WHEREAS by section 166 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas, by Proclamation dated the 7th day of November, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 6th day of December, 1940, the operations of the said Act are suspended between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9.30 p.m. on Tuesday, the 24th day of December, 1940, as therein prescribed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to further exercise the powers conferred upon the

Governor by section 166 aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act beyond the hours of 6 p.m. on Wednesday, the 25th day of December, 1940; Thursday, the 26th day of December, 1940; Friday the 27th day of December, 1940; and Saturday, the 28th day of December, 1940, in so far as it applies to the closing time of shops generally situated throughout the State, whether such closing time be fixed or appointed by the Act or poll, petition, or choice under the Act: Provided that this Proclamation shall extend and have application only to such shops as observe the closing time of 9.30 p.m. on the 24th day of December, 1940.

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared in the Kojonup District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the areas more particularly described in the Schedule hereto to be a Reserve for Natives.

SCHEDULE.

Carrolup Native Reserve (No. 21907).

Bounded by lines starting from the north-east corner of Kojonup Location 7947 and extending eastward along the southern side of a surveyed road passing along the northern boundaries of Locations 7949 and 7951 to the latter's north-east corner; thence along the east boundaries of Locations 7951 and 3468; thence along the north and west boundaries of Location 2887 and onwards crossing the Carrolup River to the north boundary of Location 7953; thence eastward along the latter's north boundary to its north-east corner; thence southward along a road on its eastern boundary to the north-east corner of Location 7149; thence along its north and west boundaries and the north boundary of Location 6503 to the east boundary of Location 2208; thence north along its east and west along its north boundaries, and north and west along the east and north boundaries of Location 1225 to the south-western boundary of Location 7950; thence along same to the west corner of said Location 7950; thence, crossing the Carrolup River, to the south-western boundary of Location 7949, and thence along its south-western and west

boundaries to the starting point: excluding Location 7946 (Water Reserve), surveyed roads, and the Carrolup River and its banks as surveyed.

If an applicant wishes to appear before the Land Board in person he may apply to the Head Office or to the Clerk in Charge of any of the District or Branch Land Offices for a certificate to the Railway Department which, on presentation at the nearest Railway Station will entitle him to a Return Ticket, at Concession Rates, to the place where the Board will sit, available for seven days from the date of issue.

The selector of a Homestead Farm from any location must take the balance thereof, if any, under Conditional Purchase.

All marketable timber, including sandalwood and mallet, is reserved to the Crown, subject to the provisions of clause 18 of the regulations.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

(No. 3 of 1939.)

Between Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral, Agricultural, Horticultural and Tobacco Curing Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Co-operative Bulk Handling and Westralian Farmers, Ltd., Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Area.

This Award shall apply to workers engaged by the respondents in connection with receiving and handling of bulked wheat at wheat receiving railway stations or sidings within the State, but excluding the ports of Western Australia, and shall also apply to labouring work in connection with the erection, removal, or renovation of wheat bulk heads, etc.

2.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from Monday, the 2nd day of December, 1940.

3.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 7 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday.

4.—Overtime.

All time worked prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time or beyond forty-four (44) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the overtime rates prescribed in subclause (c) of clause 5 hereof.

5.—Wages.

(a) Basic wage (adults)—

- (i) Within a radius of 15 miles from the G.P.O., Perth—£4 5s. 4d. per week.
- (ii) Within the South-West Land Division (excluding the area referred to in (i) of this subclause)—£4 6s. 6d. per week.
- (iii) Rest of State—£5 0s. 3d. per week.

(b) Margin per week over the basic wage—£1.

(c) All overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or the days observed in lieu, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

6.—Holidays.

Workers shall be entitled to the following holidays with pay:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or the days observed in lieu thereof.

7.—Transfers.

(a) After commencing employment at any siding or centre, if an employee is transferred by the employer to another siding, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the actual time taken in effecting such transfer. The employer shall pay all fares necessarily incurred. Fares shall be second class.

(b) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

8.—Inspections.

Any officer authorised by the union may, on any day, for the purpose of investigating any alleged breaches of this Award, and after giving notice in writing to the company or its agent, enter any premises on which the operations covered by this Award are carried on and inspect such operations and speak to workers: Provided that such permission shall not in any way be exercised so as to cause any delay in such operations.

9.—Payment of Wages and Contract of Service.

For the sake of convenience, the wages are set out in clause 5, on a weekly basis, but it is hereby prescribed that the contract of service shall be by the day, and one day's notice shall be sufficient to terminate such contract of service.

Wages shall be paid weekly, on a day mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

10.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record containing the following particulars:—

- (a) the name of the worker;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the starting and finishing time each day;
- (d) the wages (and overtime if any) paid to him each week.

11.—First-aid Kit.

If it is procurable a suitable first-aid outfit shall be supplied by the employer and shall be accessible at all times.

12.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (b) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (c) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of the Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

13.—Breakdowns, etc.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award, the employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day that the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause that the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

Between Metropolitan Superphosphate and Chemical Works Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Cuming Smith and Mt. Lyell Farmers' Fertilizers, Limited, and Cresco Fertilizers (W.A.) Limited, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the area comprised in the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of three (3) years from and including the 17th day of October, 1940, provided that, after the expiration of the first twelve months from this date and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months, application may be made to the Court by any party to the Agreement for a review of any of the provisions of this Agreement.

3.—Wages.

(The wages hereunder mentioned are expressed in weekly amounts, but the employment is under a contract of daily hiring and service, except as to the occupations specifically mentioned in clause 11.)

The minimum rates of wages payable under this Agreement shall be as follow:—

No junior worker less than seventeen (17) years of age shall be employed in wheeling bags of superphosphate or other similar material up an inclined ramp or board. No boy of less than eighteen (18) years of age shall be employed on night shift.

(d) Casual workers:—Any worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive days shall be entitled to two shillings (2s.) per day, in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed for the particular class of work in which he is employed.

4.—General Conditions.

Except where specifically prescribed in subclauses (h) and (r) of this clause, the method of calculating the extra rates provided in this clause shall be as follows:—

Any worker carrying out the special duties mentioned in this clause for less than half (½) of one (1) day or shift shall be paid the extra allowance on a *pro rata* basis for the time actually employed on such work.

Where such worker performs the work for half (½) or more of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the extra allowance for the whole of such day or shift.

- Men employed in grinding sand for sulphur burners shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed working on scaffold twelve (12) feet or more from the ground shall be allowed one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed stacking bales of bags two (2) tiers high or over shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein, but where mechanical means are employed for lifting, this allowance shall not apply, unless in the opinion of a Board of Reference the extra exertion is still required.
- Men employed lifting or carrying bags of nitrate of soda shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.

- Men employed stacking bags of raw materials over twelve (12) bags high, and where no mechanical appliances are in use, shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed handling ground limestone shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed working with tar or using mephalat shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed cleaning the septic tank shall be paid an allowance of five shillings (5s.) extra per day or part of a day.
- Men employed mixing concrete shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed as splicers or riggers shall receive two shillings (2s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men using explosives shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Hammer and gadmen shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed cleaning aerator from outside shall be paid eightpence (8d.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Men employed cleaning out aerator from inside shall be paid one shilling and eightpence (1s. 8d.) per day over the minimum rate prescribed herein.
- Rubber gloves shall be provided for men who work in or about acid plants.
- Four (4) men shall be engaged in acid chambers. The fourth man for the time being may be employed at any other work in the industry, at the appropriate rate of wages prescribed herein. Each man shall have one Sunday off in four (4).
- Loaders out and baggers shall be provided with leather aprons.
- Men working on shifts, other than men working continuous shifts, shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per shift extra. This allowance shall not apply to workers employed solely on day shift.
- Work done in the meal time or any portion thereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, but this shall not apply to cases involving completion of work commenced before such meal time, and not occupying more than fifteen (15) minutes from the commencement thereof, in which case the meal time will be extended by such period beyond the ordinary time.
- The hours of shiftmen shall include twenty (20) minutes for crib, but the time so occupied shall be taken at such a time, when possible, as to avoid a stoppage of work.
- Dust glasses or goggles shall, where necessary, be supplied to workers.

5.—Mixed Functions.

Any worker engaged on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification for less than half (½) of one (1) day or shift shall be paid the higher rate for the time actually employed on such work.

Where a worker performs duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification for half (½) or more of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of such day or shift.

6.—Hours.

(a) Day workers:—Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows, namely:—eight (8) hours on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturdays: Provided, however, that should the parties so agree, the forty-four (44) hours may be worked in five (5) days of eight (8) hours forty-eight (48) minutes each.

(b) Shift workers:—The ordinary hours of shift workers, inclusive of crib time, shall not exceed:—

- Forty-four (44) hours in one (1) week; or
- Eighty-eight (88) hours in two (2) weeks, at the option of the employer, to be worked in rotary shifts not exceeding eight (8) hours each day.

(c) Continuous process may be worked, and shifts shall rotate weekly so that, as far as practicable, all workers shall have a fair share of day shifts.

(d) Where a worker is called on to work a quick shift, he shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for such quick shift.

“A quick shift” shall mean a shift where a worker is brought on to work a full shift before having had at least eight (8) hours off.

(e) Watchman's hours:—Watchman's hours shall not exceed fifty-six (56) per week, but he shall be allowed one day off for each four (4) weeks without deduction of pay.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for work done before the recognised time for starting work and after the recognised time for ceasing work in each factory.

Each day shall be reckoned by itself.

This subclause shall not apply to men working on shifts.

Overtime for work done by workers (other than those on continuous shifts) on any day other than specified holidays or Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) Overtime for work done by men working on continuous shifts shall be paid for at the rate of double time (i.e., time in addition to ordinary time) for all time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day of twenty-four (24) hours, except so far as the excess is, owing to arrangements between the workers themselves, or is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or is owing to the relieving man not coming on duty and relieving at the appointed time, in which latter case the overtime rate shall be paid when the period exceeds one (1) hour.

(c) Any worker who is required to work on Sunday shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at the rate applicable for that day.

(d) Where a worker, without being notified on the previous day, has to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

Limitation of overtime:—Overtime shall be limited to sixteen (16) hours in any one week, unless the overtime is necessitated through a breakdown in plant.

Differentiation in rates of overtime:—Overtime shall be paid at the rate prescribed above for the first twelve (12) hours, but all overtime worked over twelve (12) hours in any week shall be paid at the rate of double time.

Call back:—When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

8.—Holidays.

(a) Continuous shiftmen and watchmen:—

(i) Shiftmen working on roasters, burners or chambers or other acid plants, and also watchmen, shall be granted a holiday of twelve (12) working days on full pay on completion of each year of service. A shiftman or watchman who does not complete one year of service shall be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month of service. These holidays shall be taken at a time mutually convenient. Failing agreement, the holidays shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer, between the 10th day of September and the 10th day of the January following.

(ii) All work done on specified holidays, except Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day by shiftmen on continuous shift and by watchmen, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(iii) All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Labour Day, by shiftmen and watchmen as aforesaid, shall be paid for at the rate of treble time.

(iv) All work done on Sundays by shiftmen shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. This provision does not apply to watchmen.

(v) “Specified holidays” shall mean New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) Other workers:—

(i) Twelve (12) days' holiday on full pay shall be granted to each worker, upon completion of twelve (12) months' service, of which nine (9) days shall be taken consecutively at a time mutually convenient. Failing agreement, the holidays shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer, between the 10th day of September and the 10th day of the January following. The other three (3) days shall be Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday the following Monday shall be given in lieu thereof.

(ii) A worker who does not complete one year's service shall be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month of service in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

(iii) All work done on any of the specified holidays (except Christmas Day, Good Friday or Labour Day) and on Sundays, shall be paid for at the rate of double time. This provision does not apply to watchmen.

(iv) Any work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of treble time.

(v) If no work is done on any other of the specified holidays (subclause (a) (v) hereof), the worker shall not be entitled to pay therefor.

(c) Holidays without deduction of pay shall be limited to twelve (12) days per annum as aforesaid.

(d) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence for any cause whatsoever.

(e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct shall lose all rights under the holiday clause.

9.—No Discrimination.

No employer shall, in the employment or dismissal of his workers, discriminate in any way against the members of the union, nor shall they, in the conduct of their business, do anything with a view to directly or indirectly injuring the union.

10.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

11.—Contract of Service.

The contract of hiring of every worker, except juniors, watchmen, despatch clerks, tally clerks, and storemen, shall be deemed to be a contract of hiring by the day.

12.—Time and Wages Book.

Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his usual place of business, or at each of them, if more than one, a book, containing a record of the names of all workers employed by him at the particular factory, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each such worker, the starting and finishing time on each day, and the amount of overtime, if any. Such book shall be open to inspection by the secretary, or such person as may be appointed by the union, on any day during working hours.

13.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent, except such stoppage is due to shortage of railway trucks.

14.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

(a) Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.

(b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate, nor shall the employer in such case be deemed guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of the Agreement founded upon an age limitation, except in the case of collusion.

(d) If any worker shall wilfully misstate his age in the above certificate, he shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.

15.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(b) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

16.—Board of Reference.

The Court may order, for the purposes of the said Agreement the appointment of a Board or Boards of Reference and assign to such Board or Boards the following functions and powers arising under or out of the said Agreement, namely:—

- (i) to adjust any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time;
- (ii) to classify and fix wages of workers employed under any designation not specifically provided for in the Agreement, or of workers employed in any occupation which, though provided for in the Agreement, is shown to have been materially altered since the issue thereof;
- (iii) to decide or report to the Court upon any other matter which the Court may from time to time refer to any such Board.

Separate Boards of Reference may be appointed, where deemed necessary or advisable, for different localities.

Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) representatives, one representative to be nominated by each party.

Save as herein provided, the provisions of regulation 92 shall apply.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 20 of 1940.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this fourth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and forty, between the West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the union"), of the one part, and C. W. Chellev & Co.; The Wagin District Co-operative Co., Limited; A. Galt, and Richardson & Co., Ltd. (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Scope.

This agreement shall apply to the shop-keeping industries carried on by the signatories hereto, in respect of workers employed by the said signatories, following the vocations mentioned herein. Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any industrial agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

2.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of five (5) miles from the Post Office, Wagin.

3.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from and including the second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and forty, subject to the right to apply to amend in pursuance of the Act.

4.—Definitions.

(a) "Shop assistant" shall mean a worker employed receiving and/or selling and/or assembling or preparing goods for sale or delivery and shall include cashiers.

(b) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that a casual hand may be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one day.

A worker engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed rate.

(c) "Adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.

(d) The term "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week. Provided that any worker employed for not more than four consecutive weeks shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand but this proviso shall not apply in cases where the services of a worker employed as a weekly hand have been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or for any cause referred to in clause 15 hereof.

5.—Chemist Shops.

Any worker employed in a chemist shop shall be subject to the terms of this Agreement up to the time he or she becomes indentured to the profession.

6.—Hours.

The hours of work shall be as follow:—

(a) Forty-six (46) hours shall constitute a week's work for males sixteen (16) years of age and over.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for females and for males under sixteen (16) years of age.

(b) Except as provided in subclauses (c), (e), and (f) of this clause, the hours of work shall be performed as follow:—

- (i) on the day of the late shopping night, between 8.30 a.m. and 9 o'clock p.m.;
- (ii) on the day observed as a half-holiday, between 8.30 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon;
- (iii) on the other four (4) days of the week (excluding Sunday), between 8.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

(c) The hours of workers employed in shops comprised in the Fourth Schedule of the Factories and Shops Act shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer: Provided that the worker shall be notified of the half day (which shall be granted to and taken by the worker on an afternoon in each week) upon which his or her services shall not be required.

(d) The employer of workers in Fourth Schedule shops shall post or cause to be posted and keep posted up in a conspicuous position in his shop, so as to be easily accessible to and easily read by every worker in his employ in such Fourth Schedule shop during working hours on every day, a roster setting out the following particulars:—

- (i) The name and sex of each worker;
- (ii) the class of work performed;
- (iii) the times at which each worker is required to commence and finish work on each day in each week;
- (iv) the hours in each day during which the worker is entitled to be off duty during each day;
- (v) the time allowed for meals on each day;
- (vi) the day in each week allowed as a half holiday and the time from which such half holiday is allowed.

The particulars contained in such roster shall be in respect of the week Monday to Sunday, inclusive, during which it is posted up, and may be altered or varied only on account of the sickness or absence of a worker, or on account of a contingency that the employer could not reasonably be expected to foresee.

(e) The hours of workers employed in chemist and druggist shops shall be in conformity with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937.

(f) On the day mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto to be observed as Christmas Eve, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties for the purpose of late shopping night.

(g) The spread of ordinary hours (inclusive of any meal hour) for all workers bound by this Agreement shall not exceed nine (9) hours, except on the day upon which the weekly late shopping night is observed, or on the day upon which the Christmas Eve late shopping night is observed.

7.—Meal Times.

(a) One hour shall be given and taken for all meals. Lunch hour shall be between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m. Tea hour shall start within forty-five (45) minutes of the prescribed finishing time.

(b) Fourth Schedule Shops:—Meal hours shall be taken at the times most convenient to the employer's business: Provided that one hour shall be given and taken for each meal and that not more than five (5) or less than three (3) hours' interval shall be worked without an interval for a meal being given. The meal hours referred to in this clause shall be taken in one continuous period.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, the lunch hour for workers other than those in Fourth Schedule shops shall, during the first two days of each of three sales per annum, and during Christmas week, be given and taken between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

8.—Meal Money.

Workers who are subject to the starting and finishing times prescribed in clause 6 (b) of this Agreement shall, if required to continue working for more than one half hour after the prescribed finishing time, be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) as meal money.

9.—Overtime.

(a) Excepting as provided hereunder, all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. In the compilation of overtime, each day shall stand by itself.

(b) Where overtime is worked in Fourth Schedule shops, the worker shall be paid overtime as provided in subclause (a) of this clause, after the prescribed weekly hours of work have been exceeded. Work performed on Sundays, the weekly half-holiday, and/or the prescribed holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Where workers are required to work continuously, after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked, they shall be paid at the rate of double time

up to the time for finishing work: Provided that that hour shall not be later than the prescribed starting time the next day.

(d) All time worked in shops other than those referred to in subclause (b) hereof before the prescribed starting time or after the prescribed finishing time, shall be paid for at overtime rates. Work performed in the afternoon of the day on which the weekly half-holiday is observed, on Sundays, and/or the prescribed holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

10.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing a year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment. Provided that, when a worker is entitled to holidays under this subclause he shall receive at least two weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take his holidays.

(c) A worker who is summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this clause.

(d) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

(d) Where a canvasser or collector provides his own bicycle he shall be paid an allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week.

(e) Any person, whether a junior or adult, employed as a canvasser and/or collector, shall be paid the full adult minimum rate. This subclause shall not apply in cases where an adult canvasser is absent from his employment on account of sickness, accident, or the holidays to which such adult canvasser is entitled under this Agreement.

(f) Casual Hands:—Adult male and female workers shall be paid at the rate of threepence (3d.) per hour in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein.

Junior male and female workers shall be paid at the rate of one penny halfpenny (1½d.) per hour in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein.

12.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

13.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

14.—Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five (5) male adults and thereafter one junior male to every two (2) male adults or fraction thereof.

(b) Where no adult shop assistant is employed, one junior shop assistant may be employed.

(c) Where one adult female assistant is employed, two (2) junior female assistants may be employed.

(d) Where two (2) adult female assistants are employed three (3) junior female assistants may be employed.

(e) Where three (3) adult female assistants are employed, four (4) junior female assistants may be employed.

(f) Where four (4) adult female assistants are employed, five (5) junior female assistants may be employed, and thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five (5) junior female assistants to four (4) adult female assistants.

(g) For the purpose of determining the ratio of juniors to senior assistants under this clause, all employers or managers when actively engaged in conducting the business of the establishment, shall be deemed to be senior assistants.

15.—Engagement.

On week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

16.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker, and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday, inclusive.

17.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time, be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) Pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

18.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement.
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which, for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

19.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (a) Name in full;
- (b) Age and date of birth;
- (c) Length of service with each previous employer.

The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim for additional wages, in the event of his age or length of service with a previous employer being wrongly stated on this certificate. Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

20.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day ($\frac{1}{2}$ -day) for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

The worker shall, if required by the employer, produce proof satisfactory to the employer of sickness.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 21 of 1940.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 25th day of November, one thousand nine hundred and forty, between Nestle & Anglo-Swiss Condensed Milk Co., (Australasia), Ltd., and W.A. Condensed Milk Co., Ltd., (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and the Dairy Factories' Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, South-West Land Division, Bunbury (hereinafter called "the union") of the other part, witnesseth that, for

the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree that one with the other, as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the South-West Land Division of the State; provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, to which another industrial union of workers is a party.

2.—Term.

This Agreement shall come into operation as from its date and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of the first twelve (12) months from that date, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of (12) months, application may be made to the Court by leave of the Court, obtained by any party to the Agreement, for a review of any of the provisions of the Agreement, and the Court shall have power to vary or rescind such provisions.

3.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable under this Agreement shall be as follow:—

(e) Washers of vacuum pans shall be allowed threepence (3d.) for each flying clean or ninepence (9d.) for each full clean, in addition to the ordinary weekly wage.

(f) Workers employed stacking tin-plate or unloading tin-plate from trucks shall be paid twopence (2d.) per hour in addition to their ordinary wage.

(g) Casual hands:—Workers employed for less than one week shall be classed as Casual Hands and paid ten per cent (10%) in addition to the foregoing rates.

4.—Hours.

(a) Forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work until the 31st December, 1940, after which forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) In accordance with the provisions of subclause (a) of this clause, the forty-four (44) hour week shall commence on the 1st January, 1941, but the provisions in this clause for a forty-four (44) hour week shall be deemed to have been complied with if an eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight (namely, one week of forty (40) hours and one week of forty-eight (48) hours) is worked: Provided further, that the eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight referred to herein shall only be applied after written permission to work same has been granted by the Union.

5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the hours prescribed in clause 4 shall be deemed to be overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) All work performed on Sunday or on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(c) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with the meal required or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

6.—Holidays.

(a) All workers, except casual workers, shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave on full pay at the expiration of each twelve (12) months' service: Provided that, if the contract of service is terminated during the year, the worker shall be entitled to holiday pay in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.

(b) Where a worker is dismissed for misconduct, or where the worker illegally severs his contract of service, he shall lose all rights under this clause.

(c) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

7.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid weekly.

8.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

9.—Contract of Service.

(a) A "casual worker" shall mean a worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive working days and who may be discharged or leave the employer's service without notice.

(b) The contract of service of workers, other than casual workers, shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice given on either side: Provided that such notice shall not apply in the case of a worker who is summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

10.—Uniforms and Overalls.

If a worker is required to wear a uniform or overall, the employer shall provide same free for use by the worker.

11.—Washing and Drinking Facilities.

(a) Adequate drinking and washing facilities shall be provided in each factory or department.

(b) Changing accommodation and showers shall be provided by the employer.

12.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept at the Factory Office, a record, in which shall be entered:—

- (a) the name of each worker to whom this Agreement applies;
- (b) the nature of the work he is doing;
- (c) the hours worked each day;
- (d) the amount of wages and overtime (if any) received by each worker each week;
- (e) the ages of junior workers.

The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union at any time during the ordinary working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

13.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this agreement, an accredited representative of the union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission, without the consent of the employer shall not be exercised more than once in any one week.

14.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift.

If employed for less than half of one day or shift, he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

15.—Absence through Sickness.

A worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident, not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause, unless he produces satisfactory proof to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate, unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

16.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of:—

- (1) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (2) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (3) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which, for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

17.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage, as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

18.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

19.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following:—

- (1) Name in full;
- (2) Age and date of birth;
- (3) Name of each previous employer;
- (4) Periods of employment with each previous employer.

This certificate shall be signed by the worker. No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age or period of employment with a previous employer being wrongly stated on the certificate.
