FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

## NURSES' REGISTRATION ACT, 1921-1937.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921-1937, has been pleased to repeal all the regulations heretofore made and in force under and for the purposes of the said Act, and in lieu thereof to make the new regulations set forth in the Schedule hereunder, to come into operation and have effect as from the date of the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*.

## NURSES' REGISTRATION ACT, 1921-1937.

*Regulations.*

1. These regulations may be cited as the Nurses' Registration Regulations, 1940.
2. These regulations are divided into Parts as follows:—

  - Part IV., rr. 28 to 55—Training and Examination of Nurses—Certificates of Registration.
    - Division 1, rr. 28 to 43—General.
    - Division 2, rr. 44 to 50—Nurses other than Infant Health Nurses.
    - Division 3, rr. 51 to 55—Infant Health Nurses.
  - Part V, rr. 56 to 58—Registration of Male Nurses.
  - Part VI., rr. 59 to 61—Miscellaneous.
  - Appendix I.—Forms.
  - Appendix II.—Fees.
  - Appendix III.—Curriculum for Training of Nurses other than Infant Health Nurses.
  - Appendix IV.—Curriculum of Training of Infant Health Nurses.

## PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

3. In the interpretation of these regulations the following terms shall have the meanings respectively set against them unless the context otherwise requires:—
  - “The Board” shall mean the Nurses' Registration Board;
  - “The Secretary” shall mean the person appointed by the Board to that office.
  - “The Act” shall mean the Nurses' Registration Act, 1921-1937.
  - “Registered nurse” shall mean a nurse registered under this Act.
  - “Regulations” shall mean the regulations made under the provisions of the Act.

## PART II.—BUSINESS AND PROCEDURE OF THE BOARD.

4. Meetings:—The Board shall meet in each month, unless otherwise decided at a previous meeting, on such day as will suit the convenience of its members and at such times as may be necessary. The chairman may at any time convene a meeting and the secretary shall convene a meeting, if so required, in writing, by any two members of the Board.
5. Notice of Meeting:—Not less than two days' notice of any meeting shall be given to each member of the Board.
6. Quorum:—Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.
7. Order of Business:—The order of business shall be as follows:—
  1. Minutes of previous meeting.
  2. Correspondence.
  3. Reports.
  4. Registrations.
  5. Notices of motion.
  6. Any other business.
  7. Date of next meeting.

Provided that the Board may at any meeting vary the above order, on the ground of urgency or convenience.
8. Voting:—Every question before the Board shall be decided by a majority of members present and voting, and the chairman shall have a vote in his own right, together with a casting vote.
9. Motions:—Every motion or amendment shall be moved and seconded, and shall be reduced to writing and handed to the chairman (if so required by him), and shall be read before it is further discussed or put to the meeting.
10. Notices of Motion:—Every notice of motion shall be in writing, signed by the member giving the notice, and shall be given or sent to the secretary, who shall insert in the Agenda Paper of the next ordinary meeting of the Board all notices of motion received not less than one clear day prior to the day on which the Agenda Paper is sent out to members. All notices of motion shall be placed on the Agenda Paper in the order in which they have been received.

11. Rescinding of Resolution:—No resolution of the Board shall be altered or rescinded at a subsequent meeting, except upon a notice of motion, of which a copy has been sent out to members by the secretary seven clear days before such meeting.

12. Committees:—Every committee appointed by the Board shall make a report of its proceedings to the Board, and the recommendations of every committee shall, so far as practicable, be in the form of resolutions to be considered by the Board, and the acts and proceedings of every committee shall be submitted to the Board for approval, unless the resolution of the Board appointing the committee shall otherwise so direct in respect of all or any of the matters referred to it.

13. Reports:—Every report from a committee shall be submitted by the chairman of the committee (if present), who shall move that it be received by the Board, and, on the motion being carried, the chairman or any other member of the committee may move to agree with the resolutions of the committee, but such resolutions shall be considered *seriatim*. The question that the report (if necessary, as amended) be now approved shall be put from the Chair, but no debate shall be allowed thereon.

14. Decision of Chairman:—The presiding chairman shall decide upon any point of order or procedure, and his decision shall be final.

15. Nomination of Two Nurses to be Members of the Board:—The nomination of two nurses shall be secured from time to time, as may be necessary, in the following manner:—

- (1) The Principal Medical Officer shall, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, call for nominations from registered nurses for the positions.
- (2) In the event of more than two nominations being received the Principal Medical Officer shall fix a date on which an election shall be held: Provided that at least one month shall elapse between the date fixed for the closing of nominations and the date fixed for such election.
- (3) He shall appoint a returning officer, who shall conduct the poll in connection with the election.
- (4) Every registered nurse shall be entitled to a vote and shall be provided by the returning officer with a ballot paper, upon making personal or written application for same.
- (5) Ballot papers may be returned to the returning officer, either personally or through the post.
- (6) On the completion of the poll, the names of the two nurses securing the greatest number of votes shall be forwarded by the Principal Medical Officer to the Governor for appointment as members of the Board.

### PART III.—TRAINING HOSPITALS.

#### *Division 1—General.*

16. A list of hospitals in this State approved by the Board at which the training of nurses may be undertaken shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and such list may be amended whenever the Board shall so direct.

17. The Board may cancel its approval of any such hospital, if satisfied that such hospital has failed to comply with the regulations.

18. For the purposes of these regulations, hospitals for the training of nurses, other than infant health nurses, are hereinafter specifically referred to as "general training hospitals" as distinct from hospitals for the training of infant health nurses, which are hereinafter specifically referred to as "infant health training hospitals."

19. (1) For the purposes of these regulations the Board may classify general training hospitals in two classes, to be known as Class A and Class B, and may determine the period of training necessary in the general training hospitals so classified respectively.

(2) For the purposes of such classification—

- (a) Class A, general training hospitals, shall be those which have an occupied bed average of not less than 40 adults of both sexes, excluding midwifery cases; and
- (b) Class B, general training hospitals, shall be those which have an occupied bed average of not less than 30 adults of both sexes, excluding midwifery cases.

20. (1) The board of management, proprietor or other controlling authority of a hospital which it is desired shall be approved by the Board as a general training hospital, or as an infant health training hospital, as the case may be, shall make application for such approval to the Board, through the medical officer in charge or the matron of such hospital, in accordance with Form No. 1 or Form No. 2 in Appendix I. to these regulations, as the case may require.

(2) The approval, if granted, shall be in writing, signed by the chairman of the Board, in accordance with Form No. 3 in Appendix I., aforesaid.

(3) Where the application for approval is made in respect of a general training hospital, the application shall be accompanied by a statement of particulars as provided for in Division 2 of this Part of these regulations.

(4) Where the application for approval is made in respect of an infant health training hospital, the application shall be accompanied by a statement of particulars, as provided for in Division 3 of this Part of these regulations.

(5) The approval granted by the Board in respect of any hospital shall remain in force until revoked by notice in writing, signed by the chairman, in accordance with Form No. 4 in Appendix I. to these regulations. An approval by the Board may be revoked at any time.

#### *Division 2—General Training Hospitals.*

21. The application to the Board for its approval of a general training hospital shall be accompanied by a statement in writing, signed by the person who has signed the application, setting out the following information, namely:—

- (a) the daily average number of beds occupied, exclusive of midwifery and child cases for each of the last two years preceding the application;

- (b) the name and qualifications of the matron;
- (c) the names of the medical staff of the hospital;
- (d) a statement that the consent of the medical staff of the hospital to give lectures in accordance with the prescribed schedule of training has been obtained;
- (e) the number of trained nurses and probationers employed in the hospital;
- (f) the number of operations performed in the hospital during the year next preceding the application;
- (g) the proportion of medical and surgical cases dealt with during the year next preceding the application, and
- (h) the number and variety of cases of infectious diseases dealt with during the year next preceding the application.

22. Every hospital, which is capable of being classified as a Class A or Class B hospital under regulation 19 (2) of these regulations, shall be eligible for approval by the Board as a general training hospital, if and so long as it fulfils the following requirements, namely:—

- (a) the matron is a registered nurse;
- (b) a course of training, in the case of a Class A hospital, is provided for a period of three years, or such other period of not less than three years, as the Board may by resolution determine and notify in the *Government Gazette*, exclusive of sick leave, when the whole of the training is undertaken in such hospital:  
Provided that where a portion of the training, which shall not, in any event, exceed fifteen months, has first been undertaken in a Class B hospital, a course of training in the Class A hospital may be limited to a period which, together with the earlier training aforesaid, makes a total period of training of four years, exclusive of sick leave.
- (c) a course of training, in the case of a Class B hospital, is provided for a period of four years, or such other period of not less than four years as the Board may by resolution determine and notify in the *Government Gazette*, exclusive of sick leave, when the whole of the training is undertaken in a Class B hospital;
- (d) the trainees receive practical instruction in the wards of the hospital from the matron or another registered nurse;
- (e) provision is made for a systematic course of lectures by duly qualified and registered medical practitioners, in accordance with the curriculum prescribed in Appendix III. to these regulations;
- (f) A report is furnished annually to the Board by the hospital authority, containing the following information, namely:—
  - (i) the daily average number of beds occupied during the year next preceding the report;
  - (ii) the names of the lecturers,
  - (iii) the subjects of lectures and the number of lectures delivered in each course; and
  - (iv) the attendances of the trainees at such lectures and showing that each trainee has attended at least three-fourths in number of the lectures delivered;
- (g) provision is made for the examination of the trainees undergoing instruction at the end of each yearly course of lectures and demonstrations in the subjects taught, and the results of such examinations are furnished to the Board in the annual report mentioned in paragraph (f) hereof.

23. In relation to Government hospitals which are approved by the Board as general training hospitals, Woorloo Sanatorium shall be deemed to be a hospital for the purposes of these regulations, but the wards thereof shall be regarded as medical wards, and the period of training in such wards shall not exceed one year, except in cases where trainees in such wards have failed to pass their examinations during that period. In such last-mentioned cases, the same shall be referred to the Board, and the Board may extend the period of training to be undertaken in the said wards by the trainees concerned.

#### *Division 3—Infant Health Training Hospitals.*

24. The application to the Board for its approval of an infant health training hospital shall be accompanied by a statement in writing signed by the person who has signed the application, setting out the following information, namely:—

- (a) daily average of occupied beds and cots for the two years next preceding the application;
- (b) name and qualification of matron;
- (c) names and qualifications of teaching staff;
- (d) names of medical staff;
- (e) a statement that the consent of the medical staff to deliver lectures in accordance with the prescribed schedule of training has been obtained;
- (f) the provision made for a systematic course of lectures to trainees, including a statement of the subjects dealt with and the period of time taken for lectures;
- (g) the number of probationers and trained nurses in the hospital during the two years next preceding the application, and also at the time of the application;
- (h) the number of—
  - (i) premature cots;
  - (ii) cots for artificially fed babies;
  - (iii) cots for breast-fed babies;

- (i) the provision made for—
  - (i) dining-sitting room for mothers;
  - (ii) premature ward;
  - (iii) food dispensary;
  - (iv) lecture demonstration and examination rooms;
  - (v) re-establishment cases.
- (j) arrangements provided for district visiting;
- (k) the period of time which nurses and trainees in the hospital spend in an infant health centre clinic, and whether such period of time is three weeks or more, and includes two weeks on indoor work in such clinic;
- (l) the provision made for practical instruction in—
  - (i) office work, chart and record-keeping;
  - (ii) paper pattern cutting;
  - (iii) demonstration to mothers *re* making mixtures, etc.
- (m) the provision made for a nurse or trainee obtaining experience in—
  - (i) the handling of premature and artificially fed babies, and whether the period of time available for obtaining such experience is 28 days or more;
  - (ii) the handling of ten re-establishment cases;
  - (iii) thirty test feeds;
  - (iv) thirty visits to homes;
  - (v) the handling of ten new cases;
  - (vi) the attendance in food dispensary of at least fourteen days.
- (n) a statement that these regulations, relating to infant health training hospitals, and the training and examination of trainees therein, have been read and understood and that the controlling authority of the hospital accepts them as the basis of the approval (if granted) of the Board.

25. Every hospital shall be eligible for approval by the Board as an infant health training hospital, if and so long as it fulfils the following requirements, namely:—

- (a) the matron or sister in charge of the nursing or instruction in the hospital is registered as a nurse under the Act, and has had not less than three years' training in a general training hospital approved by the Board, and also holds an approved certificate in infant health training and is a certificated and registered midwife;
- (b) provision is made in the hospital for—
  - (i) residential accommodation for trainees;
  - (ii) accommodation for not less than four nursing mothers and their babies;
  - (iii) a sitting and dining room for mothers;
  - (iv) a special ward, properly equipped, for premature babies;
  - (v) not less than four cots for artificially fed babies, not including premature babies;
  - (vi) approved facilities for examination of cases, breast stimulation, test feedings, and weighing and measuring babies;
  - (vii) approved facilities for bathing and dressing;
  - (viii) a properly equipped food dispensary;
  - (ix) a lecture and demonstration room;
  - (x) an emergency isolation room;
  - (xi) sun verandahs;
  - (xii) approved facilities for practical instruction in office work and keeping of records;
- (c) during the course of training of trainees in the hospital, relative proportions of nursing staff and cots are maintained to the satisfaction of the Board, and the numbers of babies received or born in the hospital are, in the opinion of the Board, sufficient to warrant the approval by the Board of the hospital as an infant health training hospital;
- (d) provision is made in accordance with the curriculum prescribed in Appendix IV. to these regulations for—
  - (i) systematic courses of lectures by instructors approved by the Board; and
  - (ii) practical instruction in the wards from the matron or another registered nurse approved by the Board.
- (e) provision is made for the issue to trainees of certificates that they have attended the systematic course of lectures and that they have received practical instruction in accordance with the curriculum prescribed in Appendix IV. to these regulations; and
- (f) provision is made whereby there shall be not more than three courses of training in each year, each course of training is in accordance with the curriculum aforesaid, and each course of training extends over a period of not less than four months, and includes at least twenty-one days at a district infant health centre approved by the Board for the purpose.

26. No infant health centre shall be approved by the Board for the purposes of paragraph (f) of regulation 25 hereof, unless—

- (a) the buildings, equipment, appliances, and daily average attendance are approved by the Board;
- (b) the nurse in charge of the instruction at such infant health centre is a registered nurse and has had not less than three years' training in a general training hospital approved by the Board, and also holds an approved certificate in infant health training and is a registered midwife.

27. The controlling authority of every approved infant health training hospital shall furnish to the Board annually a report in accordance with Form No. 5 in Appendix I. to these regulations and containing the particulars therein mentioned.

PART IV.—TRAINING AND EXAMINATION OF NURSES—CERTIFICATES OF EXAMINATION.

*Division 1—General.*

*Training.*

28. Applicants for admission as trainees into an approved general training hospital, or into an infant health training hospital, shall apply to the matron of the hospital, or, in the case of Government hospitals, to the Principal Medical Officer. The application shall be in the handwriting of the applicant and signed by her and shall be accompanied by—(a) three approved personal references and (b) a certificate of physical and mental fitness from a legally qualified medical practitioner.

29. Any applicant referred to in regulation 28 may be required to pass, before commencing her training, an examination in general education conducted by the Board, unless she holds a Junior Certificate or Eighth Standard Certificate recognised by the Education Department.

30. Subject to the said qualifications each applicant, when admitted to a hospital as a trainee, shall enter such hospital upon a three months' probation.

31. The matron of each training hospital shall furnish annually to the secretary of the Board the names of all trainees in training in the hospital, stating in each case—

- (a) the date on which training commenced;
- (b) particulars of any period during which, apart from ordinary leave or holiday, a trainee may have been unavoidably absent from her duties from illness or other cause;
- (c) the number of lectures in each prescribed course of study attended during the year.

32. Where a trainee has ceased training at any one training hospital, whether of her own accord or through dismissal, the Board shall have power to determine whether she shall be permitted to enter another training hospital and to decide what period, if any, of her previous training, and what examinations, shall be credited to her.

33. The course of training in each general training hospital shall be in accordance with the curriculum prescribed in Appendix III. to these regulations, and the course of training in each infant health training hospital shall be in accordance with the curriculum prescribed in Appendix IV. to these regulations.

*Examinations.*

34. The examination of trainees, both in general training hospitals and in infant health training hospitals, shall be written, practical and oral.

35. Examinations shall be arranged at such times as the Board decides.

36. The Board may from time to time appoint such centres for examination, as it may deem desirable.

37. In the case of infant health trainees and candidates for registration as infant health nurses, the Board shall appoint as examiners a registered medical practitioner and such number of infant health nurses as it may deem necessary.

38. Candidates for admission to any examination shall make application to the secretary of the Board in accordance with Form No. 6 in Appendix I. to these regulations, not later than one month before the date of such examination. The application shall be accompanied by the prescribed examination fee.

39. The examination papers for every examination shall be sent sealed to the various centres, where at the time appointed for the examination the seals shall be broken in the presence of the candidates and the papers shall be given out. After the close of the examination the papers of the candidates shall be forwarded to the examiners, who shall report the result of the examination to the Board.

40. Each candidate for an examination shall be provided with a numbered card. Sealed envelopes, containing numbered cards, shall be sent to the various centres and be distributed among the candidates immediately before the distribution of the examination papers.

41. The oral examination of candidates for examination shall be conducted at each centre by the local examiners appointed as provided in the Act, and shall be held after the written examination, on a date to be fixed by the examiners.

For every oral examination the maximum number of marks to be allotted in each subject shall be one hundred.

42. Upon the completion of the written, practical, and oral examination of candidates, the examiners shall forward to the Board a report on each candidate examined.

43. (1) In the case of the practical examination of candidates, each candidate may be required, subject to the prescribed curriculum and to the particular examination, of which the practical examination is a part, to make the necessary preparations and personally carry out the dressing of one or more surgical cases in the presence of the examiners, and to display a practical knowledge of bandaging and of splints, instruments, and surgical appliances in common use. Questions may be asked the candidates with a view to showing that they understand the reasons for the various procedures they carry out, the incidental risks where there are any, and the part the nurse should play in dealing with each.

(2) In particular, candidates for examination for infant health nurse registration may be required to demonstrate in a practical manner their knowledge of any matters within the prescribed curriculum relating to infant health.

*Division 2—Nurses other than Infant Health Nurses.*

44. Candidates for examination for registration as nurses other than infant health nurses shall be examined in general nursing, medical nursing, surgical nursing, hygiene, and, except where proof is produced of having already passed a satisfactory examination in such subject, in invalid cookery.

45. No such candidate shall be eligible for the final examination until she has completed the required course of training in an approved general training hospital. Provided that, in the event of the end of her period of training falling between two examinations she may present herself at the examination to be held nearest to the finishing date of her training period, but she must nevertheless complete her term of training before receiving her certificate.

46. The application to sit for the final examination must supply evidence that the applicant has attended lectures as provided in the prescribed curriculum applicable to her, and has passed other necessary examinations and has had practical experience in the operating theatre.

47. Applicants for registration as general nurses, whose training has been undertaken entirely at a children's hospital, must present evidence of having had at least six months' training in the nursing of adults of both sexes in an approved general training hospital.

48. Candidates who have passed the final examination, and have otherwise complied with the requirements of these regulations, shall receive a certificate to that effect in the Form No. 7 in Appendix I. to these regulations, signed by the examiners and by the chairman and the secretary of the Board.

49. (1) The entrance fee paid for admission to the final examination shall, if the candidate passes such examination, entitle her to a certificate of registration and the prescribed badge.

(2) In the event of a candidate failing to satisfy the examiners at the first final examination taken by her, she may present herself at one other final examination without payment of a further entrance fee, and at other final examinations, upon payment in each case of a further entrance fee of ten shillings and sixpence.

50. The oral examination of candidates to which this division relates shall be of such a nature as to satisfy the examiners that the candidate possesses a sound knowledge of practical general nursing, and for that purpose special attention shall be given to the matters, hereinafter mentioned, in each of which the candidate may be asked to give a practical demonstration, namely:—bed-making, the moving of helpless patients, the sponging of patients, the administration of baths of various kinds, local and general, including hot air baths, packs, enemata, purgative and nutrient, hypodermic injections; the cleansing of the various cavities of the body, including nose and ears; bathing the eyes; catheterisation of the bladder; the application of poultices, fomentations, blisters, mustard plasters and leeches; the preparation of the patient and the apparatus required for various minor surgical procedures such as cupping, drainage of the pleural and peritoneal cavities, lumbar puncture, drainage of subcutaneous tissues; aspiration, catheterisation and washing out of the bladder, dilation of the urethra, administration of subcutaneous saline injections, lavage of the stomach, etc.

*Division 3—Infant Health Nurses.*

51. In the case of persons who have undergone a course of training for registration as infant health nurses prior to these regulations coming into operation, such course of training shall be sufficient to entitle such persons to sit for examination under these regulations, if the same has been in accordance with the course of training provided at the King Edward Memorial Hospital in this State or in accordance with a course of training provided in similar hospitals in other States of Australia, which are of a standard not less than equivalent to the said course of training at the King Edward Memorial Hospital aforesaid, and which are recognised by the Board.

52. Subject to regulation 51, no candidate for examination in infant health nursing shall be eligible for the final examination until she has completed the required course of training in an approved infant health training hospital.

Provided that, in the event of the end of her training period falling between two examinations, she may present herself at the examination to be held nearest to the finishing date of her training period, but she must nevertheless complete her term of training before receiving her certificate.

53. The application to sit for the final examination must supply evidence that the applicant has attended lectures as provided in the prescribed curriculum applicable to her and has passed other necessary examinations.

54. Candidates who have passed the final examination, and have otherwise complied with the requirements of these regulations shall receive a certificate to that effect in the Form 8 in Appendix I. to these regulations, signed by the examiners and by the chairman and secretary of the Board.

55. (1) The entrance fee paid for admission to the final examination, shall, if the candidate passes such examination, entitle her to a certificate of registration as an infant health nurse, and a badge.

(2) In the event of a candidate failing to satisfy the examiners at any final examination she may present herself at any subsequent final examination on payment of the prescribed entrance fee.

**PART V.—REGISTRATION OF MALE NURSES.**

56. The Board shall keep a supplementary register, to be called "The Register of Male Nurses," in which shall be entered the name of each person to whom registration as a male nurse is granted by the Board.

57. (1) Every male applicant for registration as a male nurse shall make application to the Board in the Form No. 9 in Appendix I. to these regulations, and lodge therewith the prescribed registration fee and evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has had at least three years' training in a hospital or other institution recognised by the Board where the training of male nurses is undertaken.



(2) Where an applicant has satisfied the requirements of paragraph (1) hereof he shall be entitled to registration as a male nurse, and shall receive a certificate of registration in the Form No. 10 in Appendix I. to these regulations.

58. No badge shall be issued to a male nurse.

PART VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

59. (1) Every female nurse applying for registration under the Act shall make application to the Board in the Form No. 11 in Appendix I. to these regulations.

(2) Registration of female nurses shall be effected by a record in the register to be kept by the Board for the purpose, in accordance with section 3 of the Act, which shall be in the Form No. 12 in Appendix I. aforesaid.

(3) The certificate of the registration of a female nurse shall, according to the nature of such registration, be in either Form No. 13 or No. 14, or No. 15 in Appendix I. aforesaid, as the case may require.

(4) The badge to be issued to a registered nurse shall be in the form and design prescribed in Form No. 16 in Appendix I. aforesaid.

60. Every nurse who desires to apply for re-registration under the provisions of section 10A of the Act, shall make application to the Board in the Form No. 17 in Appendix I. to these regulations and lodge therewith the fee of one shilling prescribed by section 10A aforesaid.

61. The various fees payable under these regulations shall be those prescribed in Appendix II. to these regulations.
