The Game Act, 1912-1915. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
over the State of Western Australia
and its Dependencies in the Common[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-1913, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically a Magrapose a construction. fically as Macropus giganteus: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declaration contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the 1st day of October, 1940, until the 31st day of December, 1940.

(1) The Dandarragan Road District; (2) All that part of the Gingin Road District lying to the west of the Midland Railway Line;

(3) The Sussex Land District.

The Fisheries Act, 1905-1938.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lleutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Listing IL.s.]

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1938 it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from—(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

- (1) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of August, 1940, until the thirty-first day of December, 1940, inclusive.
- (2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of October, 1940, until the thirty-first day of December, 1940, inclusive.
- (3) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the sixteenth day of May, 1940, until the thirty-first day of December, 1940, inclusive.
- (4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the first day of July, 1940, until the thirty-first day of October, 1940, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying west of the north-eastern extremity of North Point (on the northern side of the said island) and west of the south-western extremity of Salmon Point (on the southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the north-western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the south-eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—On the west by a line drawn in a northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the western side of the bar) thence by a line drawn to a point on the foreshore lying a quarter of a mile north-east of the bar at the entrance to Peel's Inlet, wherever such bar may be.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

WHEREAS by sections 223 and 228 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1938 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Conneil, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the Bunbury Municipal Conneil has requested that certain lands, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which have been used or acquired for a street or way within the Municipality of Bunbury, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be a public highway, and such lands shall from the date of this Proclamation be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

By-law No. 28.

Hoardings, Advertisements, Signboards, Illuminated Signs, etc.

P.W. 1365/35.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1939, and the Acts amending the same, and in the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, and of all other powers thereto them enabling, the mayor and councillors of the Municipality of Geraldton do order as follows:

- 1. The previous by-law No. 28 be repealed and be replaced by a new by-law No. 28.
 - 2. In the construction of this by-law—
 - (a) "Advertising device" shall mean and include sign, signboard, awning, blind, illuminated sign, hearding, poster, or other advertisement;
 - (b) "Approved" shall mean approved by the building surveyor;
 - (c) "The building surveyor" shall mean the building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the time being of the Municipality of Geraldton;

- (d) "Council" shall mean the Council of the
- (d) "Council" shall mean the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton;
 (e) "Illuminated sign" shall mean every sign, signboard, poster, or advertisement lighted or capable of being lighted, whether from within or from without, by electric or other light, if such light is provided solely or mainly for the purpose of lighting such sign, signboard, poster, or advertisement;
 (f) "Municipality" shall mean the Municipality of Geraldton:

of Geraldton;
(g) "Roof sign" shall mean any sign which projects more than 2 ft. above the eaves or parajects more than 21t. above the caves or para-pet of any building. Any sign which pro-jects higher than the ridge of the roof of the building to which it is attached shall be classified as a roof sign, also.

Part I.-Signboards, Awnings, Blinds, etc.

No person shall erect or maintain, and no occupier of any premises shall permit to remain on his premises any sign, signboard, awning, blind, or other advertising device, other than an illuminated sign, over or near any footway or roadway within the municipality without a written license from the Council, or, except in accordance with and upon the terms and conditions of such license, and such license shall be granted

only upon the terms and conditions contained in this by-law. Applications for licenses under this Part, which shall be in the form of Schedule 1 or Schedule 3 hereto, shall be made annually, and every license granted hereunder shall expire on the 31st day of October next following the date of issue.

- 4. (1) In cases where there is a verandah, signs and signboards-
 - (a) shall be fixed on the outer plate or fascia of the verandah, parallel with the kerb, and shall be of a maximum depth of two feet,
 - (b) shall be under the roof of the veraudah securely and rigidly fixed to the T-iron or rafter and following absolutely the contour of the verandah at right angles to the building line, and of a maximum depth of 12 inches. Signs under the verandah may be fixed to each rib, provided that the minimum distance between any two signs shall be 6 feet; or
 - (e) shall be above the roof of the verandah, but not attached thereto, and shall be securely bolted to the building alignment wall, and shall be not more than 2 feet deep. Except, in the case of approved angle signs (see clause 5), shall be parallel to the building alignment wall, and there shall be no intervening spaces between the base of such signs or signboards and the wall, but they may be inclined outwards so that a space of not more than six inches intervenes between the top and the wall. Not more than one such sign or signboard shall be erected on any one storey of a building.
- (2) In cases where there is no verandah, signs and signboards shall be securely bolted and attached to the building alignment wall and parallel thereto and not more than 2ft, in depth. There shall be no intervening space between the base of such signs or signboards and the wall, but they may be inclined outwards so that a space of not more than 6in. intervenes between the top and the wall. Not more than one such sign or signboard shall be erected on any one storey of a building.
- 5. Angle signs will be permitted above verandahs and on the face of buildings where no verandahs exist, providing:
 - (a) no angle sign shall be more than 2ft, in depth;
 - (b) the base of each sign (viz., one end) must be actually attached to the wall, fixed securely with bolts. Both ends must be bolted to the wall where two-way angle signs are erected;
 - (e) no part of an angle sign will be permitted to extend more than 2ft. from the wall, measared from the face of the wall to the outer face of the sign;
 - (d) all angle signs must be securely and rigidly fixed with angle iron brackets bolted to wall. Plan and design of sign showing details of framework and method of fixing to accompany application.
- 6. In no case shall glass be used in the construction of signs or signboards.
 - Roof signs are prohibited.
- 8. Sign and signboards shall be so placed as to allow a headway of not less than 8ft, from the lowest portion thereof to the surface of the footway or roadway.
- 9. Awnings and blinds, other than blinds attached to the face of a building, shall be of a colour to be approved by the building surveyor, and there shall be no advertisement or writing of any kind thereon. They shall be so constructed that the lowest part thereof cannot hang lower than 6ft. 6in. above the level of the footway and, when down, shall be fixed rigidly.
- 10. No sign, signboard, awning or blind shall be so erected as to obstruct access to or from any door, fire escape, or window other than a window designed for the display of goods.
- 11. Applications for licenses for signs, signboards, awnings, and blinds, and licenses for the same under this Part of this by-law shall be in the form of Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4 hereto.

- (a) A fee of 2/6 shall be paid to the Council on the issue of any license under this Part: Provided, however, that no fee shall be payable on the issue of a license which is purely a renewal of a license issued during the preceding licensing year.
- (b) A fee of 2/6 shall be paid by the applicant in respect of approval, under clause 29 of this by-law, of a transfer of a license issued under this Part.
- 13. Any sign, signboard, awning, or blind for which a license is issued under this Part of this by-law may be removed by the building surveyor, at the cost of the holder of the license, in the event of any of the conditions of the licenses not being complied with.

Part II.-Illuminated Signs.

- 14. No person shall erect or maintain, and no occupier of any premises shall permit to remain on his premises, any illuminated sign over or near any public place, footway, street, or road without a license in writing issued by the Council and signed by the building surveyor.
- Applications for licenses under this Part, which shall be in the form of Schedule 5 hereto, shall be made annually, and every license granted hereunder shall expire on the 31st day of October next following the date of issue.
 - 16. Roof signs are prohibited.
- 17. Licenses for illuminated signs shall only be issued subject to the following conditions:-
 - (a) Illuminated signs under verandalis or balconies: i) shall be at right angles to the building line;
 - (ii) the bottom of such signs shall be at least 8 ft.
 from surface of footway or roadway;
 (iii) shall be so fixed that the centre coincides with
 - the centre line of the verandah or balcony; (iv) shall be so fixed that the minimum distance
 - between any two signs shall be six feet.
- (b) Illuminated box signs under verandals or balconies shall comply with the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof and also with the following provisions, namely:-
 - (i) the depth of the sign shall not exceed 1 ft., the width shall not exceed 8 in., and the length shall not exceed 8 ft.;
 - (ii) the sign shall be rigidly attached to an approved manner, either to a rafter of a pillar verandah or to a truss of a cantilever verandah:
 - (iii) the sign shall not exceed in weight ten pounds per lineal foot.
- (e) Horizontal illuminated signs (excluding under verandahs and balcomes) shall not be of a greater depth than 2 ft., nor shall project more than 2 ft. from the face of the building to which they are attached. Only one sign shall be permitted to each storey of a building, but such sign may occupy laterally the full width of the storey.
- (d) Vertical illuminated signs shall not have a projection of more than 2 ft. beyond the face of the building to which they are fixed, excluding embellishments thereon; shall not have a width of more than 2 ft. 6 in., measured on the face of the building to which they are fixed; and shall have a clear horizontal space of not less than 12 ft. between each such sign.
- (e) No alteration of the characters or other matter on a sign shall be made without the written approval of the Council, and application for such approval shall be made by the holder of the license in respect of such sign and shall be accompanied by a fee of 5s.
- (f) Materials and designs:—All illuminated signs shall be constructed of materials and after a design to be approved by the building surveyor; with the exception of the insulation of wires all materials then. tion of the insulation of wires, all materials shall be incombustible; lamps must not be enclosed with bunting or other combustible material.
- (g) Construction and installation; illuminated signs shall be constructed, installed, and maintained in a safe, secure, and workmanlike manner and to the satisfaction of the building surveyor.
- (h) Electric installations:-The electric installation in connection with illuminated signs shall be carried ont in a workmanlike manner, to the satisfaction of the manager of the Electricity Department of the Municipality of Geraldton, and in accordance with the regulations of the Municipality of Geraldton and of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Western Australia.

- (i) If any glass is embodied in the construction of any illuminated sign such glass shall be so protected that, in case of breakage, it shall be prevented from falling to the footway or roadway.
- (j) No part of any illuminated sign shall be less than 8ft. above the footway or 10ft, above a roadway.
- (k) Illuminated signs shall be descriptive, whether by words or symbols only, of :-
 - (i) the name of the occupier or occupiers of the premises to which such signs are attached:
 - (ii) the business carried on by such occupier or occupiers on such premises;
 - (iii) one or more things sold by such occupier or occupiers in course of such business.
- The maintenance and use of illuminated signs shall be in accordance with the following conditions:--
 - (a) the light from illuminated signs shall at no time be sufficiently intense to cause any annoyance to the public.
 - (b) Flashing and intermittent illuminated signs shall be allowed to continue the flashing and intermittent effects between only such hours as the Council shall at their discretion from time to time prescribe.
 - (c) Illuminated signs shall at all times be maintained as illuminated signs, and shall be kept in safe, secure, proper, and cleanly condition, to the satisfaction of the building surveyor and in accordance with the provisions of this by-law.
- 19. Licenses shall be granted, continued, and renewed at the absolute discretion of the Council, and on any failure by any license holder to comply with all or any of the conditions or requirements set forth in this by-law, the Council may serve on such license holder notice in writing to conform to the by-laws, or to remove the illuminated sign in respect of which the breach of this by-law has been committed, within eight days, and on the failure of such license holder to comply with the requirements of such notice, the Council may forthwith, at the risk and expense of such license holder remove or have removed such illuminated sign: Provided that, if any illuminated sign is in the opinion of the building surveyor in a condition dangerous to the public, the building surveyor may forthwith, without any notice to the license holder, and at the license holdier's expense and risk, remove or have removed such illuminated sign.
- Licenses granted under this Part of this by-law shall be in the form of Schedule 6 hereto.
- (a) A fee of 5/- shall be paid to the Council on the issue of any license under this Part: Provided, however, that no fee shall be payable on the issue of a license which is purely a renewal of a license issued during the preceding licensing year.
- (b) A fee of 5/- shall be paid by the applicant in respect of approval under clause 29 of this by-law of a transfer of a license issued under this Part.
- 22. No license under Part I. of this by-law shall be necessary in respect of any sign for which a license under this Part is in force.

Part III .- General.

- 23. Immediately this by-law becomes law, every advertising device shall, if it does not already do so, be altered to conform with this by-law and be licensed, or otherwise it shall be taken down and removed.
- 24. (a) Nothing in this by-law contained shall be deemed to authorise or permit any act, matter, or thing which is prohibited by any Town Planning Scheme passed by the Council under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928.
- (b) No person shall erect or maintain, and no occupier of any premises shall permit to remain on his premises, any hoarding, and no person shall post any bill, or paint, steneil, place or affix an advertisement upon any hoarding, or upon any building, fence, verandah or other place abutting upon or facing into any street, or way, except in so far as the doing that act or thing is permitted or authorised by or under the foregoing provisions hereof, and is not prohibited by any such Town Planning Scheme.

- 25. No advertising device shall be constructed wholly or partly of calico, canvas, paper, or other flimsy material, except that a license may be issued for any such advertising device of a temporary nature; such license to be for a maximum period of one month.
- 26. The Council shall have the absolute right to refuse a license for any advertising device.
- 27. No advertising device shall be erected so as to obstruct any view from any roadway or public place which in the opinion of the Council should not be ob-
- 28. Every advertising device shall bear on its face at the top left hand corner, in figures legible from the nearest road or way, the number of the license under which it is erected or displayed.
- 29. Any license issued under this by-law may, with the approval of the Council and upon payment of the prescribed fee, be transferred by the licensee to any persons who has acquired, as purchaser, lessee, or otherwise, the possession of the premises upon which the sign the subject of the license is erected, but subject, as aforesaid, a license shall enure for the benefit of the licensee named therein only.
- 30. If any person shall contravene any of the provisions of this by-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, or, if such contravention is in the nature of a continuing effence, then to a daily penalty not exceeding £2.

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906-1939. City of Fremantle.

P.W. 1331/34

By-law of the City of Fremantle, made pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1939, Numbered 152, for regulating movable or temporarily fixed Stalls.

Regulation of Movable and Temporarily Fixed Stalls. IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the City of Fremantle orders as follows:-

No person shall stand with any movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drinks, catables, or any articles of merchandise in or near any street or way within the City of Fremantle, except he be duly licensed by the City of Fremantle so to do.

- 2. No person shall stand with any movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or any articles of merchandisc, except during the hours particulated in the biomes growted for such stall mentioned in the license granted for such stall.
- 3. For the purpose of this by-law a stall includes a barrow, truck, eart, handcart, earriage, shelf, or temporary building, or any other thing from which any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise may be sold or offered for sale.

Conditions under which Licenses may be Granted.

- 4. No person shall use any movable temporarily fixed stall in or near any street, within the Municipality of Fremantle, unless he be previously licensed by the City of Fremantle so to do.
- 5. The City of Fremantle may in its discretion grant such licenses to any person requiring the same, on application being made to it therefor, and may refuse any such license without assigning a reason.
- 6. The City of Fremantle doth hereby prohibit any person from using any movable or temporarily fixed stall as aforesaid unless he be duly licensed in manner aforesaid.

Fees to be Paid for Movable or Temporarily Fixed Stalls.

7. For movable or temporarily fixed stall-For sale of meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, merchandise—£1 per month.

Penalties.

8. Any person committing an offence against this by-law shall on conviction forthwith pay a sum not exceeding five pounds (£5).

Repeals.

9. All previous by-laws of the City of Fremantle in force at the time of passing this by-law dealing with matters mentioned in this by-law are hereby repealed.
