FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with section 7, sub-section (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:---

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Award-Shop Assistants (Albany).

(No. 7 of 1938.)

Between the West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Ezywalkin, Limited; Drew, Robinson & Company, and others mentioned in the Schedule annexed hereto, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said Agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

1.--Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the industries mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder and to the respondents set out in the second column of the said Schedule and to other persons, firms, companies, carrying on similar businesses in respect of workers employed by the said respondents following the vocations mentioned herein: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

2.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the Post Office, Albany.

3.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date of its delivery, subject to the right to apply to amend in pursuance of the Act.

4.—Definitions.

(a) "Shop assistant" shall mean a worker employed receiving and/or selling and/or assembling or preparing goods for sale or delivery and shall include cashiers.

(b) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that a casual hand may be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one day. A worker engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate.

(c) "Adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.

(d) The term "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side; such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided that any worker employed for not more than four consecutive weeks shall be classed **as** a casual hand and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where the services of a worker employed as a weekly hand have been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or for any cause referred to in clause 15 hereof.

5.-Chemist Shops.

Any worker employed in a chemist shop shall be subject to the terms of this Agreement up to the time he or she becomes indentured to the profession.

6.-Hours.

The hours of work shall be as follow:----

(a) Forty-seven (47) hours shall constitute a week's work for males sixteen (16) years of age and over: Provided that such weekly working hours shall be reduced to forty-six (46) and remain at forty-six (46)while the closing time for receiving goods at the Railway Goods Sheds at Albany is fixed at 10 a.m. and no earlier.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for females and for males under sixteen (16) years of age.

(b) Except as provided in subclauses (c), (e), and (f) of this clause the hours of work shall be performed as follow:—

- (i) Between 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., on five (5) days of the week, excluding Sunday;
- (ii) Between 8.30 a.m. and 1 p.m., on the day observed as a half holiday.

(c) The hours of workers employed in shops comprised in the Fourth Schednle of the Factories and Shops Act shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employers: Provided that the workers shall be notified of the half day (which shall be granted to and taken by the worker on an afternoon in each week) upon which his or her services shall not be required.

(d) The employer of workers in Fourth Schedule shops shall post or cause to be posted and keep posted up in a conspicuous position in his shop, so as to be easily accessible to and easily read by every worker in his employ in such Fourth Schedule shop during working hours on every day, a roster setting out the following particulars:---

- (i) The name and sex of each worker;
- (ii) The class of work performed;
- (iii) The time at which each worker is required to commence and finish work on each day in each week;
- (iv) The hours in each day during which the worker is entitled to be off duty during each day;
- (v) The time allowed for meals on each day;
- (vi) The day in each week allowed as a half holiday and the time from which such half holiday is allowed.

The particulars contained in such roster shall be in respect of the week, Monday to Sunday, inclusive, during which it is posted up, and may be altered or varied only on account of the sickness or absence of a worker or on account of a contingency that the employer could not reasonably be expected to foresee.

(e) The hours of workers employed in chemist and druggist shops shall be in conformity with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937.

(f) On the day mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto to be observed as Christmas Eve for the purpose of a late shopping night, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties. (g) The spread of ordinary hours (inclusive of any meal hour) for all workers bound by this Agreement shall be as under:—

- (i) Where a forty-seven (47) hour week is worked —nine (9) hours thirty (30) minutes in any one day.
- (ii) Where a forty-six (46) hour week is worked nine (9) hours twenty (20) minutes in any one day.

The foregoing spreads of hours will not apply on the day upon which the Christmas Eve late shopping night is observed.

7.-Meal Times.

(a) One hour shall be given and taken for all meals. Lunch hour shall be between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m. Tea hour shall start within forty-five (45) minutes of the prescribed finishing time.

(b) Fourth Schedule Shops:—Meal hours shall be taken at the times most convenient to the employer's business: Provided that one hour shall be given and taken for each meal, and that not more than five (5) or less than three (3) hours' interval shall be worked without an interval for a meal being given. The meal hours referred to in this clause shall be taken in one continuous period.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, the lunch hour for workers, other than those in Fourth Schedule shops shall, during the first two days of each of three sales per annun and during Christmas week, be given and taken between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

8.-Meal Money.

Workers who are subject to the starting and finishing times prescribed in clause 6 (b) of this Agreement shall, if required to continue working for more than one half hour after the prescribed finishing time, be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) as meal money.

9.—Overtime.

(a) Excepting as providing hereunder, all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. In the compilation of overtime, each day shall stand by itself.

(b) Where overtime is worked in Fourth Schedule
(b) Where overtime is worked in Fourth Schedule
shops, the worker shall be paid overtime as provided in
subclause (a) of this clause, after the prescribed weekly
hours of work have been exceeded. Work performed on
Sundays, the weekly half-holiday, and/or the prescribed
holidays, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
(c) Where workers are required to work continuously

(c) Where workers are required to work continuously after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked, they shall be paid at the rate of double time up to the time for finishing work: Provided that that hour shall not be later than the prescribed starting time the next day.

(d) All time worked in shops other than those referred to in subclause (b) hereof before the prescribed starting time or after the prescribed finishing time shall be paid for at overtime rates. Work performed in the afternoon of the day on which the weekly half holiday is observed, on Sundays and/or the prescribed holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

10.-Holidays.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of corvice. A worker way completion of each year of corvice.

(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing a year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment: Provided that, when a worker is entitled to holidays under this subclause, he shall receive at least two weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take his holidays.

(c) A worker who is summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this clause.

(d) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

11.---Wages.

rate. (d) Where a canvasser or collector provides his own bicycle, he shall be paid an allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week.

(e) Any person, whether a junior or adult, employed as a canvasser and/or collector shall be paid the full adult minimum rate. This subclause shall not apply in cases where an adult canvasser is absent from his employment on account of sickness, accident, or the holidays to which such adult canvasser is entitled under this Agreement.

(f) Casual hands:—Adult male and female workers shall be paid at the rate of threepence (3d.) per hour, in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein. Junior male and female workers shall be paid at the rate of one penny half-penny (1½d.) per hour in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein.

12 .- No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

13 .- Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

14.--Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five (5) male adults and thereafter one junior male to every two (2) male adults or fraction thereof.

(b) Where no adult shop assistant is employed, one junior shop assistant may be employed.

(c) Where one adult female assistant is employed, two (2) junior female assistants may be employed.

(d) Where two (2) adult female assistants are employed, three (3) junior female assistants may be employed.

(e) Where three (3) adult female assistants are employed, four (4) junior female assistants may be employed.

(f) Where four (4) adult female assistants are employed, five (5) junior female assistants may be employed, and thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five (5) junior female assistants to four (4) adult female assistants.

(g) For the purpose of determining the ratio of junor managers, when actively engaged in conducting the business of the establishment, shall be deemed to be senior assistants.

15.-Engagement.

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

16.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday, inclusive.

17 .--- Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or in-firmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) Pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

18.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Agree-ment, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of:--

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and condi-tions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Agreement.

19.-Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:-

- (a) Name in full;
- (b) Age and date of birth;

(c) Length of service with each previous employer. The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim for additional wages in the event of his age or length of service with a previous employer being wrongly stated on this certificate: Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

20.-Payment for sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such illhealth shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sick-

This clause shall not apply where the ness occurred. worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

The worker shall, if required by the employer, produce proof satisfactory to the employer of sickness.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreenient on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Conrt, pur-suant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Conrt:---

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

1.-Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the Sonth-West Land Division of the State: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, to which another industrial union of workers is a party.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall come into operation as from its date and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years: Provided that, at any time after the expira-

President.

tion of the first twelve (12) months from that date, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve (12) months, application may be made to the Court, by leave of the Court obtained, by any party to the Agreement for a review of any of the provisions of the Agreement, and the Court shall have power to vary or rescind such provisions.

3.-Wages.

(d) Casual hands:--Workers employed for less than one (1) week shall be classed as casual hands and paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the foregoing rates.

4.---Hours.

(a) Forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work until the 31st December, 1940, after which, fortyfour (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) In accordance with the provisions of subclause (a) of this clause, the forty-four (44) hour week shall commence on the 1st January, 1941, but the provisions this clause for a forty-four (44) hour week shall be deemed to have been complied with if an eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight (namely, one week of forty (40) hours and one week of forty-eight (48) hours) is worked: Provided further, that the eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight referred to herein shall only be applied after written permission to work same has been granted by the union.

(c) Subject to the provisions of subclause (b) of this clause, each worker shall have one half-day off duty each week; such half-day off duty shall be granted on the afternoon of the day considered most suitable by the employer. Where practicable, the half-day off duty shall be granted on a Saturday.

5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the hours prescribed in clause (4) shall be deemed to be overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two (2) hours and time and a half thereafter.

(b) Except as provided in subclause (a) of this clause, all work performed on Sunday or on a holiday shall be paid for at ordinary rates.

(c) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than two (2) hours, he shall be provided with the meal required, or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

6.-Holidays.

(a) All workers, except casual workers, shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave on full pay, at the expiration of each twelve (12) months' service: Provided that, if the contract of service is terminated during the year, the worker shall be entitled to holiday pay in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.

(b) Where a worker is dismissed for misconduct, or where the worker illegally severs his contract of service, he shall lose all rights under this clause.

(c) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatever.

7.--Higher Duties.

Any worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

8.—Absence through Sickness.

A worker, other than a cashal worker, shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each com-pleted month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his em-ployment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause, unless he produces satisfactory proof to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be en-titled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

9.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at the Factory Office a record, in which shall be entered :-

- (a) the name of each worker to whom this Agreement applies; (b) the nature of the work he is doing; (c) the hours worked each day.

 - (d) the amount of wages and overtime (if any) received by each worker each week; (e) the ages of junior workers.

The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union at any time during the ordinary working hours, and he shall be al-lowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

10.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement, an accredited representative of the union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission, without the consent of the employer, shall not be exercised more than once in any one week.

11 .--- Uniforms and Overalls.

If the worker is required to wear a uniform or overall, the employer shall provide same free for use by the worker.

12.-Contract of Service.

(a) A casual worker shall mean a worker employed for less than six consecutive working days and who may be discharged or leave the employer's service without notice.

(b) The contract of service of workers, other than easual workers, shall be terminable by one week's notice given on either side: Provided that such notice shall not apply in the case of a worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

13 .--- No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement is being paid higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed in this Agreement for his class of work.

14.-Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following:----

- (1) Name in full;
- (2) Age and date of birth;

(3) Name of each previous employer;

(4) Periods of employment with each previous employer.

(

This certificate shall be signed by the worker. No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age or period of employment with a previous employer being wrongly stated on the certificate.

15.-Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage, as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

16 .- Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of:---

- adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (2) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling in cheese manufacturing not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (3) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Agreement.

17.-Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any canse which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

I certify, pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 15 of 1940.)

THIS Industrial Agreement, made on the 28th day of October, one thousand nine hundred and forty, in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, between the Kalgoorlie Electric Power and Lighting Corporation, Limited (hereinafter called "The Company"), of the one part, and the Eastern Goldfields Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, of the other part (hereinafter called the "Organisation"), witnesseth that, for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the works owned and controlled by the Kalgoorlie Electric Power and Lighting Corporation, Limited, at Kalgoorlie.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate as from 6th November, 1940, and shall continue in force for a period of three (3) years, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration at any time after the expiration of twelve months from such date and/or at the end of any succeeding twelve months from the date of any such application to amend this Agreement.

3.—Wages.

Basic wage-£5 0s. 3d.

The minimum rate of wages payable under this Agreement shall be as follows:---

And thereafter the wages prescribed for adults.

(a) The first fourteen days of employment shall be on a daily basis.

4.-Hours of Labour.

Forty-four (44) hours, excluding Sunday, shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows:--

- Continuous shift workers:-Eighty-eight hours, excluding Sundays, shall constitute a fortnight's work, to be worked in alternate weeks of six shifts of eight hours one week and five shifts of eight hours the following week, and one shift relieved.
- Boiler cleaners:—Six (6) hours shall constitute a shift's work inside gas and water spaces of any boiler or flue in cleaning or scraping work in the case of boiler cleaner's working broken shifts, one hour of the above description of work shall count as one hour and twenty (20) minutes.

5.-Sunday Rates.

For all work done on Sundays shift workers shall be paid at the rate of time and a half and non-shift workers at double time.

6.—Overtime.

For all time worked on week days outside the prescribed honrs, overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours, and double time thereafter, except when such time is worked:---

- (a) by arrangement between the employees themselves, with the consent of the Company;
- (b) for the purpose of effecting the periodical rotation of shifts;
- (c) in consequence of the relieving man not coming on duty at the proper time, in which cases (a), (b), and (c) ordinary rates shall be paid for the time so worked.

Provided that, where in case (c) the relieving man fails for more than two hours to come on duty, any such time worked after the said period of two hours shall be paid at overtime rates.

7.-Holidays.

All employees shall be entitled to three holidays, hereinafter mentioned, without pay, viz.:--Christmas Day, Easter Monday, and Labour Day. All work performed on those days shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

8.—Annual Leave.

Annual leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Management, between the months of September and April, workers to receive four (4) weeks' notice of the date on which the holiday is to commence. A committee of three (3) to be appointed to assist the Management in the arrangement of a suitable roster.

All employees shall be granted, once in each year, fourteen conscentive days' holiday, which shall include twelve (12) working days, for which the employee shall be paid two weeks' wages. If the employment is determined before the holiday is due, the employee shall be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every complete month of his service or portion of a month.

In the case of a continuous process where workers are relieved on week days, each shift so relieved shall be connted as having been worked, for the purpose of computing annual holidays.

A pieceworker shall be entitled to be paid, when on holiday, the minimum rate for his grade.

Workers shall not be entitled to receive their holiday pay mutil the last pay preceding the date on which the holiday is to be taken.

9.—Payment of Wages.

(a) The payment for shift work, overtime, Sundays, and holidays shall be computed on the hourly basis obtained by dividing the weekly wage by the wekly hours.

(b) Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the Company's office, if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing.

Payment of wages shall be fortnightly on Fridays.

10.-Change Room.

A suitable change room, supplied with heating appliance, wash basins, hot and cold showers, shall be provided for the employees.

11.-Union Official.

A duly accredited official of the union shall be allowed to collect union fees at the office on pay days, and he shall be allowed to inspect the time sheets and pay sheets relating to any worker affected by this Agreement, and make extracts therefrom.

12 .- Breakdowns, etc.

For the purpose of setting out plainly the exact method of procedure under this clause, it shall be mutually understood that, where it becomes necessary for the Company to deduct payment when any member of the organisation cannot be usually employed, it is hereby mutually agreed that:—

- (a) No deduction will be made where the breakdown or stoppage of work for any cause of the Company cannot reasonably be held responsible for, only affects one employee member for not more than two consecutive days; or,
- (b) alternatively, affects only two employees for not more than one day; thus making a total of six shifts in either alternative as a maximum to be paid by the Company.
- (c) Should the breakdown or stoppage affect the Company to a greater extent than as above specified in (a) and (b), then the Company agrees to stand down the employee members

of the organisation in reasonable rotation, so as to give as far as possible equal work for all employees, always excepting the leading firemen, whose services the Company reserves the right to retain at its discretion.

13.—Relieving.

Relieving hands, when not engaged at relieving, shall be found snitable work to make up full time.

14.-Mixed Functions.

Any worker who is employed for more than two hours on a higher classification shall be paid the rates of such classification for the whole of the shift, and if employed on a lower classification he shall be paid his ordinary rates.

15.-Maintenance of Existing Conditions.

Save, so far as they may be altered or varied by this Agreement, all now existing conditions and customs shall be maintained during the period of this Agreement.

16.---Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such illhealth shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled to service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision, shal, not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

(c) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any lost time through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this elause, unless he produces a doctor's certificate to his employer as satisfactory proof of sickness.
