(b) In addition to the leave prescribed in (a) the following public holidays shall be granted to each employee, provided the job or depot in which he is employed is closed on such days:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Now York, Day Cook, Heider, Fester Sections. Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day.

(c) Sick leave, not exceeding six days in each year of service, shall be granted to employees having not less than one month's continuous service, on production of an adequate medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the officer in charge.

6.-Contract of Service.

Wages shall be paid weekly. The engagement shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side. An employee may, however, be summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

7.—Oilskin Coats.

Foremen shall be issued with an oilskin coat, at the rate of one coat every two years.

8.-Board of Reference.

- (1) A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purposes of this Agreement.
- (2) Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) members, one nominated by the Minister, and one nominated by the union.
- (3) The chairman shall be some other person agreed upon by the parties, but if the parties are unable to agree upon an appointment, the parties hereby agree to accept as chairman any person nominated by the Court of Arbitration.
- (4) On the chairman and members being appointed, the Board shall be deemed to be constituted.
- (5) There are assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of:—
 - (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
 - (b) deciding any dispute which under the terms of the Agreement may be decided by the Board of Reference, including any appeal against the margin fixed by the Engineer, Metropolitan Water Snpply, Sewerage, and Drainage: provided such appeal is lodged with the chairman of the Board of Reference within one mouth from the date the margin is fixed. margin is fixed;

- (c) deciding any other matter that the Minister may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (6) The union agrees that there shall be no interruption in the work of the Minister over any matter within the jurisdiction of the Court or the Board.
- (7) The decisions of the Board shall be recorded in writing, and such decisions shall be conclusive. A signed copy of the decisions shall be forwarded to each of the parties hereto.
- (8) The Board shall sit at such times and places as the chairman shall direct.
- (9) The decision of the Board shall be the decision of the majority.
- (10) With the consent of the chairman either party may at any time vary its nomination of representative member.

9.—Fares.

- (a) Workers engaged on construction or reconstruction work situated more than one (1) mile by the shortest possible route from the nearest railway station or public transport facility shall receive sixpence (6d.) per day in addition to their ordinary pay, plus sixpence (6d.) per day for every additional half (½) mile walked, unless travelling in the Minister's time.
- (b) Where the Minister provides transport to the nearest railway station or transport facility, workers shall travel in their own time and receive no allowance

10.—Camp Allowance.

Employees who are obliged to live in a tent at or near the works shall receive an allowance of 5s. 3d. per week, when no cook is provided at the department's expense.

11.-Away from Home Allowance.

When a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed to any place where he cannot return to his abode at night, he shall receive as expenses an amount of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per item per day, or reasonable expenses. "Item" means breakfast, dinner, tea and bed.

12.—Relieving Foremen.

When an employee is relieving a foreman, he shall be paid not less than his existing rate of pay, and in any case not less than the minimum rate payable to a foreman.

13.-Camp Equipment.

Stretchers, mattress, pillow, and requisite cooking utensils shall be provided by the department for employees who are obliged to camp at or near the works.

14.-Term.

This Agreement shall come into operation from the date hereof and remain in force for a period of three

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F. & S. 253/40.
WHEREAS under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, the Governor may make regulations, as may be necessary or convenient, for carrying out or giving effect to the provisions of the Act: And whereas regulations have been made under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of September, 1938, and amended by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 12th day of May, 1939, and the 5th day of July, 1940: And whereas it is deemed necessary to repeal the amendments to the said regulations as set out in the Schedule to the Order in Conneil published in the Government Gazette on the 5th day of July, 1940, and to substitute new amendments to the said regulations in lien thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lientenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act doth hereby repeal the Amendments to the said regulations as set out in the Schedule to the Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 5th day of July, 1940, and in substitution thereof doth hereby amend the said regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

- (1) Regulation "20" is renumbered "22".
- (2) New regulations are inserted after regulation 19, to stand as regulations "20" and "21", as follow:—

Statements by approved Insurance Offices.

- 20. (1) Every incorporated insurance office which prior to the date of commencement of this regulation has received, and every incorporated insurance office which shall hereafter receive, the approval of the Minister under the provisions of section 10 of the Act shall, within thirty days from the date of the commencement of this regulation, or the receipt of such approval, as the case may be, transmit to the Minister a statement in the Form L in the Appendix to these regulations, showing the names, addresses, and occupations of each employer who had in force at such date a policy or contract of insurance with such insurance office against liability under this Act: Penalty ten pounds.
- (2) Every incorporated insurance office which prior to the date of commencement of this regulation has received the approval of the Minister shall, within fourteen days from the end of the first calcudar month after the commencement of section 10A of the Act, and thereafter within fourteen days from the end of each succeeding calcudar month, transmit to the Minister statements in the Forms M and N in the Appendix to these regulations showing the information required under section 10A of the Act in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) thereof: Penalty ten pounds.
- (3) Every incorporated insurance office which hereafter receives the approval of the Minister shall, within fourteen days from the end of the first clear calcular month after the date of such approval, and thereafter within fourteen days from the end of each succeeding calcular month, transmit to the Minister statements in the same forms and containing the same information as is prescribed in the preceding paragraph. Penalty ten pounds.
- (4) Any statement required to be submitted to the Minister under this regulation shall be forwarded to the office of the Chief Inspector of Factories, and any statement so forwarded shall be deemed to be addressed to the Minister for the purpose of this regulation.

Authorisation by Minister.

- 21. The authorisation by the Minister for any person to institute inquiries in accordance with the provisions of the Act shall be in accordance with Form O in the Appendix to these regulations and such authorisation shall be signed by the officer duly authorised in that behalf.
