WHEREAS it is provided by section 244 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, that rates through the district shall be uniform, except insofar as a Board may fix the rates for any townsite or for any special area, defined for that purpose by Proclamation, at a higher figure within the limits set forth in the said section: And whereas it is desirable to proclaim and declare that all those portions of the Northam Road District defined in the Schedules hereto shall be areas within which the Northam Road Board may rate at such higher figure: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby Proclaim and declare that all those portions of the Northam Road District defined in the Schedules hereto shall be areas within which the Northam Road Board may fix the rate at such higher figure as aforesaid, within the limits mentioned in section 244 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939:—

#### SCHEDULE A.

Portion of Clackline Townsite.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-eastern corner of Clackline Townsite Lot 40 and extending northerly along the western alignment of Kimberley road to the southern alignment of Lockyer road; thence westerly along the latter alignment to the eastern alignment of Dyer street; thence southerly to the north-western corner of Lot 28, and thence easterly to the starting point.

#### SCHEDULE B.

Portion of Baker's Hill Townsite.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the eastern corner of Baker's Hill Lot 190 and extending south-easterly along the south-western alignment of Kimberley street to the north-western alignment of Great Eastern highway; thence south-westerly along

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Amendment of By-laws.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a local authority may make or adopt by-laws, and may amend, repeal, or vary any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Mundaring Road Board, being a local health authority within the meaning of the said Act, and having adopted the Model By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, doth hereby amend its by-laws in the following manner:—

By repealing the by-law in Part I, numbered 11A, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th

day of October, 1937, and by substituting in lieu thereof the following by-law, to stand as 11A:

11A. No person other than the sanitary contractor, or person duly authorised by the local health authority, shall collect, remove, and/or dispose of night-soil, urine, and/or liquid wastes from or upon any premises situate in the following defined portions of the Mundaring Health District, namely:—

## TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1935.

P.W. 497/41.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 46 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935, has been pleased to amend the Traffic Regulations, 1936, made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th August, 1936, and amended from time to time thereafter in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

## Schedule.

The Traffic Regulations, 1936, are amended as follows:—

(1) Regulation 33 is amended by inserting after paragraph (4) a new paragraph, to stand as paragraph (5), as follows:—

(5) Every motor vehicle fitted with or having attached thereto a gas producer shall be submitted to a local authority for approval before being used on any road.

(2) Regulation 38 (c) is amended by inserting the following proviso, as follows:—

Provided: (i) That, where a gas producer is attached to the rear of a vehicle, an additional overhang of not more than twelve inches (12 inches) may be permitted;

(ii) That the distribution of the load weight shall allow for at least 10 per cent. on the front axle when the vehicle is fully loaded with gas producer, passengers, or other loading.

(3) Regulation 44 is amended by inserting after paragraph (c) a new paragraph to stand as paragraph (d), as follows:—

(i) No license shall be granted for any motor vehicle operating on producer gas, or petrol and producer gas, unless the following conditions are complied with in respect thereof:—

(ii) All joints and connections shall be fitted so as to prevent gas leaks. Packing used for joints shall be of an approved type of fireproof and heat-resisting material. Where the generator and its auxiliary units (scrubbers, cleaners, and coolers) are separated and distributed over the vehicle, the metal connecting pipes are to be divided and joined by flexible joints, such as rubber hose and clips, where necessary, to avoid risk of breakage through distortion on rough roads, but the separated ends of the metal connecting pipes so joined are not to be further than 1 inch apart. Any coupling between the generator and the first scrubber, cleaner, or cooler (see footnote\*) is to be of fireproof and heat-proof construction.

\*Where, on leaving the generator, gas passes through two dry scrubbers placed close together near the generator, before going on through oil baths or filters, both these dry scrubbers are to be considered as the first scrubber, cleaner, or cooler.

Provision must be made for efficient cleaning of connecting pipes and bends between the various units and the producer plant. Precaution must be taken to avoid risk of fire in the event of damage to or breakage of any coupling in the connecting pipes.

- (iii) An automatic blow-back valve opening inwards shall be fitted to the tuyère holder on all cross-draft generators. On all air inlets, whether fitted with blow-back valves or not, shall be fitted bronze wire gauze 28 x 28 mesh x 28 s.w.g.

Two safety valves must be fitted, one to be between the engine and the final cleaner and on the engine side of the security filter (should a security filter be fitted), and the other fitted either on the generator on the first scrubber or cleaner, or between the generator and the first scrubber or cleaner. The safety valve outlet to be covered with a similar (scrubber or) type of gauze as the air inlet.

Provided that the fitting of a flame trap on the generator to the air inlet, in lieu of the valve on the generator or the pipe leading therefrom to the first cleaner will be sufficient compliance with this paragraph.

Safety valves shall be large enough to provide free escape of gases, the area to be equivalent to not less than two-thirds of the area of the connecting pipes.

- (iv) Generators or scrubbers mounted in exposed positions shall be covered with an outer grille not less than 1 inch clearance, so as to afford adequate protection to persons.
- (v) Generators shall be placed so that adequate protection shall be given to the driver or persons riding on such vehicle, and to such goods requiring protection.

A shield of fireproof material shall be interposed between the generator and any inflammable material, woodwork, and/or bodywork which is closer than 12 inches to the generator and outlet pipe.

Where partitions are necessary, asbestos or other approved fire-resisting material shall be used and provision made for clearance of not less than three inches from any woodwork or any other inflammable material.

- (vi) Generators fitted within the luggage compartment of a motor vehicle shall be completely and permanently sealed from leakage of gas into the interior of the vehicle and shall be suitably insulated with an approved fireproof material. Woodwork or other inflammable materials must not be less than 6 inches from the nearest point of the generator, gas pipes, or scrubbers.

Sufficient ventilation of the compartment shall be provided to allow gases or fumes to escape.

The filling orifice of any generator shall not approach within 12 inches of any portion of the compartment when the filling lid is open.

- (vii) No generator shall be placed within five feet of any petrol tank or filler.
- (viii) The water drip sight feed placed inside any vehicle shall be totally enclosed to prevent the possibility of escaping gas or the blow-back of hot water, and shall at all times be plainly visible to the driver and accessible for easy adjustment.
- (ix) Gas pipes leaving the generator must enter a scrubber or cooler, which shall not be more than one foot from such generator.
- (x) Producers fitted to the rear of a motor vehicle shall, as far as practicable, be fitted close to the body; provided, however, that in no case must the legal overhang be exceeded. In regard to motor wagons, tractors, and graders, omnibuses, producers shall be fitted to a position approved by the local authority.
- (xi) The fitting of any generator, scrubber, cooler, filter, or pipes attached thereto shall not exceed the maximum width of the vehicle, except that in the case of a generator fitted on the driving side an overhang not exceeding 6 inches will be allowed; provided the maximum width permitted under the loading regulations is not exceeded; they must not interfere with the driver's vision, front or rear. The highest point of any unit or part shall not be placed higher than the bottom of the windscreen. The lowest point of any unit or part shall not be lower than the lowest point of the front axle of the vehicle concerned when fully laden.
- (xii) All entrance doors, openings, and exit floors shall be kept free from obstructions.
- (xiii) All producers, parts, and fittings, shall be securely fixed to the vehicle, and all parts subject to severe vibration must be connected by bolts or studs, and nuts shall be fastened by locknuts or by nuts and efficient spring or lock-nut washers, or by castellated nuts and split pins, or by some other efficient device, so as to prevent their working or coming loose, to the satisfaction of the local authority.
- (xiv) Where gas producer units are fitted upon trailers they shall be sufficiently protected from damage by accident, and to be constructed so that they will not cause danger or damage to any person or property. The connecting gas pipe between the trailer and the motor vehicle shall be of approved flexible type.
- (xv) All other requisites that may be deemed necessary for securing proper control and due provision for the safety of vehicles using producer gas shall be provided to the satisfaction of a local authority.
- (xvi) Subject to the foregoing specific provisions, the general provisions of the Traffic Regulations, insofar as they apply to the design, equipment, and condition of motor vehicles, shall apply.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

(No. 18 of 1940.)

Between Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A., Coastal Branch, Applicant, and The Minister for Health for the State of Western Australia, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

*Award.*

1.—Interpretation.

(a) For the purposes of this Award "Hospital" shall be as defined in the Hospitals Act, 1927, and

(b) "Adult" shall mean a person of not less than twenty-one (21) years of age.

2.—Scope and Area.

(1) Scope:—(a) This Award shall apply to nurse assistants employed in all hospitals under the control of the Minister for Public Health and to all hospitals under the control of Boards: Provided that, when the daily average of occupied beds does not exceed nine (9) clause 3 and clause 4 shall not apply: Provided further, that should the daily average prescribed by clause 7 (n) of Award No. 5 of 1935 (Trained Nurses) be altered, then the number nine (9) mentioned herein shall be automatically altered in consonance therewith and shall take effect from the same date of operation.

(b) The daily average of occupied beds shall be the average for the six (6) months ending June 30th and December 31st in each and every year, and shall be calculated on the in-patients, out-patients and babies not being included.

(2) Area:—This Award shall apply outside a radius of thirty-five (35) miles of the G.P.O., Perth, excluding the following registered Goldfields:—Mt. Margaret Goldfield, Broad Arrow Goldfield, North Coolgardie Goldfield, North-East Coolgardie Goldfield, East Coolgardie Goldfield, Coolgardie Goldfield, Yilgarn Goldfield, and Dundas Goldfield.

3.—Hours of Duty.

(a) The ordinary hours of duty shall be ninety-six (96) a fortnight, exclusive of meal times.

(b) Where reasonably practicable, workers on day duty shall be allowed one and a half (1½) days continuous time off duty per week, and those on night duty shall be allowed one and a half (1½) days continuous time off duty per week or three days continuous time off duty per fortnight, and, where it is not practicable and the days off duty as specified are missed and not taken within four (4) weeks, equivalent time off shall be added to the annual leave of the worker, or, in the case of a casual worker, it shall be paid for when the employment terminates.

4.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the ordinary working time shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, or, if the employer and worker so agree, time off in lieu thereof shall be granted, at the convenience of the hospital: Provided, however, that such time off shall be in unbroken periods, according to each period of overtime worked. And also provided, that the overtime is made up within twenty-eight (28) days from the time when it becomes due, except where it applies to the change-over from night duty to day duty or day duty to night duty.

(b) Less than thirty (30) minutes' overtime for a week or a fortnight, as the case may be, shall not be paid for.

5.—Roster.

Weekly or fortnightly rosters shall be kept posted in a convenient place, setting out the hours of starting and finishing, and the duties of each worker thereon, together with the day each worker is booked off duty. Such a roster shall be drawn up in such a manner as to show the hours of each worker forty-eight (48) hours preceding the date the roster commences, and may only be altered on account of sickness or the absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee.

6.—Time Book.

(a) A time book, to be open for inspection by the representative of the union at any reasonable time, shall be provided. Each worker must record in such book the exact time she starts and finishes duty on each day and also the time booked off for meals or breaks in shift.

(b) The wages sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open to inspection by the union secretary during ordinary office hours, at Head Office, in the case of hospitals under the control of the Minister, and at the office of the employer, in the case of hospitals controlled by Boards.

7.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely:—Good Friday, Labour Day, and Christmas Day. Any worker required to work on any of the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of double time, or shall have one day added to her annual holiday for each day so worked, at the option of the employer.

(b) A holiday of three (3) weeks on full pay, without any deductions being made for board and lodging, shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of her service: Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for misconduct for any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

8.—Sick Leave.

(a) Sick leave with pay may be granted on the following scale, on the production of an adequate medical certificate, or, in regard to leave not exceeding two (2) days, other evidence satisfactory to the officer in charge:

(1) Under three (3) years' service—one and one quarter (1¼) days for each calendar month of continuous service with hospitals under this Award: Provided that payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(2) Over three (3) years' service—two (2) months on full pay.

The worker must furnish proof of continuous service.

(b) Sick leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall not in any one triennial period exceed the time provided for in the foregoing scale.

(c) A "triennial period" shall be three (3) years preceding the date of application.

(d) Sick leave with pay will not be granted when the illness is due to the worker's misconduct.

(3) Years of service as a junior shall count in fixing the wage for an adult. Service shall include service in hospitals under this Award and also service in other hospitals as Unregistered Nurses where the experience and training is similar to that to be acquired in hospitals regulated hereunder.

(4) Deductions—Where adult workers receive board and lodgings, a deduction of an amount of 52% of the female basic wage, and where lodging only is received, a deduction of 17½% of the female basic wage shall be made from the specified weekly wage. Where workers receive part board and no lodgings, a deduction of ninepence (9d.) for each meal shall be made in the South-West Land Division and tenpence (10d.) for each meal in other portions of the State.

(5) Allowances—Where junior female workers are required to live away from the hospital an allowance on the same scale as the deductions shown in the foregoing subclause shall be made in lieu of lodgings and/or any portion of the board not partaken of by the workers.

#### 10.—District Allowance.

District allowance, as specified herein, shall be paid to workers stationed at:—

#### 11.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid fortnightly, and overtime, if any, shall be paid at least monthly.

#### 12.—Accommodation.

Reasonable accommodation shall be provided for all staff living in and suitable dressing rooms for the staff living out.

#### 13.—Uniforms.

All uniforms, i.e., uniformity in dress, shall be supplied free of cost to all workers required to wear them. Aprons shall be provided for all workers.

#### 14.—Casual Workers.

All persons engaged for a period of less than six (6) days in any one week shall be paid at the rate of ten (10) per cent., in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed, with a minimum engagement of one day: Provided that this shall not apply in the case of a worker summarily dismissed for misconduct.

#### 15.—No Reduction.

Nothing contained in this Award shall operate to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of the Award is being paid a higher rate than the minimum prescribed for her class of work.

#### 16.—General Clauses.

(a) No worker shall be rostered for night work for a longer period than seven (7) consecutive nights.

(b) A worker required to take a day off duty not already shown on the roster for such day must be so informed before booking off on the day previous.

(c) All washing forming a part of a uniform shall be laundered free of cost to the worker.

(d) Space shall be provided in the workers' dining room for the purpose of posting union notices.

(e) When a worker is entitled to annual leave under this Award, such worker shall be given, wherever possible, at least two (2) weeks' notice of the date when such leave is to commence, and such leave shall be for an unbroken period.

(f) A copy of the Award shall be posted in a conspicuous position by the officer in charge of each institution.

(g) Overtime rate shall be calculated and based on the aggregate wage, i.e., the amount paid in cash plus the value of board and/or lodgings. The district allowance shall not be included for the purpose of such calculation.

(h) If a worker's day off falls on a day prescribed by this Award as a holiday, such worker shall be allowed another day in lieu thereof.

(i) Letter racks shall be provided in the dining rooms.

#### 17.—Preference to Unionists.

All other qualifications being equal, preference in the matter of employment shall be given to members of the union.

#### 18.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 19.—Certificate of Service.

If at the termination of her service a worker requires a certificate, the same shall be supplied by the employer. Such certificate shall show the time served and the class of work in which the worker has been engaged.

#### 20.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date of delivery.
