## Native Administration Act, 1905-1940. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia tis.e.] Lieutenant-Governor. In the Commonwealth of Australia.

PURSUANT to section 63 of the Native Administra-tion Act, 1905-1940, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and establish a Court of Native Affairs in the districts or district or parts of districts which are comprised within the boundaries of the Broome Magisterial District, and declare that such Court shall be known as the Broome Court of Native Affairs.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

## THE HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the by-laws, as set forth in the Schedule hereunder, which have been made for and in respect of the Perth Dental Hospital by the Board of Management of the Perth Dental Hospital, under section 22 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

## Schedule.

## PERTH DENTAL HOSPITAL (INC.). By-laws.

1. The objects of the Perth Dental Hospital are:-(a) to provide the indigent poor, old-age and by provide the integer poor, old-age and invalid pensioners, wards of the State under the Child Welfare Act, 1907-1927, or otherwise, and inmates of charitable institutions, with efficient treatment in operative, conservative, and prosthetic dentistry free of charge:

- (b) to provide similar treatment for persons of limited means at fees commensurate with their financial positions;
  (c) to provide facilities for the training of dental students by the Western Australian College
- of Dental Science.
- 2. The Board at its first meeting in each year may appoint an honorary treasurer and an honorary secretary, and shall from time to time appoint such other officers as it thinks requisite to assist in the management of the Hamital. ment of the Hospital.
- 3. The Board may from time to time appoint from its members such committees as it may deem fit and confer upon them such powers as it may deem desirable.
  - 4. The Board shall have power to:-

(a) conduct the usual operations of a public dental

hospital;

- (b) provide facilities for the education of dental students at the request of the Western Australian College of Deutal Science, and to arrange with the Western Australian College of Dental Science for the payment of such fees or other charges, as may be decided upon from year to year;
- (c) dismiss or suspend any officer or servant of the institution;
- (d) accept fees for services rendered.
- 5. The annual general meeting of the Board shall be held in July of each year. The Board shall meet once a mouth for its ordinary meetings and shall hold such other meetings as may be required from time to
- 6. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or upon written requisition of any three members of the Board, such requisition to be forwarded to the honorary secretary, who will give members at least three clear days' notice stating clearly the objects of such special meeting.

- 7. Five clear days' notice of every annual, general, and ordinary meeting, specifying the place, the date and the hour of meeting, shall be sent to the address of all members of the Board by the honorary secretary.
- 8. The chairman, the honorary treasurer and the honorary secretary shall form an executive committee, to deal with urgent business arising between meetings of the Board.
- 9. In the case of any member of the Board being absent from three consecutive monthly meetings without leave of absence, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his or her seat be declared vacant and that another person be appointed to fill the vacancy.
- 10. The Board shall cause true accounts to be kept of all moneys received and expended on behalf of the Hospital, and records of all matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of all assets, credits, and liabilities of the Board.
  - (a) All moneys received shall be under the control of the Board. The superintendent shall be responsible for such moneys and shall bank the same daily in a bank approved by the Board. Accounts due for payment shall be paid only when passed by a vote of the Board. All cheques must be signed by any two of the hereinafter-mentioned executive officers: the chairman, the honorary treasurer, and the honorary secretary.
  - (b) The Board shall have power to invest any of the moneys, not immediately required, in such manner and in such securities as they may think fit, and from time to time vary or realise such investments. Pending such investigations as are deemed necessary, the Board may place moneys on deposit in a bank for such period as the Board thinks fit.
  - (c) The accounts shall be closed on the thirtieth day of June in each year, and a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past year, as well as a balance sheet, shall be prepared.
- 11. The Common Seal of the Board shall be kept in the custody of the honorary secretary, at the registered office of the Board. Such seal shall be affixed to any instrument in the presence of the chairman and the hon, secretary, who shall then subscribe their names: Provided that such seal shall not be used without the authority of a resolution of the Board.
- 12. All publicity and communications to the Press shall be made only under the authority of the chairman.
- 13. Subject to the approval of the Governor, this Constitution or any of these rules and regulations may be amended or rescinded at any time, or any alteration in the name of the Board may be made: Provided that a resolution of the Board sauctioning such amendment or rescission is passed by a majority of the members of the Board present at a special meeting called for the purpose, and provided that due notice of such meeting and such motion has been sent to the address of all members.
- 14. These rules and regulations supersede the regulations previously made by the Board.

### INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

(No. 5 of 1941.) (Registered 26.2-41.)

T. 487/40.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this Eighteenth Day of February, 1941, between the Commissioner of Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Commissioner"), of the one part, and the West Australian Government Electric Transways, Trackless Trams, and River Ferries Employees' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter referred to as the "Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the consideration hereinafter appearing, mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

## 1.-Term of Agreement.
