WHEREAS by section 17 of the Courts of Session Act, 1921, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation fix the times at which periodical sittings of Courts of Session may be held and also revoke or vary any Proclamation made under that section: And whereas by Proclamation dated the 7th day of November, 1940, the third Wednesday in March, June, September and the fourth Wednesday in November were fixed for the sittings of the Court of Session for the Eastern Goldfields at Kalgoorlie: And whereas it is desirable to alter the date of the sitting of the said Court of Session: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the consent of Executive Council do hereby appoint the Wednesday following the third Monday in February, May, August and November, as the days on which the periodical sittings of the said Court shall be held.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-38, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets, in any of the portions of Western Australia

lian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from the 1st day of January, 1941, until the 31st day of December, 1942, inclusive.

Schedule.

(1) The waters of the Swan river and its tributaries extending in a northerly, easterly, and north-easterly direction from a line drawn from the north-eastern extremity of the Mill Point Wharf (situated on the western side of Belches or Mill Point) to the north-western extremity of the Harbour and Lights Wharf (situated on the western side of the river between the Swan Brewery and Eliza Point) upwards to the railway bridge at Guildford (except for prawns, vide separate Proclamation).

(2) The waters of the Swan river and its tributaries from the Upper Swan Bridge (near Midland) upwards to its source (except for prawns, vide separate Proclamation).

(3) The waters of the Swan river and its tributaries from a line drawn from the south-western extremity of Point Resolution to the south-western extremity of the Point Walter Jetty (situated at Point Walter) downwards to a line drawn from the western extremity of the South Mole to the western extremity of the North Mole (at Fremantle).

(4) The whole of the waters of the Canning river, and all its tributaries, from the bridge on the Canning highway upwards to its source.

(5) The whole of the waters of the Chammel Entrance to Peel's Inlet (Mandurah) bounded on the north by a line drawn in an easterly direction from the extremity of the western point of entrance (at the bar) to a point on the mainland on the eastern shore, and on the south by lines drawn in an easterly direction from the south-eastern corner of Murray Location No. 5 to the southern extremity of Chammel Island; thence to the south-western extremity of Creery Island and by its southern foreshore to the eastern extremity of that island; thence by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction to a point on the foreshore of the mainland.

(6) The whole of the waters of the Murray river and the Serpentine river (including their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which during

any time of the year have access directly or indirectly to the sea) lying north, east, and south-east of a line drawn from a point on the eastern foreshore of Peel's Inlet situated east of the southernmost point of Goongoolup Island and extending in a westerly direction half-a-mile; thence in a northerly direction to the foreshore of Peel's Inlet to a point lying west of the western side of the entrance to the Serpentine river.

(7) The whole of the waters of the Harvey river and that portion of the Harvey estuary south of a line being the prolongation easterly to the eastern shore of the estuary of the northern boundary of Murray Location No. 479.

(8) The whole of the waters of Toby's Inlet and that portion of the ocean waters within a radius of a quarter-of-a-mile from the entrance on either side to the said Toby's Inlet.

(9) The whole of the waters of the King river (Albany), including its tributaries, north of a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from a point on the western foreshore of Oyster Harbour 25 chains south from the southern extremity of the Lower King river bridge to a point on the northern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 57 chains east of the northern extremity of the said bridge.

(10) The whole of the waters of the Kalgan river (Albany), including its tributaries, north of a line drawn in a south-easterly direction from a point on the northern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 57 chains east of the northern extremity of the Lower King river bridge to a point on the foreshore at Swan Point 68 chains south of the eastern extremity of the Kalgan river bridge.

(11) The waters of the Channel Entrance between King George's Sound and Oyster Harbour (Albany), downwards from a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains north of Emu Point to a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains south of Emu Point.

(12) All that area of Western Australian waters on the northern side of Princess Royal Harbour (Albany) north of a line drawn from Residency Point to the southern extremity of the Town Jetty; thence to the southern extremity of the Deep-water Jetty and thence by the eastern side of that jetty to the northern shore aforesaid.

(13) The whole of the waters of the Denmark river and its tributaries and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the mouth of the said Denmark river.

(14) The whole of the waters of the Hay river and its tributaries and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet east and south-east of a line drawn from the north-east corner of Plantagenet Location 1500 to the south-west corner of Plantagenet Location 3502.

(15) The whole of the waters of the Preston river, the Collie river, and the Capel river, with their tributaries.

(16) That portion of the waters of Champion Bay (Geraldton) extending from a point on the foreshore 100 yards eastward of the railway jetty to a point on the foreshore 100 yards to the westward of the said jetty, and thence half-a-mile into the waters of the said Champion Bay.

(17) That portion of the waters of Champion Bay (Geraldton) extending from a point on the foreshore 100 yards eastward of the Esplanade Jetty to a point on the foreshore 100 yards westward of the said jetty, and thence half-a-mile into the waters of the said Champion Bay.

(18) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as the "Dead" water, situated in Sussex Location No. 11.

(19) All that portion of the waters of Coekburn Sound (near Rockingham Beach) lying south of a line drawn from the north-western extremity of Point John, intersecting the north-western extremity of the northernmost pier or jetty at Rockingham Beach, and extending to a point on the foreshore at the said Rockingham Beach.

(20) All that portion of the Western Australian waters contained in the Vasse and Wonnerup estuaries.

(21) The whole of the waters of Torbay Inlet (near Albany), including the Channel Entrance both north and south of the Flood Gates, and the waters of the creeks flowing into the inlet.

(22) That portion of the waters of the Gascoyne river (Carnarvon) lying between the Jetty tramway bridge and a line drawn from the beacon on the south-eastern corner of Babbage Island to Mangrove Point on the mainland

(23) All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottneet Island lying east of the north-eastern extremity of North Point (on the northern side of the said island), and east of the south-western extremity of Salmon Point (on the southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

(24) The whole of the waters of Grassmere Lake, also known as Nine-Mile Lake (near Albany), and the waters of the creeks flowing into it.

(25) The waters of Geographe Bay, near Wonnerup Inlet, bounded on the south by a north-westerly line drawn from a point on the foreshore fifteen (15) chains south-east from the southern side of the "Old Jetty," and extending into the waters of the said bay a distance of 40 chains; thence by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction a distance of about 120 chains; thence by a line drawn in a south-easterly direction extending to the foreshore of the said bay at a point 60 chains north of the northern point of entrance to Wonnerup Inlet, and thence in a south-westerly direction by the foreshore of the said bay to the point of commencement.

(26) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as "The Quarries," near Cape Naturaliste.

(27) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as Yallingup Bay, starting from the point of high-water mark at the Rocky Point half-a-chain south of the mouth of Yallingup Brook; thence into the water a quarter-of-a-mile; thence north-easterly to a point a quarter-of-a-mile from the north-west corner of Government Reserve No. 8427A; thence easterly to the point of high-water mark on the foreshore and back to the point of commencement.

(28) The whole of the waters of Nornahup Inlet, Walpole Inlet, Deep river, and the Frankland river, with its tributaries.

(29) All that portion of the ocean waters at Fremantle lying between the South Mole and the Fish Market breakwater and between the Fish Market breakwater and the Fish Market jetty bounded on the west by a line running from the western extremity of the South Mole to the southern extremity of the Fish Market breakwater; thence to the southern extremity of the Fish Market jetty.

(30) All that area of Western Australian waters from the north-eastern extremity of the North Mole (near Rous Head) at Fremantle, and extending in a northerly direction to the south-western extremity of North street, Cottesloe, with a width of a quarter-of-a-mile from the foreshore.

(31) The whole of the waters (including tributaries) of Parry's Harbour.

(32) The waters of the Channel Entrance to Hardy's Inlet (Angusta) situated between a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from Duke's Head (on the western side of the inlet) to Point Frederick (on the eastern side of the inlet) and a line drawn in a westerly direction from Point Irwin (on the eastern side of the inlet) to a point where the southern boundary of Harford street touches the foreshore on the western side of the inlet.

(33) The whole of the waters of Carrolup river (near Katanning).

(34) All that portion of the ocean waters at Yanchep beach commencing at a point on the foreshore one half-mile north-west of the north-western corner of Reserve No. 12439 and extending in a generally south-easterly direction to a point on the foreshore one quarter-mile south-east of the south-western corner of the said reserve, and extending seaward to a distance of one half-mile from the foreshore.

(35) The whole of the waters of Bow river (near Irwin's Inlet).

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of the State, not being a municipal district, a health district with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order and also may alter the boundaries of any such district: And whereas Rockingham health district was duly constituted by an Order in Council dated the 17th day of November, 1926, and the boundaries of such health district as defined in such Order in Council have subsequently been altered by Orders in Council published from time to time in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient further to alter the boundaries of the said health district in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of his powers conferred by section 19 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the said Rockingham health district in such manner that the boundaries of such health district shall be the same as the boundaries of the Rockingham road district.

BY-LAWS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MUNDARING PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Reserve No. 10083—By-laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the trustees of the Public Cemetery, Mundaring, the said Trustees make the following by-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule "A," shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an Order for Burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours, or for specially selected sites, 12 working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with a Justice's order therefore, be handed in in such time as to allow at least five hours or 12 hours as before-mentioned.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves or graves to be opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the Order for Burial shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—1st September to 30th April: Week days only, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August: Week days only, from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour, excepting by written permission of the Trustees, and overtime paid to the officer attending such duties.

9. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

10. No hearse, mourning coach or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer for the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these by-laws.

11. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in the charge of some responsible person.

12. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery or to discharge fireworks therein.

13. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these by-laws.

14. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass,

or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border or any erection, commits an offence against these by-laws.

15. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution or circulars, by cards or otherwise or by any system of advertisement whatsoever.

16. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

17. Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the cemetery shall apply in writing to the Trustees, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

18. Subject to the by-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

19. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is done, may issue a grant in the Form E. in the schedule.

20. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a grant in the Form E. in the schedule.

21. Every grant shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the Order for Burial aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

22. Every coffin placed in such bricked vault or grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

23. If application be made for an Order Burial in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

24. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897.

25. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

26. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

27. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

28. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees, the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either the two preceding by-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

29. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work, shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying such materials with wheels less than 4 in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

30. No catacomb shall be allowed.

31. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or any person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these regulations and by-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these by-laws.

32. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any adjoining ground or grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b) No sand, soil or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
- (c) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

33. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these by-laws may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing by-laws with the accompanying schedule, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office on the 12th day of September, 1940.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Woodanilling Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Woodanilling.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application accompanied by a copy of these by-laws shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof. Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a bush fire brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such brigade is established, the brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who, in the Board's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall when so directed by the Board instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) Fire fighting members; and (c) Associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the brigade at the following rates:—(i) owner or occupier of land within the brigade area, minimum subscription of 10s.; (ii) other persons, a minimum subscription of 5s.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire fighting member.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigade.

9. The Brigade shall meet once every year on a date to be fixed by the captain as near as it can be conveniently called to the date fixed for the commencement of the prohibited times for the district; and as often thereafter during the year as a majority of the officers may decide, or when directed to do so by the Board.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Woodanilling Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Woodanilling on the 1st March, 1940.
