PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.]

WHEREAS by section 42 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, the Governor may by Proclamation, whenever in the interests of the natives he thinks fit, declare any municipal district or town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare portion of the Carnarvon Townsite, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain.

Schedule.

Portion of Carnarvon Townsite, being the area bounded by lines starting at the eastern corner of Lot 547 and extending south-westward along its southeastern boundary and the south-eastern boundary of Lot 551 to the southern corner of the latter, continuing south-westward to the south-eastern side of Richardson street at the north corner of Lot 238, and onward along said side of said street to its junction with the south-western side of West street; thence northwestward along said side of West street to the left bank of the Gascoyne river: thence northward along said bank of the river to the prolongation south-westward of the south-eastern side of Foss street: thence north-eastward to the north-west corner of Lot 393; thence eastward to the north-west corner of Lot 547 and onward along the northern and north-eastern boundaries

of said Lot 547 to the starting point. (Plan Carnarvon Townsite, Sheet 1.)

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938, that the Governor may from time to time, on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee as constituted by the said Act, by Proclamation fix minimum and maximum prices at which substances included in the definition of flour, or in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State by any person, and that the Governor may from time to time revoke or vary any Proclamation: And whereas the Governor, by a Proclamation issued and published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of March, 1940, fixed certain prices in relation to flour, bread, and other substances therein specified at which flour, bread and the other substances aforesaid might be sold by any person in the various parts of the State therein specified: And whereas it is now deemed necessary and expedient to vary the said Proclamation in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in accordance with the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Com-

mittee aforesaid, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby vary and amend the said Proclamation as issued and published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of March, 1940, as aforesaid in the manuer following, that is to say:

- (1) By deleting from paragraph 6 of the said Proclamation the whole of subparagraph (A) and inserting in lieu thereof new subparagraphs as follow:—

 - (b) In respect of sales of the goods specified in subparagraph (A1) of paragraph 6 hereof at Rottnest Island, in lieu of the various prices specified in the said subparagraph (A1) the prices shall be as follows:—

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, the Governor may make regulations as may be necessary or convenient for carrying out or giving effect to the provisions of the Act: And whereas regulations have been made under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of September, 1938, and the 12th day of May, 1939: And whereas it is deemed desirable to amend the said regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder, the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act.

Schedule.

- 1. Regulation "20" is renumbered "22."
- 2. New regulations are inserted after regulation 19, to stand as regulations "20" and "21," as follow:—

Statements by approved Insurance Offices.

- 20. (1) Every incorporated insurance office which prior to the date of commencement of this regulation has received, and every incorporated insurance office which shall hereafter receive, the approval of the Minister under the provisions of section 10 of the Act shall, within thirty days from the date of the commencement of this regulaof the Receipt of such approval, as the case may be, transmit to the Minister a statement in the Form L in the Appendix to these regulations showing the names, addresses, and occupations of each employer who had in force at such date a policy or contract of insurance with such insurance office against liability under this Act. Penalty ten pounds.
- (2) Every incorporated insurance office which prior to the date of commencement of this regulation has received the approval of the Minister shall, within fourteen days from the end of the first clear calendar month after the commencement of section 10A of the Act, and thereafter within fourteen days from the end of each succeeding calendar month, transmit to the Minister statements in the Forms M and N in the Appendix to these regulations showing the information required under section 10A of the Act in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) thereof. Penalty ten pounds.
- (3) Every incorporated insurance office which hereafter receives the approval of the Minister shall, within fourteen days from the end of the first clear calendar month after the date of such approval, and thereafter within fourteen days from the end of each succeeding calendar mouth, transmit to the Minister statements in the same forms and containing the same information as is prescribed in the preceding paragraph. The provisions of subsections (3), (4), and (5) of section 10A of the Act and the provisions of section 10B of the Act shall apply in all details to any matters or persons to which or whom the said subsections and the said section 10A are applicable, except that the penalty in any case shall not exceed ten pounds.
- (4) Any statement required to be submitted to the Minister under this regulation shall be forwarded to the office of the Chief Inspector of Factories, and any statement so forwarded shall be deemed to be addressed to the Minister for the purpose of this regulation.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT No. 10 of 1940. (Registered 17/6/1940.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this Twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty, between Swan Portland Cement, Limited (hereinafter called "the employer"), whose registered office is situate at Portland Honse, Rivervale, in the State of Western Australia, of the one part, and the Metropolitan and Sonthwestern Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of W.A., Perth (hereinafter called "the mion"), whose registered office is situate at Trades Hall, Perth, of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:-

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers covered in the Schedule of rates and engaged by the abovenamed Company.

3.—Term.

This Agreement shall take effect from the twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty, and shall continue in force for a period of three years.

4.-Hours of Work.

(a) Employees working three (3) shifts shall work eight (8) hours per day for the first five (5) days of the week, including crib time, and four (4) hours on Saturday: Provided that the foregoing hours may be altered at any time by agreement in writing between the parties.

the parties.

(b) Day shift workers shall work eight hours per day, exclusive of crib time, on the first five days of the week and four hours on Saturday.

(c) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in banking fires, and attending to boilers or engines, during meal (d) Drivers shall fire the boilers and maintain steam

on both the shore and floating cranes.

5.—Crib Time.

Crib time for shift workers shall be taken in relays, at such time as not to cause a stoppage of work, and no deduction shall be made therefor from the employees'

6.-Overtime and Holiday Rates.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Time and a half shall mean one half day's wages in addition to the prescribed minimum rate, or pro rata,

if there is more or less than a day.

if there is more or less than a day.

(c) All work done on Sundays by day workers shall be paid for at the rate of double time, and by shift workers at the rate of time and a half. All work performed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday or Labour Day, being the holidays specially mentioned in clause 7 hereof, shall be paid for at double time.

(d) Work done in the meal hour, or any portion thereof, shall be paid for at the rate of double time, but this shall not apply to cases involving completion of work commenced before the lunch hour and not occupying more than fifteen (15) minutes from the com-

mencement of the lunch hour, in which case the lunch hour shall be extended by fifteen minutes beyond the ordinary time. This subclause shall not apply to shift workers who are provided for under clause 5.

(e) Double time shall mean one (1) day's wages in addition to the prescribed minimum rate, or pro rata, if there is more or less than a day.

(f) Nothing in this Agreement shall entitle the worker working any overtime, either on week days or Sundays or holidays, to more than twice the ordinary rate of

7.—Holidays.

- (a) Twelve (12) paid holidays per annun shall be granted each worker after twelve (12) months' continuous service: Provided always, that New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or the days observed as such, shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays. The balance of the six (6) days shall be granted as annual leave at the convenience of the employer, but shall not be allowed to accumulate be allowed to accumulate.
- (b) In the event of a worker being employed for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holidays on full pay.
- (c) Except when employed subject to the conditions (c) Except when employed subject to the conditions of clause 6 (c) (Overtime), no worker shall be required to present himself for duty on any of the specially named holidays in subclause (a) hereof. 11.-Notice to Cease Work.

In the event of a breakdown of machinery, or an industrial dispute, the Company shall only be called upon to give employees one day's notice to cease work. In other instances the ordinary week's notice shall apply.

12.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance, on the ground of personal ill-health for one half (½) day for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such illhealth shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereinider may be adjusted at the end year. Fayment hereinider may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
