### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor for MIT.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855, that the Governor may by Proclamation from time to time frame, alter, amend, or repeal rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance, to be observed by all masters and commanders of all ships or vessels in any of the ports or harbours of Western Australia, and by all persons duly appointed or licensed to act as harbour masters or pilots in such ports or harbours, and may substitute others in their stead, but so that all such rules and regulations shall be promulgated by Proclamation in the Government Gazette at least one month before the same shall be in full force and effect: And whereas the Governor did by Proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of November, 1917, make regulations in accordance with the said Ordinance: And whereas such Proclamation has been amended from time to time thereafter: And whereas it is now deemed desirable to amend the said regutime thereafter: And whereas it is now deemed desirable to amend the said regulations by repealing the regulations Numbered 8 to 11, both inclusive, as inserted by Proclamation dated the 1st day of February, 1934, and published in the Government Gazette on the 9th day of February, 1934, and by substituting new regulations in place thereof: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Ordinance, do hereby amend the said regulations made under the said Ordinance by a Proclamation dated the 1st day of February, 1934, and published in the Government Gazette on the 9th day of February, 1934, in the manner following, that is to say, the regulations Numbered 8 to 11, both inclusive are hereby repealed, and new regulations as set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby inserted in the said regulations in lieu of the particular regulations, which are hereby repealed as aforesaid: And further I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do declare that this Proclamation and the new regulations hereby made shall come into force one month after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, that the term "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird, or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals, birds, or insects the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to add to the Third Schedule the name of the bird known as "Smoker Parrot" or "Black Tailed Parakeet" (Polytelus Anthopeplus) so that the same

shall be "vermin" for the purposes of the said Act, but to restrict the operation of this Proclamation to that portion of the State comprised in Gingin Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, the name of the bird known as "Smoker Parrot" or "Black Tailed Parakeet" (Polytelus Anthopeplus) so that the same shall be "vermin" for the purpose of the said Act, and direct that the operation of this Proclamation shall be restricted to that portion of the State comprised in Gingin Vermin District.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excel-

lency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage, Reticulation Area No. 13, Claremont:—Proposed 12-inch, 9-inch, 6-inch, and 4-inch diameter pipe sewers, with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, as shown in green on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 6653.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 19th day of December, 1941.

# Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of surance office, approved by the Minister, a poncy or insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Conneil exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10: And whereas the Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, being an employer and as such subject to the said section 10, has duly, in accordance with the regulations, made application for exemption from the said section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Certificate of Title Volume 478, Folio 98, in which is comprised an estate in fee simple in all that piece of land being portion of Perth Town Lot G1, charged with all payments to become due under the said charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lientenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Excentive Conneil and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Australian Mutnal Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, during the period of two years commencing on the 18th day of November, 1941.

# BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Carnamah Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Carnamah (Carnamah-Winchester and Coorow-Marchagee).

# Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws, shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof: Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

# Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

- 3. The secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.
- 4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.
- 5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

# Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire-fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or land under pasture.

### Membership of Brigade.

- 7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.
- (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

  - (ii) Other persons—a minimum subscription of ..... 5 0
- (3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.
- (4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire-fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.
- (5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.
- (6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

# Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

# Meetings of Brigade.

9. Meetings to be held at Carnamah on the third Wednesday of each month, and/or on such other day and place as may be directed by the chairman of the Board.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Carnamah Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Carnamah on 17th September, 1941.
