Money Lenders Act, 1912-1937. PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

PURSUANT to paragraph (f) of section 3 of the Money Lenders Act, 1912-1937, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby proclaim and declare that the West Australian Finance, Limited, a body corporate, shall be exempt from registration under the said Act for a period of twelve months from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939. PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. | Lis.] | Lieutenant-Governor wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into the State of Western Australia, either generally or from any specified State, country or place, of any specified kind of plant,

fruit, or other thing which in his opinion may be likely to introduce any disease into the State of Western Australia: And whereas the said Lieutenant-Governor is of the opinion that the bringing into the State of Western Australia of the plants or things hereinafter mentioned in the Schedule hereunder from any of the following States of the Commonwealth of Australia, that is to say, Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania, would be likely to introduce into the State of Western Australia the disease known as Pieris rapae (L) (Cabbage Butterfly): Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers in this behalf conferred upon me by the said Act, do by this Proclamation prohibit the bringing into the State of Western Australia from any of the following States of the Commonwealth of Australia, that is to say, Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania of the plants or things mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, except in accordance with the relative regulations made and from time to time in force under the said Act.

Schedule.

Borecole, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, chou moellier, horse radish, kohl rabi, radish, rape, swedes, turnip, lettuce, and any plant whatsoever of the family cruciferae.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

In accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1940, and the regulations thereunder, I hereby require returns of all income derived during the year of income ended 30th June, 1941 (or the accounting period, if any, adopted under the Act in lieu of that year), to be furnished to me at the Office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth, in such of the forms provided for the purpose as is applicable, containing the information and particulars mentioned or reing the information and particulars mentioned or re-ferred to in the form and verified by declaration as therein set forth, and accompanied by all such balancesheets, profit and loss accounts, statements, and other documents as are mentioned in the form or as are requisite, on or before the dates hereinafter stated.

On or before the 31st July, 1941:-

(a) by every person resident in Western Australia who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and by every married woman whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was not less than £100, and by every married man resident in Western Australia whose total income, nt western Australia whose total income, from all sources, was not less than £200, derived exclusively under one or more of the following headings, viz., remuneration as an employee, stipend, interest, annuities, dividends from any company, whether incorporated in the State or not, and whether paid out of income derived from sources in or cutoids the income derived from sources in or outside the State, or any other sources (not being a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term). On or before the 31st August, 1941:-

- (b) by every person resident in Western Australia who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and by every married woman whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was not less than £100, and by every married man regident in Western Australia whose total resident in Western Australia whose total income from all sources was not less than \$200, derived wholly or partly from a source which is a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term, including a professional business:
- (c) by every company deriving income in Western Australia whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was £1 or more;
- (d) by every non-resident person whose total in-come derived from all sources in Western Australia was £1 or more.

Every person or institution holding money lodged at interest in Western Australia is hereby required to furnish a statement showing the names and addresses of depositors to each of whom interest in excess of £25 was paid or credited during the year ended 30th June, 1941, and the amount of interest paid or credited to each

A return of the total income of every partnership is hereby required to be furnished by the partners resident in Western Australia for the furnished by the partners resident in Western Australia or by any one of them. Where there is no partner resident in Western Australia the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Western Australia for the partnership. Each individual partner who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and every married woman whose total income from all sources was not less than £100, and every married man whose total income from all sources was not less than £200 is also required to furnish a return.

A return of the total income derived in Western Australia by every trust is hereby required to be furnished by the trustees resident in Western Australia or by any Where there is no trustee resident in one of them. Western Australia, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Western Australia for the trustees.

Every owner or charterer of ships whose principal place of business is out of Australia, who had amounts paid or payable to him in respect of the carriage of pand or payable to him in respect of the carriage of passengers, live-stock, mails or goods shipped in Western Australia is hereby required to make and furnish a return of the amount so paid or payable.

Every agent for a principal, whether resident or non-resident, is hereby required to furnish a return demanded of his principals.

Every company is hereby required to furnish, in addition to the return of income, separate statements to accompany the return showing:-

- (a) the names and addresses of all shareholders and the amount of dividend (if any) paid to each shareholder during the year ended the 30th June, 1941;
- (b) the names and addresses of all persons to whom interest in excess of £25 was paid or credited during the year preceding the year of tax and the amount so paid or credited to each person during the year ended the 30th June, 1941;
- (c) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the year ended the 30th June, 1941, to depositors and debenture holders, who are not residents of Australia, on money secured by debentures of the company and used in by depentures of the company and used in Western Australia or used in acquiring assets for use or disposal in Western Australia, and on money lodged at interest in Western Australia with the company, after deducting (unless the Commissioner otherwise directs) interest paid or credited to a company not a resident of Australia but which has a public officer duly appointed under the Act;
- (d) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the year of income, in respect of debentures payable to bearer, the names and addresses of the holders of which are not supplied to the Commissioner by the company;
- (e) the names and addresses of all holders of debentures payable to bearer, which the company is in a position to furnish (whether

residents or non-residents), together with the amount of interest paid or credited during the year ended the 30th June, 1941, to each of such holders of debentures.

Every employer of labour is hereby required to furnish on or before the 31st August, 1941, a statement showing :-

- (a) the names and addresses of all persons employed by him during the year ended the 30th June, 1941;
- (b) the capacity in which each person was employed:
- (e) the total amount of remuneration earned by
- each person during that period;
 (d) the value of board, residence, or other allowance made to each person during that period.

The statement is required to show the actual amount earned during the period from 1st July, 1940, to 30th June, 1941, even though the employer's return is made np for a different period. Remuneration to persons at a rate less than £100 per annum should be shown in one

The attention of all persons is drawn to the fact that all the returns and statements required by the foregoing notice to be furnished to the Commissioner are returns under the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1940, and are required to be furnished when called for. Failure to duly furnish them renders the persons concerned liable to a penalty fixed by section 211 (1) of the Act, viz., a penalty not less than £2 or more than £100 as may be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

The returns as required above shall, where the person is also liable to furnish returns under the Common-wealth Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936-1940, be in a combined form for Commonwealth and State purposes.

All lifts over three tons weight occurring during the course of ordinary continuous work in discharging or loading a vessel will be charged as "special lifts," and the time occupied in dealing with same will be deducted from the time of continuous work.

The secretary may at any time reallocate the cranes, or remove a crane from any hirer if the exigencies of the work on the jetty, in his opinion, require such action. The secretary may also, in his discretion, charge the hirer with the cost of specially moving a crane in special circumstances.

THE PLANT DISEASES ACT, 1914-1939.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to section 35 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, has been pleased to amend, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1921, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, and as amended in the notice published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of February, 1941.

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by deleting regulation 2A (Gazette, 28th February, 1941) and inserting in lieu thereof a new regulation, to stand as regulation 2A as follows:—

- 2A. Insofar as any Proclamation made and issued under section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, prohibits the bringing into the State of Western Australia from any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia any of the following plants or things, that is to say—borecole, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, chou moellier, horse radish, kohl rabi, radish, rape, swedes, turnip, lettuce, and any plant whatever of the family crueiferac, except in accordance with the relative regulations made and from time to time in force under the said Act, and while any such Proclamation remains in force the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (1) Wherever in this regulation the expression "the State of origin" is used, such expression means the prohibited State of the Commonwealth from which any of the plants or things aforesaid are about to be brought directly to the State of Western Australia.
 - (2) Before any plants or things aforesaid are brought into the State of Western Australia from the State of origin, the proposed importer or his agent shall obtain a certificate dated and signed by and inspector or other authorised officer of the Department of Agriculture in the said State of origin, identifying the plants or things and stating the number or quantity thereof, and—
 - (a) if they have been grown in the said State of origin, stating-
 - (i) that the disease or pest known as Cabbage Butterfly (Pieris rapae) does not exist in the part of such State of origin in which they were grown; and
 - (ii) that they were on inspection prior to despatch from the said State of origin found to be free from the said disease or pest; and
 - (b) if they were not grown in the said State of origin, stating-
 - (i) the name of the State in which they were grown; and
 - (ii) the name of the State in which they were packed for export from the said State of origin; and
 - (iii) if they were packed in the said State of origin, that they were so packed in clean new packages; and
 - (iv) the place in which they were grown in a State other than the said place of origin (where such other State is also a prohibited State) is free from the said disease or pest; and
 - (v) that prior to despatch from such other State (where such other State is also a prohibited State) to the said State of origin, or after arrival in the said State of origin and before despatch from the said State of origin to the State of Western Australia they were found on inspection to be free from the said disease or pest.
 - (3) When any of the plants or things aforesaid are brought into the State of Western Australia from any State or origin it shall be the duty of the importer thereof or his agent to produce and deliver to an inspector in the State of Western Australia on demand the certificate obtained pursuant to paragraph (2) hereof in relation to such plants or things.
 - (4) Upon failure by an importer or his agent to comply with the requirements of paragraph (3) hereof, an inspector may seize and deal with the plants or things aforesaid found by him in the State of Western Australia in any manner authorised by these regulations in relation to plants and things brought into the State of Western Australia from any State, country, or place outside of Western Australia.

ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY ACT, 1926-1940.

Department of Agriculture, Perth, 12th June, 1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 6 of the Royal Agricultural Society Act, 1926-1940, has been pleased to repeal the whole of the uniform by-laws made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 4th day of November, 1927, and amended by notice published in the Government Gazette from time to time thereafter, and has been pleased to substitute in lieu thereof new uniform by-laws governing all registered agricultural societies and the members thereof in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

Uniform By-laws.

- 1. In the construction and for the purposes of these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms specified hereunder shall have the meaning defined:—
 - "Committee" means the duly elected president and members of the committee of the society.
 - "Society" means an agricultural society registered in pursuance of the Royal Agricultural Society Act, 1926-1940.
 - "The Royal Agricultural Society" means the Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia incorporated.

Office Bearers.

- 2. (a) The general management of the affairs of the society shall be vested in a committee, which shall consist of a president and such other office bearers, as the members at a properly constituted meeting of members shall from time to time decide.
- (b) Office bearers comprising the committee shall be financial members of the society.
- (c) Patrons and vice-patrons shall not be members of the committee and need not necessarily be members of the society.

Nomination and method of election of Office Bearers.

- 3. Office-bearers of the Society shall be nominated prior to or at the annual general meeting. No unfinancial member shall be nominated as an office bearer. Office-bearers shall be elected at the annual general meeting of the society.
 - (a) Should the number required, and no more, be so nominated, the chairman of the meeting shall declare all candidates elected.
 - (b) Should the number nominated exceed the number required, a ballot shall be taken.
 - (c) Should a less number than required be nominated, the committee at its next meeting shall fill such vacancies.
 - (d) The meeting shall appoint a returning officer and two scrutineers to assist in the conduct of the ballot.

Voting for Office Bearers.

4. The voting for office bearers shall be conducted as follows:-

Members shall vote in each instance for the required number of candidates, and any voting paper on which are recorded votes for more or less than the required number of members for any office or committee shall be informal to that extent, but any such informality shall not affect the legality of the voting paper in instances where votes for a member or members for other offices or committees are properly recorded on the same voting paper.

Term of Office.

5. Office bearers shall commence to hold office upon the first day of the month following the meeting at which they are elected.

The president shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-election.

One-third of the committee, or such number being not less than one-third, as the members of the society at a properly constituted meeting shall decide, shall retire each year and shall be eligible for re-election.

The treasurer, if such office be provided for, shall retire annually and shall be eligible for re-election.

The auditor, who shall not be a member of the committee, shall retire each year and shall be eligible for re-election.

Special Vacancies.

6. The method for dealing with special vacancies shall be as follows:-

Vacancies in the number of office bearers caused by death, resignation, absence without leave, or otherwise, and occurring at any time between two annual general meetings, shall be notified by the secretary to the committee at its next meeting thereafter, and the secretary shall notify such vacancies in writing to each of the members of the committee not present at such meeting and all such vacancies shall be filled by the committee at the next following meeting. Any member so appointed shall, previous to such appointment, signify to the secretary his willingness to accept such appointment, but any person so chosen shall retain office only so long as the

member in whose place he is appointed would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred. Provided, however, that when any such vacancy has been filled by the appointment thereto of any other office bearer of the society, the notification of the next meeting of the committee to be given in pursuance of by-law 8 shall specify the vacancy so created, and the committee may at such meeting fill the same.

In the case of any vacancy arising in the office of auditor through any cause prior to the date of the annual meeting, such vacancy shall be filled by the committee, and such person or firm so appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office until the first day of the month following the annual meeting.

Committee Meetings.

7. Meetings of the committee shall be held at such times as the chairman considers necessary; provided, however, that meetings of the committee shall be held at least twice annually, and at all committee meetings four shall form a quorum.

Convening of Committee Meetings.

- 8. (a) The secretary shall convene meetings of the committee by notifying each member of the committee in such manner as the committee shall decide.
- (b) The chairman may convene a special meeting of the committee at any time, and in such case the secretary shall give to all members such notification as the committee shall decide.

Attendance Committee Meetings.

9. If any of the elected members be absent without leave for three consecutive ordinary meetings of the committee, he shall cease to be an office bearer.

Election of Members.

10. Subject as hereinafter provided, any person paying to the society the amount of the annual subscription may be enrolled as a member and entitled to the privileges of membership: provided that, when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, one member only of such firm or one nominee of such company may exercise the rights and privileges of membership and may be elected to any office.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the secretary, on the instructions of the committee, shall have the right to refund within two calendar months any money so received and to refuse to accept any person as a member of the society.

Privileges of Members.

11. The privileges of membership of the society shall consist of power to vote at any general meeting of members, free admission to the show grounds (on production of member's ticket or badge) at any time when the society is holding a show, and any other privileges which the members at a properly constituted meeting shall from time to time decide.

Subscriptions.

12. The annual subscription shall be fixed by the members at a properly constituted meeting, and shall continue to be payable until altered by any subsequent general meeting. The date of payment thereof shall also be fixed at a properly constituted meeting of members and may be altered from time to time as the members think fit.

Expulsion.

13. If any member of the society has been guilty of any breach of these by-laws for any misconduct, he may be called upon to show cause to the committee why he should not be expelled from the society. The committee may appoint a day for the hearing of the matter of which at least seven days' notice shall be given to the member. If, at the hearing, the committee is satisfied of the truth of the charge and that it is of sufficient gravity, it shall have power to expel such member from membership of the society. In lesser offences a fine not exceeding ten pounds, or some other penalty which in the opinion of the committee is adequate in the circumstances, may be imposed.

Resignation of Members.

14. The resignation of any member shall be by written notice to the secretary, but no such resignation shall relieve any member from payment of any subscription or other moneys due by him to the society at the time of such resignation, and such subscription or other moneys shall be deemed to be a debt due to the society and may be recoverable at law.

Arrears of Subscription.

15. Any member who shall be six months in arrears in payment of his subscription shall not be entitled to hold or continue to hold any office in the society or to any privileges of membership. Any member who shall be twelve months in arrears in the payment of his subscription shall be deemed to have resigned his membership, and his name may be struck off the roll of members.

Register of Members.

16. An alphabetical list of the names of all members of the society shall always be kept in the office of the society.

Secretary.

17. The appointment and dismissal of the secretary shall be dealt with by the committee only.

The society shall appoint a secretary, and such appointment shall be notified to the Boyal Agricultural Society in writing under the hand of the chairman.

Any office bearer of the society may be appointed to the position of secretary, in which case the person so appointed shall be deemed to have resigned from the office previously held by him and the vacancy shall be filled in accordance with by-law 6.

Nothing in these by-laws, however, shall prevent one person holding the combined offices of secretary and treasurer of the society.

The society may appoint joint secretaries, should it so desire, without its being necessary to alter these by-laws to that effect.

General Meetings.

- 18. A general meeting of members (six to form a quorum) shall be held during each year, at such time and place as may be appointed by the committee. Such meeting shall—
 - (a) elect the office bearers of the society in accordance with by-law 2;
 - (b) elect the auditor of the society;
 - (c) consider the annual report and yearly statement of accounts;
 - (d) attend to any other business with which it is competent to deal under these by laws.

Summoning of Special General Meeting.

19. A special general meeting shall be called (six to form a quorum) at any time by the secretary, on the direction of the president, or on the requisition in writing of six financial members; but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

Voting powers of Chairman.

20. The chairman of any general or special general meeting shall have a deliberative vote, and, in case of equality of votes, a casting vote also.

Notices of Meeting.

21. Notice of any general or special general meeting shall be posted or delivered to members fourteen days at least prior to the time fixed for such meeting. The accidental omission to give notice of any such meeting or the non-receipt of any such notice shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting.

Auditor.

22. The auditor shall hold office from and including the first day of the month following the date of the meeting at which such election takes place.

How Questions are to be decided.

23. Subject to the proviso hereinafter contained, all matters (except the election of office bearers) to be dealt with at general meetings shall be determined on the voices, unless a division be called for.

Committee.

- 24. (a) The committee shall have the control and management of the income and expenditure of the funds of the society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all the society's other affairs and concerns, and also the appointment and management of its officers and servants.
- (b) The president shall preside at all meetings of the committee. In the absence of the president, the members present shall elect a chairman from among their number. The chairman presiding at any meeting shall have a deliberative and, in the case of equality of votes, a casting vote also.

Rescinding Resolutions.

25. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to reseind any resolution previously passed by the committee during the same year shall be entertained, unless notice of intention to move the same shall have been given in writing to the secretary at least fourteen days prior to the holding of the meeting of the committee at which it is proposed to move such resolution.

Sale of Property.

26. No real property belonging to the society shall be sold, except by the authority of a majority of members present, at an annual general meeting or at a special general meeting called for the purpose and of which purpose notice was stated in the notice convening such meeting.

Borrowing Powers.

- 27. (a) The committee may, with the sanction of a resolution passed by members in general meeting or in any special meeting called for the purpose, raise money by bank overdraft or by the issue of debentures, or by such other means as may be approved of at such meeting, and, if necessary, may secure the payment thereof by any mortgage or charge upon the property of the society, or by such other means as the members by such resolution shall decide.
- (b) The notice convening any general or special meeting at which it is intended to seek the foregoing power from members shall set out the intention of the committee to seek such power, and such notice shall be posted or delivered to each member not less than 14 days before which the meeting is convened.

In chemical and manure works journeymen carpenters, journeymen joiners engaged in all repairs and renewals on superphosphate mixing plants and pyrites furnaces shall receive one and one halfpence per hour additional to the rate prescribed.

3.-Casual Workers.

(a) Casual workers shall be paid ordinary rates plus ten per cent. (10%).

(b) Leading hand:—Leading hand shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day above the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed for his trade.

4.—Definitions.

"Casual worker" means any worker whose services are dispensed with by the employer before he shall have completed five (5) days of his engagement.

"Leading hand" means any tradesman placed in charge of three (3) or more other tradesmen or six (6) other workers.

5.—Country Work.

When any worker is sent by his employer, or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid, in addition to his regular wages, two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day. Accommodation to be supplied by the employer. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time: Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight hours in any one day.

The employer shall also provide free transport for the employees' tools.

6.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked as follows, namely:—On the first five (5) days of the working week between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., with an interval of not more than sixty (60) minutes for lunch, each day standing by itself.

7.—Overtime.

All work performed after the usual time for ceasing duty shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter. Any worker who is called upon to work overtime for more than two (2) hours without receiving notice of such overtime on the previous day shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) for a meal, or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment. Any worker who has left the premises in which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one hour shall receive payment for one hour at overtime rates. If an employer requires a worker to work during the usual meal time, he shall allow to such worker a period equal to the usual meal time for the purpose of having his meal. For all work done at the request of the employer after 12.30 p.m. by a worker who has not had the usual time allowed for a meal, and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time. All time worked on Saturdays and Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates, and, for the purpose of this clause, shall be from midnight Friday to midnight Sunday.

8.—Travelling Time.

During the hours of work, all travelling time from and to the employer's place of business, or from one job to another, shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

9.—Payment of Wages.

When a worker is discharged at or before the usual pay time, he shall then be paid all wages due to him. Payment of wages shall be made on or before Friday of each fortnight, within fifteen minutes of the usual time for ceasing work. The employer shall not keep more than five (5) days' pay in hand.

10.-Holidays.

- (a) Each worker shall be entitled to twelve (12) days' annual leave on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.
- (b) Every employee shall be allowed the following holidays on full pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Kalgoorlic Cup Day, and Labour Day.

Every employee compelled to work on such days shall be paid double time rates. When any of these holidays fall on Saturday or Sunday the following Monday, Tuesday to be observed as a holiday.

11.-Weekly Hiring.

- (a) A week's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side, except in the case of casual workers.
- (b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 9, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Award.

12.—Safe keeping of Tools.

The employer shall provide a place for the storing and safe keeping of his employees' tools when not in use.

13.-Provision of Appliances.

The employer shall provide the following tools when they are required on the job:—Dogs and cramps of all descriptions, bars of all descriptions, steel tapes, augers of all sizes, bits not ordinarily used in a brace, all hammers except claw hammers, glue pots and brushes, dowel plates, transmels, hand and thumb screws, soldering irons, and spanners from three-quarters of an inch and upwards. The employer shall provide on all jobs suitable sanitary convenience and boiling water ready for meal times where it is necessary.

14.—Employee presenting himself and services not required.

In the event of an employee turning up to work at the usual starting time and finding his services are not required, he shall be paid for two hours at the ruling rate.

15.—Grinding Time.

- (a) When an employee is discharged, he shall be allowed two (2) hours for grinding tools, or shall receive two hours' pay in lieu thereof. The employer shall provide, for the use of his employees, a suitable grinding stone on any job where such grindstone is reasonably necessary, together with the required power (hand or driven) for turning same.
- (b) The two hours for grinding tools shall not be allowed unless the tools of the worker are in good order and condition before he commences work.

16.—Interviewing Workers.

The secretary of any duly authorised official of the union shall not be prevented by an employer from visiting and conversing during meal times with the members of the union on any job or in any shop.

17.-Record Book.

The employer shall make and keep a record showing the name of each worker and the hours worked by and the amount paid to each worker. Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection by the representative of the union during working hours.

18.—Preference to Unionists.

- (a) In this clause the term "unionist" means a worker who is a member of the applicant union, and the term "non-unionist" means a worker who is not a member of the applicant union.
- (b) Unionists shall be given preference of employment.

19.—Posting Notices.

No employer shall prevent an official of the organisation at any time from posting a copy of this Agreement, or any notice of the organisation, not exceeding fourteen inches by nine inches, in a suitable place on any job. Such notice shall not be destroyed by any person before the completion of the job.

20.—Definition.

The term "carpenter and joiner" shall mean a worker engaged upon the crection, repair, ornamentation, or any form of constructional work, as well as the making, preparing and fixing of all necessary woodwork and fitting in connection therewith, including metal shop fronts and fitting and aircraft work.

21.—Apprentices.

- (a) In this Agreement the term "apprentice" means an apprentice duly registered with the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause, and the term "probationer" means a person working as apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause: Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.
- (b) Any employer hereafter taking a probationer or an apprentice shall, within fourteen days thereafter, duly register such probationer or apprentice by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed forms.
- (c) If at the date of this Award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.
- (d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him.
- (c) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six mouths immediately preceding such time.
- (f) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the period of apprenticeship.
- (g) (i) Should any employer from any cause whatsoever be unable to carry out his obligations to his
 apprentice, he shall be allowed, with the consent of the
 union and the apprentice, and the parent or guardian
 of the apprentice, to transfer the apprentice to another
 employer, who shall thereupon be bound by the covenants, conditions, and stipulations of the agreement of
 apprenticeship and of this Agreement, and be held to
 indemnify the former employer from all actions, claims
 and demands in respect of same. The agreement of
 apprenticeship shall be indersed to this effect and signed
 by the new employer and the other parties thereto, and
 a clause shall be inserted providing that the indenture
 may be cancelled by mutual consent.
- (ii) It shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Registrar of the date of such transfer and such particulars thereof as may be required.

- (h) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—
 - (i) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (n), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
 - (ii) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate in the prescribed form to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice, and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this Agreement according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form prescribed. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
 - (iii) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice, if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
 - (iv) Before an apprentice employed under a registered agreement is discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct, the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship shall first have been cancelled by the order of the Court.
 - (v) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.
 - (vi) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that in the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.
- (i) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

- (j) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service, when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do, and shall in each year of his apprenticeship attend at a technical school the classes for instruction in the trade covered by this Agreement.
- (k) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at such place as shall be from time to time appointed by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

- (1) The examination will be held in the month of November in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the workers' mion; one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the employers, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.
- (m) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.
- (n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in any year in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners at the examination for that year referred to in subclause (1) or (until he has completed the carpentry course) fails to obtain from a technical school a certificate that he has during the year passed an annual examination in carpentry at the school. The employer shall pay the fees payable to the technical school.
- (o) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* gnilty of a breach of this Agreement under section 97 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.
- (p) Such fee shall be paid by the Clerk t_0 the examiners as the Court shall allow.
- (q) The forms referred t_0 in this clause or prescribed therein shall be such as are provided by the Court.

22.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall come into force in the day of the date herein and shall remain in force for the period of three (3) years thence ensuing, and thereafter subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said employer in the Municipality of Boulder.

23.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half-day for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. For this purpose twenty (20) days shall constitute a month. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness cocurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. Provided always, that an employer shall be entitled to demand a medical certificate from any worker claiming such payment before he can be required to make any such payment.
- (b) Should any of the holidays stated in clause (6), with the exception of Saturday and Sunday, occur during an employee's absence from work through sickness, or as the result of an accident, the said employee shall be entitled to receive payment for such holiday.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT. (No. 8 of 1941.)

(Reg. 26/5/41.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 21st day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one (1941), between the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch (hereinafter called "the union"), of the one part, and Paramount Film Service Pty., Limited; Columbia Pictures Proprietary, Limited; Fox Film Corporation (Australia) Pty., Limited; Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Pty., Limited; R.K.O. Radio Pictures (Australasia) Pty., Limited; Universal Pictures Pty., Limited; United Artists (Australasia) Pty., Limited; Warner Brothers First National Pictures Pty., Limited; Warner Brothers First National Pictures Pty., Limited; Warner Brothers First National Pictures Pty., Limited; and Arthur Berryman Nielsen, Agent for British Empire Films Proprietary, Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to an area comprised within a radius of twelve (12) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers employed as clerks (including telephone attendants and messengers, where such workers do clerical work) in the Film Renting Industry.

3.—Hours.

The maximum number of hours to constitute a week's work shall be forty-fom (44): Provided that, where the hours ordinarily and customarily worked by any clerk in any establishment covered by this Agreement prior to the date of this Agreement were less than forty-four (44), such hours shall continue to be observed as a week's work.

4.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day, or after six (6) o'clock p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first three (3) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) All time worked on Sunday or on the holidays prescribed in clause 7, or after one (1) p.m. on Saturdays, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, all clerks in receipt of a salary of three hundred and fifty pounds (£350) per annum or over shall not be entitled to payment for overtime.

5.-Meal Money.

(a) If a clerk is required to resume work after six (6) o'clock p.m. on any of the first five (5) days of the week, or after one (1) o'clock p.m. on Saturday, for more than one half hour, he or she shall, in addition to the overtime above referred to, be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for a meal.

(b) Workers required to perform the duties of "checkers" shall, if their ordinary day's work does not finish prior to six (6) o'clock p.m., receive in addition to the payment referred to in subclause (g) of clause 6, the sum of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for a meal.

6.—Wages.

(a) Basic wage:—Males, £4 6s. 11d. per week; females, £2 6s. 11d. per week.

- (e) Experience:—Where the worker has had trainin in commercial subjects at a recognised commercial co lege or technical school for a period of six (6) month or longer, fifty per cent. (50%) of such period of training, with a maximum allowance of six (6) months, shabe regarded as experience, for the purpose of determining the rate of wage payable.
- (f) Casual clerks:—Casual clerks may be employed an hourly rate for a lesser period than two (2) weeks and shall be paid, whilst so employed, twenty-five pecent. (25%) in addition to the rates prescribed above with a minimum engagement of four (4) hours.
- (g) Workers required to perform the duties c "checkers" shall be paid the sum of five shillings (5s. for each night so employed and, in addition, shall receive first-class return fares actually and reasonably in curred in travelling between the place of residence and the job: Provided that such workers shall not be entitled to the provisions of clause 4 (Overtime). Meanning shall not be payable, except in accordance with the provisions of subclause (b) of clause 5.

7.—Holidays.

The following days, or the days observed in lieu sha be observed as holidays and paid for, namely:—Ne Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easte Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day Foundation Day, Show Day (after 12 o'clock noon) Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) Workers other than casual workers shall be entitled to two weeks' annual leave on full pay.

(b) A worker not completing a year of service sha be granted pay in lieu of holidays in the proportio that his length of service bears to the full year's en ployment.

(c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absert from work, except time for which he is entitled to claisiek pay in accordance with the provisions of clause hereof, or when on annual leave in accordance wit subclause (a) of this clause, shall not count for the pupose of determining his right to holidays.

(d) A worker who is summarily dismissed for misco: duet or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs h contract of service, shall lose all rights under the clause.

9.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for no attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one (1) day for each completed month of service: Privided that payment for absence through such ill-healt shall be limited to twelve (12) days (i.e., two (2) week pay) in each calendar year: Provided further, that worker with at least two (2) years of service, who priduces to his employer a medical certificate that person ill-health necessitates a longer absence from his employment than the period allowed of one (1) day per mont of service shall be entitled to payment for sickness to two (2) days for each completed month of service with a limit of twenty-four (24) days (i.e., four (4 weeks' pay) in each calendar year: Payment hereund may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, at the time the worker leaves the service of the er ployer, in the event of the worker being entitled I service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowam than that made at the time the worker is entitled compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any parent from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the cours of his employment, or for any accident, wherever su tained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

10.-Engagement.

The employment of any worker shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

11.—Record.

Readily intelligible records shall be kept by each em ployer, in which shall be entered the name of each worker to whom this Agreement applies, the age of the worker, the length of experience, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day and the amount of wages received each week. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the records each week. The said records shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union, during usual office hours, not more than once in each week: Provided that the employer, when required by the representative of the union, shall extend the period of inspection beyond the one day so as to enable the union representative to complete his inspection.

12.—Reference.

A reference shall, if required, be given to any worker of not less than three (3) months' service, containing all necessary information in regard to length of service and duties performed.

13.-Higher Duties.

A worker relieving a senior clerk and performing the major portion of his duties for a period of not less than two (2) weeks continuously shall be paid the higher minimum rate appropriate to the position whilst so employed.

14.—Proportion of Juniors.

The proportion of juniors that may be employed in the industry to which this Agreement relates shall be:—

(a) Male juniors:

(i) Where no male worker in receipt of the minimum adult wage is employed, one (1) junior

male may be employed;
(ii) Where the number of male workers in receipt of the minimum adult wage does not exceed five (5), an equal number of junior male workers may be employed; (iii) Where the number of male workers in receipt

of the minimum adult wage exceeds five (5) an increased number of junior males may be employed in the proportion of one (1) to two (2) in respect of the number over five (5).

(b) Female juniors:-

(i) Where no male worker in receipt of the minimum adult wage is employed, one junior female may be employed;
(ii) Where no female worker in receipt of the minimum adult wage is employed, junior female worker.

females in the proportion of one to each male in receipt of the minimum adult wage

may be employed;

(iii) Where the number of female workers in receipt of the minimum adult wage does not exceed twelve (12), the proportion of junior females that may be employed shall not exceed two (2) to one (1).

(iv) Where the number of female workers in receipt of the winter adult workers are adventished.

ccipt of the minimum adult wage exceeds twelve (12), the proportion of junior females that may be employed in respect of the excess shall not exceed three (3) to each two (2) females in receipt of the minimum adult wage.

In computing the number of junior workers to be allowed under this clause, all clerical workers in the establishment shall be taken into consideration.

15.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

(i) Name in full;

(ii) Age and date of birth;

- (iii) Period of commercial training at a recognised commercial college or technical school and the name of such college or school;
- (iv) Name of each previous employer; (v) Length of service with each previous employer; (vi) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the above particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be indorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of his age, period of commercial training, or of the length of service with previous employers being wilfully mis-stated in the certificate, and he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.

16.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;

 (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not appear the provided by more than the Agreement.
- specifically mentioned in the Agreement;

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

17.-Under-Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at,

the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference

for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

18.-No Reduction.

Nothing in this Agreement shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

19.—Term.
