### Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939.

#### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

Agric. 3417/13.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939, that the Governor may, by notice published in the Government Gazette, declare any plant to be a noxious weed, either generally or in any locality defined in the notice, and may from time to time alter or revoke any such declaration: And whereas by a Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 25th day of October, 1935, the Governor declared the plant known as Boxthorn to be a noxins weed in the locality defined in the Schedule to the Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed desirable to amend the said locality and to revoke the said Proelamation accord-ingly: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, ingly: Now, therefore 1, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Excentive Conucil and in accordance with the powers conferred by section 4 of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1924-1939, do hereby revoke the aforesaid Proclamation published in the *Government Gasette* on the 25th day of October, 1935, and do hereby declare that the plant known as Boxthorn shall be a noxious weed in the locality de-fund in the Soledule hereuwder. fined in the Schedule hereunder.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the seashore situate in prolongation easterly on the northern alignment of Gladstone street, in Esperance Townsite, and extending westerly to and along the said alignment to a point situate in prolonga-tion north-easterly of the north-western alignment of Windieh street; thence south-westerly to and along the latter alignment to the northern alignment of Andrew street; thence westerly along the said alignment of Andrew street and onwards to the south-eastern corner of Lot 114 of East Location 23; thence southerly to

and along the western alignment of Jane street to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern alignment of Hardy street; thence easterly to and along the said alignment of Hardy street and onwards to the seashore aforesaid, and thence generally northerly and north-easterly along said seashore to the starting point.

INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1937-1939.

#### Income Tax-Notice to make Returns.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, and the regulations thereunder, I hereby require returns of all income derived during the year of income ended 30th June, 1940 (or the accounting period, if any, adopted under the Act in lien of that year), to be furnished to me at the Office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth, in such of the forms provided for the purpose as is applicable, containing the information and particulars mentioned or referred to in the form and verified by declaration as therein set forth, and accompanied by all such balancesheets, profit and loss accounts, statements and other documents as are mentioned in the form or as are requisite, on or before the dates hereinafter stated.

- On or before the 31st July, 1940:---
  - (a) By every person resident in Western Anstralia who is not married, i.e., hachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and by every married woman whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was not less than £100, and by every married man resident in Western Anstralia whose total income from all sources was not less than £200, derived exclusively under one or more of the following headings, viz., remnneration as an employee, stipend, interest, annities, dividends from any company, whether incorporated in the State or not, and whether paid out of income derived from sources in or ontside the State, or any other sources (not being a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term).
- On or before the 31st August, 1940:-
  - (b) By every person resident in Western Australia who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divoreed person, and by every married woman whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was not less than £100, and by every married man resident in Western Anstralia whose total income from all sources was not less than £200, derived wholly or partly from a source which is a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term, including a professional business;
  - (c) By every company deriving income in Western Anstralia whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was £1 or more;
  - (d) By every non-resident person whose total income derived from all sources in Western Australia was £1 or more.

Every person or institution holding money lodged at interest in Western Australia is hereby required to furnish a statement showing the names and addresses of depositors to each of whom interest in excess of £50 was paid or credited during the year ended 30th June, 1940, and the amount of interest paid or credited to each.

A return of the total income of every partnership is hereby required to be furnished by the partners resident in Western Anstralia or by any one of them. Where there is no partner resident in Western Anstralia the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Western Australia for the partnership. Each individual partner who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and every married woman whose total income from all sources was not less than  $\pm 100$ , and every married man whose total income from all sources was not less than  $\pm 200$  is also required to furnish a return.

A return of the total income derived in Western Australia by every trust is hereby required to be furnished by the trustees resident in Western Anstralia or by any one of them. Where there is no trustee resident in Western Anstralia, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Western Anstralia for the trustees.

Every owner or charterer of ships whose principal place of business is out of Australia, who had amounts paid or payable to him in respect of the carriage of passengers, livestock, mails, or goods shipped in Western Australia is hereby required to make and furnish a return of the amount so paid or payable.

Every agent for a principal, whether resident or nonresident, is hereby required to furnish a return demanded of his principals.

Every company is hereby required to furnish, in addition to the return of income, separate statements to accompany the return showing:---

- (a) the names and addresses of all shareholders and the amount of dividend (if any) paid to each shareholder during the year ended the 30th June, 1940;
- (b) the names and addresses of all persons to whom interest in excess of £50 was paid or credited during the year preceding the year of tax and the amount so paid or credited to each person during the year ended the 30th June, 1940;
- (c) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the year ended the 30th June, 1940, to depositors and debenture holders, who are not residents of Anstralia, on money secured by debentures of the company and used in Western Australia or used in acquiring assets for use or disposal in Western Australia, and on money lodged at interest in Western Anstralia with the company, after deducting (unless the Commissioner otherwise directs) interest paid or credited to a company not a resident of Australia but which has a public officer duly appointed under the Act;
- (d) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the year of income, in respect of debentures payable to bearer, the names and addresses of the holders of which are not supplied to the Commissioner by the company;
- (e) the names and addresses of all holders of debentures payable to bearer which the company is in a position to furnish (whether residents or non-residents), together with the amount of interest paid or credited during the year ended the 30th June, 1940, to each of such holders of debentures.

Every employer of labour is hereby required to furnish on or before the 31st August, 1940, a statement showing:---

- (a) the names and addresses of all persons employed by him during the year ended the 30th June, 1940;
- (b) the capacity in which each person was employed;
- (c) the total amount of remnneration earned by each person during that period;
- (d) the value of board, residence, or other allowance made to each person during that period.

The statement is required to show the actual amount earned during the period from 1st July, 1939, to 30th June, 1940, even though the employer's return is made up for a different period. Remuneration to persons at a rate less than £100 per annum should be shown in one total. The attention of all persons is drawn to the fact that all the returns and statements required by the foregoing notice to be furnished to the Commissioner are returns under the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, and are required to be furnished when called for. Failure to duly furnish them renders the persons concerned liable to a penalty, fixed by section 192 (1) of the Act, viz., a penalty not less than £2 nor more than £100, as may be determined by a Court of competent jurisdiction.

The returns as required above shall, where the person is also liable to furnish returns under the Commonwealth Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936-1940, be in a combined form for Commonwealth and State purposes.

# LAND AND INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1907-1936.

### Land Tax-Notice to make Returns.

NOTICE is hereby given that every person who was at noon on the 30th day of June, 1940, the owner within the meaning of the said Act, of any land whatsoever in Western Anstralia, and who is liable to Land Tax, is hereby required to make and furnish to me, at the Office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth, on or before the 31st day of Angust, 1940, a Land Tax return in the prescribed form.

Penalty for not furnishing a return-Not less than £2 nor more than £100.

Penalty for making a false return—Not less than  $\pounds 2$  nor more than  $\pounds 100$  and treble tax.

## Notice to Make Returns.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1937, and the regulations thereunder, I hereby require returns from persons liable to taxation under the said Act, personally or in any representative capacity, of all income derived during the year ended the 30th June, 1940, to be furnished on the prescribed form to me at the Office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth.

On or before the 31st August, 1940:-

(a) By every person who has not furnished an Income Tax return under the provisions of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1939, and whose gross income from all sources, other than from salary or wages, during the year mentioned was not less than £52.

The attention of all persons is drawn to the fact that the returns required by the foregoing notice to be furnished to the Commissioner of Taxation are returns under the Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1937, and are required to be furnished when called for.

Failure to furnish these returns renders the persons concerned liable to the penalties fixed by section 18 of the Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1937, viz., penalty for the first offence £20; for any subsequent offence £100, as may be determined by a Court of competent jurisdiction.

#### No. 18 of 1939

Between the Eastern Goldfields Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Work-ers, Applicant, and John Adams and others, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:---

### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note.-Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

#### 1.---Scope.

This Award shall apply to the industries conducted by respondents and similar industries conducted by other persons, firms, or companies in respect of workers following the vocations mentioned herein; provided always, that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, to which another industrial Union of workers is a party.

#### 2.-Area.

This Award shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, Kalgoorlie.

#### 3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date hereof, subject to the rights of the parties pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

#### 4.-Definitions.

(a) 'Shop assistant'' shall mean a worker employed receiving and/or selling and/or assembling or preparing goods for sale or delivery. The term 'Shop assistant'' shall include cashiers and storemen.

(b) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that a casual hand may be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one day. A worker engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate.

(c) "Adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.

(d) The term "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminated by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided always, that any worker employed for a period of four (4) consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where the services of a worker employed as a weekly hand have been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any cause referred to in clause 15 hereof.

(e) "Wholesale establishments" shall mean any warehouse or place where goods are exclusively or principally sold for resale and/or where goods are sold for consumption and/or use in another business.

Any worker employed in a chemist shop shall be subject to the terms of this Award up to the time he or she becomes indentured to the profession.

#### 6.-Hours.

Except as provided hereunder the ordinary hours of work shall be as follows:---

(a) Forty-six (46) hours shall constitute a week's work for males sixteen (16) years of age and over;

(b) Forty four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for females and for males under sixteen (16) years of age;

(c) Except as provided in subclauses (d) and (e) hereof the hours shall be performed as follows:---

- (i) Males sixteen (16) years of age and over:-Between 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. on five (5) days of the week, excluding Sunday, and between 8.30 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on the weekly half-holiday.
- (ii) Males under sixteen years of age and females:
   —Between 8.50 a.m. and 6 p.m. on five (5) days of the week, excluding Sunday, and between 8.50 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on the weekly half-holiday.

(d) The hours of workers employed in shops comprised in the Fourth Schedule of the Factories and Shops Act shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer: Provided that the worker shall be notified of the half-day (which shall be granted to and taken by the worker on an afternoon in each week), upon which his or her services shall not be required.

(e) The hours of workers employed in wholesale establishments shall be worked as follows:---

- (i) Between 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. on five (5) days of the week, excluding Sunday, and,
- (ii) Between 7.30 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on Saturday, which is the day upon which the half holiday in wholesale establishments shall be observed.

Provided that, if and when the Court prescribes a lesser number of hours for workers now provided for pursuant to Award No. 41 of 1936, this clause shall automatically be varied accordingly.

#### 7.-Meal Times.

(a) Shops (other than Fourth Schedule shops and wholesale establishments):—One hour shall be given and taken for meals; lunch hour shall be between 12 o'clock noon and 2.15 p.m.; tea hour shall start within forty-five (45) minutes after the prescribed finishing time.

(b) Fourth Schedule shops:—Meal hours in Fourth Schedule shops shall be taken at the times most convenient to the employer's business: Provided that one hour shall be given and taken for each meal and that not more than five (5) or less than three (3) hours' interval shall be worked without an interval for a meal being taken.

(c) The meal hours referred to in this clause shall be taken in one continuous period.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, the lunch hour for workers in retail establishments other than Fourth Schedule shops shall, during the first two (2) days of each of three (3) sales per annum and during Christmas week, be given and taken between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

#### 8.---Meal Money.

Workers who are subject to the starting and finishing times prescribed in clause 6(c) of this Award shall, if required to continue working for more than one half hour after the prescribed finishing time, be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money.

#### 9.—Overtime.

(a) Excepting as provided hereunder, all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. In the computation of overtime, each day shall stand by itself.

(b) Where overtime is worked in Fourth Schedule shops the worker shall be paid overtime as provided in subclause (a) after the prescribed weekly hours of work have been exceeded. Work performed on Sundays and/or prescribed holidaws shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) All time worked in establishments other than those referred to in subclause (b) hereof before the prescribed starting time or after the prescribed finishing time, shaft be paid for at overtime rates. Work performed in the afternoon of the day on which the weekly half-holiday is observed, on Sundays and/or prescribed holidays, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

#### 10 .- Holidays.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely:— New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzae Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Kalgoorlie or Boulder Cup Day.

(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing a year of service shall be granted pay in lien of holidays in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.

Provided that, when a worker is entitled to holidays under this subclause, he shall receive at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take his holidays.

(c) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

(d) A worker who is summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this clause.

(d) Where a canvasser or collector provides his own bicycle he shall be paid an allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week.

(e) Any person, whether a junior or adult, employed as a canvasser and/or collector, shall be paid the full adult minimum rate. This subclause shall not apply in cases where an adult canvasser is absent from his employment on account of sickness, accident, or the holidays to which such adult canvasser is entitled under this Award.

(f) Casual hands :--- Adult male and female workers shall be paid at the rate of threepence (3d.) per hour in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein.

Junior male and female workers shall be paid at the rate of one penny halfpenny (1½d.) per hour, in addi-tion to the ordinary rates prescribed herein.

#### 12 .--- No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

#### 13.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is classified at a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs, shall be entitled to pay-ment at the higher rate while so employed.

#### 14.-Proportion of Juniors.

(a) Where one adult is employed, two (2) juniors (a) where one addit is employed, two (2) juniors may be employed and where two (2) adults are em-ployed, three (3) juniors may be employed. Where more than two (2) adults are employed, one (1) junior to each adult may be employed.

(b) Where no male or female adult is employed, one (1) junior male or one junior female may be employed.

(c) Where one adult female is employed, two (2) junior females may be employed.

(d) Where two (2) adult females are employed, three (3) juniors may be employed.

(e) Where three (3) adult females are employed, four (4) juniors may be employed.

(f) Where four (4) adult females are employed, five (5) juniors may be employed and thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five (5) juniors to four (4) adult females.

#### 15.—Engagement

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an em-ployer at any time may dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not earry out his or her duties in the same manuer as he or she did prior to such notice.

#### 16 .- Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the waves paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday inclusive and shall be kept in the establishment or shop where the worker is usually employed.

#### 17.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other repre-sentatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of :-

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not speci-fically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such (b) Board in the manner and subject to the conditions pre-scribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 18 .- Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:--(i), name in full; (ii), age and date of birth.

(a) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(b) No worker shall have any claim upon the embeing wrongly stated on this certificate: Provided that months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to ob-tain proof of the junior worker's age.

#### 19 .--- Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attend-ance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be payment for absence through such in-heatin shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This places chall not apply where the worker is entitled to clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. The worker shall, if required by the employer, pro-

duce satisfactory proof of sickness.

#### 20.-Change Room.

Where an employer usually has more than six (6) workers engaged under the terms of this Award, he shall provide such workers with a suitable room for keeping their hats and clothing and for use as a room for taking their meals. Such room shall be situated within a reasonable distance of his place of business and shall be kept in a proper state of cleanliness.
