(No. 3 of 1941).

(Reg. 17/1/41.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 27th day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty, between Nestle One thousand nine nundred and forty, between Nestle & Anglo-Swiss Condensed Milk Co. All time worked in excess of the ordinary working hours in any one day shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

#### 5.-Payment of Wages.

Workers shall be paid at the shop or on the job within five (5) minutes of the time for ceasing work.

### 6.-Holidays.

- 6.—Holidays.

  (a) Each worker shall be entitled to twelve (12) days' annual leave on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holidays in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. The following shall be days upon which, if the employer's establishment be closed, payment may be deducted:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Eve, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Anzae Day, King's Birthday, Labour Day, Foundation Day, and Union Picnic Day: Provided, however (if it suits the convenience of the employer and worker), the employer shall be entitled to grant six (6) of the holidays above mentioned as paid holidays, and, if such six (6) days are granted in this manner, they shall be deducted from the twelve (12) days' annual leave.

  (b) Holidays without deduction of pay, whether
- (b) Holidays without deduction of pay, whether granted annually or in the manner set out in the above proviso, shall be limited to twelve (12) days for each year of service.
- (c) In the event of a worker being employed by an (c) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and, if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holiday on full pay.
- (d) All work performed on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (e) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.
- (f) A worker who is dismissed for wilful misconduct (1) A worker who is dismissed for wilful misconduct shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause: Provided that any dispute as to what may constitute wilful misconduct shall be referred to a Board of Reference that may be constituted for that purpose, in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, nuder this Agreement

### 7.-Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is muable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

### 8.—Time and Wages Record.

- (a) The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept at the Factory Office a record, in which shall be entered:—
  - (i) The name of each worker to whom this Agreement applies.
  - (ii) The nature of the work he is doing.

  - (iii) The hours worked each day.
    (iv) The amount of wages and overtime (if any)
    received by each worker each week.
    (v) The ages of junior workers.

The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union at any time during the ordinary working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

(b) In the case of disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement, an accredited representative of the union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission, without the consent of the employer, shall not be exercised more than once in any one week.

Any junior worker without previous experience entering the trade at seventeen (17) years or over may be paid for the first year of service and thereafter the rate of pay he would have received had be been one year younger.

No junior worker under the age of eighteen (18) years shall operate a press or power hammer. "Press" shall mean a machine ordinarily used for the production of stamping or cutting by means of dies operated other than by human exertion.

# 11.—Contract of Service.

The contract of hiring of every worker shall be deemed to be a contract of hiring by the day.

# 12.-Absence through Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces satisfactory proof to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

This Agreement shall come into operation as from its date and shall remain in force for a period of three (3) years: Provided that at any time after the expiration of the first twelve (12) months from that date, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve (12) months, application may be made to the Court, by leave of the Court obtained, by any party to the Agreement for a review of any of the provisions of the Agreement and the Court shall have power to vary or rescind such provisions.
