WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 142 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that no building shall be erected within any municipal district unless and until plans and specifications thereof have, before the commencement of such building, been submitted by the owner or occupier to and have been approved in relation to ventilation, lighting, and sanitary construction, and also as to the area of the open space appurtenant to such building by the local authority: And whereas it is also enacted by subsection (2) of section 142 aforesaid that the Governor may from time to time declare by Proclamation that subsection (1) of the said section shall apply in any other district, or in any portion of

any other district: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that subsection (1) of section 142 aforesaid shall apply to that portion of the Westonia Health District hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred upon me by subsection (2) of section 142 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, do hereby declare that, as from and after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* subsection (1) of section 142 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, shall apply to those portions of the Westonia Health District comprised in the townsite of Westonia, and also within imaginary lines running parallel with the boundaries of the said townsite at a distance of three miles therefrom.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that the residents of any area are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare such area to be a region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the residents of the areas specified in the Schedule hereunder are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services,

proclaim the said areas to be regions under the provisions of the said Act, to be designated the Kununoppin region and the Kondinin region, respectively.

SCHEDULE.

Kununoppin Region.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the south-eastern corner of Avon Location 11480 and extending generally northerly, passing through the north-western corner of Ninghan Location 1697, the easternmost south-eastern corner of Location 1760, and onwards to the north-western corner of Location 3253; thence due north to a point due west of Survey Mark K88 (Mt. Churchman); thence east to said Survey Mark; thence easterly to the 100-M.P. on the No. 1 Rabbit-Proof Fence; thence generally southerly along the said Fence to a point due east of the north-eastern corner of Avon Location 15977 (near Campion); thence south-westerly to the north-eastern corner of Location 12193, and thence westerly to the starting point.

Kondinin Region.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the 113-M.P. on the No. 1 Rabbit-Proof Fence (situate west of Mt. WHEREAS by section 42 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, the Governor may by Proclamation, whenever in the interests of the natives he thinks fit, declare any municipal district or town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area at Karonie, more particularly described in the attached Schedule, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain.

Schedule.

An area bounded on the north and west by lines starting from a point situate north five miles and west five miles from the centre of Karonie, on the Trans-Continental Railway, and extending east ten miles and south ten miles, the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 8 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit— (a) the taking of trout of the species *Salmo irideus* (Rainbow trout) and *Salmo fario* (Brown trout) by any means of capture whatsoever, from the date of publication of this Proclamation to the 28th February, 1941, inclusive, and from the 1st May to the 31st December, 1941, both days inclusive; and (b) the taking of trout of the species *Salmo irideus* (Rainbow trout) and *Salmo fario* (Brown trout) by all means of capture other than a single rod held in the hand and line with an artificial fly as lure, from the 1st March to the 30th April, 1941, both days inclusive.

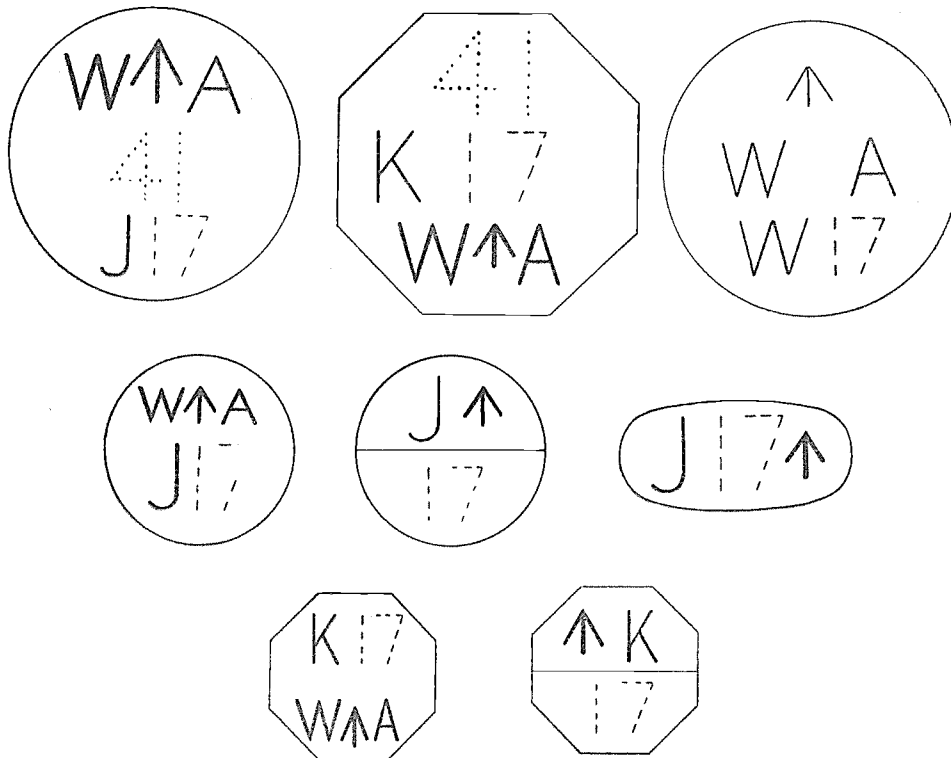

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty, between Goode, Durrant & Murray, Limited; Pearse Bros., Ltd.; Western Footwear Company, Limited; Perth Footwear Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and the Boot Trade of Western Australia Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the union"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the Boot and/or Slipper Making Industry and shall be limited in its effect to an area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

2.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for manufacturing in this industry, and shall be worked in five (5) days, from Monday to Friday, inclusive.

The ordinary hours of work shall not exceed eight (8) hours forty-eight (48) minutes on each day, to be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

Work done in connection with the overhauling and repairing of the employer's bootmaking plant may be performed on Saturday, at the following rates:—

- (a) Where the worker has worked forty-four (44) hours in five (5) days as set out above—time and a quarter.
- (b) Where the worker who carries out the duties of overhauling and repairing the boot-making plant works the forty-four (44) hours in six (6) days—ordinary rates.

4.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two (2) hours and time and a half thereafter.

(b) All overtime shall start at the usual time for knocking off work on each day at the factory.

(c) Double time shall be paid for work performed on any the following holidays, whenever observed in the State:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(d) The employer's factory may be worked, when necessary, on Saturdays: Provided that two consecutive Saturdays shall not be worked without first obtaining permission to work the second Saturday from the secretary of the union: Provided that all manufacturing work performed on a Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and quarter for the first two (2) hours and time and a half thereafter.

5.—Apprentices.

(a) The provisions of the Schedule hereto marked "Apprenticeship Regulations" are hereby embodied in and form part of this Agreement.

(b) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every three (3) journeymen or fraction of three (3) journeymen employed by him.

(c) The term of apprenticeship shall be not less than three (3) years and not more than five (5) years.

(d) The employer shall teach the apprentice one at least of the following functions or processes:—

- (i) clicking; (ii) stuff-cutting and preparing bottom stuff for makers; (iii) making. The apprentice may be taught to make by hand.

Where the factory contains the necessary machinery the apprentice shall also be taught the use of four machines, two of which shall be selected from the following ten machines:—

- (1) pulling over machines; (2) lasting machines; (3) stuff-laying machines; (4) Blake sewing machines; (5) wetting machines; (6) rough rounder and channelling machines; (7) rapid or fair-stitching machines; (8) sole levelling machines; (9) screwing machines; (10) heeling machines.
- (iv) Finishing:—(a) right through by hand; or (b) heel and edge trimmer, and any other two machines; or (c) edge trimmer and edge setter, and any other two machines.

All the above operations by hand or machines are to be carried out on the employer's method.

(v) Slipper-making:—The apprentice shall be taught to make a slipper throughout.

6.—Free boys (boys other than apprentices).

No lad not apprenticed shall be employed or retained in employment after he has attained the age of sixteen (16), or on any work other than is comprised under the following heads:—Errands, sweeping, last-carrying, sorting and slipping lasts, heel nail feeding and building, drawing tacks, inking heels and edges, socking and sizing, tacking up stuff and putting in shanks, and bottom filling or skiving shanks, stamping or colouring sizes in various departments, and putting in followers and branding, putting in toes and stiffeners, solutioning and closing channels, winding bobbins, turning shoes, steaming slippers: Provided that not more than five (5) free boys may be allowed in each factory. The services of such free boys may be utilised in any department.

7.—Free girls (girls other than learners).

Free girls may be employed in slipper making only or any of the following classes of work, namely—tying, pomming and packing.

8.—Female Learners.

Female learners may be employed in the proportion of three (3) learners to every one journeywoman employed in receipt of the adult journeywoman's rate of pay.

9.—Weekly Payments.

Once at least in each week each worker shall be paid moneys due up to the night previous to pay day. Any worker working only a portion of a week shall be paid before ceasing work for that week, and all payments shall be made in working hours.

10.—Termination of Employment.

The engagement of a worker may be terminated, upon the employer giving such worker two (2) days' notice that his or her services shall no longer be required. Such notice may be given at any time during the week, and the employer shall be liable only for payment of wages up to the time of the expiration of such notice of termination of employment.

11.—Suspension of Work.

One day's notice shall be given of suspension of work or that any worker will not be wanted to attend at the factory, and the employer shall be liable only to payment of wages up to the time of the expiration of such notice. If at any time work is suspended, or a worker is told that he or she will not be wanted to attend at the factory without such one day's notice having been given, a worker shall nevertheless be entitled to one day's pay, or to payment for such less time as work may be suspended, or the worker is not wanted to attend at the factory respectively, unless the suspension of work arises from some cause beyond the employer's control, in which case the employer shall not be liable to pay any worker for the time during which work is so suspended. Workmen shall give notice to their employer when they desire to be absent from work, except in case of sickness or emergency beyond their control.

Holiday pay shall not accrue during the period that a worker is suspended under this clause. Notice of suspension of work given before noon on the day that it is intended to suspend work shall be deemed a day's notice for the purpose of this clause.

12.—Female Workers.

No female worker, unless paid the male journeyman's rate of wage, shall be employed in the clicking, making, finishing, or stuff-cutting department, except in socking, dressing, boxing, or branding (other than power branding), or ironing or working the Fortuna skiver on either upper or sole offal.

13.—Grindery, etc.

Employers shall find all grindery, workshops, and light, and serve out all colours and materials used in connection with the trade.

14.—Posting Notices.

Every employer may allow such shop notices and union notices as he shall consider unobjectionable to be posted up in a place approved by the employer.

15.—Hot Water.

Employers shall provide employees with hot water free of charge for use at lunch time.

16.—Certificate of Experience.

Workers under twenty-one (21) years of age shall, upon being engaged, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following:—

1. Name in full.
2. Age and date of birth.
3. Names of each previous employer.
4. Length of Service with each previous employer.
5. Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such certificate shall be signed by the worker and shall contain a declaration to the effect that the particulars entered thereon are true and correct.

No worker shall have any claim upon the employer, in the event of the worker wrongly stating any particular in such certificate.

17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date hereof: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of the first twelve months from the date of the Agreement, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months, application may be made to the Court by leave of the Court, obtained by any party to the Agreement, for a review of any of the provisions of the Agreement, and the Court shall have power to vary or rescind such provisions.

18.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

19.—Holidays.

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to twelve (12) days' holiday on full pay, on completion of each year of service.

(b) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall be only entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holidays on full pay.

(c) On any public holiday the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, and the wage for that day may be deducted, but, if the establishment or place of business is kept open and work is performed, ordinary rates shall apply, except as provided in subclause (e) of clause 4 hereof.

(d) Where a worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct or dereliction of duty, he will not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

(e) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

20.—Power to visit Factory.

Once weekly the employer's factory may be visited by the union secretary during working hours.

21.—Definitions.

“Journeyman” or “Journeywoman” shall mean a male or female worker, respectively, in receipt of the prescribed adult rates of pay.

22.—Deductions.

No deduction shall be made from the wages of any employee for charities or raffles, or for more than actual time lost by them.

23.—Record Book.

Each employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the following particulars:—

- (a) The name of each worker to whom this Agreement applies.
- (b) The nature of the work performed by him.
- (c) The hours worked each day.
- (d) The wages (and overtime, if any) received.
- (e) The ages of Junior Workers.

Such record shall be open to inspection by a duly accredited representative of the union during working hours, and he shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom.

SCHEDULE.

Apprenticeship Regulations.

Definitions.

1. (1) "Act" means the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and any alteration or amendment thereof for the time being in force.

(2) "Apprentice" means any person of either sex of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught any industry, trade, craft, or calling to which these regulations apply, and includes an apprentice on probation.

(3) "Award" includes Industrial Agreement.

(4) "Court" means the Court of Arbitration.

(5) "Employer" includes any firm, company or corporation.

(6) "Minor" means a person not less than fourteen years of age and not more than eighteen years of age who customarily works under the direction of or in association with an employer, master, or journeyman upon the material and with the tools or implements used in the industry.

(7) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the Court.

Employment—Probation.

2. No minor shall (except where provision is otherwise made in this Award) be employed or engaged in the industry, except subject to the conditions of apprenticeship or probationership herein contained.

3. (1) Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by the Award. In the event of his becoming an apprentice such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

(2) The Court may in any case where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

4. (a) Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall within 14 days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed form. If at the date of the coming into operation of these regulations an employer is employing any apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(b) At the end of the period of probation of each apprentice, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of the boy, but not otherwise, he may become an apprentice under an agreement.

5. The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the period of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

6. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under an Award of the Court.

Advisory Committee.

7. A Board to be called "The Advisory Committee" may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter. Such committee shall consist of the following:—

(a) Some person appointed by the Court who shall act as Chairman.

(b) Two representatives appointed by the employers.

(c) Two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of workers in the trade.

The Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine.

8. (i) No employer shall refuse employment to any person, or dismiss any worker from his employment, or injure him in his employment or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the worker is a member of any Advisory Committee, or by reason merely of anything said or done or omitted to be done by any such person or worker in the course of his duty as such member.

(ii) In any proceeding for any contravention of this regulation it shall lie upon the employer to show that any person proved to have been refused employment, or any worker proved to have been dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced whilst acting as such member, was refused employment or dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced for some reason other than that mentioned in this regulation.

Agreement of Apprenticeship.

9. (a) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on a form approved by the Court, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the Registrar. No employer, guardian or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

(b) There shall be three copies of each agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one copy shall be retained by the Registrar.

(c) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within one month of the termination of the probationary period.

(d) Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provisions of the Award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

10. Every agreement entered into by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice shall be in accordance with the provisions of subclause (c) of clause (5) of the Agreement, provided that the periods of apprenticeship therein set out may be reduced in special circumstances with the approval of the Court.

11. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain—

- (a) The names and addresses of the parties to the agreement.
- (b) The date of birth of the apprentice.
- (c) A description of the industry, craft, occupation, or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound.
- (d) The date at which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship.
- (e) A condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and apprentice to comply with the terms of the Industrial Award so far as they concern the apprentice.
- (f) A condition that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
- (g) A condition that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.
- (h) The general conditions of apprenticeship.

Transfer of Apprentices.

12. (a) The Court shall have power to transfer an apprentice from one employer to another either temporarily or permanently—

- (i) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or
- (ii) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice for good cause shown.

(b) The transfer of every agreement shall be on a form approved by the Court, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assignee, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, the Registrar, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within two months of the date on which the transfer is effected.

(c) One copy of the transfer agreement shall be held by the late employer, one shall be held by the new employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

13. Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may with the consent of the apprentice and guardian transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Court in its Award or otherwise according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

14. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship, from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the Clerk of the Court, and the cause thereof.

15. In the event of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or to arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

16. Where a person is apprenticed to partners his agreement of apprenticeship shall upon the retirement or death of any partner be deemed to be assigned to the continuing partner or partners.

Cancellation of Agreement.

17. Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

18. If the apprentice shall at any time be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders of the employer, his managers, foremen or other servants having authority over the apprentice, or be slothful, negligent, or dishonest, or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself, or shall not conduct himself as a good and faithful apprentice should do, or shall not faithfully observe and keep his part of his agreement, then it shall be lawful for the employer, with the consent of the Court, to discharge the apprentice from his service.

19. The Court may in its discretion for any cause which it may deem sufficient on the application of any party to an apprenticeship agreement vary or cancel the agreement, either unconditionally or subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable.

20. No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court on the application of the employer.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended for misconduct by the employer, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and in the event of the Court refusing same the wages of the apprentice or such portion thereof, if any, as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such suspension, and, in the event of the application for cancellation being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

21. Subject to the provisions of the Acts relating to bankruptcy and insolvency and the winding-up of companies, the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) The Trustee or Liquidator, as the case may be, may give written notice to the apprentice and his parent or guardian of his intention to discontinue the employment of the apprentice from a date to be named in such notice, and thereupon the agreement shall be deemed to be terminated from the said date; subject, however, and without prejudice to the right of the apprentice, his parent or guardian, to compound, compromise, or agree upon or to sue for and recover such damages (if any) as he may have sustained through such rescission of the agreement as aforesaid.

- (b) Any proceedings for damages hereunder must be commenced within six weeks after the service on the apprentice of the notice referred to in subclause (a) hereof otherwise any claim for damages shall be deemed to be waived and forfeited.

Extension of Term.

22. Subject to regulation 37, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatsoever may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement at the end of the year of service in which the time has been lost or at the termination of the apprenticeship period.

23. The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

Technical Education Classes.

24. (a) Every apprentice shall attend regularly and punctually a Government or other approved technical school vocational classes or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade. This clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the apprentice takes a course in an approved correspondence school: Provided, however that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of 12 miles from the place where instruction is given, or in the case of illness of the apprentice the proof whereof lies on him: Provided also that if technical instruction is not available in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available by correspondence, at reasonable cost to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such

correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(b) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

(c) The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes if any shall be four hours per week.

25. Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice, by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause, cannot conveniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, such of these regulations as relate to attendance at a technical school or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but he shall be subject to such conditions as the Court may direct.

26. If the examiners or the industrial union or employer concerned make representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the technical school, or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices, are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations, and such report to the Minister controlling such technical school, or such other place, as it deems necessary.

27. When an apprentice attends a technical school, vocational classes, or other class or classes of instruction during his ordinary working hours, where such is prescribed, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

Examinations.

28. (a) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times appointed by the Registrar after consultation with the examiners.

(b) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per centum of attendances at the technical school or other place of instruction unless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.

(c) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(d) The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiners such material and machinery on his premises as may be required by them, and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

29. (a) The examiners shall be persons skilled in the industry and appointed as prescribed by the Award. Failing provision or appointment as aforesaid the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.

(b) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.

(c) Such examination shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

30. The Registrar shall, after each examination issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the secretary of the union, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and produce the same for inspection by the industrial inspector when ever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate shall also be signed by the examiners.

31. Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of

proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the Clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the clerk of the Court thereof.

32. In lieu of, or in addition to, examiners above referred to the Court may appoint, wholly or partly, examiners to be appointed by the Director of Technical Education for the whole or any portion of the subjects of instruction, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine.

33. In the event of an apprentice failing to pass any of his examinations, the employer may apply to the Court to disallow the increase in wages prescribed by the Award, and the Court on any such application, may make such order as the circumstances of the case may seem to require.

34. Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or such other remedial measures (*i.e.*, increased time for technical instruction) as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

35. Upon the completion of the period of training prescribed for apprenticeship, each apprentice shall be required to pass the final examination test to the satisfaction of the examiners, and upon passing this test shall be provided with a certificate to that effect by the Registrar.

Lost Time.

36. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this Award: Provided—

(a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in each year;

(b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost if any of such certificate or certificates not exceeding 5s. to be borne by the employer;

(c) an apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

37. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the industrial Award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

38. When an apprentice is absent from work for any cause other than sickness or in pursuance of the provisions of these regulations, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.

39. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

Part-time Employment.

40. Where in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice for such

lesser time per week or per month, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine, being not less than the proportionate amount of the rate of wages prescribed by the industrial Award for the trade, calling, or industry. If the Court grants the application holidays will be reduced *pro rata*.

Miscellaneous.

- 41. (1) The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing— (a) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers; (b) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed; (c) a record of the progress of each apprentice, recording the result of the examiners' reports; (d) any other particulars the Court may direct. (2) These records shall be open to inspection by employers and the Union of workers interested, upon request.

42. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. Where the employer is himself a journeyman regularly and usually working at the trade he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices allowed. Where a business is in operation for less than twelve months the method of ascertaining the number shall be as agreed by the parties to the Award, or, if no agreement arrived at, as determined by the Court.

43. Every industrial inspector appointed in pursuance of the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, shall have the power to enter any premises, make such inspection of the premises, plant, machinery or work upon which any apprentice is employed or could be employed, interview any apprentice or employee, examine any books or documents of the business relating to the wages and conditions of apprentices, interrogate the employer in regard to any of the above-mentioned matters.

44. With a view to determining whether the number of apprentices being trained is sufficient to meet the future requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Registrar may require any employer to furnish him with any specified information relating to the said industry, or relating to the workers engaged therein.

45. In every application under clauses 15, 18, 19, 20, 22, 23, 33, and 40 of this Schedule, the Union of workers registered may intervene and make such representations at the hearing as it may deem necessary. The representative shall be appointed in the manner prescribed by section 65 of the Act.

(a) That the apprentice shall and will truly and faithfully serve the employer as his apprentice in the said trade at... aforesaid, and will diligently attend to his work at the said trade, and will at all times willingly obey the reasonable directions of the employer, his managers, foremen, and overseers, and will not during the apprenticeship, without the consent in writing of the employer, sell any goods which the employer makes or employ himself in the service of any other person or company in any work, or do any work which the employer undertakes, other than for the employer, and will not absent himself from the employer's service without leave, and will comply with the provisions of the regulations and of all Awards and Agreements made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, or any other Act in force so far as the same shall relate to his apprenticeship.

(b) That the apprentice will not do or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the property of the employer.

5. The employer for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns HEREBY COVENANTS with the apprentice as follows:—

(a) That the employer will accept the apprentice as his apprentice during the said term, and will during the said term, by the best means in his power, cause him to be instructed in the trade of..... and will provide facilities for the practical training of the apprentice in the said trade.

(b) That the technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the expense of the employer and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.

(c) In the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiner or examiners appointed by the Arbitration Court, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable the apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

(d) That the employer will observe and perform all the conditions and stipulations of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, or any Act or Acts amending the same and any regulations made thereunder, as far as the same concern the apprentice, AND ALSO the conditions and stipulations of any relative Award or Industrial Agreement for the time being in force.

4. IT IS FURTHER AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO:—

(a) That the apprentice shall not be responsible for any faulty work or for any damage or injury done to materials, work, or machinery, tools, or plant other than wilful damage or injury during the course of his work.

(b) That the apprentice shall not be required to work overtime without his consent.

(c) This agreement may, subject to the approval of the Court, be cancelled by mutual consent by the employer and parent (or guardian) giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that this agreement shall be terminated, and on such mutual consent being given the apprenticeship shall be terminated without prejudice to the rights of any of the parties hereto in respect of any antecedent breach of the provisions of this agreement.

(d) Other conditions:—

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 1 of 1941.)

Registered 8th January, 1941.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 16th day of December. One thousand nine hundred and forty, between Nestle and Anglo-Swiss Condensed Milk Co. (Anstraliasia), Ltd. (hereinafter called "the employer") of the one part, and the Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other, as follows:—

1.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be one year from the date hereof.

2.—Wages.

(c) Cleaners of boilers: Any worker engaged inside the gas or water space of a boiler, fine, or economiser in cleaning or scraping work shall be paid ninepence (9d.) per hour, in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay, as the case may be, whilst so employed.

(d) Engine-drivers and/or firemen shall, if necessary, perform such additional work as required, provided that such additional work shall not prevent them having continual supervision over their engine and/or boiler.

3.—Hours.

(a) Forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work until the 31st December, 1940, after which forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) In accordance with the provisions of subclause (a) of this clause, the forty-four (44) hour week shall commence on the 1st January, 1941, but the provisions in this clause for a forty-four (44) hour week shall be deemed to have been complied with if an eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight (namely, one week of forty (40) hours and one week of forty-eight (48) hours) is worked. Provided further, that the eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight referred to herein shall only be applied after written permission to work same has been granted by the union.

4.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the hours prescribed in clause 3 shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) Work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. If Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be kept.

5.—Holidays.

(a) Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' annual leave on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

(b) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall lose all rights under this clause.

6.—Rotation of Shifts.

Where a worker works afternoon or night shift only, or afternoon and night shifts in rotation, but does not work day shift one week out of three, he shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to the rates set out above.

7.—Casual Workers.

A "Casual worker" shall mean and include a worker competent to do the work he is engaged to do, who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of six (6) days from and including the date he starts work.

Casual workers shall be paid ten (10) per cent. in addition to the rates set out in clause 2.

8.—Contract of Service.

Except as provided by clause 7, the contract of service shall be a weekly one terminable by one week's notice on either side, but this clause shall not apply where a worker is summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

9.—Definitions.

"Engine-driver" means any person who operates or drives any engine or engines of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity or any other motive power other than manual or animal power.

10.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division in the State of Western Australia.

11.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all engine-drivers and/or firemen engaged in the Condensed and Concentrated Milk Industry.

12.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(b) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

13.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.
