WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act Amendment Act, 1940, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that the residents of any area are not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical services, the said Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare such area to be a region within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the residents of the areas specified in the Schedule hereunder are not adequately provided

for in respect of medical or surgical services, proclaim the said areas to be a region under the provisions of the said Act—to be designated the Meekatharra region.

SCHEDULE.

Meekatharra Region.

Bounded on the south by an east-west line passing through a point 18 miles due south of the Post Office, Meekatharra; on the east by a north and south line passing through the 54-Mile Post on the Meekatharra-Wilma Railway; on the north by an east-west line passing through a point 100 miles due north of the Post Office, Meekatharra, and on the west by a north-south line passing through a point 75 miles due west of the Post Office, Meekatharra.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1940, that the term "District" means any portion of the State declared by Proclamation to be a district for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas, by a Proclamation issued and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of May, 1940, the Governor declared the several portions of the State more particularly described, defined, and delineated respectively in the Schedule to the said Proclamation under the names by which the said districts shall be known shall be districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, and that the said several districts shall be known by and referred to under the names contained in the said Schedule respectively in relation to the description, definition, and delineation of the said portions of the State which by the said Proclamation are declared to be districts as aforesaid: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to cancel or abolish some of the districts declared as aforesaid, and to amend the boundaries of some of the other districts declared as aforesaid, and also to declare certain new districts for the purposes of the said Act, and for these purposes to amend and vary the hereinbefore-mentioned Proclamation accordingly: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby amend and vary the Proclamation heretofore made under section 2 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of May, 1940, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, with the intent that the said hereinbefore-mentioned Proclamation as amended by this present Proclamation shall remain in full force and effect as the declaration of districts under and for the purposes of the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

The Schedule to the above-mentioned Proclamation is amended and varied as follows:—

1. The description of the district of "Bassendean" is deleted and a new description of the said district is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Bassendean.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre of Bennett Brook with the southern boundary of Pyrton Estate and extending westerly along the said boundary and onwards to the centre of Walker road; thence generally southerly along the said centre to the centre of Collier road; thence easterly along the said centre to the centre of Duffy street; thence south-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Clune street; thence generally south-easterly along the said centre, the centre of Wicks street, and that of Vincent street, and onwards to the centre of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence generally south-westerly and south-south-easterly along the said centre and that of the Belmont Railway Reserve to the right bank of the Swan River; thence generally easterly and north-easterly, upwards, along the said bank to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the centre of Bulong avenue; thence south-easterly along the said prolongation to the centre of the said river; and thence generally north-easterly, upwards, along the said centre and that of Bennett Brook aforesaid to the starting point.

2. After the description of the district of Big Bell, a new name and description of a new district, to be known as Boddington, is inserted in the said Schedule as follows:—

Boddington.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the centre of Dumbitmoony Pool on the Hotham River and extending south-westerly to a point in the centre of the Williams River situate east of the south-eastern corner of Cookernup Townsite; thence west, crossing the Murray River and onwards to a point in the centre of the last-mentioned river situate near the northernmost corner of Wellington Location 1748; thence northerly along a line towards the summit of Mt. Randall to a point situate west of the Trigonometrical Station on Mt. Cooke; thence east to said station; thence easterly to the south-eastern corner of Avon Location 7374; thence east to a point situate north of the starting point, and thence south to the said starting point.

3. The name and description of the district of "Carnegie" is deleted from the said Schedule and the said district is abolished.

4. The description of the district of "Causeway" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Causeway.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the junction of the centres of Royal and Lord streets and extending generally north-easterly along the centre of the latter street to the centre of Summers street; thence easterly along the said centre and onwards to the right bank of the Swan River; thence generally south-south-westerly, downwards, along the said bank to a point situate in prolongation south-south-westerly of the centre of Bennett street; thence north-north-easterly to and along the said centre to the centre of Royal street aforesaid, and thence north-westerly and westerly along the said centre to the starting point.

5. The description of the district of "Dongarra" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Dongarra.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-eastern corner of Melbourne Location 938 and extending westerly along its northern boundary and onwards to the centre of the Hill River; thence generally westerly along said centre, downwards, to the seashore; thence generally northerly along said shore, including all islands adjacent thereto, to a point situate west of the summit of Mt. Hill; thence east through said summit and onwards to the centre of Road No. 2275; thence generally south-south-westerly along said centre to the centre of the Irwin River; thence generally south-westerly, downwards, along the said centre of river, to a point in prolongation north-westerly of a line between the south-western corner of Victoria Location 2273 and Trigonometrical Station WYY; thence south-easterly, passing through said corner and station, to a point situate north of starting point; and thence south to the said starting point.

6. The description of the district of "Dwellingup" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Dwellingup.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the south-eastern corner of Cockburn Sound Location 16 and extending northerly along the eastern boundary of said location to a point situate west of the Trigonometrical Station on Mt. Cooke; thence east to a point situate on a line between the summit of Mt. Randall and a point east of the south-eastern corner of Cookernup Townsite, and situate in the centre of the Murray River near the northernmost corner of Wellington Location 1748; thence southerly, partly along the said line, to a point situate east of Survey Mark F59 on the Murray River; thence west to the centre of the said Murray River; thence generally north-westerly, downwards, along the said centre, to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of Location 16 aforesaid, and thence northerly to the starting point.

7. The description of the district of "Fremantle" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof, whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Fremantle.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the junction of East and High streets and extending easterly along the centre of the latter to the centre of Carrington street; thence northerly along the said centre to the centre of High road; thence generally easterly along the said centre, that of Bull Creek road; the centre of Road No. 7660 and onwards to the left bank of Bull Creek; thence generally easterly, upwards, along the said bank and onwards, crossing over to the right bank of the said creek near the north-eastern corner of Canning Location 27; thence generally northerly, downwards, along the said right bank to the left bank of the Canning River; thence generally north-easterly and south-easterly, upwards, along the said left bank to a point in prolongation northerly of the centre of Riley road; thence generally southerly to and along the said centre and that of Road No. 796 to the centre of Ranford road; thence generally south-easterly along the said centre to the centre of Nicholson road; thence generally southerly along the said centre to the centre of Acourt road; thence south-easterly along the said centre to the centre of Hale road; thence generally south-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Keane road; thence southerly along the said centre to the centre of Rowley road; thence easterly along the said centre to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of Peel Estate Lot 106; thence southerly to the southernmost corner of the said lot; thence south-south-westerly, passing through the north-eastern corner of Peel Estate Lot 1040 and onwards to a point situate west of the Trigonometrical Station of Mt. Cooke; thence west to the seashore; thence generally northerly along the said seashore, including the islands adjacent thereto, to a point situate west of the centre of the western portion of Road No. 1716; thence generally easterly to and along the said centre to the centre of Road No. 312; thence generally northerly along the said centre, and to and along that of Carrington street aforesaid to the centre of Stephen street; thence generally westerly along said centre to the centre of Attfield street; thence northerly along said centre to the centre of Alma street; thence westerly along said centre to the centre of South terrace; thence southerly along said centre to the centre of Howard street; thence westerly along said centre and onwards to the seashore; thence west to a point situate south of the western extremity of the North Mole; thence north to said extremity; thence generally easterly along the northern side of said Mole to its eastern extremity; thence south-east to the right bank of the Swan River; thence north-easterly, upwards, along said bank to the south-eastern corner of Reserve B2020; thence southerly in prolongation of the eastern boundary of said reserve to the left bank of the Swan River aforesaid; thence generally south-south-westerly, downwards, along said bank to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the centre of East street, and thence southerly along said centre to the starting point, including Rottneest Island.

8. The description of the district of "Geraldton" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof, whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Geraldton.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the centre of the mouth of the Oakahee River and extending easterly to the centre of Abbarwardoo Pool in the Greenough River; thence generally south-westerly, downwards, along the centre of said river to a point situate west of Wongoondy Well in Victoria Location 8756; thence south-south-westerly to the northern end of Road No. 2275 and onwards along the centre of the said road generally in the last-mentioned direction to a point situate east of the summit of Mt. Hill; thence west through said summit and onwards to the seashore, and thence generally north-north-westerly along the said seashore, including all islands adjacent thereto, to the starting point.

9. The name and description of the district of "Greenough" is deleted from the Schedule and the said district is abolished.

10. The name and description of the district of "Highgate" is deleted from the Schedule and the said district is abolished.

11. After the description of the district of "Harvey" a new name and description of a new district, to be known as "Inglewood," is inserted in the Schedule as follows:—

Inglewood.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of William and Vincent streets and extending easterly and east-south-easterly along the centres of Vincent, Harold, and Norwood streets, and onwards to the centre of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence generally north-north-easterly along the said centre of reserve to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the centre of First avenue; thence north-westerly to and along the said centre to the centre of Coode street; thence generally north-easterly along the said centre and the centres of Kennedy street, Harrow street, Crawford road, Alma street, Stuart street, and Bowden street to the centre of a road along part of the south-western boundary of Swan Location V; thence north-westerly along said centre about two chains; thence north-easterly along the centre of a surveyed street to the centre of Shaftesbury avenue; thence north-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Adelphi street; thence generally north-easterly along the said centre of Adelphi street and the centres of Lawrence, Paterson, and Drake streets and that of Rothbury road to the centre of Drynan street; thence north-westerly and north-north-easterly along the said centre and that of Greenford road to the centre of Collier road; thence north-westerly along the said centre and that of Wellington road to the centre of Bunya street; thence northerly along the said centre to the centre of Widgee road; thence westerly along the said centre and onwards to the centre of Road No. 262; thence southerly along the said centre to the centre of Crawford road aforesaid; thence south-easterly along the said centre to a point in prolongation northerly of the centre of the southern portion of Browning street; thence southerly to and along the said centre to the centre of Wordsworth avenue; thence westerly along the said centre and onwards to the centre of Bourke street; thence southerly along the said centre to the centre of Bradford street; thence south-easterly along the said centre to the centre of Learoyd street; thence generally south-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Walcott street; thence south-easterly along the said centre to the centre of William street aforesaid, and thence south-westerly and southerly along the said centre to the starting point.

12. The description of the district of "Leederville" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof, whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Leederville.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of Loftus street and Anzac road and extending westerly along the centre of the said road and onwards to the shore of Lake Monger; thence generally north-westerly and south-westerly along said shore to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre of Dodd street; thence westerly to and along the said centre to the centre of Harborne street; thence generally northerly along the centre of Harborne street to the centre of Scarborough Beach road; thence generally north-westerly along said centre to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western side of Road No. 5; thence northerly along said side and onwards to the centre of Beatrice street; thence westerly along said centre to the centre of Lake View terrace; thence northerly along said centre to the centre of Adelaide terrace; thence generally westerly along said centre and the centre of Bourne-mouth parade and onwards to the seashore; thence generally southerly along said shore to a point situate west of the north-western corner of Swan Location 3150; thence east to said corner; thence generally easterly along the northern boundaries of Swan Locations 3150 and 2121 to the latter's northernmost corner; thence northerly along a prolongation of the western boundary of Reserve 18044 to the centre of a two-chain road; thence generally north-easterly along said centre to the centre of Selby street; thence northerly along said centre to the centre of Cambridge street; thence easterly along the said centre to the centre of McCourt street; thence

northerly along said centre to the corner of Ruislip street; thence easterly along said centre to the centre of Northwood street; thence generally northerly along said centre to the centre of Vincent street; thence generally easterly along said centre to the centre of Loftus street aforesaid, and thence generally northerly along said centre to the starting point.

13. The description of the district of "Maylands" is amended and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Maylands.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point situate in the centre of First avenue and in prolongation south-westerly of the centre of Coode street and extending generally north-easterly to and along the centre of the said street and the centres of Kennedy street, Harrow street, Crawford road, Alma street, Stuart street, and Bowden street to the centre of a road along part of the south-western boundary of Swan Location V; thence north-westerly along said centre about two chains; thence north-easterly along the centre of a surveyed street to the centre of Shaftesbury avenue; thence north-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Adelphi street; thence generally north-easterly along the said centre of Adelphi street and the centres of Lawrence, Paterson, and Drake streets and that of Rothbury road to the centre of Drynan street; thence north-westerly and north-north-easterly along the said centre and that of Greenford road to the centre of Collier road; thence north-westerly along the said centre and that of Wellington road to the centre of Bunya street; thence northerly along the said centre to the centre of Widgee road; thence easterly along the said centre to the centre of Road No. 1545; thence southerly along the centre of said road and that of Boulder street to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of Pyrton Estate; thence easterly along the said prolongation to the centre of Walker road; thence generally southerly along the said centre to the centre of Collier road aforesaid; thence easterly along the said centre to the centre of Duffy street; thence south-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Clune street; thence generally south-easterly along the said centre, the centre of Wicks street and that of Vincent street and onwards to the centre of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence generally south-westerly and south-south-easterly along the said centre and that of the Belmont Railway Reserve to the right bank of the Swan River; thence generally west-south-westerly, south-easterly, again west-south-westerly, north-westerly, and south-westerly, downwards, along the said bank to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre of Summers street; thence westerly along the said prolongation to the centre of the Eastern Railway Reserve aforesaid; thence generally north-north-easterly along the said centre of reserve to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the centre of First avenue aforesaid, and thence north-westerly to and along the said centre to the starting point.

14. The description of the district of "Mt. Hawthorn" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Mt. Hawthorn.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of Loftus street and Anzac road and extending westerly along the centre of the said road and onwards to the shore of Lake Monger; thence generally north-westerly and south-westerly along said shore to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre of Dodd street; thence westerly to and along the said centre to the centre of Harborne street; thence generally northerly along the centre of Harborne street to the centre of Scarborough Beach road; thence generally north-westerly along said centre to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western side of Road No. 5; thence northerly along said side and onwards to the centre of Beatrice street; thence westerly along said centre to the centre of Lake View terrace; thence northerly along said centre to the centre of Adelaide terrace; thence generally westerly along said centre and the centre of Bourne mouth parade and onwards to the seashore; thence generally northerly along said shore, including the islands adjacent thereto, to a point situate west of the south-eastern corner of Swan Location 1352; thence

east to a point situate north of the intersection of the centres of Road No. 1545 and Widgee road; thence south to the said intersection; thence westerly along the centre of the said Widgee road and onwards to the centre of Road No. 262; thence southerly along the said centre to the centre of Crawford road; thence south-easterly along said centre to a point in prolongation northerly of the centre of the southern portion of Browning street; thence southerly to and along said centre to the centre of Wordsworth avenue; thence westerly along said centre and onwards to the centre of Wanneroo road; thence generally south-south-easterly along said centre and that of Charles street to the centre of Green street; thence generally westerly along said centre to the centre of London street, and thence generally southerly along said centre and to and along that of Loftus street aforesaid to the starting point.

15. The description of the district of "Mundijong" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Mundijong.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from Trigonometrical Station on Mt. Cooke and extending easterly to the south-eastern corner of Avon Location 7374; thence north to a point situate west of the south-eastern corner of Location 6036; thence west to a point situate south of the Trigonometrical Station on Mt. Dale; thence north to a point situate east of the south-eastern corner of Coekburn Sound Location 45 near Byford; thence west to a point situate on a line between the southernmost corner of Peel Estate Lot 10 and the north-eastern corner of Lot 1040; thence south south-westerly, passing through the last-named point, to a point situate west of the starting point, and thence east to the starting point.

16. The description of the district of "Narrogin" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

Narrogin.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the centre of Dumbitmoony Pool on the Hothar River and extending north to a point situate east of the south-western corner of Wandering Townsite; thence east to a point situate on a line between the south-eastern corners of Williams Locations 94 and 5014; thence southerly to the latter corner; thence east to a point situate north of the south-eastern corner of Williams Location 5614; thence south to said corner; thence south-westerly to a point in the centre of the Arthur River situate south of the southernmost corner of Williams Location 6943; thence south-westerly, downwards, along said centre to the centre of Neerahn Pool; thence west-north-westerly to the north-eastern corner of Williams Location 7752; thence northerly to the north-eastern corner of Dumberning Agricultural Area Lc 39, and thence north-westerly to the starting point.

17. The description of the district of "North Perth" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follow:—

North Perth.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centres of Vincent and Loftus streets and extending generally northerly along the centres of Loftus and London streets to the centre of Green street; thence generally easterly along the last mentioned centre to the centre of Charles street; thence generally north-north-westerly along said centre and that of Wanneroo road to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the centre of Wordsworth avenue; thence easterly along the said prolongation to the centre of Bourke street; thence southerly along the said centre to the centre of Bradford street; thence south-easterly along the said centre to the centre of Learoyd street; thence generally south-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Walcott street; thence south-easterly along the said centre to the centre of William street; thence generally south-south-westerly along the said centre to the centre of Bulwer street, and thence west-north-westerly and westerly along the said centre and that of Vincent street aforesaid to the starting point.

18. The description of the district of "Nullagine" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follows:—

Nullagine.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the 620-M.P. on the No. 1 Rabbit-Proof Fence and extending east to the eastern boundary of the State; thence north along said boundary to the southern boundary of the Kimberley Division; thence west along said boundary to a point situate south of Trigonometrical Station G.L.; thence north to a point situate east of the Trigonometrical Station on Mt. Alexander; thence west to a point situate south of the 55-M.P. on the Broome-Derby Telegraph Line; thence south to a point situate east of the 898-M.P. on the abandoned Rabbit-Proof Fence survey; thence west to a point situate north of the 70-M.P. (from the north end) on the No. 1 Rabbit-Proof Fence; thence south to said M.P.; thence generally south-easterly along the said fence to a point situate east of the Trigonometrical Station on Pulleunah Hill; thence west, passing through said station and onwards to a point situate north of the Trigonometrical Station B.4 on Cummagnumma; thence south, passing through said Station B.4 and onwards to a point situate west of the starting point, and thence east to the said starting point.

19. The name and description of the district of "Peel" are deleted from the Schedule and the said district is abolished.

20. The description of the district of "Perth" is deleted and a new description is inserted in lieu thereof whereby the boundaries of the said district are amended and are as follows:—

Perth (including Central).

(c) The expression "floor area" applied to a tenement shall mean the total nett internal superficial area of all floors of so many horizontal sections as there are storeys in the said tenement. In the calculation of "nett internal floor area," walls, porches, staircases, and all embellishments shall be excluded.

2. That clause (3) of provision 1 (d) of the Scheme, page 8 of the *Government Gazette* dated 5th January, 1940, be revoked.

3. That the Scheme be amended by inserting in lieu of clause (3) of provision 1 (d) the following:—

(a) All or any building used for tenement house purposes shall be of brick, stone, or cement construction;

(b) existing building of stone, brick or cement may be altered into tenement houses, provided:—

(i) such buildings were erected and have been used only for the purposes of human habitation;

(ii) all alterations shall be of a permanent nature in stone, brick or cement;

(iii) there shall be a dividing wall of at least 9 inches in thickness without any openings between the portion of the buildings to be used by each family or between each self-contained flat, and this wall must be constructed of material that will render the wall fire-resisting and sound proof to the approval of the Council, providing that in such circumstances the Council may approve of such wall to be less than 9 inches in thickness;

(iv) in the event of any portion of any existing dwelling or building, to be altered into a tenement house, not complying with the by-laws and regulations in force at the time that any alteration is desired to be made, such portion of the building as does not comply shall be altered in such a way as to comply with the existing by-laws and regulations;

(v) any person making such alterations or additions shall comply with all the existing regulations and by-laws of the municipality including the Health Act and regulations;

(vi) any dwelling-house or other building so altered shall be deemed a tenement within the meaning of the by-laws or regulations for the control of tenement houses, set out in *Government Gazette* of 5th January, 1940.

4. That clause 5 of provision 1 (d) of the Scheme, page 9 of the *Government Gazette* dated 5th January, 1940, be altered to read as follows:—

(5) "Floor area" of a tenement house consisting of one floor only shall not cover an area exceeding half of the allotment or parcel of land upon which it is built. Where a tenement house has more than one floor, the total aggregate "Floor area" of all storeys shall be not greater than half of the area of the allotment or parcel of land upon which it is built.

5. That in clause 8 of provision 1 (d) of the Scheme, page 9 of the *Government Gazette* dated 5th January, 1940, the figures "450 sq. feet" be altered to read "350 sq. feet."

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 14 of 1941.)

(Reg. 25/8/41.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this fourteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one between the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie (hereinafter termed the employer), of the one part, and the Kalgoorlie Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners' Industrial Union of Workers, being a union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935 (hereinafter termed the employee), of the other part, whereby the said parties are mutually agreed as follows:—

1.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wages payable to workers under this Agreement (other than duly registered apprentices or probationers) shall be:—

Journeyman carpenters and journeyman joiners, including shop or mill carpenters, when working in dust-laden atmosphere caused by the use of materials for insulating, deafening, or pugging work (as, for instance—pumice, charcoal, silicate of cotton, or any other substitute), or working on insulating work in an average temperature of forty-five degrees or under, shall be paid not less than threepence per hour in addition to the rate prescribed.

2.—Casual Workers.

(a) Casual workers shall be paid ordinary rates plus ten per cent. (10 per cent.).

(b) Leading hand:—Leading hand shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day above the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed for his trade.

3.—Definitions.

"Casual worker" means any worker whose services are dispensed with by the employer before he shall have completed five (5) days of his engagement.

"Leading hand" means any tradesman placed in charge of three (3) or more other tradesmen or six (6) other workers.

4.—Country Work.

When any worker is sent by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid, in addition to his regular wages, 6s. per day for the first seven days and 30s. per week thereafter. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time: Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight hours in any one day.

The employer shall also provide free transport for the employee's tools.

5.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work; such hours shall be worked as follows, namely:—On the first five (5) days of the working week—between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., with an interval of not more than sixty (60) minutes for lunch, each day standing by itself.

6.—Overtime.

All work performed after the usual time for ceasing duty shall be paid at the rates of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter. Any worker who is called upon to work overtime for more than two (2) hours without receiving notice of such overtime on the previous day, shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) for a meal, or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment. Any worker who has left the premises in which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one hour, shall receive payment for one hour at overtime rates. If an employer requires a worker to work during the usual meal time, he shall allow to such worker a period equal to the usual meal time for the purpose of having his meal. For all work done at the request of the employer after 12.30 p.m. by a worker who has not had the usual time allowed for a meal, and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time. All time worked on Saturdays shall be paid at time and a half rates for the first two hours and double time thereafter and Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates.

7.—Travelling Time.

During the hours of work all travelling time from and to the employer's place of business, or from one job to another, shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

8.—Payment of Wages.

Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the office, if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing work, whenever same is practicable.

Payment of wages shall be made on or before Friday of each fortnight, within fifteen minutes of the usual time of ceasing work.

The employer shall not keep more than five days pay in hand.

9.—Holidays.

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to two weeks' annual leave (10 working days) on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

(b) Every employee shall be allowed the following holidays on full pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Kalgoorlie Cup Day, and Labour Day.

Every employee compelled to work on such days shall be paid double time rates. Whenever any of these holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday or Tuesday shall be observed as a holiday.

10.—Weekly Hiring.

(a) A week's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side, except in the case of casual workers.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except when such absence from work is due to illness or comes within the provisions of clause 7, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Agreement.

(c) This clause does not effect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

11.—Safe-keeping of Tools.

The employer shall provide a place for the storing and safe-keeping of his employees' tools when not in use.

12.—Provision of Appliances.

The employer shall provide the following tools when they are required on the job:—Dogs and cramps of all descriptions, bars of all descriptions, steel tapes, augers of all sizes, bits not ordinarily used in a brace, all hammers except claw hammers, glue pots and brushes, dowel plates, trammels, hand and thumb screws, soldering irons, and spanners from three-quarters of an inch and upwards. The employer shall provide on all jobs suitable sanitary conveniences and boiling water ready for meal times, where it is necessary.

13.—Employee presenting himself and Services not Required.

In the event of an employee turning up to work at the usual starting time and finding his services are not required, he shall be paid for two hours, at the ruling rate.

14.—Grinding Time.

(a) When an employee is discharged he shall be allowed two (2) hours for grinding tools, or shall receive two hours' pay in lieu thereof. The employer shall provide, for the use of his employees, a suitable grinding stone on any job where such grindstone is reasonably necessary, together with the required power (hand or driven) for turning same.

(b) The two hours for grinding tools shall not be allowed, unless the tools of the worker are in good order and condition before he commences work.

15.—Interviewing Workers.

The secretary or any duly authorised official of the union shall not be prevented by an employer from visiting and conversing during meal times with the members of the union on any job or in any shop.

16.—Working Plods.

The employer shall make and keep a plod card showing the name of each worker and hours worked by and the amount paid to each worker. Such cards shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection by the representative of the union during working hours.

17.—Preference to Unionists.

(a) In this clause the term "unionist" means a worker who is a member of the applicant union, and the term "non-unionist" means a worker who is not a member of the applicant union.

(b) Unionists shall be given preference of employment, and an employer who employs a non-unionist commits a breach of this Agreement, if during such employment there are unionists competent to do the work and available and ready to perform it.

(c) It shall not be a breach of the clause if an employer shall continue to employ a non-unionist who was in the employ at the date of this Agreement, but the employment of the non-unionist shall cease not later than twenty-one (21) days from such date, unless in the meantime he becomes a unionist.

18.—Posting Notices.

No employer shall prevent an official of the organisation at any time from posting a copy of this Agreement, or any notice of the organisation, not exceeding fourteen inches by nine inches, in a suitable place on any job. Such notice shall not be destroyed by any person before the completion of the job.

19.—Definition.

The term "carpenter and joiner" shall mean a worker engaged upon the erection, repair, ornamentation, or any form of constructional work, as well as making, preparing, and fixing of all necessary woodwork and fitting in connection therewith, including metal shop-fronts and fittings and aircraft work.

20.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. For this purpose twenty (20) working days shall constitute a month. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act: Provided always, that an employer shall be entitled to demand a medical certificate from any worker claiming such payment before he can be required to make any such payment.

(b) Should any of the holidays stated in clause nine (9), with the exception of Saturday and Sunday, occur during an employee's absence from work through sickness or as the result of an accident, the said employee shall be entitled to receive payment for such holiday.

21.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and, in default of such agreement being reached within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his own hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

22.—Apprentices.

(a) In this Agreement the term "Apprentice" means an apprentice duly registered with the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provision of this clause, and the term "Probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause: Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b) Any employer hereafter taking a probationer or an apprentice shall, within fourteen days thereafter, duly register such probationer or apprentice by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.

(c) If at the date of this Agreement any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(f) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the period of apprenticeship.

(g) (1) Should any employer from any cause whatsoever be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice he shall be allowed, with the consent of the union, the apprentice, and the parent or guardian of the apprentice, to transfer the apprentice to another employer, who shall thereupon be bound by the covenants, conditions, and stipulations of the agreement of apprenticeship and of this Agreement, and be held to indemnify the former employer from all actions, claims, and demands in respect of same. The agreement of apprenticeship shall be indorsed to this effect and signed by the new employer and the other parties thereto, and a clause shall be inserted providing that the indenture may be cancelled by mutual consent.

(g) (2) It shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Registrar of the date of such transfer and such particulars thereof as may be required.

(h) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

(1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (n) pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate in the prescribed form to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this Agreement, according to the total length of time served and, generally, to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form prescribed. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer, if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(4) Before an apprentice employed under a registered agreement is discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct, the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship shall first have been cancelled by the order of the Court.

(5) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.

(6) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that, in the event of the apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense, to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

(i) The minimum wage paid to an apprentice shall be:—

Apprentices' Wages.	Percentage of Basic Wage and Industry Allowance.
First six months	20
Second six months	25
Second year	30
Third year	45
Fourth year	65
Fifth year	85

(j) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service, when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do, and shall in each year of his apprenticeship attend a technical school the classes for instruction in the trade covered by this Agreement.

(k) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at such place as shall be from time to time appointed by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(l) The examination will be held in the month of November in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person, skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the workers' union, one person, skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the employers, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court.

The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(m) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the results of the examination.

(n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in any year in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners at the examination for that year referred to in subclause (l) or (until he has completed the carpentry course) fails to obtain from a technical school a certificate that he has during the year passed an annual examination in carpentry at the school. The employer shall pay the fees payable to the technical school.

(o) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this Agreement under section 97 of the Act and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(p) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

(q) The forms referred to in this clause or prescribed therein shall be such as are provided by the Court.

23.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall come into force on the day of the date herein, and shall remain in force for the period of three (3) years thence ensuing, and thereafter subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said employer in the Municipality of Kalgoorlie.
