WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-13, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus giganteus*: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and con-sent of the Executive Council, exempt from the opera-tions of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declara-tion contained therein all those localities mentioned tion contained therein all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the 1st day of November, 1940, until the 30th day of April, 1941.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 17 of the IN pursuance of the provisions of section 17 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1938, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby declare:-(1) That with respect to nets known as or called "mesh-ing nets," to be used or intended to be used in the waters of Bandy Creek (in the vicinity of Esperance) for catching all species of marine fish, nets of two hundred yards in length having meshes of three and

one half inches throughout shall be lawful nets; (2) that with respect to nets known as "seine nets," to be used or intended to be used in the waters of Bandy Creek (in the vicinity of Esperance) for catching all species of marine fish, nets of two hundred yards in length having a bunt of one hundred yards in length, or one-third of the total length of net in use or intended to be used, whichever is the less, and having meshes in the wings of three inches and in the bunt of one inch shall be lawful nets.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 17 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1938, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:-

- (a) that with respect to nets known as or called "meshing-nets" for catching all species of marine fish, nets of 150 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 21/4 inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Koombana Bay and Leschenault Estuary, be lawful nets;
- (b) that with respect to nets known as or called "set-nets" for catching all species of marine fish, nets of 100 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 31/2 inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of that part of Leschenault Estuary north of a straight line drawn from the south-eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the north-western corner of Leschenault Location 31, be lawful nets;
- (c) that with respect to nets known as or called
 "pilchard-nets" for catching yellow-eye mullet or pilchard, nets of 100 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 21% inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Koombana Bay and Leschenault Estuary, be lawful nets;
- (d) that with respect to nets known as or called "whiting-nets" for catching all species of whiting, nets of 50 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 2 inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Koombana Bay and Leschenault Estuary, be lawful nets.
- (e) that with respect to nets known as or called "garfish-nets" for catching all species of garfish, nets of 50 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 11/2 inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Koombana Bay, be lawful nets.

The paragraph numbered (2) and the Second Locality Schedule of the Proclamation dated 20th December, 1916 (published in Government Gazette of 22nd December, 1916), as subsequently amended by Proclamations dated 8th July and 27th October, 1931, respectively, and the Proclamation dated the 5th November, 1930 (published in *Government Gazette* of 14th November, 1930), referring to lawful nets used or intended to be used in Leschenault Estuary, are hereby revoked.

The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and mainton-ance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more they are such denotes in the area the Faujument more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the disofficer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, disofficers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fir-fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge so the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members;
(b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates :---

- 10 0 (ii) Other persons-a minimum subscription \mathbf{of} 50

(3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called up, and who sign an undertaking in the form con-tained in the First Schedule of these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for firefighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., in payment of services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. The meetings of the Brigade shall be held during the months of October and December of each year and at such other times as deemed necessary.

These by laws, under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Perenjori Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Perenjori, on 12th April, 1940.

CEMETERIES ACT, 1897. By-laws Wandering Public Cemetery.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

Perth, 30th October, 1940.

Corres. No. 701/33. HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of the above Act, of the following by-laws for the control and management of the Wandering Public Cemetery.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Wandering General Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following by-laws.

All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as 1. set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

Any person desiring to inter a dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form con-tained in the Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in the Schedule C.

All applications for interment shall be made at 3. the office of the secretary in such time as to allow at least eight working hours' notice being given to the least eight working hours' notice being given to the superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for appli-cations within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours' notice being given as above notice being given as above.

The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required.

Before any interment is allowed, the Order for 5. Burial shall be handed to and retained by the superintendent.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this by-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 7 ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 ft. 6 in. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. Unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.

The hours for burial shall be as follows :-- 1st 10. September to 30th April—week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

11. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery.

Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery shall be in charge of some responsible person.

14. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any fireworks be discharged therein.

15. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erec-tion, or in any way infringing these by-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

17. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of adver-tisement whatsoever, and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

18. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily in-terested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

19. Subject to the by-laws, the superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all mat-ters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

Any person wanting an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing, specifying the location of the grave or vault, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such applications shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

21. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the co11struction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a grant in the Form E in the Schedule.

22. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a Grant in the Form E in the Schedule.

23. Every such Grant shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless on production

of the Order for Burial aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees

24. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, nuless special exemption be obtainable, in writing, from the Trustees.

25. If application be made for an Order for Burial in any grave or vanit of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

26. Any person desiring to place or erect any monu-ment, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Ceme-tery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897.

27. Every tombstone, monunent, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

The materials used in every such erection shall 28.be subject to the approval of the superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

29. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.

30. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, de-posit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding by-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

31. All materials required in the erection and completion of any such work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

32. No catacomb shall be allowed.

33. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an Order for Burial shall, within three months from the date of the application, cause to be placed upon the grave mentioned in the application a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault.

34. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

No trees or shrubs shall be plauted on any grave, 35. except such as shall be approved by the superintendent.

36. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst work-ing within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these regulations and hy-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said superintendent, shall be liable to expulsion from the Cemetery.

37. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule F; such license to be renewed annually in the month of January.

38. Any person taking part in dressing or attend-ing to any grave shall comply with the following rules:

- (a) No rubbish, soil, saud, or other material re-moved in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immedi-ately the work is completed;
- ately the work is completed;
 (b) no sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the superintendent;
 (c) the dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of any such material shall be subject to the supervision of the superintendent.

(d) work in all cases to be carried on with due dispatch, and only during regulation hours.
