## WESTERN AUSTRALIAN FIRE BRTGADES BOARD.

Fire Brigades Act and Amendments.
NOTICE is herewith given that the following are liable to reuder to the Board, not later than 30th June, 1941, al return of Fire Preminms for the year ended December 31, 1940, viz.:-
(1) Insurance Companies calrying on business in Western Australia who insnre from fire goods and/or property sitnate within Wester'u Aus. tralia;
(2) Broker's, agents, and any person who negotiates any contract insuring against fire any goods and/or property in Western Australia, on behalf of any insurance company, broker, agent, minderwiter, or group of underwriters not carrying on business in Western Australia;
3) Owners of goods and/or property in Western Anstralia who insure such against fire with any insurance company, broker, agent, maderwriter, or group of underwriters not carrying on business in Western Australia.
Notes.-(a) "Goods" inchide motor vehicles and teroplanes. The proportion of preminns applicable to the fire risk under comprehensive policies has been fixed at 5 per cent.
(b) Insurance Companies caryying on the business of marine insnrance, and not otherwise contribnting to the finds of the Board, shall contribute £10 per annum for the fire protection of interests insured under thein policies on wharves and jetties.
The penalty for default in furnishing such return is a penalty not exceeding $£ 5$ for every day during which default continues.

## The City of Perth.

## BXLLAW No. I.-STANDTNG ORDERS.

LX parsuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Municipal Corpomations Act, 1900-1940, and of all other powers in that behalf, the Lord Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order that by-law No. 1 he repealed and that the following new by law be substituted therefor:-

1. The proceetings and business of the Council shan be conducted according to the following regulations, which shall be ealled the Standing Orders.

## Charman.

2. In the construction of this by-law, unless the com text otherwise requires, the words "Lord Mayor"' shall inc Jude the Councillor chosen to preside at any meeting of the Comncil.
3. The Lord Mayor, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Comeil, and, in his absence, or if, after heing present, le retires, one of the Councillors hosen by the Comeitloss present shall preside.

## Quorum,

4. At any meeting of the Council a quorum shan consist of not less than eight Councillors in addition to the Lord Maror. Every meeting shall proceed to husiness so soon arter the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quormm.

Adjoumment in absence of Quorum.
5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for such neeting, the majority of the Councillors present, or any one Councillor, if only one be present, or the Town Clerk, if no Councillor be present, nay adjourn such meeting to any date not later than seven (7) duys from the dite of such adjoumment.

## Count Out.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a Councillor shall call the attention of the Lob Mayor to the fact that a quorum is not present the Lord Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the mecting for a period of two minutes, and if a quormu be not present at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Lor? Mayor shall adjourn it to some future date.

Record of Comeillors present.
7. At all meetings at which there are not present eight Councillors and the Lord Mayor, or nine Councillore, as the case may be, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the Councillors then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

## Open Doors.

S. The busimess of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such oceasions as the Coun cil shall, by resolution, otherwise decide, which resolntion may be moved without notice.

## Reporters.

9. At all meetings accredited newspaper reporters shall be permitted to attend in such part of the Commeit Chmmer as may be appropriated for their accommoda. tion, but they simb withdraw upon a vote of the Connet so requiring during any portion or the whole of the neeting.

Disturbance by Visitors.
10. The admission of citizens, reporters, and visitors to the Council Chamber slatl be under and subject to the regulations that no expression of dissent or approval, conversation, or interruption to the proceedings of the Comeil shall take place, and in. the event of any breach of this regulation, the Lord Mayor may at his discretion, and withont a vote of the Comeil, require the person or persons so offending to withdraw, and thereupon such person or persons shall immediately withdraw from the Council Chamber.

## Removal of Disturbers.

11. Any person, not being a member of the Counci', who interrupts the orderly conduct of the business of the Council, who toes not, immediately upon being called upon be the Lord Mayor so to do, withdraw from the Council Chamber, may by order of the Lord Mayor be remosed from the Council Chamber forthwith.

## BUSTNESS AT COUNCTL MEETINGS.

## Order of Business.

12. The order of business of an ordinary mecting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Counril at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered in resolution to that effect:-
13. Confirmation of minutes.
14. Annonncements by the Lord Mayor withont discussion.
15. Qnestions of which due notice has been given. without discussion.
16. Correspondence,
$\therefore$ Petitions and memorials.
17. Notice of intention to move the suspemsion of Standing Orders at the close of the mentine.
18. Reports of committees.
19. Orders of the day, including cousidering and ordering upon any business left over from the previous meeting and any business the Tord Mayor may thimk desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and mar have directed to be entered is sti order of the day.
20. Motions of which previous notices have beene given.
21. Notices of motions for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Orter at Special Meetings.
13. The order of business at any special motting of the Conncil shall be the order in which surh business stands in the notice thereof.

## Minutes.

14. The miututes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previonsly confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Council in order to their confirmation; and no discus sion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the Lord Mavor as by section 176 of the Act required.

## Questions.

15. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council slaall give notice thereof in writ ing to the Town Clerk at least four hours before the hour fixed for the meeting.
16. All questions and answers shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

## Correspondence.

17. No discussion shall be permitted on :ny motion that :ay correspondence be received or not receired or that any correspondence or any part thereof be refermel to my Speci:l Committee of the Council.

## Notices of Motion.

18. (1) Any Councillor may bring forward such business as lie may consider advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to th: Town Clerk, either at the meeting previous to the mect-
ing at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than three clear days betore such last-mentioned meeting.
(2) Erery notice of motion shall relate to some question affecting the constitution, administration, or condition of the city.
(3) The Tord Mayor shall male out of order any motion which does not comply with the last preceding subelause.

Motion to Lapse.
19. Every such motion shall lapse, unless the Com cillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to more the same when such motion shall be called on.

## DEPUTATIONS.

Reception of Deputations.
20. Deputations wishing to be received by the Council shall be requested, in the first instance, to send in a memorial in writing, and the Town Clerk shall bring the memorial before the Committec concerned, which shall be authorised, if it see fit, to receive the deputation and to report to the Council. If the Committee is of the opinion that the memorial is one which should be brought before the Council, the Committec shall so report; and, if the Council shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

Number of Deputation.
21. A deputation shall not exceed ten in number. and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Comacil, or a Committee of the Council, cxcept in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee, and the matter shall not be further eonsidered by the Council or the Committec until the deputation shall have withdrawn.

## CONDUCI OF DEBATE.

Councillors to Address the Chair-Point of Order.
22. (1) Any Councillor moving a motion or amend ment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Lord Mayor, and shall not be interrupted unless upon a point of order, when he shall restume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the ques. tion of order has been disposed of, when the Comecillor in possession of the chair may proceed.
(2) Rising to express a difference of opinion with or to contradict a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order.
(3) The following actions shall be deemed breaches of order namely:
(a) Discussion of a question not before the Council;
(b) The use of offensive or insulting language;
(c) The riolation of any by-law or Standing Order of the Council.

Nature of Motion to be stated.
23. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or anendment shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon, and, if so required by the Lord Mayor, shall put the same in writing.
Motions to be Seconded-Enforcement of Standing Orders.
24. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded. but : Councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Conncil by directing the Lord Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of Titles.
25. At meetings of the Council, speakers in referring to others prosent thereat shall designate them by their respective titles of Lord Mayor or Councillor, ats the case may be.

## Priority of Speakers.

20. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the stme time, the Lord Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

## Lord Mayor to Speak.

27. Whenever the Lord Maror rises during a debate, any Contillor then speaking or offering to speali, is to sit down, and the Council is to be silent so that the Lord Mayor may be heard withont interuption.

Comeillor Not to Speak Twice-Personal Explanation. 28. No Councillor shatl speak twice on the sane question, except by way of explanation or in reply, apon any original motion of which he may be the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last carried. tud no Councillor shall speak to auy question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply. No Councillor shall speak otherwise than upon the question before the Council, except to make a pexsonal explanation. Any Comeillor making a personal explanation must confine himself to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood, and to the explanation itself, and he must not adrert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose, nor endearour to strengtheu his former argument by introducing new argunent or matter or by replying to other Conncillors.

Calling to Order for Speaking twice.
29. The Lord Mayor shall, without waiting for the inter-position of the Council, eall to order any Councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover or Seconder to be held to have Spoken.
30. A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

No Speaking after Notice put.
31. No Councillor may speak to any question after the same has been put from the Chair.

## Time Linit.

32. No Councillor shall speali or address the Council upon any motion or amendment before the Council, or in reply for a longer period than ten minates without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified withont debate.

## Speaking in Reply.

33. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine limself to answering previous speakers.

Division of complicated Resolutions.
34. The Lord Mayor, at his discretion, may, or the Council may by motion without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of several resolntions.

## Withdrawal of Motion.

35. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the nover, with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any Councillor to speak upon it after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless such permission shall have been refused.

## Production of Docmments.

36. Any Councillor may of light require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

Reflection upon Vote of Council.
37. No Conncillor shall reflect upon any rote of the Council, except for the purpose of moving that such rote be rescinded.

All Councillors to Vote-Casting Vote.
38. At all meetings of the Council, save where the Act ohherwise provides, all the Councillors present shall vote, and if any Conncillor fails to rote the Lord Mayor shall call upon him, eitlier to vote or to leare the Council Chamber. If: there be an equal division of rotes upon any question, the Lord Mayor shall, in addition to his own vote, lave a secoml or casting vote.

Digression from Subject-Personal Reflections.
39. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question nuder discnssion nor impnte improper motives to any other Councillor, and all personal reffections upon any Conncillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

## Record of Words used by a Councillor.

40. Aly Councillor may require the Town Clerk to take dowa any particnlar words used by a Councillor inmediately upon the same being nsed.

## Lord Mayor's Ruling.

41. The Lord Mayor, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall give his decision, and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particnlar case, unless a majority of the nembers of the Conncil then present shall, upon motion made forthwith, without dis cussion by the mover or seconder or other person, dissent therefrom.

## Withdrawal of Offensive Expression.

42. Any Comncillor who shall use any expression which in the opinion of the Lord Mayor reflects offensively on any member of the Council, shall, when required by the Lord Mayor, unreservedly withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the Chair, and if he decline or neglect to do so, the Lord Mayor may refuse to hear such Conncillor further upon the matter then muder discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjom the sitting of the Council, or may direct the offending Councillor to withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Conncil.

## Disturbance-Conversing aloud.

43. No Comeillor shall make any noise or disturb. ance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud whilst any other Comeillor is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

## Continued Irrelevance.

44. The Lord Mayor may call the attention of the Council to continned irrelevance, tedions repetition, unbecoming langnage, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Conncillor and may direct such Comcillor, if speaking, to discontime his speech, and therempon such Councillor shall cease speaking and resmue his met.

## Crossing Comncil Chamber.

45. When the Lord Mayor is putting any question no Councillor shall walk out of or across the Chamber, nor shall any Comeillor, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

Lord Mayor may call to Order.
46. The Lord Mayor shall preserve order, and may on his own motion call aly Councillor to order whenever in his opinion there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.
47. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Lord Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Comeillor.

Decision of Lord Mayor on Point of Order-Councillor to Apologise when called upon.
48. Whenever it shall have been decided by the Lord Mayor that any motion, anendment, or other matter before the Council is ont of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Lord Mayor to make such explanation, retraction or apology, as the ease may require.

## Comeillor to withdraw from Comeil Chamber.

49. Any Councillor who shall persist in any line of conduct which the Lord Mayor shall have decided, or which by any clause of this by-law is declared to be ont of order, or who shall refuse to make auy explanation, retraction, or apology required by the Lord Mayor as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the Lord Mayor, withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

## Removal of Councillor from Council.

50. In the event of any Councillor refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the Council Chamber, when requested or directed by the Lord Mayor so to do, the Lord Mayor may order such Conncillor to be removed from the said Chamber and to be exchnded therefrom during the remainder of the then sitting of the Comeil.

Disorder.
51. If disorder should arise at any meeting of the Comeil, the Lord Mayor, acting in his discretion, may as a matter of right quit the Chair and amounce the adjournment of the meeting for a period of fifteen mimites, when the Council shall reassemble and decide the question whether the business shall be proceedel with or otherwise, which question shall be put from the Chair and decided without debate by a majority of the members present.

## ORDER TN DEBATE.

Motions and Amendments.
52. When a motion is under debate at any mecting of the Council $n o$ further motion shall be received, except the following:-

1. That the motion be anended.
2. That the Council do now adjon'u.
3. That the dehate be adjommed.
4. That the question be now put.
5. That the Council do proceed with the next business.
6. That the Comeil do resolve into Committee of the Whole.

## 1.-That the Motion be Amended.

Relevaney of Anendment.
53. Bvery amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

To be Read.
54. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.
55. Only one amendment at a time shall be discussed, but as often as an amendment is lost another amendment may be moved before the original question is put to the vote: Provided that, when an amendment is carried, one amendment thereto and no more may be moved.

Substantive Motion.
56. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the ancudment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding elanse, be treated as an original motion.

## 2.-That the Council do now Adjourn.

Time to Move.
57. A Comneillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Conneil do now adjourn: Provided that the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak beyond formally seconding, and the mover of the question (if any) under debate, on the motion for adjournment being made, may be heard in reply for five mimutes, but no further debate shall be allowed. No Conncillor who has spoken on the question then before the Conncil shall be permitted to move the adjommment of the Comneil.

No Discussion-Procedure before further Motion.
58. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjommment of the Council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be disenssed before any subsequent notion for adjomrnment, shall be entertained.

Question Adjourned to next Mecting.
59. On a resolution for adjournment, the question (if any) monder debate, when motion for adjomrment was made, shall stand adjomed to the next mecting.

## One Motion only.

60. At the sume sitting no Councillor may move or second more than one motion for the adjourmment of the Council.

## Speaking at resumption of Council.

61. On a motion for the adjourmment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration at the time of the adjoumment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject. Provided that this clause shall not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

## 3.-That the Debate be Adjowned.

Time to More.
62. Any Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of :ay other member, move withont previous notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.

No discussion-Definition of Adjommment.
63. A motion for the adjoumment of a debate shall be confined to the formal moving and seconding thereof, and no argument or diseussion shall be permitted thercon.

Any motion luaving for its object the deferring of a final decision on :my subject to a later mecting of the Council shall be deemed to be a motion for the adjourmenent of the debate.

Mover to Speak First.
64. On resuming :1n adjourned debate, the Councillor who moved its adjourment shall be entitled to speak first.

## One Motion Only,

65. At the same sitting, no member shall move or second more than one motion for adjournment of the same debate.

Resumption of Debate after Count Ont.
66. If the debate on any motion, moved, and seconded, be interrupted by the Council being connted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interupted, on motion with notice.

## Speaking at subsequent Debate.

67. On a motion for the adjourmment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate, and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent debate on the same subjeet: Provided that this clanse shall not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

## 4.-That the Question be now Put.

Time to Move-Put witlout Debate.
68. A councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of another Comecillor move without notice and without comment that the question under consideration be now put, and upon such motion being formally seconded the same shall be immediately put withont debate.

Two-thirds Majority.
69. A motion that the question under consideration be now put shall not be moved by a Councillor who has already spoken on the question, and such :1 motion slanll not be carried without the consent of a twothircls majority of the Comeillors present.

Speaking in Reply.
70. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than fire minutes before the question is put.

## Motion to be put at once.

71. Should the motion be carried, the motion or amendment under delate shall be at once put.

Question includes Anendment.
72. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration shall be put, the question to be so put from the Clair shall be eonstrued and taken to mean and include the main question, as well as any amendment thereto.
5.--That the Council do proced to the next Business. Time to Move.
73. It shall be competent for any Councillor, at the close of the speech of any other Councillor, to move, without notice, that the Council do proceed to the next business, and if the motion be seconded, it shall be put forthwith.

Question to be dropped.
74. When a motion be carried that the Council do proceed to the next business, the question mader dischssion shall be considered as dropped.

Further Motion.
75. During the same debate a second motion that the Comeil do proceed with the next business shall not be made within one hour.

## 6. -That the Council resolve into Committec. <br> Decision of Conncil.

76. The Council may determine that any question shall be considered in Committee of the Whole, and : motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice.

Matters to be considered by Committec.
77. Such Committee shall consider snch matters only as shall have heen referred to it by the Council.

## Conduct of Conmittees.

78. In Committee of the whole the Standing Orders of the Council shall apply, except that Councillors may speak more than once to the same question.

## Adoption of Committee's Resolutions.

79. The Lord Mayor shall report the resolutions arrived at in Committee of the Whole to the Council at its next ordinary meeting, or upon the resumption of the Council, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Council may think fit.

## Confidential Busimess.

80. All matters dealt with or broukht before the Comen in Conmittee or before :my Committee of the Council slall be treated as strictly confidential, and unless and until the Council or a Committee appointed by the Council otherwise determine, no information whatever in relation to the proceedings thereat shall be disclosed to any person outside the Council prior to the issue of the bnsmess paper containing the items to be submitted to Conncil for confirmation.

Motion to incrense Expenditare.
81. No motion or amendment shall be moved at any meeting of the Council, otherwise than in the form of :a reference to the Finance Committee for consideration and report, if it would have the effect of incurring expenditme not provided for in the estimates.

## RESCISSION OF RESOLUTTONS.

## Rescission.

82. No resolution of any meeting of the Council shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered at any subsequent meeting held during the municipal year, except in the mamer provided in section 165 of the Act.

## Repetition of Neg:tived Motion.

83. No motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained within a period of three months, unless with the consent of at least 14 members of the Council.

## SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.

## How Moved.

84. In cases of urgent necessity, my Standing Order or Standing Orders of the Council may be snspended on motion duly mide and seconded: Provided that-
(a) no such motion shall be made until all business appearing in the Notice Paper has been disposed of;
(b) no such motion shall be carried anless the number of Councillors voting in the affimative shall exceed those roting in the negative by at least eight;
(c) no such motion shall be permitted nnless notice thereof in writing shall have been given at the time prescribed by clause 12 of these Standing Ortlers, muless the Lord Mayor shall be satisfied that this requirement could not reasonably have been complied with.

Objects of Suspension to be Stated.
85. Any Councillor moving the snspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

## VOTING

Method of taking Votes.
86. The Lord Mayor shall, in taking the rote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion as to which party has the majority on the roices or by a show of hands.

## Voting--Division

87. (1) The Conncil shall vote on the voices, or by : show of hands as may in cach case be directed by the Lord Mayor, but :my Conncillor may call for a division on any question.
(2) Upon a division being called for the division bell shall be rung, and after the lapse of one half of a minnte from the bell ceasing to ring no Councillor slatl be permitted to enter or leave the Chamber until after the division has been taken.
(3) When a division is being taken and until the vote is recorded, all Councillors voting in the affirmative shall stand up and all those voting in the negative shall remain seated.

## COMMTTTEES.

## Standing Committees.

88. In addition to such special committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be eight standing committees appointed from among the Councillors, namely:-(1) A Finance Committee; (2) a TVorks Committee; (3) a General Purposes Committee; (4) a Health Committee; (5) an Electricity and Gas Committee; (6) an Endowment Lands Committee; (7) a Buildings Committee; and (8) a Transport Committec. Each of the Committees numbered 1-6 inclusive shall consist of not less than five nembers. The Committees numbered 7 and 8 shall each consist of five members. Each of such Committees shall be appointed cach year at the first meeting of the Comncil which shall be held after the annual election, and shall hold office until the thirtieth day of November following its appointment.

## Election of Committees

89. The members of the said Committees slatll, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot, and in the event of an equality of votes for two or more conncillors, the Lord Mayor shall have a casting vote.

## Powers and Dnties of Committees.

90. The Standing Committees of the Comeil shall have the oversight of the following matters:-

Finance Committee:- (a) The finances of the Conncil; (b) Items of expenditure recommended by the Spending Committee; (c) Estimates of receipts and expenditure for each financial year; (d) Loans; (e) The Comeil's official staff.

Works Committec:-- (a) Construction and maintenance of streets, ways, drains, bridges and other public places; (b) Sweeping and watering of streets; (c) Resmmption of land for new strects, and widening existing streets; (d) Fencing vacant lands; (e) Construction of crossing over footpaths, and any constructional matters in connection with the streets.
Bnildings Committee:-Buildings, verandals, signs, hoardings and similar matters.

Electricity and Gas Committec:-The supply of elee. tricity and gas for public and private purposes and the lighting of public streets, ways, and public places.

Health Conmittee:-(a) Matters affecting or relating to the health of the citizens; (b) Honse to house inspections; (c) Noxious trades, private hospitals, lodging honses, morgues, etc.; (d) Places of public ammsement; (e) Sale of food and drugs; (f) The nightsoil and rubbish services of the city; (g) Hawkers, dogs and goats; (h) Stands for licensed vehicles.

General Purposes Committee:-(a) Parks, Reserves, enclosed ovals and children's playgrounds; (b) Resumption of land for open spaces; (c) Street trees; (d) Baths, tom halls and offee buildings; (e) Civic functions (with power to act).

Endownent Lands Committee:-(a) The City Endowment Lands and Limekilns Estate; (b) Transport to the Estate: (c) Sale or lease of such portions as may be decided by the Council

Transport Committee:-(a) All transport and motor vehicles the property of or used by the Council; (b) The purchase and sale of such vehicles; (c) The purchase, control, and sale of supplies necessary for the transport facilities of the Council.

Special Committees.
91. Special Committees may consist of any number of members, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be liwfully entrusted to a Committee, and for the performance of which in the opinion of the Council :l Special Committec ought to be appointed. No standing Committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to :my Special Committee. The appointment of a Special Committee shall be made by resolntion of the Council, which shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Special Committee, and may either state the mumber of Councillors to be elected by ballot, or shall name the Councillors whom it is proposed shall constitute such Committee. In the event of a ballot being taken and an equality of votes being recorded in favour of any two or more Councillors, the Lord Mayor shall have a casting vote.

## Convening Committee Meetings.

92. The Town Clerk shall call a mecting of any Committee, when requested so to do by the Lord Mayor, the chairman, or any two members of such Committee.

Standing Orders.
93. The Standing Orders of the Council shall be oloserved and apply in Committecs, except the order limiting the number of times of speaking, and except as to Committees being conducted with open doors.

## Quorum.

94. At a mecting of a committec a quorum shall consist of not less than three members. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitnte a quorum.

Minutes.
95. Each Standing Committee shall keep a book, to be called the Minnte Book, in which shall be eutered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minntes of each meeting sliall be confirmed at the following mecting and signed by the chairman thereof.

## Penalty.

96. Any Conncillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law shall be liable, on conviction before a Court of summary jurisdiction, to a penalty not exceeding $£ 20$.

## Enforcment of By-laws.

97. Whenever any Conmeillor shall have committed an offence under this by-law, the Lord Mayor may forthwith lay, or canse to be laid, an information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending Councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the cliarge.
