#### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

WHEREAS by the Constitution Act, 1889, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 25th day of July, 1940.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Constitution Act, 1889, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia to fix the time and place for the holding of the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: And whereas the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued until the 25th day of July, 1940: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that the Second Session of the Seventeenth Parliament shall be holden for

the despatch of business on Thursday, the 25th day of July, 1940, at the hour of 3 o'clock in the afternoon, in the House of Parliament, in the City of Perth; and Members of the Legislative Council and Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

### The Game Act, 1912-13.

#### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-

C.S.D. 1324/19.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-13, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus giganteus*: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation certain defined localities: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declaration contained

therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the 1st day of July, 1940, until the 30th day of September, 1940, inclusive.

Schedule.

- (1) The Dandarragan Road District;
- (2) All that part of the Gingin Road District lying to the west of the Midland Railway Line;
- (3) The Sussex Land District.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

## MEMORANDUM ABOVE REFERRED TO.

## 1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to casual workers employed handling explosives between the ship and the explosives magazines: Provided that it shall not apply to



workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

#### 2.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

#### 3.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date hereof.

#### 4.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday. No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday, and four (4) hours on Saturday, to be worked in one continuous shift.

#### 5.—Meal Times.

(a) One (1) hour shall be allowed for the luncheon meal, Monday to Friday, inclusive. Such hour shall be between 12 noon and 1 p.m.

(b) The meal hour referred to in this clause shall be taken in one continuous period.

#### 6.—Meal Money.

(a) All workers shall, if required to work after the usual finishing time from Monday to Friday, or after the usual finishing time on Saturday, be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for meal money: Provided that meal money shall not be payable where a worker continues to work on after the prescribed finishing time for one half-hour or less.

(b) When a worker is required for duty during the mid-day meal time, whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

#### 7.—Overtime.

(a) All overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. In the computation of overtime, each day shall stand by itself.

(b) Where workers are required to work continuously after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked (except on Saturday), they shall be paid at the rate of double time up to the time they finish work: Provided that hour shall not be later than the prescribed starting time the next day.

(c) All time worked in excess of eight (8) hours from Monday to Friday, inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturday, or before the prescribed starting or after the prescribed finishing times, shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(d) Work performed on Saturday after 1 p.m. or on Sunday, or the following holidays, shall be paid for at the rate of double time:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

#### 8.—Wages.

#### 9.—Engagement.

“Casual worker” shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that the minimum engagement of all casual workers shall be four (4) hours, to be worked in one continuous period.

A worker engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate of pay.

#### 10.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker, and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday, inclusive.

#### 11.—Travelling Time.

Workers shall be paid the ordinary hourly rate applicable during travelling time, both to and from the magazines. This shall not apply to the driver, if a member of the applicant union; in his case work shall be deemed to commence when he assumes his duty of driver and cease when such duty ceases.
