### PROCLAMATION

Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-  
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared in the Nelson District, at the Tone River: now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the areas more particularly described in the Schedule hereto to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

Nelson (Tone River—No. 21945):—Bounded by lines commencing at the south-eastern corner of Location 7986 and extending westward along the southern boundaries of Location 7986 aforesaid and Locations 7985, 7984, and 7976 to the latter's south-western corner; thence north along the west boundaries of said Location 7976 and Location 7977 and onward to the left bank of the Tone River; thence generally northward along said left bank of river to the production south of the east boundary of Location 785; thence north along said production and part of the east boundary of said Location 785 to the production west of the south boundary of Location 4356; thence east and north along said production and boundaries of said Location 4356 to its north-east corner; thence east along the south boundaries of Locations 6433 and 9837 and onward to the production north of the east boundary of Location 7991; thence south to and along the east boundaries of said Location 7991 and Locations 7990, 7989, and 7986 to the starting point (excluding surveyed roads) (about 14,600 acres).

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (5) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that it shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies, excepting those in certain districts named in the subsection, to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week, subject to the provisions of the said subsection, and that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation issued on the petition of a majority of the shopkeepers affected, determine the day on which such shops shall so remain open in each week for any district: And whereas by Proclamation made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of March, 1938, the Governor proclaimed and determined that the day in each week on which all shops in the Black Range Shop District shall remain open until nine o'clock in the evening shall be Saturday: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the shopkeepers in the Black Range Shop District, praying that the day on which such shops in that district shall remain open until nine o'clock in the evening shall be Friday instead of Saturday: And whereas it is deemed desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition and to repeal and revoke the aforesaid Proclamation: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 100 (5) of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, do hereby repeal and revoke the Proclamation issued under the said section in respect of the Black Range Shop District and published in the

*Government Gazette* on the 18th day of March, 1938, and do hereby proclaim and determine that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the day in each week on which all shops in the Black Range Shop District shall remain open until nine o'clock in the evening shall be Friday.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act between the hours of six o'clock and nine o'clock in the evening of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in every week during the period commencing on the first day of January, 1941, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1941, in so far as it applies to the closing time of shops conducted in open markets which are kept open for the conduct of business therein between the times aforesaid and on the days aforesaid, and in which shops home-made jams and preserves, honey, butter (other than factory butter), and eggs, hams and bacon (not being factory hams or bacon), are sold or offered for sale: provided that only the said goods shall be sold or offered for sale between the said times by virtue of this Proclamation, and the said shops shall not be kept open for the sale or offering for sale of any other goods which cannot otherwise be lawfully sold or offered for sale between the times aforesaid.

1. The War Funds Regulation Act Regulations, 1940, are amended by inserting after regulation 5 a new regulation, to stand as regulation 5A, as follows:—

**Withdrawal of Authorisation.**

5A. (1) The Council may, in respect of any war fund for which a general or particular authorisation has been granted, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, or by notice in writing to the person or persons who applied for the authorisation of the fund, or to the Trustees thereof, at any time withdraw its authorisation or vary or add to the conditions imposed at the time of the authorisation, and may in the same manner revoke or vary any such notice.

(2) Where the Council has withdrawn its authorisation for the establishment of any war fund, it may give such directions to the Trustees and take such other action as appears desirable for the purpose of winding up the affairs of the fund and for ensuring that any moneys in the fund are disbursed in a proper manner. Any Trustees failing to comply with any direction given by the Council in this behalf shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation and shall be liable, both jointly and severally, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

(3) The powers granted to the Council by this regulation are in addition to the powers which may be granted by Proclamations issued under sections 5 and 6 of the Act.

- (2) At the expiration of any period limited by the notice mentioned in the last preceding sub-clause, the provision of sanitary conveniences to the number mentioned in such notice shall be deemed to be prescribed in respect of such premises by this by-law.
- (3) The local authority may by notice require the owner and/or occupier of any house, public place, or private place to remove therefrom any sanitary convenience constructed or equipped otherwise than in accordance with these by-laws.

THE Dumbleyung Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, and the Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882, hereby appoint Kukerin District Pound, situate Reserve 15526, to be a Public Pound for the Merilup and Kukerin Wards of the Dumbleyung Road District.

(1) A new regulation, to stand as regulation 82A, is inserted after regulation 82 as follows:—

Fittings, etc., to be above Flood Level.

82A. (1) No inlets or openings shall be placed, or, if already placed, shall be permitted to remain placed in such positions that any extraneous water, due to rise of subsoil water level, or from any river, bay, gully or creek, or any other source, whether in flood or otherwise, may gain access to the Minister's sewers.

(2) Without in any way limiting the generality of paragraph (1) of this regulation in areas liable to be flooded or affected by rise of subsoil water level, no person shall place in position for use any fitting, fixture, or apparatus having an inlet or opening into any drain or into any sewer of the Minister unless the inlet or opening is above a level fixed by the Minister for the particular district or locality; such level providing a safe margin above the highest known subsoil water level or flood level.

The Schedule.

ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909-1931.

Katanning Road Board District Regulations.

1. These regulations shall operate and be in force in the Katanning Road Board District as declared for the time being and from time to time under the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1931.

2. In these regulations—

- “Act” means the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1931;
- “Board” means the Katanning Road Board;
- “Carcass” means the whole or any portion of the flesh, wool, skin, hide, bones, hair, hoofs, and offal of any stock;
- “The abattoir” means the land, buildings and plant owned by the Katanning Road Board and established as an abattoir on Pinwernyng Sub. Lot 36 at Katanning;

“Inspector” means the inspector appointed by the Katanning Road Board, who shall be the officer in charge of the abattoirs;

“Large stock” means and includes bulls, bullocks, cows, steers, heifers, and calves over 200 lbs.;

“Person” includes a body of persons, whether corporate or incorporate;

“Staff” means and includes every person engaged in or about the abattoir, being an employee paid by the Katanning Road Board;

“Stock” has the meaning prescribed by the Act and includes sheep and lambs;

“Vehicle” includes every description of cart, wagon, carriage, motor, and any other conveyance.

Duties of Officer in Charge.

3. It shall be the duty of the officer in charge—
- (a) to control and direct the working of the abattoir;
  - (b) to see that the provisions of the Act and the regulations are duly observed and complied with, and, if necessary, to enforce the same;
  - (c) to see that all prescribed fees and charges are collected.

Hours of Business.

4. The abattoir shall be open for business on every week day, except on Saturdays and holidays observed at the abattoir. The hours during which the abattoir shall be open shall be fixed from time to time by the officer in charge.

Inspection.

5. No carcass shall be removed from the abattoir until it has been examined, passed, and branded by the inspector.

6. No carcass or any portion thereof shall be removed from the abattoir in any vehicle of any description, unless such vehicle is clean and provided with a suitable clean cover.

7. Every person engaged in slaughtering or loading or driving vehicles of any description, or engaged in any work connected with the preparation and transport of meat from the abattoir to the shops, shall wear clothing which is clean.

Condemned Carcasses.

8. Should the whole or part of any carcass or offal be condemned by the inspector, it shall be destroyed by fire under the direction of the inspector.

Food and Drink to Animals.

9. Every person who shall bring animals to the abattoir and keep same there for more than twenty-four hours shall provide them with sufficient food and water, and, if such person fails to provide such food and water, the officer in charge shall provide the same at the cost of the said person or the owner of such animals.

Arrival of Stock.

10. Animals for slaughter will be received at the abattoir at any hour between sunrise and sunset, but they will not be permitted to occupy the abattoir pens or small holding pens for a longer period than twenty-four hours before being slaughtered.

Slaughtering Elsewhere than in the Abattoir Prohibited.

11. No animal intended for sale for human consumption shall be slaughtered within the district in which these regulations operate and are in force, except at the abattoir.

Slaughtering.

12. (a) Any person wishing to slaughter stock in the abattoir shall make application to the officer in charge, who will direct when and in what portion of the abattoir such stock shall be slaughtered, and the owner and employees of the owner shall be bound to observe such direction and to conform to all the regulations of the establishment, and no stock shall be slaughtered at any time or in any part of the abattoir otherwise than as directed by the officer in charge.

(b) Any person having obtained permission to slaughter any stock under the preceding clause shall be required to thoroughly cleanse the section of the abattoir occupied by them on the completion of such slaughtering each day and to remove all manure, blood, offal, or other waste as required by the officer in charge.

Damage to Plant or Equipment.

13. Any person damaging or removing plant, gear, or equipment belonging to any part of the establishment shall pay the cost thereof to the Katanning Road Board.

Instructions by the Inspector to be Observed.

14. Every person using the abattoir shall promptly obey any instructions issued by the inspector relative to the inspection or preparation of any carcass, or the provision of the Health Act, 1911-1935, and the regulations or by-laws made thereunder.

No carcass of meat will be examined or branded where the viscera, lymphatic glands, pleura or peritoneum have been removed or tampered with, except by the authority of the inspector.

Offal not to remain on Floor.

15. No offal or viscera of any kind shall be allowed to remain on the floor of the slaughterhouse, but must be placed in receptacles provided for the purpose.

Fees.

16. Fees to be charged for the use of the abattoir, inclusive of inspection, shall be as follows:—

For every pig .. ..	2	0

Payment of Fees.

17. Every person shall pay to the officer appointed to collect abattoir fees, the fees payable for slaughtering and inspection and for feeding stock, and any other charges incurred before the carcasses are removed from the abattoir, and the officer in charge may at any time refuse to allow to be removed from the abattoir all or any carcasses, skins, hides, or fat belonging to any person until he shall have paid all such fees as are due by him.

Board to have Lien for Fees.

18. The Katanning Road Board shall have a lien on all stock, carcasses, skins, hides or fat for the time being in the establishment of any person indebted to the abattoir, and if any person shall make default for seven days in payment of any fees due by him to the abattoir, the Board may, without making any demand or giving notice, sell by public auction or private contract all or any of such stock, carcasses, skins, hides, or fat, and receive the net proceeds thereof, and, after deducting all fees due to the abattoir, he shall pay the balance or surplus thereof to such person or to whom he may direct.

Storing Hides and Skins.

19. Owners of skins and hides will be allowed to store, free of charge, in the building provided for the purpose all skins and hides, for six days after slaughter; at the expiration of that time they shall be removed as directed by the officer in charge.

Conduct of Persons in the Abattoir.

20. No person in the abattoir shall—
- (a) behave in a disorderly or indecent manner; or
  - (b) commit any act of dishonesty therein; or
  - (c) be or remain in the abattoir if he has no legitimate business therein, or if he has at any time committed a breach of paragraphs (a) or (b) of this regulation.

Not to Enter without Permission.

21. No person, other than such as shall be employed or engaged upon or in connection with the business or work of the abattoir, shall enter the establishment without the permission of the officer in charge.

Persons may be Removed from Abattoir.

22. Any person contravening regulations 18 or 19 hereof, or being intoxicated, may be removed from the abattoir at the direction of the officer in charge, and thereafter may be refused admission to the abattoir by the officer in charge.

Dogs at large may be Destroyed.

23. No owner or person having the charge or control of any dog shall take the same into the abattoir or permit or suffer such dog to enter therein, except when used in driving stock; after such stock is yarded the dog must be tied up in the place appointed for that purpose.

24. Any dog, whether having been used for driving stock or not, which is found in any of the slaughterhouses, whether in charge of any person or not, or at large in or upon the abattoir, may be instantly destroyed, and the owner shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

Employment of Boys.

25. No boy apparently under the age of fourteen years shall be employed at the abattoir in any capacity whatsoever.

General.

26. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, any person using the abattoir or employed therein, shall carry out any reasonable instructions issued by the officer in charge which may be necessary in the interests of the smooth-working of the establishment.
