WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the expression "Public holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Tuesday, the 4th day of November, 1941, shall be a public holiday in the Blackwood Upper Shop District for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.
