WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. [L.s.]

WHEREAS by the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish, by any means whatever, or against fishing generally, by any method of capture, during any specified time, in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters of the Dale River should be declared closed against the taking of English Perch: Now, therefore I, the said Lientenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—That

the waters of the Dale River shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture whatever, for a period of twelve months as from the 8th day of May, 1941.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia over the State of Western Australia in its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, inter alia, that the Governor may by proclamation prohibit, except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into any specified portion of the State from the rest of the State generally any specified

kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease into such specified portion of the State: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to prohibit, except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into that portion of the State, more particularly specified and described in the Schedule hereunder, from the rest of the State generally any species of pea plant (Pisum) as being in the opinion of the said Lieutenant-Governor likely to introduce the disease Pea Weevil (Bruchus pisorum) into the said pordisease Pea Weevil (Bruchus pisorum) into the said portion of the State: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby prohibit, except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into that portion of the State, more particularly specified and described in the Schedule hereunder, from the rest of the State generally any species of Pea plant (Pisum) as being in my opinion likely to introduce the disease Pea Weevil (Bruchus pisorum) into the said portion of the State: vil (Bruchus pisorum) into the said portion of the State: And I declare that the prohibition hereby imposed shall continue in operation until this present Proclamation is cancelled or revoked by a subsequent Proclamation issued under section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939.

By-laws Relating to Omnibus Stands.

PERTH Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act,

1. In the construction of these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "Omnibus" means a motor vehicle used or intended to be used as a passenger vehicle to carry passengers at separate fares.

2. The following areas are allocated as stands for

"Omnibuses," namely:

- (i) On the west side of The Esplanade, Scarborough, commencing at a point on the western kerbline seventy feet northwards of the point where the southern building alignment of Scarborough Beach road intersects the western kerbline of The Esplanade and extending a distance of two hundred feet southwards, having a depth of eight feet from the western kerbline of The Esplanade.
- Esplanade.

 (ii) On the east side of The Esplanade, Scarborough, commencing at a point one hundred feet south of the southern building alignment of Scarborough Beach road and extending southwards a distance of two hundred feet, having a depth of eight feet westwards from the eastern kerbline of The Esplanade.

3. No person in charge of any vehicle other than an omnibus shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand on any portion of the area allocated as stands for omni-

buses referred to in the preceding clause.

4. If any person commits a breach of any of these by-laws such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

5. The by-law relating to Omnibus Stands, passed by the Perth Road Board on the 27th day of August, 1936 (Government Gazette, 2nd October, 1936), is hereby re-

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to section 35 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1921, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921.

Schedule.

The above-mentioned regulations are amended by inserting therein, after regulation 2A (vide Gazette dated 28th February, 1941), a new regulation, to stand as regulation 2B, as follows:—

2B. (1) In so far as any Proclamation made and issued under section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, prohibits the bringing into any portion of the State, specified in such Proclamation, from the rest of the State generally any species of Pea plant (Pisum), except in accordance with the relative regulations made and from time to time in force under the said Act, and while any such Proclamation remains in force, no species of pea plant aforesaid shall be brought into the particular portion of the State, specified in the said Proclamation, from any other portion of the State, unless and until it shall first have been submitted to the Department of Agriculture for inspection for evidence of infestation with Pea Weevil (Bruchus pisorum), and either shall be found free from such infestation or otherwise shall have been treated, as provided by these regulations, to the satisfaction of an inspector.

(2) Upon failure by any person to comply with paragraph (1) of this regulation, an inspector may seize any Pea Plant found by him within that portion of the State specified in the said Proclamation, and hold the same pending a prosecution of the offender for a breach of this regulation, and, upon the conviction of the offender for such breach, may deal with such Pea Plant in any manner authorised by the Act or these regulations.
