Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section: And whereas the Bank of New South Wales, of St. George's terrace, Perth, in the State of Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act, has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer it has established a fund for insurance against its liability aforesaid, and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond of five thousand pounds, given by the said Bank, charged with all payments to become due and payable by the Bank under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Bank of New South Wales as such employer aforesaid from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, for a period of one year computed from and including the 31st day of March, 1941.

#### HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

##### Gosnells Road Board—Resolution.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that a local authority may, by by-law, define localities in the district within which noxious or offensive trades, businesses, or manufactures may not be established or carried on: And whereas the Gosnells Road Board, being a local health authority in respect of the Health District of Gosnells within the meaning and for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-1937, deem it desirable and expedient to make such a by-law: And whereas the Gosnells Road Board, as such local authority aforesaid, by a resolution published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of July, 1930, adopted Series "A" of the Model By-laws prepared pursuant to section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1926, and has amended such by-laws by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Gosnells Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, acting pursuant to section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, that the said by-laws be amended in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

##### Schedule.

1. By-law 5 of Part IX. is repealed and a new by-law is substituted in lieu thereof as follows:—
5. No person shall establish or carry on any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufacture, other than cleaning establishments, dye works, fish shops, and laundries, within any portion of the district defined within the boundaries described and defined in Schedule F hereto.
2. A new Schedule, to stand as Schedule F, is inserted after Schedule E, as follows:—

##### SCHEDULE F.

##### Noxious Trade Area.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the north-western boundary of Canning Location 16a with the eastern alignment of the Albany road and extending north-easterly along said boundary to the eastern alignment of Astley street, Gosnells; thence generally north-north-westerly along said alignment to the south-eastern alignment of Lucy street; thence north-easterly along the latter to the left bank of the Canning river; thence generally north-westerly downwards along said bank to the eastern corner of

PUBLIC CEMETERY, MANDURAH.

By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Mandurah, the said Trustees make the following by-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in the Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. No graves shall be dug, and no vault, brick graves, or graves shall be re-opened without the permission of the Trustees.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the secretary.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased, stamped, or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this by-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—1st September to 30th April—week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 1st May to 31st August—week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery, or proceed, except at and by such roads, as directed by the officer of the Trustees from



time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these by-laws.

12. Children under the age of twelve years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these by-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, or any erection, commits an offence against these by-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing, specifying the locations of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the name of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the by-laws the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the prescribed "Form" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the "Order of Right of Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for Right of Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial," on making application for a grave to be reopened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before an "Order for Burial" will be issued by the Trustees.

26. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclose in any part of the Cemetery, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897.

27. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

28. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

29. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.

30. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited, if either of the two last preceding by-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

31. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by the tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material, with wheels less than four inches broad, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

32. No catacomb shall be allowed.

33. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

34. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault without permission of Trustees.

35. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.

36. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these by-laws.

37. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed;
- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
- (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees;
- (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due dispatch, and only during regulation hours.

38. Prior to the conduction of any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees a fee of 10s. 6d. for each burial, or £2 2s. per year, and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and, unless in the possession of such a "Permit," no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

39. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

40. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

41. Any person committing any breach of these by-laws and regulations, or of any other rules, regulations or by-laws, lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be

liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the secretary or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

42. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave and a Register of all Certificates of "Right of Burial" shall be kept at the Office.

43. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

44. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees:—

- (a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as a result of injuries or disease received in the late war;
- (b) and that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances; provided that such "Grant" shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.

45. The Trustees may maintain the graves of deceased soldiers free of cost for a term of seven years.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their Office, at Mandurah on the 19th day of September, 1940.

## EDUCATION ACT, 1928.

Education Department,

Perth, 26th February, 1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 28 of the Education Act, 1928, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of March, 1923, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

## Schedule.

The above-mentioned regulations are amended as follows:—

(1) Regulation 25 is amended by inserting after the first paragraph a proviso as follows:—

Provided that no teacher will be granted an increase in reclassification as a result of the completion of an examination, before the 1st day of January in the year following that in which he completed the examination.

(2) Regulation 29 is amended by inserting in paragraph (e) at the end thereof a proviso as follows:—

Provided that, in order to enable rectification, should an appeal to the Appeal Board be successful, all appointments made pursuant to the approval of the Minister shall be provisional for one month from the date of the publication thereof in the *Education Circular*.

(3) Regulation 64 is amended by inserting new paragraphs at the end thereof, as follows:—

Students who are absent on account of illness for periods of at least one week, shall forward to the Department a certificate from a registered medical practitioner testifying to such illness.

Students shall not be paid the proportionate period of their allowance for periods during which they are absent from the College, unless payment of the amount is approved by the Director.

(4) Regulation 155 is amended by deleting from the second paragraph in the second line thereof, the words "any teacher who applies for it" and substituting in lieu thereof the words "each teacher."

(5) Appendix I. is amended by inserting in clause (3) a new paragraph to stand as paragraph (c), as follows:—

(c) have been resident in Australia for at least two years immediately preceding the 1st January of the year in which the successful candidates will enter upon the Scholarship.

(6) Appendix II. is amended by inserting between the first and second paragraphs a new paragraph, as follows:—

Only candidates who have been resident in Australia for at least two years immediately preceding the 1st day of January in the year in which the successful candidates will enter upon the Scholarship.

(7) Appendix III. is amended by inserting in clause 3 in the third line of the fourth paragraph thereof after the word "school" the following words:—

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 4 of 1941.)

(Registered 24/2/1941.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 31st day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty, between the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral, Agricultural, Horticultural, and Tobacco Curing Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, and the West Australian Shop Assistants' and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the unions"), of the one part, and the Co-operative Bulk Handling, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employer"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

## 1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers engaged by the Co-operative Bulk Handling, Limited, in connection with the operations of the North Fremantle Wheat Silos controlled by the said Company.

## 2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date hereof.

## 3.—Hours.

The ordinary hours of work shall not exceed forty-four (44) hours in any one week and shall not exceed eight (8) hours daily, to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., from Monday to Friday, inclusive, 8 a.m. and noon, Saturday.

## 4.—Overtime.

Overtime, as hereinafter defined, shall be paid for at the following rates:—

- Between 6 p.m. and midnight, Monday to Friday inclusive—ordinary rate and a half;
- Between midnight and 7 a.m., Monday to Saturday, inclusive—double ordinary rate;
- For work done on Saturday between noon and midnight, double ordinary rates shall be paid.

Payment for time worked on Sundays and holidays shall be as under:—

- Ordinary holidays:—For work done on ordinary holidays the rates shall be—
  - Between midnight and 7 a.m.—two and a half times the ordinary rate;
  - Between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.—ordinary rate and a half;
  - Between 5 p.m. and midnight—double ordinary rate.
- Sundays and extraordinary Holidays:—For work done between midnight on Saturday and midnight on Sunday and between midnight and midnight on extraordinary holidays, two and a half times the ordinary rate shall be paid.

## 5.—Holidays.

The holidays shall be as follows:—

- Extraordinary Holidays:—Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Picnic Day, and Sundays;
- Ordinary Holidays:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Easter Monday, Boxing Day, State Foundation Day, and Anzac Day.

## 6.—Wages.

Basic wage, at the rate of £4 5s. 4d. per week, calculated on an hourly basis.

(a) Margin:—The margin per hour shall be such amount as is necessary to make the total wage, exclusive of any other allowances herein provided, equal the ordinary rate of wage provided by the Award applicable to waterside workers at the Port of Fremantle from time to time.

(b) Men working outside the silo when employed in the discharge of bulk wheat trucks, on rolling up canvasses and the spoutman loading trucks, and men shunting trucks after they are loaded, shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per hour extra.

## 7.—Smoko.

The following smokos shall be allowed:—

Night Time:—9 p.m. to 9.30 p.m., unless work ends for the night before 10 p.m.; 3 a.m. to 3.30 a.m., unless work ends for the night before 3 a.m.

Where the ordinary starting time is 8 a.m.—10 a.m. to 10.15 a.m.; 3 p.m. to 3.15 p.m.

## 8.—Inspections.

Any officer or other person authorised by either of the unions may, on any day for the purpose of investigating any alleged breaches of this Agreement, and after giving notice to the employer or his agent, enter any premises on which the operations of this Agreement are being carried on, inspect such operations and speak to workers: Provided that such inspection shall not in any way be exercised so as to cause any delay in such operations.

## 9.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid in cash on or before Friday in each week, within ten minutes of the time for finishing work. Provided that, when the engagement of the worker is terminated, all wages and holiday pay due shall be paid within ten minutes of the termination of the engagement.

## 10.—Time of Duty.

(a) The time of duty shall begin at the time and place to which the employee is directed to present himself for work.

(b) Employees who are engaged for work shall be paid as for two hours at least and, after two hours of duty, they shall be paid for each fraction of a half-hour of duty as if it were a full half-hour.

(c) When men are required for duty on a holiday they shall be engaged on the working day immediately preceding the holiday and ordered to start at a stated place and time.

(d) Employees who present themselves by direction of the employer for work after meal hours, without having been discharged, shall be paid as for one hour at the least, even if they are not turned to work.

(e) The pick-up place shall be at the rear of the C.O.R. office, or at such other place as may be fixed by mutual agreement between the parties, from 7.30 a.m. to 9 a.m. and from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.

#### 11.—First Aid Kit.

A first aid kit, in accordance with the Schedule referred to herein, shall, if procurable, be supplied by the employer, and same shall be accessible at all times.
