paty for the time actually served.

A worker dismissed for misconduct slall forfeit all right to holiday pay under this clanse.

Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with the provisions of clanse 27, shall not count for the parpose of determining his right to holidays.
13.-Meals.
(a) Where full bourd is provided, workers shall be provided with three meals per day, such as are daily served in ordinary fimily hotels. Such meals shall include a dinner consisting of at least three courses.
(b) Subject to clause 5, at least one half hour but not more thin one hour, shall be allowed for each meal.
14.-Casual Workers.
(a) A casual worker shall mean a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service.
(b) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.
(c) Casual workers shall not be engaged for less than three (3) hours.

## 15.-Climbing Ladders.

No waitress shall be permitted or compelled to climb latders for the purpose of eleaning electric fans, fanlights, walls, or windows.
16.-Roster.
(a) A roster of the working hours shall be exhibited in the office of each establishment and in such other place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned.
(b) Such roster shall denote the hours to be worked by cach worker, and shall be open for inspection by a
duly aceredited representative of the Union in the office, at such time and place as the Record Book is so open for inspection.
(c) Such roster shall be drawn up in such manner as to show the hours of each worker for one week in advance of the date of the roster, and may only be altered on account of the sickness or absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee.
17.-Weekly Wage.

Wages shall be paid, at least, weekly,
Except for casual workers, the contract of service shall be on a weekly basis: provided, that one day's notice of termination of service may be given on either side.
(1) Females:
(a) Where board is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker the fol lowing amount:-

(b) Where lodging is provided, the employer shall be cutitled to deduct from the wages of the worker the following amount:-
(i) Within a 15 -mile radins of the G.P.O., Perth .. .. .. .. .. $\quad 7$
(ii) Outside a 15 -mile but within a $20-$ mile radius of the G.P.O., Pertli $\quad \geq$
(c) Where a worker notifies the employer on the day immediately preceding her day off or half day off, as the case may be, that she does not dosire a meal or meals to be provided on such day off or half day off, the foregoing deductions for board shall be reduced by a proportionate anount for each such meal.
(2) Males (other than night porters and kitehen staff):
(a) Boarding and/or lodging on the licensed premises of the employer slatl be prohibited, unless by agrecment between the employer and the Union, or, failing such agreement, by permission of the Board of Reference.
(b) Where by agreement or by decision of the Board of Reference:-
(i) lodging is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wiges of the worker $7 / 31 / 2 \mathrm{~d}$. per week within a radius of 15 miles of the Gencral Post Office, Perth, and $7 / 4 d$. per week outside a radins of 15 miles but within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office, Perth;
(ii) board is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker $16 / \overline{5}$, per week within a radius of 15 miles of the General Post Office, Perth, and $16 / 71 / 2 \mathrm{~d}$. per week outside a 15 -mile but within a 20 -mile radius of the General Post Office, Pertll.
(3) Male Kitclen Staff:
(a) Lodging on the licensed premises of the employer shall be prohibited, unless by agreement between the employer aud the Union, or, failing such agreement, by permission of the Board of Reference.
(b) Where by agreement or by decision of the Board of Reference:-
lodging is provided, the employer may deduct from the wages of the worker the amome shown in subclause (2) (b) (i) of this clause.
(c) Where board is provided, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker the amount set out in subclanse (2) (b) (ii) of this clause.
(d) Where a worker notifies the employer on the day immediately preceding his day off or half day off, as the case may be, that he does not desire a meal or meals to be provided on such day off or half day off, the deduction for bourd shall be reduced by a proportionate amount for each such meal.
(4) Male night porters:
(a) Lodging on the lieconsed premises of the employer shall be prohibited, unless by agreement between the employer and the Union, or, failing such agreement, by permission of the Board of Reference.
(b) Where by agreement or by decision of the Board of Reference lodging is provided, the employer may deluct from the wages of the worker the anount shown in subclause (2) (b) (i) of this elause.
(e) Where meals are provided by the employer, a deduction proportionate to the amount shown in subclause (2) (b) (ii) of this clause may be made from the wages of the worker for each meal provided. In no case shall the employer be entitled to deduct for more than two meals provided in any one day
(5) The board and lodging allowances prescribed by this clause shall vary proportionately with the rise or fall in the basic wage.

## 19.-Accommodation.

(a) An employer requiring a worker to slecp in shall provide suitable accommodation. If the worker shall cousider the accommodation unsuitable, any party to this Award may refer the matter to the Board of Reference for decision, as provided in clause 29.
(b) Workers sleeping in shall be provided with a common sitting-room, apart from their bedrooms, and shall have access to a properly equipped bathroom.

## 20.--Landering.

If an employer requires female employees to wear stiff white cuffs, collars, or white aprons, he shall pay to such employees the sum of one shilling (1s.) per week for the laundering of the same; otherwise he shall cause the same to be laundered at his own expense.

If an employer requires white coats to be worn by his male employees, he shall pay them one shilling (1s.) per week extra for the laundering of the same, or cause such white coats to be lanndered at his own expense.

## 21.-Bar Work.

Any worker, other than a night porter, who performs the dinties of a barman, that is, actually dispensing drimks across the bar, shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of sixpence ( 6 d. .) per hour in addition to his prescribed rate of wage for the time so employed.

## 22.-Hearl Bands.

The employer nay require plain white head bands to be worn by female employees.

## 23.-Change and Rest Room,

Adequate Change and Rest Rooms shall be provided by the cmployer, in cases where the cmployees do not reside on the premises.

> 24.-Under-rate Workers.
(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is mable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid snelt lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the cmployer.
(b) In the eveut of no agrecment being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

## 25.-Record.

(a) The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, at his business premises, or at each of then, if more thau one, a Time and Wages Book, wherein shall be entered the name and oceupation of each worker, and, in the case of jumior workers, the age on his last birthday, the time each worker commences and finishes work each day, and the total hours worked each weck, and the wages paid to each worker.
(b) The record shall be entered up from day to day.
(c) The word "book," for the purpose of this clause, shall include loose leaves, if bound together and num bered consecutively.
(d) The employer and the worker shath be severatly responsible for the proper daty entering of the record, which shall be intialed, if correct, by the worker, daily.

The hon's shown as worked in the Record Book shall be prima facie evidence of the correctness thereof in any proceedings for the enforeement of this Award.
(e) The book shall be open to inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Union, at the office of the employer, on days other than Saturday and Sunday between the hours of $9 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and $5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. (except from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.).
26.--Higher Duties.

Any worker performing work for more than two homs in any day in work carrying a higher preseribed rate of wages than that in which he is engaged shall receive such higher wage for the time so employed.

## 27.-Payment for Sickness.

A worker shali be entitled to payment for non attendance, on the gromd of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence throngh such ill-health shall bo limited to six days in eachi calendar year. Payment heremoder may be adjusted at the end of cach calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness ocemred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation moder the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be cutitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost thongh the result of an accident not arising ont of or in the conrse of his employment, or for any accident, wherever snstained, arising out of his own wilful defanlt or for sickness arising out of lis own wilful defanlt.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clanse unless he prodnces proof satisfactory to his suployer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

## 28.- Jmior Worker's Certificate.

Junion workers, upon being engaged shall, if requiv $d$, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-(1) Name in full; (2) age and date of birth; (3) name of each previous employer; (4) class of worls performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be indorsed on the eertificate and signed by the employer, npon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate.

## 29.--Board of Reference.

The Cont hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference.
The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court, and two other representatives, one to be appointed by each of the parties.
The Board is herely assigned the following functions, in the event of a disagreement between the parties bomd by the Award:-
(i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award, but so as not to contravene any of the provisions herein;
(ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
The provisions of regnlation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed herennder.

## 30.-No Victimisation.

No employer shall dismiss any worker from his enployment or injure him in his employment, or alter his position to lis prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the worker is a member of the Hotel, Club, Caterers', Tearoom and Restanant Employees' Indus-
trial Union of Workers, or by reason of the fact that snch worker is entitled to all the benefits of this Award.

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note:-Wherever the word "Award"' oceurs herein it shall be taken to mean and inclnde "Agreement.'')
1.-Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radins of 20 miles from the General Post Office Perth.
2.-Term.

This Award shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1940, and remain in force for a term of three (3) years.

## 3.-Hours.

(a) Forty-fon hours shall constitnte a week's work.
(b) If a worker is at liberty to leave the premises of the employer for any time, being not less than half an hour, but elects to remain thereon, the time he remains on the premises shall not be inchnded in his or her working time.
4.-Spre:ad of Shift.
(a) Daily spread of shift shall mean the time which elapses from the worker's starting time to the worker's finishing time for the day.
(b) Weekly spread of shift shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spreads for a week.
(c) The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed seventy-eiglit hours.
(d) Snbject to clanse 10 , the longest spread of shift in any one day shall not exceed thirteen (13) hours.

## 5.-Breaks in Shift.

In addition to breaks of at least half an homr, but not more than one hour each for meals, there may be a break of at least two hours during each shift. Such break of at least two homs may include a meal break.

## 6.-Night Work.

Except for night porters, any work done after 12 o'clock midnight and before 5 o'elock a.m. shall be paid at treble time rates in the case of females and time and a half in the case of male workers.

## 7.-Wages.

The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable to workers per week:-


## 8.-Definitions.

"Waiter" shall mean a worker who serves at table and attends to all the requirements of guests while haring meals.

For the purpose of this Award, "Coffee palace"" means a residential establishment, not being an hotel licensed to sell fermented or spirituons hquors nor a boarding-house, where (in addition to permanent or weekly boarders and/or lodgers, or where permanent or weekly boarders and/or lodgers are not necessarily catered for) boarders and/or lodgers are catered for, for pay or reward, for a period of less than (1) week at a time, or where, in addition to eatering for lodgers, whether permanent or otherwise, a dining room is maintained which is open to the public.

Provided that the term "Coffee palace" shall not inchde an establishment where not more than eight (8) boarders and/or lodgers, not being members of the proprictor's family, are received for pay or reward and which has no public dining room but such establishment shall be deened to be a boarding-honse for the purposes of Award No. 16 of 1931.

## 9.-Thnior Workers.

(a) Mate workers:

Male workers muder the age of twenty-one (21) years may be employed as junior workers in any of the occupations covered by this Award, in the proportion of one junior to every two or fraction of two adnlt workers employed in the same ocenpation, at the following rates:-

Percentage of Male Basic Wage per Week.
Between 18 and 19 years of age.. 55
Between 19 and 20 years of age . 75
Between 20 and 21 years of age . . 90
Provided that, where no adnlt is employed, one junior mate may be employed, except in the kitchen.

## (b) Female workers:

Female workers under the age of nineteen (19) years may be employed as jmior workers in any of the occupations covered by this Award, in the pro-
partion of one junior to every two or fraction of two adult workers employed in the same ocenpation, at the following rates, in addition to boatd and lodging:-

Basie Wage per Week.
Under 18 years of age 34
Between 18 and 19 years of age 45
At 19 years of age
Full adult rate.
Provided, that where no adult is employed, one jmior female may be employed.

## 10--Orertime.

All work done ontsite the daily spread provided in clanse 4 , or beyond eight homs in any one day, or beyond forty-four hons in any one week, shall be deemed to be overtime.

Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of one-third in addition to the ordinary rate herein preseribed: Provided that any overtime in exeess of seven hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

## 11.--Molidays.

All workers (other than night porters) shall be entitled to receive one finll day off dity in each week: Provided always, that in the ease of an employer employing not more than three (3) workers under the provisions of this Award, two half dalys may be granted by agreement between the employer and the worker in lieu of one full day. If no agreement can be reached as to whether two half clays in lien of one full day off shall be allowed, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

The half day off shall, if taken in the morning, terminate at 2 p.m., and, if taken in the afternoon, shall commenee at 2 p.m. A worker shall not be required to work more than four (4) hours on the day on which his half day off ocenrs.

Night porters.-Night porters shall be entitled to one night off duty in each week: Plovided that, if work is performed by a night porter, in heu of his night off, he shall be paid one-third, in addition to his ordinary wage, for that night. This provision shall not be availed of more than on six nights in any one year. Any dispnte arising out of this provision shath be referred to the Board of Reference.
All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

## 12.-Anmal Holiday.

On completion of twelve (12) months' service each worker shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' holiday on full pay, withont any deduction for board and/or lodging.
The ammal holiday shall be granted within three (3) months of its becoming due.

Provided that, any worker who shall have served one month or over, and whose eontract of service shall have been terminated by either party for any canse other than misconduct before the ammal holiday became dne, such worker shall be entitled to receive a proportionate allowance of holiday pay for the time actually served.

A worker dismissed for misconduct shall forfeit all right to holiday pay under this clause.

Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is eutitled to claim sick pay in accordance with the provisions of clause 26 , shall not count for the propose of determining his right to holidays.
13.-Meals.
(a) Where finll board is provided, workers shall be provided with three meals per day, such as are usually served in ordinary coffee palaces. Such meals shall inchide a dinner consisting of at least three courses.
(b) Snbject to clause 5 , at least one half hour but not more than one hour, shall be allowed for each meal.
14.-Casial Workers.
(a) A casual worker shall mean a worker engaged on ain hourly contract of service.
(b) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.
(c) Casual workers shall not be engaged for less than three (3) honrs.

## 15.-Climbing Liadders.

No waitress shall be permitted or compelled to climb ladders for the purpose of cleaning electric fans, fanlights, walls, or windows.

## 16.--Roster.

(a) A roster of the working liours slatl be exhibited in the office of each establishment and in sneh other place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned.
(b) Such roster shall denote the hours to be worked by each worker, and slall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Uuion in the office, at such time and place as the Record Book is so open for inspection.
(c) Such roster shall be drawn up in such manmer as to slow the hours of cach worker for one week in advance of the date of the roster, and may only be altered on account of the sickness or absence of a worker, or on acconnt of any contingeney that the employer conld not reasomably foresce.
17.-Weekly Wage.

Wages shall be paid, at least, weekly.
Except for casual workers, the contract of service shall be on a weekly basis, provided: that one day's notice of termination of service may be given on either side.

## 18.-Board nard Lodging

(1) Fenales:
(a) Where board is provided, the employer shall be eutitled to deduct from the wages of the worker the following amount:-

## 25.-Higher Duties.

Any worker performing work for more than two hours in any day in work carrying a ligher prescribed rate of wages than tlat in which le is engaged shall receive such higher wage for the time so employed.

## 26.-Payment for Sicknes-

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attend ance on the ground of personal ill-health, for one halt day for each completed month of service: provided that, payment for absence though such ill-liealth shall be limited to six days in each calendar year. Payment heremuder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer. in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clanse shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising ont of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising ont of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clanse unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate wuless the absence is for three days or more.

## 27.-Tunior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-(1) Name in full; (2) age and date of birtli: (3) name of each previous employer: (4) class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request of the worker.
No worker shall have any claim upon an eniployer for additional pay, in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate.

## 28.-Board of Reference.

The Conrt hereby appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference.
The Board shall consist of a chairman, to be appointed by the Court, and two other representatives, one to be appointed by each of the parties.

The Board is hereby assigned the following functions, in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by the Award:-
