## PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,  
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and  
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia  
Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-  
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under section 2 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1940, Native Institution means and includes any missions, reformatory, orphanage, school, home, station, reserve, or other institution for the benefit, protection, or care of the native inhabitants of the State declared by Proclamation to be a Native Institution for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of December, 1937, the Karonie Feeding Depot was, *inter alia*, declared to be a Native Institution for the purposes of the said Act, but recently the said Feeding Depot has recently been transferred from Karonie to Reserve No. 22100 (Natives) and henceforth will be known as Cundelee Feeding Depot, and it is desirable and expedient to determine Karonie Feeding Depot as a Native Institution, and in lieu thereof to declare the new Feeding Depot in Reserve No. 22100 (Natives) to be a Native Institution for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do by this Proclamation declare that the Karonie Feeding Depot declared by the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of December, 1937, to be a Native Institution for the purposes of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1940, shall as from the date of the issue of this Proclamation cease to be a Native Institution as aforesaid, and that the said hereinbefore-mentioned Proclamation shall be and is hereby amended and varied accordingly: And also, that the Feeding

Depot now established on Reserve No. 22100 (Natives) and known as Cundelee Feeding Depot shall be a Native Institution for the purposes of the said Act.

## PROCLAMATION No. 6

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,  
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and  
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia  
Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-  
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, that the Governor may from time to time, on the report and advice of the Commissioner, under section 11 of the Act, fix and declare for any commodity the maximum price at which it may be sold, and may fix and declare for any such commodity the maximum price at which it may be sold, according to or upon any principle or condition prescribed, and may vary any price previously fixed but so as to apply only to future transactions: And whereas by Proclamation issued under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of October, 1939; the 17th day of November, 1939; and the 1st day of December, 1939; the Governor fixed and declared the maximum price at which commodities may be sold: And whereas the Commissioner of Prices, under section 11 of the said Act, has now reported and advised that the

maximum price so fixed should be amended in accordance with certain principles and conditions: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and on the report of the Commissioner of Prices aforesaid, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 13 of the said Act, do hereby fix and declare that the maximum price at which commodities (save and except such commodities which may be exempted by Proclamation) which have been or which may hereafter be declared as such under the said Act shall be sold as from the date of this Proclamation shall be determined in accordance with the principles and conditions prescribed herein and appearing in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.  
Definitions.

1. In this Proclamation, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Average cost” means, as regards goods of any particular quality, the cost ascertained by dividing the aggregate cost of old stock and new stock by the number of units of old and new stock, or, if there is no old stock, by dividing the aggregate cost of new stock by the number of units of new stock, and any reference to “averaging the cost” of any goods has a like meaning;

“Basic price” means, in relation to any trader or manufacturer—

(a) the price, whether wholesale or retail, at which goods substantially identical in quantity and quality with the goods in relation to which the expression is used, were sold by a trader or manufacturer, on the prescribed date, at the same place, and on the same terms and conditions;

(b) such price as, pursuant to paragraph 8 of this Proclamation, is substituted in respect of those goods for the price specified in subparagraph (a) of this definition;

“Charged” includes debited or otherwise taken into account.

“Cost” means—

(a) as regards goods of any particular quality held for sale by a trader, the sum of money, or other valuable consideration, paid or furnished or agreed to be paid or furnished, for or in respect of those goods, by the trader; and

(b) as regards goods manufactured or partially manufactured in Western Australia and held for sale by the manufacturer, all expenses directly incurred in the manufacture of those goods, together with such proportion of other expenses as is, in the opinion of the Commissioner, properly chargeable against the manufacture of those goods, and, when any payment is specified to be made, or is made in a currency other than Australian currency, exchange at the rate current on the date on which payment is made;

“Date of manufacture” means the date on which the manufacture of the goods is completed;

“Goods” means all goods, wares, and merchandise proclaimed to be declared commodities for purposes of the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939;

“Gross profit” means the difference between the basic price and the cost on the prescribed date of the goods in relation to which the expression is used;

“Manufactured” includes “produced” and any reference to “manufacture,” “manufacturer,” or “manufacturing” has a like meaning;

“Materials” includes fuel and supplies used in respect of the maintenance of plant and for manufacturing processes;

“Old stock,” when used in contradistinction to new stock, means—

(a) in relation to a trader—goods in store and unsold at the date of the receipt of new goods; and

(b) in relation to a manufacturer—

(i) goods in store and unsold at the date of the manufacture of new goods; or

(ii) materials in store and unused at the date of the receipt of new materials;

“Paid” includes credited or otherwise taken into account;

“Prescribed date” means—

(a) the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine; or

(b) where, in relation to any particular class or kind of goods, a trader or manufacturer did not on that date make any sale of goods substantially identical in quantity and quality and comparable as regards place, terms, and conditions—the last date prior thereto upon which that trader or manufacturer made a sale of goods substantially identical in quantity and quality, and comparable as regards place, terms and conditions; or

(c) where the Commissioner, pursuant to paragraph 8 of this Proclamation substitutes a date for the date determined or determinable under the preceding subparagraphs of this definition—the date so substituted;

“Purchased” includes acquired by barter, exchange or otherwise;

“Quality” includes grade and description;

“The Commissioner” means the Commissioner for the time being appointed and acting under the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939.

Imported Goods.

2. As regards goods imported into Western Australia, I fix and declare the maximum wholesale price at which such goods may be sold by any trader to be the basic price, with the following exceptions, the operation of which is subject to the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Proclamation:—

(a) where, after the prescribed date and whether before or after the making of this Proclamation, the trader has received or receives new goods substantially identical in quality with stock received by him prior to 31st August, 1939, he shall take into account the cost of the new stock received in such a way that the maximum price for any sale of stock, whether old stock or new stock, of such goods, as on and from the date upon which he so takes into account the cost of that new stock, shall be the sum that represents the average cost of all the stock, both old stock and new stock, plus gross profit thereon, calculated on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price;

(b) where, prior to 1st September, 1939, the trader did not make any sale of goods substantially identical in quality with stock he receives after that date, the maximum price at which any such stock may be sold shall be the cost of the stock, plus gross profit thereon calculated—

(i) on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price of goods of similar class;

(ii) if the trader sold no such goods on the prescribed date on such basis as, after application by the trader, the Commissioner declares to him in writing.

Goods Manufactured in Western Australia and Sold by Trader.

3. As regards goods manufactured in Western Australia and held for sale by a trader, I fix and declare the maximum wholesale price at which such goods may be sold by any such trader to be the basic price, with the following exceptions, the operation of which is subject to the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Proclamation:—

(a) where, after the prescribed date, and whether before or after the making of this Proclamation, the trader receives new goods substan-

tially identical in quality with stock received by him prior to 31st August, 1939, he shall take into account the cost of the new stock received in such a way that the maximum price for any sale of stock, whether old stock or new stock, of such goods, as on and from the date upon which he so takes into account the cost of that new stock, shall be the sum that represents the average cost of all the stock, both old stock and new stock, plus gross profit thereon, calculated on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price.

- (b) where, prior to 1st September, 1939, the trader did not make any sale of goods substantially identical in quality with stock he receives after that date, the maximum price at which any such stock may be sold shall be the cost of that stock, plus gross profit thereon calculated—
- (i) on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price of goods of similar class; or
  - (ii) if the trader sold no such goods on the prescribed date, on such basis as, after application by the trader, the Commissioner declares to him in writing.

#### Western Australian Manufactured Goods held for Sale by the Manufacturer.

4. In the case of goods manufactured or partially manufactured in Western Australia and held for sale by the manufacturer, I fix and declare the maximum price at which such goods may be sold by any such manufacturer to be the basic price, with the following exceptions, the operation of which is subject to the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Proclamation:—

- (a) where, after the prescribed date and whether before or after the making of this Proclamation the manufacturer manufactures goods substantially identical in quality with goods manufactured by him prior to 31st August, 1939, he shall take into account the cost of the new goods so manufactured in such a way that the maximum price for any sale of stock, whether old stock or new stock of such goods, as on and from the date upon which he takes into account the cost of that new stock shall be the sum that represents the average cost of all the stock both old stock and new stock, plus gross profit thereon calculated on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price;
- (b) where, after the prescribed date and whether before or after the making of this Proclamation the manufacturer receives materials substantially identical in quality with, or interchangeable with, stocks of materials received by him prior to 31st August, 1939, such materials, being for use either in or in connection with the manufacture of goods of a particular quality, then for the purpose of ascertaining the cost of manufacture of those goods, he shall take into account the cost of the new stocks of materials he receives, in such a way that, as on and from the date on which he takes into account the new stocks of materials, the cost of the materials, whether from old stocks or from new stocks, used in or in connection with the manufacture of those goods shall be the sum that represents the average cost of all the materials, whether old stock or new stock;
- (c) where, prior to 1st September, 1939, the manufacturer did not make any sale of goods substantially identical in quality with goods he manufactures on or after that date, the maximum price for any sale of such goods shall be the cost of the goods, plus gross profit thereon calculated—
- (i) on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price of goods of similar class; or
  - (ii) if the manufacturer sold no such goods on the prescribed date upon such basis as, after application by the manufacturer, the Commissioner declares to him in writing.

#### Extension of Proclamation to certain Sales.

5. Where on any date a trader makes a sale by wholesale or a manufacturer makes a sale of goods of a quantity or on terms and conditions substantially different from the quantity in which or the terms and conditions upon which, on the prescribed date, the trader or manufacturer sold goods substantially identical in quality, then this Proclamation shall extend to such sale, but so that the maximum price declared by this Proclamation for those goods shall be increased or decreased by an amount corresponding to the amount of the additional cost or saving to the trader or manufacturer consequent on the change in quantity or in the terms and conditions, or both.

#### Application of Averaging to falling Costs.

6. The system of averaging prescribed in paragraph 2, 3, and 4 of this Proclamation, when adopted by any trader or manufacturer, shall apply equally to cases where new stock is acquired or produced by that trader or manufacturer at lower cost than old stock as to cases where the new stock is acquired or produced at higher cost.

#### Retail Goods.

7. (a) As regards goods of any particular quality held by a trader for sale by retail, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any such goods may be sold by any such trader to be the cost to him of those goods, together with gross profit thereon, calculated on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price.

Provided that the Commissioner may, subject to such conditions as he may impose, permit the "cost" for the purposes of this calculation to be the "average cost" of those goods.

(b) Where, prior to 1st September, 1939, the trader did not make any sale of goods substantially identical in quality with goods he sells on or after that date, the maximum price for any sale of such goods shall be the cost of the goods, plus gross profit thereon calculated—

- (i) on the same basis as that on which gross profit is included in the basic price of goods of similar class; or
- (ii) if the trader sold no such goods on the prescribed date upon such basis as, after application by the trader, the Commissioner declares to him in writing.

(c) For the purposes of subparagraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph, "cost" shall not, unless the approval of the Commissioner has first been obtained in writing, include sales tax at a rate greater than 10 per cent.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Proclamation, where sales tax is incurred by a retail trader at a rate greater than 10 per cent., such additional amount may be added to the selling price, calculated in accordance with subparagraphs (a), (b) and (c) hereof.

#### Variation of Basic Price.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Proclamation, where the Commissioner is satisfied that, by reason of any special circumstances, declared in writing by any person (such circumstances, if the Commissioner so requires, to be verified by statutory declaration, and supported by any evidence he may require), the fixation and declaration of a maximum price for any goods, in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Proclamation, would be inequitable or onerous to a trader or manufacturer or to any buyer or consumer of the goods—

- (i) there may be substituted, with the consent of the Commissioner, a different date for the prescribed date as the basic date for the calculation of the price to be charged by that trader or manufacturer for any specified goods;
- (ii) there may be substituted, with the consent of the Commissioner, for the price specified in subparagraph (a) of the definition of "basic price" contained in paragraph 1 of this Proclamation, such price as in all circumstances appears to the Commissioner to be reasonable to the trader or manufacturer and to any buyer or consumer of the goods; or
- (iii) the application of this Proclamation, with respect to any specified goods, may be modified in such other manner as the Commissioner declares.

## Keeping of Records.

9. Every trader and manufacturer shall—
- (a) keep records of—
- (i) costs and quantities of stocks on hand and of new stocks at the date of any alteration of price; and
- (ii) the cost at which new stocks are acquired or manufactured; and
- (b) upon notice served upon him individually or published in the *Gazette*, such notice having relation either to all goods or to such goods as are specified in the notice, furnish to the Commissioner, within such time as is specified in the notice, copies of any records kept by the trader or manufacturer in pursuance of this Proclamation.

## PROCLAMATION.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,  
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and  
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia  
Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-  
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into the State of Western Australia, either generally or from any specified State, country, or place of any specified kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease into the State of Western Australia: And whereas the said Lieutenant-Governor is of the opinion that the bringing into the State of Western Australia of the plants or things hereinafter mentioned in the Schedule hereunder from the State of Vic-

toria would be likely to introduce into the State of Western Australia the disease known as *Pteris rapae* (L) (Cabbage Butterfly): Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred upon me by the said Act, do by this Proclamation prohibit the bringing into the State of Western Australia from the State of Victoria of the plants or things mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, except in accordance with the relative regulations made and from time to time in force under the said Act.

## Schedule.

Borecole, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, chou moellier, horse radish, kohl rabi, radish, rape, swedes, turnip, lettuce, and any plant whatsoever of the family cruciferae.

## Bulk Handling Act, 1935.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agric. 928/39.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by section 20 of the Bulk Handling Act, 1935, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council hereby orders that the terms and conditions set out in the Second Schedule of the Act, as amended by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of January, 1936, be varied in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

## Schedule.

1. Condition (1) is amended by deleting subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (b) thereof, and substituting in lieu thereof a new subparagraph as follows:—

(ii) not more than 2 lbs. per bushel in the aggregate of unmillable material. Unmillable material includes cracked wheat, unthreshed heads or parts thereof, chaff, straw, backbone, barley, oats, drake, and any other foreign grain.

2. Condition (2) is amended by deleting from paragraph (c) the fourth paragraph thereof, commencing with the words "For every pound of barley," and substituting in lieu thereof a new paragraph as follows:—

"For every pound of unmillable material above that shown on the warrant, a payment of one half-penny per bushel."

## FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

1. Regulation 23 is amended by inserting in paragraph (6) after paragraph (h) thereof a new paragraph, to stand as paragraph (i) as follows:—
  - (i) For trailers and caravans drawn by other vehicles—yellow numbers or letters and numbers on a dark blue ground.
2. A new regulation to stand as regulation 305 (H), is inserted after regulation (G) as follows:—
  - 305 (H) Parking is prohibited in Johnson parade, in the Mosman Park Road District.

## THE PLANT DISEASES ACT, 1914-1939.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to section 35 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, has been pleased to amend, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921.

## Schedule.

The above-mentioned regulations are amended by inserting therein after regulation 2 a new regulation, to stand as regulation 2A, as follows:

- 2A. Insofar as any Proclamation made and issued under section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, prohibits the bringing into the State of Western Australia

from the State of Victoria any of the following plants or things, that is to say:—borecole, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, chou moellier, horse radish, kohl, rabi, radish, rape, swedes, turnip, lettuce, and any plant whatsoever of the family cruciferae, except in accordance with the relative regulations made and from time to time in force under the said Act, and while any such Proclamation remains in force the following provisions shall apply:—

- (1) Before any plants or things aforesaid are brought into the State of Western Australia from the State of Victoria, the proposed importer or his agent shall obtain a certificate, dated and signed by an inspector or other authorised officer of the Department of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, identifying the plants or things and stating the number or quantity thereof, and—
  - (a) if they have been grown in the State of Victoria, stating—
    - (i) that the disease or pest known as *Pieris rapae* (L) (Cabbage Butterfly) does not exist in the part of the State of Victoria in which they were grown and;
    - (ii) that they were on inspection prior to despatch from the State of Victoria found to be free from the said disease or pest; and
    - (iii) that they were packed in the State of Victoria in clean new packages; or
  - (b) if they were not grown in Victoria, stating—
    - (i) the name of the State in which they were grown; and
    - (ii) the name of the State in which they were packed for export from Victoria; and
    - (iii) if they were packed in Victoria, that they were so packed in clean new packages.
- (2) When any of the plants or things aforesaid are brought into the State of Western Australia from the State of Victoria it shall be the duty of the importer thereof or his agent to produce and deliver to an inspector in the State of Western Australia, on demand, the certificate obtained pursuant to paragraph (1) hereof in relation to such plants or things.
- (3) Upon failure by an importer or his agent to comply with the requirements of paragraph (2) hereof, an inspector may seize and deal with the plants or things aforesaid found by him, in the State of Western Australia, in any manner authorised by these regulations in relation to plants and things brought into the State of Western Australia from any State, country, or place outside the State of Western Australia.

#### Schedule.

#### THE MARGARINE ACT, 1940.

#### Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Margarine Act Regulations.

#### Interpretation.

2. In these regulations the terms used, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the meanings stated in section 6 of the Margarine Act, 1940, and also—
 

“Approved,” if not otherwise expressed, means approved by an inspector;

“Margarine factory” means any building or place where margarine is manufactured or where fats (whether of animal or vegetable origin) are treated or prepared preparatory to the manufacture of margarine.

#### Licenses to Manufacture.

3. (1) Every application for a Table Margarine License or for a Cooking Margarine License (as the case may be) shall be in writing in the Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these regulations.
- (2) Such application shall contain the particulars indicated in the said form and shall be signed by the applicant and shall be accompanied by the appropriate license fee.
4. Subject to the proviso to section 19 of the Act, the annual license fee for a Table Margarine License or for a Cooking Margarine License shall be one pound.
5. Subject to section 17 of the Act—
  - (a) A Table Margarine License shall be in the Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these regulations; and
  - (b) A Cooking Margarine License shall be in the Form No. 3 in the said Appendix.
6. Every license granted under the Act shall be so granted in respect of the margarine factory specified in the application for such license.
7. (1) The Minister shall cause to be kept a register, in which particulars shall be entered of every license granted and of the cancellation or transfer of any such license.

(2) Such register shall be open to inspection by the public, at such times and on such days as the Minister may determine, on payment of an inspection fee of one shilling.

8. (1) A license granted under the Act shall not be cancelled, as provided for in section 24 of the Act, until after a report in writing has been made to the Minister by the Under Secretary for Agriculture that such license is liable to cancellation.

(2) Upon receipt of such a report the Minister shall cause to be served upon the holder of such license a notice in writing calling upon such holder to show cause why his license should not be cancelled, and appointing a day, time, and place on and at which such holder will be heard.

(3) The holder of a license who has received such notice may, before the time appointed therein, by writing under his hand sent to the Minister, show cause as aforesaid, or, on the day and at the time and place appointed by the notice, may appear before the person then present, being either the Minister, or some other person appointed by the Minister, for the purpose, either in person or by his solicitor or agent, and show cause as aforesaid.

(4) After the holder of the license has shown cause as aforesaid, the Minister shall consider the representations made by the holder of the license, and thereafter shall determine whether the license shall be cancelled or not.

(5) Where the Minister decides that the license shall be cancelled, a memorandum of such cancellation shall be entered in the license register, and notice of the cancellation shall be served upon the holder of the license in the Form No. 4 in the Appendix to these regulations.

#### Sale or Lease of Margarine Factory.

9. (1) When any margarine factory in respect whereof a current license under the Act has been issued is transferred or leased by the holder of such license to another person, the holder of such license shall, within fourteen days after such transfer or lease, notify the Under Secretary for Agriculture of such transfer or lease, and of the name and address of the transferee or lessee, as the case may be.

(2) Any such transferee or lessee intending to use the margarine factory which has been transferred or leased to him as a margarine factory, shall, before so using the same, either obtain a transfer to him of the current license granted in respect thereof, or otherwise, make application for and obtain a new license under the Act in respect of such margarine factory.

#### Permits to Export Margarine.

10. (1) Any person who desires a special permit under section 27 of the Act authorising him to manufacture table margarine for export, may make application to the Minister for such special permit.

(2) The application shall be in writing in the Form No. 5 in the Appendix to these regulations, shall be signed by the applicant, and be sent or delivered to the Under Secretary for Agriculture.

(3) Every special permit granted under section 27 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 6 in the said Appendix.

11. Every person who intends to export beyond the State margarine manufactured within the State shall, at least three clear days (exclusive of Sundays and public holidays) before so exporting such margarine, give to an inspector notice in writing, in the Form No. 7 in the Appendix to these regulations, of his said intention.

12. No person shall export or attempt to export from the State any margarine manufactured within the State, unless and until an inspector has examined the same and has issued a certificate, in the Form No. 8 in the Appendix to these regulations, that in relation to the margarine about to be exported all the requirements of the Act and of these regulations have been complied with.

#### Standard for Margarine.

13. Margarine shall contain not less than one part potato starch or Queensland arrowroot (*cauma edulis*) per 1,000 parts of margarine, or, alternatively, not less than five parts per centum by weight of sesame oil. It shall not contain more than 16 parts per centum of water and shall conform with the general standard for edible fats and oils. It shall not contain any other substance, except salt (sodium chloride) other than substances made from animal or vegetable fats or oils. The sesame oil, which is added to margarine, shall give the chemical reaction as prescribed in the regulations made under the Health Act, 1911-1937.

14. The fatty portion of cooking margarine shall conform with the following chemical and physical criteria, namely:—

Reichert Meissl No. . . . .	Not greater than 1.0
Polenske No. . . . .	Not greater than 2.5
Iodine value . . . . .	Not greater than 5
Specific gravity . . . . .	Not greater than 0.937
Artificial butter flavour . . . . .	Nil.

#### Labelling of Table Margarine.

15. Where the words "Table Margarine" are written or printed on packages of table margarine, as provided for in section 30 of the Act, they shall be so written or printed in capital letters equivalent in size to bold face sans-serif capital letters of not less than 30 points face measurement.

16. (1) Where in any store, shop, stall, in market or other place the words "Margarine sold here" are displayed on a sign as provided for in subsection (1) of section 32 of the Act, such words shall be so displayed in bold face sans-serif capital letters of not less than 24 points face measurement.

(2) Where in any hotel, cafe, restaurant, tearoom, or other place the word "Margarine" is displayed on any vessel, or the words "Margarine is served here" are displayed on any sign, as provided for in subsection (2) of section 30 of the Act, such word or words shall be so displayed in bold sans-serif capital letters of not less than 18 points face measurement, where the word "margarine" is displayed, and of not less than 24 points face measurement, where the words "margarine is served here" are displayed.

#### Labelling of Cooking Margarine.

17. Where the words "Cooking margarine for cooking purposes only" are written or printed on packages of cooking margarine, as required by section 31 of the Act, they shall be so written or printed in capital letters equivalent in size to bold face sans-serif capital letters of not less than 18 points face measurement.

#### Fee for Examination of Margarine.

18. A fee shall be payable by the manufacturer for every examination by an inspector under the Act, or these regulations of margarine manufactured by such manufacturer, at the rate of one penny per hundredweight, or any part of one hundredweight, of the quantity of margarine so examined.

Sale of Cooking Margarine in which the Fatty Content consists of less than 90 per cent. Beef or Mutton Fat.

19. The persons or the class of persons to whom the holder of a Cooking Margarine License may sell cooking margarine, which contains beef fat or mutton fat, or beef fat and mutton fat, in a quantity of between seventy-five and ninety per centum by weight of the total quantity of fat and oil contained in such margarine, as provided for in section 26 of the Act, shall be the following, that is to say:—(a) Pastrycooks; (b) Biscuit manufacturers; (c) Confectioners.

#### Returns by Margarine Manufacturers.

20. Every manufacturer of margarine shall send or deliver monthly to the Department of Agriculture, so as to be received by the Superintendent of Dairying not later than the 20th day of each and every month, a return, in the Form No. 9 in the Appendix to these regulations, in relation to the margarine manufactured by him during the month next preceding the month in which such monthly return is made.

#### Books to be kept in Margarine Factory.

21. The holder of every license issued under the Act shall cause to be kept in his margarine factory, or at a place or premises approved by the Minister, the following books, which shall be made up at the end of each calendar month and shall be available at all times for examination by an inspector:—

- (a) A Manufacturing Book, showing the weight in pounds of margarine manufactured daily, and which shall be signed daily by the employee or agent of the manufacturer who carries out the process of manufacture;
- (b) A Margarine Stock and Sales Book, showing on each day the opening stock on hand, the margarine manufactured, oils, or fats used in the manufacture of margarine, consignments, sales, donations, and closing stock on hand.

#### Storage of Foreign Materials in Margarine Factories.

22. No materials or substances other than those required for use in connection with the manufacture of margarine shall be stored or kept in rooms or places used for the manufacture or storage of margarine.

#### Provisions relating to Margarine Factories.

23. In relation to every margarine factory, the following provisions shall apply:—
- (a) Sanitation:—The factory shall be so situated that good sanitation as regards disposal of sewage and freedom from the ill-effects of noxious trades is permanently and economically possible.
  - (b) Proximity to Pigsties:—The factory shall be situated not less than 200 yards of a pigsty, where less than twenty-five pigs are kept, and not less than 300 yards of a pigsty where twenty-five or more pigs are kept, and, where pigs are grazed in paddocks and are allowed plenty of room, the factory shall be situated not less than 100 yards of the nearest boundary fence of any such paddock.
  - (c) Proximity to Slaughter-house:—The factory shall be situated not less than 200 yards of a slaughter-house, and if pigs or sheep are kept in a slaughter-house for the purpose of being killed there for more than six hours prior to being killed, the factory shall be situated not less than 300 yards of such slaughter-house.
  - (d) Floors:—The floors in the factory where the margarine is manufactured shall be of impervious material, such as concrete, shall be smooth on the surface, and be so graded that the washings will be readily run away into suitably made drains.
  - (e) Walls:—In order that the walls of manufacturing rooms shall not become offensive in any way, they shall be of impervious material, and be capable of being washed down to a height of at least six feet.
  - (f) Ceilings:—Every manufacturing room shall be provided with a ceiling so constructed as to follow the contour of the roof and, where deemed necessary, as to prevent the deposit of unnecessary and avoidable dust.
  - (g) Ventilation:—Every manufacturing room and storage room shall be so ventilated that a reasonably pure atmosphere always obtains therein.
  - (h) Water:—Water used in connection with the manufacture of margarine shall be obtained from a pure source, shall be free from avoidable organic matter and from deleterious mineral matter.
  - (i) Cool-storage Rooms:—The cool-storage rooms in margarine factories shall be kept free from unnecessary moisture; and any drip from thawing ice shall be carried away in suitably arranged open guttering.

- (j) Disposal of Sewage:—Factory sewage shall be disposed of and in a manner which will preclude the possibility of such sewage contaminating the atmosphere surrounding the factory. Open concrete drains shall, wherever possible, be used for carrying away factory washings.
- (k) Protection from Flies:—The manufacturing room shall have all the doors and windows thereof fitted with fly-proof metal gauze.
- (l) Atmosphere:—No building or premises shall be passed or approved by an inspector as being suitable for use as a margarine factory, if through, proximity to any noxious trade centre, or through any other cause whatsoever, the atmosphere surrounding the factory becomes or is likely to become tainted in a manner which can be detected by the sense of smell by an odour which, when absorbed, would be detrimental to the flavour of the margarine manufactured in such factory.
- (m) Size:—The manufacturing room shall have a floor space of at least 336 square feet, and the height between the floor and the lowest portion of the roof shall be at least 12 feet.
- (n) Water Supply:—The factory shall be provided with an ample supply, both of cold water and of boiling water, and also with steam for the washing and sterilisation of all equipment used in the manufacture of margarine and for the cleansing of the manufacturing room.

Breach of Regulations.

24. Any person who is guilty of any contravention of any of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding the sum of twenty pounds, and, in addition, if such contravention is of a continuing nature, to a daily penalty not exceeding two pounds for every day or part of a day during which such contravention continues.

The Fire Brigades Act Regulations aforesaid are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 37F (*Gazette* 2nd February, 1940) is amended by adding thereto a new paragraph as follows:—

(4) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained elsewhere in this regulation, whenever a subscriber, having been granted leave of absence from his employment for the purpose, either by reason of enlistment or being called up, is engaged on war service continuously during the time of war, the following provisions shall apply, namely:—

- (a) his liability to contribute as a subscriber under this regulation shall be suspended whilst he is so engaged in such war service;
- (b) subject, as in this subparagraph hereinafter provided, the Board shall continue to make its contributions under this regulation in respect of such subscriber;

Provided that the liability of the Board under this subparagraph shall cease upon the happening of any of the following events:—

- (i) the death of the subscriber during the period of his war service;
  - (ii) the incapacitation of the subscriber during the period of his war service to an extent or in a manner which renders him physically or mentally unfit to resume his employment under the Board upon his discharge from war service; or
  - (iii) the failure of the subscriber to report to the Board for resumption of his duty as an employee within such period of time as the Board considers reasonable, after his discharge from war service.
- (c) Wherever the terms "time of war," "war," and "war service" are used in this paragraph, such terms shall have the same meanings respectively as they have when used in the Commonwealth Defence Act as amended from time to time.
  - (d) All expenditure incurred by the Board under this paragraph shall be charged to the administration costs of the Board.

2. Regulation 37I (*Gazette* 2nd February, 1940) is amended as follows:—

(a) by inserting in the proviso to the said regulation after paragraph (d) (in lieu of the paragraph (e) disallowed by Parliament on the 28th day of August, 1940) a new paragraph (e) as follows:—

- (e) (i) In the event of a subscriber committing a breach of trust or other wrongful act by reason of which the Board suffers or may suffer pecuniary loss, the Board shall have full power to use the amount standing at credit to such subscriber's account for the purpose of making good any such loss.
- (ii) Where, as a result of the aforesaid breach of trust or other wrongful act the subscriber is dismissed or retires in order to escape dismissal, he shall, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained elsewhere in this regulation, be entitled to receive from the Fund only a sum equal to the balance (if any) of his contribution thereto after deducting the amount of the loss.

(b) by adding at the end of the said regulation a new paragraph, as follows:—

(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained elsewhere in this regulation, where a subscriber dies or retires during the currency of any financial year, the share of profits to be credited to him from the date of the last apportionment to the date of his death or retirement shall be calculated at the rate of three pounds per centum per annum on the lowest monthly balance of such subscriber's account.

3. Regulation 37L (*Gazette* 2nd February, 1940) is repealed and a new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

37L. Any sum due or payable to any subscriber under these regulations shall be paid only if the cash is available for the purpose; until paid, however, such sum shall carry interest at the rate of three pounds per centum per annum on the lowest monthly balance of such subscriber's account.
