# PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.] Wealth of Australia. Lieutenant-Governor.

D.N.A. 802/37. WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared near Norseman: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of 19 acres, more particularly described in the Schedule barea to Proceed the Council of the Council described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

Reserve No. 22179, in the Dundas District, near Norseman.

Bounded by lines commencing at a point on the eastern side of the Coolgardie-Esperance railway reserve situate about 5 chains northwards of 105-mile post on the said railway and extending northwards along said eastern side of reserve for a distance of about 10 chains; thence at right angles thereto for about 17 chains 50 links to the south-western side of the G.W.S. Pipe Line; thence south-eastwards along same for about 10 chains; thence westwards to the starting point.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, sub-section (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, has been issued 1930-1934, which reads as follows:

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

(2) The expression "disgraceful or improper conduct" as used in paragraph (f) of this regulation includes-

(i) the action of an officer in being or becoming, after the coming into operation of this paragraph, a member of any body, corporate or unincorporate, which, after the coming into operation of this paragraph, is, under the provisions of the National Security (Subversive Associations) Regulations contained in Statutory Rule 1940 No. 109, made under the National Security Act, 1939, declared to be unlawful;
(ii) the doing by an officer, after the coming into operation of this paragraph, of any act, matter, or thing which is prohibited by any of the provisions of the National Security (Subversive Associations) Regulations aforesaid:

(iii) the refusal or failure by an officer, after the coming into operation of this paragraph, to do any act, matter, or thing which such officer is lawfully required to do under any of the provisions of the National Security (Subversive Associations) Regulations aforesaid; and

(iv) the expressing by an officer publicly, either within a Government department or elsewhere, after the coming into operation of this paragraph, of any doctrine or principle which was advocated by a body which has, under the provisions of the National Security (Subversive Associations)

Regulations aforesaid, been declared to be pulgaful or which is pre-Regulations aforesaid, been declared to be unlawful, or which is prejudicial to the defence of the Commonwealth or to the efficient prosecution of the war.

# NATIVE ADMINISTRATION ACT, 1905-1936.

Department of Native Affairs Perth, 15th August, 1940.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 68 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder the Native Administration Regulations, 1938, as made under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 1st day of November, 1938, and thereafter amended from time to time as notified in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of January, 1939; the 8th day of September, 1939; the 8th day of December, 1939, and the 2nd day of February, 1940.

### Schedule.

The Native Administration Regulations, 1938, abovementioned are amended as

(1) By adding to the said regulations, after regulation 156, a new regulation as follows:

Fees and Charges for Hospital Treatment, Maintenance, etc.

- Where the department provides medical treatment, hospital treatment, maintenance, or other accommodation for natives or other persons in native hospitals and clinics and other institutions or establishments conducted and maintained by the department, fees and charges may be charged by the department against and shall be payable to the department by the natives or other persons aforesaid for whom such treatment or other accommodation is provided as aforesaid, in accordance with the scale prescribed in the Second Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) By deleting the heading "The Schedule" above the Schedule immediately following regulation 156 and inserting in lieu thereof the heading "The First Schedule."

(3) By adding to the said regulations, after the existing Schedule thereto, a new Schedule, to stand as "The Second Schedule," as follows:—

#### THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

Fees and Charges for Medical Treatment, Hospital Treatment, Maintenance, and other Accommodation,

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1939; THE TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1928.

Perth Road Board—Building By-laws. P.W. 953/38.

PERTH Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, and the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, do hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

### 1.-Minimum Height of Rooms

(a) In the Inglewood, Lawley, and Maylands Wards and that portion of the Osborne Ward proclaimed as Joundanna Heights Townsite, habitable rooms in all buildings shall be in every part at least 10 feet six inches in height from floor to ceiling and the minimum height for non-habitable rooms shall be eight feet.

Provided that habitable rooms may be constructed in the roofs of buildings of one storey only, if they are built entirely in the roof and if each room has a minimum height of eight feet six inches from floor to ceiling over not less than one half its floor area, and if no part of the ceiling is less than six feet above the floor, and if no such room or rooms is constructed or adapted for separate occupation from the ground floor.

The expression "entirely in the roof" shall be interpreted to mean that the only vertical walls of a room constructed in a roof showing externally shall be gable walls carried up directly from the main external walls of the building with similar materials and of the same thickness, type, and construction as such main walls.

Provided also that sleep-outs, sun porches, and laundries may be constructed, and existing verandalis may be partially enclosed to form sleep-outs, sun porches, laundries, and for approved similar purposes, with a minimum height from floor to ceiling of eight feet, if an area of vertical wall equal to not less than

two-fifths of the floor area be kept open for light and ventilation, at least two-fifths of which must be kept open for ventilation.

Fly wire or louvres may be fitted to the ventilation area and fixed or movable glazed sashes to the light area.

Provided also, that sleep-outs, sun porches, and similar enclosures built over garages shall have their vertical walls built of the same material and type of construction as the walls of the ground storey.

The expression "habitable room" shall be interpreted to include bedroom, lounge, living room, dining room, billiard room, recreation room, kitchen, scullery, vestibule, study, den, library, music room, office, studio, work room, surgery, and any other room to be used for work, recreation, or sleep.

The expression "non-habitable room" shall be interpreted to include bathroom, water closet and pantry. Rooms in dwellings shown as storeroom or lumber room shall be classed as habitable, unless they have a cubic capacity less than 800 cubic feet and are not used for any of the purposes set out in the definition of habitable room. Laundries shall be classed as habitable rooms unless they are open at least to the same extent as required for sleep-outs.

(b) In the Scarborough and Hamersley Wards and all that portion of the Osborne Ward not included in the Townsite of Joondanna Heights, the by-laws set out above shall apply, with the following exceptions:—

At least two of the habitable rooms of every dwelling shall have a minimum height from floor to ceiling of 10 feet. The other habitable rooms may be enclosed verandals or lean-to construction with an average height of not less than nine feet: provided that provision is made for light and ventilation as required by the Health Act and Health by-laws, and provided also, that no verandah enclosure to form a habitable room shall be permitted which adversely affects the light and ventilation of any other habitable room.

2.—Distance from Road and from Side Boundary.

No part of any building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house, and no domestic or public building to be erected in any residential street, and no addition to any such building shall be built within a distance of 25 feet, measured horizontally, from the alignment of the road the building fronts, unless—

- (a) a building line at a different distance from such road has been fixed by a proper authority;
- (b) the existing buildings on adjoining lots are at a lesser distance.

Where the road alignment is curved, irregular, or not at right angles to the side boundaries of the land, the distance back shall be such that the mean of the greatest and least distance is not less than 25 feet.

The expression "residential street" shall mean a street the greater part of the frontage to which between two cross streets is occupied by residences, unless such street is a gazetted shopping area or certified by the secretary of the Board to be a future shopping area.

No part of any factory or any building of the warehouse class, and no addition to such buildings, when built other than in gazetted factory, industrial, or shopping areas, shall be built within the distances above specified from the alignment of the road the building fronts.

The distances from the side boundaries of allotments and from the side road frontages of corner allotments shall be not less than three feet: provided that the building may be built closer than three feet, if the external wall is carried up in brick, stone, or concrete so as to form a parapet 12 inches at least above the highest part of the adjoining gutter.

Any window constructed in a wall erected less than three feet from the boundary of the land on which a dwelling is built shall be neglected in computing the light area of the room affected.

# 3.—Space about Buildings.

(The area of the allotment on which a dwelling may be erected is set out in the *Government Gazette* of 20th November, 1936.)

At least one-third of the area of any allotment on which a dwelling house is erected shall be left open and unbuilt upon and for the exclusive use of the occupants of the building erected upon such allotment.

The depth of the rear yard of any dwelling house shall not be less than 25 feet or less than 600 square feet in area, exclusive of outbuildings.

### 4.-Floor Area of Dwellings.

Every dwelling house, except a tenement house, shall have a total floor area of not less than 800 square feet, and shall contain not less than three habitable rooms, and every building shall be erected to a design approved by the Board: provided that, in the Scarborough and Hamersley Wards, and that portion of the Osborne Ward not included in the Townsite of Joondanna Heights, the total floor area shall be not less than 500 square feet and the dwelling shall contain not less than two habitable rooms each of not less than 100 square feet in floor area and having a minimum height from floor to ceiling of not less than 10 feet.

The expression tenement house shall mean a dwelling house containing two or more flats or tenements.

In Joondanna Heights Townsite buildings of brick, stone, cement, or similar construction must have a minimum area of 10 squares and a minimum value of £650.

#### Additional Room:-

Not more than one dwelling of the prescribed dimensions shall be erected on one allotment of land: Provided that outside any townsite or on subdivided lots of one acre or more in area, a building additional to and separate from the principal dwelling may be erected and used as a habitation, subject to the following conditions.

- (a) The building shall comply with building and health regulations and by-laws as regards location, materials, structural details, dimensions, light, and ventilation and extent of occupation.
- (b) The building shall provide sleeping and living room accommodation only for a member of the family of the owner or occupier of the principal dwelling or for a bona fide employee working on the property.
- (c) The floor area of such building shall be not less than 100 square feet.

#### 5.—Shops.

The expression "shop" means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also includes hairdressers' saloons, offices of agents, auctioneers, and other businesses or trades.

A bona fide private boarding house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are supplied for payment to persons other than boarders.

No shop shall be erected on a site with an area of less than 2,000 square feet and a frontage to a street of less than 16 feet 6 inches.

No combined shop and dwelling shall be erected on a site with an area of less than 6,000 square feet and a frontage to a street of less than 49 feet 6 inches. No shop or shops shall be built in front of any existing dwelling house, except in compliance with the following conditions:—

One shop shall be connected to the existing dwelling so that, when completed, the whole shall form one building and be in one occupation.

A clear and uninterrupted frontage of at least 15 feet shall be retained for such dwelling house.

No building containing a shop or shops shall be erected unless each dwelling shall have a clear and uninterrupted frontage of at least 15 feet to a street on either the ground or upper floor.

A building containing a shop or shops and one or more dwellings shall comply with any tenement by-laws in force in the portion of the district where such building is proposed to be erected. Where dwellings are erected over shops each dwelling must either be adapted for occupation with one shop or be separated therefrom by a horizontal party wall of adequate strength and fire-resisting construction. Where a dwelling and shop on different floors are in one occupation, the floor area of the shop may be deducted in computing the total floor area. And light courts, unroofed balconies, and flat roofs accessible to tenants may be included in the unbuilt on area. All garages and outbuildings are to be included in the total floor area.

Every shop shall be so erected and built that, without passing through the building, there is reasonable access to the back premises and offices of such shop for the removal of night soil and other refuse to a road or lane at least 10 feet wide.

#### 6.—Second Hand Material.

No old or second-hand material may be used in any building or outbuilding unless approved by the surveyor and painted where exposed.

#### 7.—Plans and Specifications.

The plans and specifications required to be deposited under by-law gazetted 2nd September, 1938, are to be deposited in duplicate, one copy to be permanently retained by the Board.

#### 8.—Fees.

When for any reason a building license is cancelled and no building operations commenced, the building fee shall be refunded to the applicant, subject to a deduction of 25 per cent., to be retained by the Board towards the cost of examining plans and making and altering records.

#### 9.—Septic Tanks.

Wherever a public water supply but no sewerage system is available, all new buildings shall be provided with an adequate septic tank installation. All plumbing work in such installation must be carried out to the standards of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department, and, on completion, a certificate to the effect that the work is to standard produced for examination by the surveyor.

#### 10.-Enclosures.

No existing open verandahs are to be enclosed without approval in writing from the Board and then only in accordance with by-laws controlling height of rooms and sleep-out construction respectively.

# 11.—Wooden Framed Buildings.

- (a) Wooden framed buildings shall be constructed or adapted for one occupation only, and the external walls measured from floor level to the top of wall-plate shall not exceed 15 feet in height, except in the case of special industrial buildings approved by the Board, and shall not exceed 20 squares in area.
- (b) Wooden framed buildings shall be built at least 25 feet from the alignment of the road which the building is to face and at least eight feet from any other street or way, and four feet from the boundaries of land not in the same occupation, or from any brick buildings. Where by-laws permit a wooden framed building to be used as a shop, a wooden framed shop may be erected on the street alignment or alignments.
- (c) In Joondanna Heights Townsite, buildings of wood, asbestos, or similar construction must have a minimum area of 10 squares and a minimum value of £500.
- (d) The framing shall be constructed of merchantable quality hardwood, in sizes and spacing of sufficient strength for the purpose for which the building is required, properly supported on stumps or footings and adequately braced.
- (e) The exterior surface of the walls of wooden framed buildings shall be covered with dressed jarrah weatherboards, galvanised iron not less than 26-gauge, asbestos cement sheets no less than three-sixteenths of an inch in thickness, or other materials approved by the surveyor; provided that galvanised iron shall not be used for buildings of the domestic or public building classes or for any building permitted to be built within 25 feet of the street alignment.
- (f) The interior surface of all walls and ceilings of wooden framed buildings of the domestic or public buildings classes shall be finished in lath and plaster, metal, asbestos cement, fibrous plaster, approved hardwood, or other materials approved by the surveyor.
- (g) Roof shall be covered with tiles, slates, metal, or other material approved by the surveyor.
- (h) In the construction of all wooden framed buildings, except outbuildings and sheds, vermin plates shall be used.

No additions of any kind shall be made to any wooden framed building which shall have the effect of making the distance between such building and any other wooden framed building less than eight feet and any other brick building less than four feet.

# 12.-Garages and Outbuildings.

- (a) The expression "garage" means any building used for housing a motor vehicle and excludes a service station or any garage carried on as a business undertaking.
- (b) "Outbuilding" means any building on the curtilage of any dwelling, shop, or combined shop and dwelling used as a workshop or storeroom, not being a building for the storage of inflammable materials, nor for housing any animals or birds, and not exceeding four squares in area and 15 feet in height.
- (c) Garages and outbuildings shall comply, as to materials and method of construction, with all by-laws controlling buildings generally.
- (d) When incorporated with or attached to the main building a garage shall conform in all respects thereto, but must have a ceiling of fire-proof material, approved by the surveyor, and also be proof against the passage of noxious fumes to the main building.
- (e) Isolated garages or outbuildings may be constructed with hardwood timber framing covered with dressed jarrah weatherboards, asbestos cement sheets not less than three-sixteenths of an inch in thickness, or other materials approved by the surveyor. Corrugated galvanised iron sheets not less than 26-gauge may be used: provided that the garage or outbuilding is erected at least 75 feet from the street or road which the land fronts and not less than 20 feet from any other street or road.
- (f) No garage or outbuilding shall be erected nearer to the alignment of the street which the allotment on which the garage or outbuilding is proposed to be erected fronts than the distance which a dwelling house is required to be set back under any existing by-law, except as hereafter allowed.

Where a dwelling has already been erected closer to the front street alignment than the distance prescribed by by-law, a garage or outbuilding may be erected on the same lot on the same alignment as the dwelling only if there is an existing dwelling on the adjoining allotment so situated that its outlook or amenity will not be adversely affected by the erection of the garage or outbuilding.

No garage or outbuilding shall be erected on a corner allotment which is joined at the rear by the back of another corner allotment at a less distance from the side street than a dwelling house of the same materials as the garage or outbuilding is required to be set back by any existing by-law: provided that, when constructed of brick, stone, or concrete with a parapet or gable wall and of approved design, the garage or outbuilding may be built on the street alignment.

No garage or outbuilding shall be erected on a corner allotment which is joined at the rear by the side of another allotment at a less distance from the side street than a dwelling house of the same materials as the garage or outbuilding is required to be set back by any existing by-law, and, in addition, shall not project beyond a straight line joining two points; one on the common boundary of the two allotments and the same distance from the side street alignment as a dwelling house fronting such street is required to be set back by any existing by-law, and the other on the alignment of the side street and 50 feet from the common boundary of the two allotments.

(g) When on account of the contour, shape, or dimensions of, or want of access to the rear portion of an allotment, the location of a garage or outbuilding as set out in subclause (f) is impracticable, the Board may permit the erection of such garage or outbuilding in another position subject to such restrictions as to design and materials of construction as may be necessary to preserve the amenity of the district.

Garages and outbuildings shall be erected three feet back from the side and rear boundaries of allotments if of brick, stone, or concrete and four feet, if of wooden framing: provided that, with walls of brick, stone, or concrete the distance may be less than three feet if the wall adjoining the boundary is carried up in brick, stone, or concrete to form a parapet not less than nine inches high.

Garages and outbuildings of wooden framing shall be at least four feet from every wall of every building of brick, stone, or concrete, and outbuildings of wooden framing shall be at least eight feet from every wall of every wooden framed building.

The doors of any garage when opened shall not encroach on any road or obstruct any footpath.

#### 13.-Iron Chimneys and Fireplaces.

The erection of iron chimneys and fireplaces is prohibited in any townsite, also on any allotment, unless such allotment contains an area exceeding one half an acre

#### 14.-Fowl Houses.

Fowl houses may be erected on lots in townsites and lots of less than one half an acre: provided they are not more than two squares in area and not more than six feet in height, and are erected at the rear of any dwelling, shop, or building used mainly for human habitation which may be upon the land whereon such fowl house is to be built.

All such fowl houses must be erected not less than 75 feet from the street or road which the land fronts, and not less than 20 feet from any other street or road, and not less than four feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation, and not less than 20 feet from any dwelling, shop, public building, or building used mainly for human habitation.

The walls and roof covering of such fowl houses must be of iron or other fire-resisting material approved by the surveyor.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 46 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935, has been pleased to amend the Traffic Regulations, 1936, made under and for the purposes of the said Act, and published in the Government Gazette on the 26th August, 1936, and amended from time to time thereafter, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

### SCHEDULE.

The Traffic Regulations, 1936, are amended as follows:-

(1) A new regulation to stand as regulation 305F, is inserted after regulation 305E, as follows:—  $\,$ 

Guildford Municipality.

305F. The carriage by any vehicle of a load (including the weight of the vehicle) exceeding ten tons on East street and Helena street in the Guildford Municipality is hereby prohibited.

- (2) Regulation 329 is amended by deleting the word "vehicle" in the first line thereof.
- (3) A new regulation, to stand as regulation 333B, is inserted after regulation 333A, as follows:—  $\,$

333B. The driver of a motor vehicle upon a public street shall, when he intends or is about to—  $\,$ 

(i) turn his vehicle towards his right; or

(ii) cause his vehicle to diverge towards his right; or

(iii) draw his vehicle out from the kerb;

give timely and unmistakable indication of his intention to do so by extending his right arm and hand with the palm turned to the front and holding them rigid in a horizontal position straight out on the off side of such vehicle and shall continue such signal as may be necessary to give other users of the road clear indication of his intention.

# TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1935.

#### SCHEDULE.

The Traffic Regulations, 1936, are amended by inserting after regulation 80A, a new regulation, to stand as regulation 80B, as follows:—

- 80B (i) No person shall cause a vehicle to stand on the pavement of a two-lane road in such a manner as to prevent the free flow of traffic, where such portion of the pavement is marked with a double white line along the centre.
- (ii) The driver of a vehicle which is travelling along a public street shall drive such vehicle so as to keep the centre line of the carriageway of the street on his right whilst his view along the carriageway is obstructed, within a distance of five hundred feet ahead—
  - (a) by reason of the fact that the vehicle is approaching the crest of a grade; or
  - (b) by reason of a curve in the street.
- (iii) The driver of a motor vehicle upon a public street shall not cause it to stand so that any portion of it is upon the carriageway in a position where, by reason of a grade or curve in the street, the driver of a vehicle or the rider of a horse or bicycle approaching it from the rear will not have a clear view of it for a distance of at least one hundred and fifty feet.

### By-law No. 119—Repeal.

By-law No. 119, made by the Municipality of Claremont under the powers of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, and published in the Government Gazette dated the 26th February, 1932, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

# By-law No. 119.

- 1. No shop, business, or place of industry shall paint, erect, or permit to remain erected or exhibited any sign or other advertisement or notice/device, except the name of the owner or owners of the shop, business, or industry, goods sold on the premises, and the trade or calling carried on within the premises.
- 2. No signboard or other advertising notice/device shall be renewed, altered, repainted, or recrected until plans and specifications in ink shall have been submitted to and approved by the Council.
- 3. All plans for any advertising notice/device shall show clearly the wording proposed to be written on such sign.

The size of such advertising notice/device exhibiting the name or trade or calling of the occupiers or owners shall not exceed the length of the front of the building and two feet in height overall.

5. Such sign shall not be put up or exhibited above any gutter line or parapet line on any structure, and its location shall be subject to the approval of the Council.

6. All signs or other advertising notice/device existing at the time of the enactment of this by-law which do not comply with the conditions hereby prescribed, shall not be repaired, renewed, altered, or repainted, save only in such manner as will cause the same to conform to the conditions as set out in this by-law.

7. If any sign, advertising notice/device is at any time in the opinion of the Council in a dangerous or neglected condition, and the owner or occupier shall upon the receipt of a written notice to that effect, fail to forthwith remove or refix the

that effect, fall to forthwith remove or refix the same to the satisfaction of the building surveyor, the Council may remove the same and recover the cost of so doing from the owner of the premises.

8. If any person shall contravene any of the provisions of this by-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, or, if such contravention is in the nature of a continuing offence, then to a daily penalty not exceeding £2.
