PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of the Bank Holidays Act, 1884, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint special days to be observed as Bank Holidays, as follows:—

Date and Town.

9th October, 1940—Metropolitan Area. 16th October, 1940—Pingelly.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 17th day of September, 1940, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 828/34.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Area, or of any District; and

whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of Metropolitan Stormwater Districts Nos. 2 and 1 as at present defined should be altered: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of Metropolitan Stormwater Districts Nos. 2 and 1 and declare that the said boundaries as shown on Plans M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., Nos. 3449 and 2545, and as described in Order in Council of 18th June, 1919, and subsequent amendments, shall be altered in the following manner, by deleting the area described in the Schedule hereunder from Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 1 and including it in Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 2:—

Schedule.

Commencing at a point in the centre of King William street, opposite the centre of Almondbury road and proceeding south-west along the centre of Almondbury road to a point opposite the south corner of Lot 7, Almondbury road; thence north-west across Almondbury road and along the south-west boundary of the said Lot 7 to the centre of the right-of-way at the rear of Lots 15 and 16, Hill street; thence south-west along the said right-of-way to the centre of the right-of-way at the south-west side of Lot 16, Hill street; thence north-west along the centre of the said right-of-way to and across Hill street and along the south-west-west boundary of Lot 29, Hill street, to its north-west corner; thence north-east along the north-west boundaries of Lots 29 and 28, Hill street, and along the entre of the right-of-way at the rear of Lots 27 and 26, Hill street, to the centre of George street; thence north-west along George street to the south-east side of Glyde street; thence north-east along the east side of Glyde street; thence north-east along the east side of Lots 17, 18, and 19, King William street, along the north-west boundary of Lot 18, King William street, to and across King William street along the north-west boundaries of Lots 35, King William street and 32 Hamilton street, to the centre of Hamilton street; thence north-west along the centre of Hamilton street; thence north-west along the centre of Hamilton street to a point opposite the centre of the right-of-way at the rear of

Lots 1 to 7, South crescent; thence east and later north-east along the centre of the said right-of-way to the centre of Slade street; thence south-east along the centre of Slade street; thence south-east along the centre of Slade street to a point opposite the south-east boundary of Lot 4, Slade street; thence south-west across Slade street and along the south-east boundaries of Lots 4, Slade street and 9 Hamilton street to the centre of Hamilton street; thence north-west along the centre of Hamilton street to the centre of Olfe street; thence south-west along the centre of Olfe street to the centre of King William street; thence south-east along the centre of King William street to the point of commencement, as shown in brown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 3449.

This Order in Conneil shall take effect from the 27th day of September, 1940.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

Prohibited Periods.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Corr. No. 270/38. Perth, 25th September, 1940. HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Excentive Council has been pleased to declare, under section 8 of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in the following Road Districts and Municipality, during the periods set out in the Schedule hereunder, and to approve of the suspension of the operation of such prohibition, so far as it extends to the Midland Railway Reserve, for the period extending to the 21st December, 1940, inclusive.

(b) where the water is used for watering fruit trees or fruit vines, no mechanical device shall be used at any time for the purposes of such watering, and such watering shall be done only with a watering can or other container held in the hand or with a hose held in the hand;

(c) where the water is used for watering market gardens or nurseries of plants other than fruit trees or fruit vines, and in all other cases of watering (other than the watering of fruit trees or fruit vines), where the water is supplied at irrigation prices as prescribed under these by-laws, no mechanical device or hose held in the hand shall be used for the purposes of such watering on any day other than Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, except with the permission of the Minister, and where the watering is done on days upon which the use of a hose or a mechanical device is prohibited by this subparagraph, it shall be done only with a watering can or other container held in the hand;

(d) where the water is used for watering racecourses, sports grounds, bowling greens, croquet greens, tennis courts, golf courses or gardens appurtenant to any of the places aforesaid, no mechanical device shall be used at any time for the purposes of such watering, the water shall not be used for such watering on any day other than Monday and Friday in any week, and on Mondays and Fridays such watering shall be done only with a watering can or other container held in the hand or with a hose held in the hand.




Figure 18 .- School Sign.
