Lieutenant-Governor, and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1939, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV. of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners, at any time and from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that Part III. of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to any river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp, or marsh specified in the Proclamation to which immediately prior to the

issue of the Proclamation the said Part III. does not apply, but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of thirty days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or authorities in or through whose district or districts such river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp, or marsh runs or is situate, to the intent that, before the making of such declaration, any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered: And whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by Proclamation to declare that Part III. of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Canning River and its tributaries to which immediately prior to the issue of the Proclamation the said Part III. does not apply: And whereas, after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister, and with the advice of the Commissioners, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III. of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1939, shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Canning River, and all the tributaries thereof, as shown marked and defined on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 29369, as kept in the Department of Public Works.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Profiteering Prevention Act, 1939, that the Governor may from time to time, on the report and advice of the Commissioner, under section 11 of the Act, fix and declare for any commodity the maximum price at which it may be sold, according to or upon any principle or condition prescribed, and may vary any price previously fixed but so as to apply only to future transactions: And whereas, by Proclamations issued under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of February, 1941, and on the 2nd day of May, 1941, the Governor fixed and declared the maximum price at which commodities may be sold: And whereas the Commissioner of Prices, under section 11 of the said Act, has now reported and advised that the maximum price so fixed should be amended in accordance with certain principles and conditions: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and on the report of the Commissioner of Prices aforesaid, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me in that behalf by section 13 of the said Act, do hereby amend the Proclamations issued under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of February, 1941, and on the 2nd day of May, 1941, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Paragraph 1 of the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th day of February, 1941, as amended by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of May, 1941, is amended by inserting in the definition of "Cost" in the fifth line of paragraph (b) thereof, after the word "Goods" the words "except any tax imposed by the Pay Roll Tax Act, 1941."

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 123/38.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and

extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements, North Fremantle Municipality:—Proposed six-inch and four-inch diameter mains, together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus and the lifting of the existing 3-inch diameter mains (as shown on Plan No. M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6656).

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section: And whereas the New Zealand and Australian Land Company, Limited, of Yathroo Station, Dandarragan, in the State of Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and as such subject to section 10 of the said Act, has duly, in accordance with the regulations, made application for exemption from the operation of the said section 10, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act and has deposited with the Treasury a security, to wit, Australian Inscribed Stock of the amount of £5,150, already held by the Treasurer, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said The New Zealand and Australian Land Company, Limited, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1939, for a period of two years commencing on the 1st day of November, 1941.

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Dwellingup Hospital.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, the Governor may make regulations for the purpose of the Act, and may thereby formulate Model By-laws for the guidance of Boards in respect of all or any of the matters regarding which Boards may make by-laws: And whereas the Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the said section, has formulated Model By-laws as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940: And whereas a Board may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: Now, therefore, Dwellingup District Hospital Board, being a Board within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, doth hereby adopt the whole of such Model By-laws as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940, with the following amendments:—

Subclause 4, by-law No. 1.—To read “two consecutive meetings.”

Subclause 5, by-law No. 1.—To read “for three months.”

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Dwellingup District Hospital on the 1st day of November, 1941, the following resolution was passed:—

Whereas, under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits, and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such Fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Dwellingup District Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

By-laws for the Control of Medical Funds under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

1. The term “subscriber” shall mean any person (male or female) who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks’ subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

2. The subscription to be paid by a subscriber shall be seven shillings per calendar month, or 1s. 9d. per week, or part thereof. The rate for workers under 21 years of age earning less than the basic wage shall be 3s. 6d. per calendar month.

3. The word “dependant” shall mean the wife, parents, and grandparents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers, and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.

(b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

4. Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws, for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge and in accordance with the B.M.A. Timber Mill Agreement.

6. Subscribers whose subscription is deducted at the source of income shall be deemed financial as from the first deduction.

7. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—

(a) Incurable diseases.

(b) Disorder for the cure of which other establishments are provided.

- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for a benevolent institution.
- (d) Venereal disease.
- (e) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (f) Dentistry.
- (g) Insanity.
- (h) Accouchements (abortive or otherwise).
- (i) Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (j) Sera and vaccines.
- (k) Pathological examination fees.
- (l) Major operations with the exception of urgent operations. (An urgent operation is one where the postponing of the operation for more than 24 hours after the decision to operate has been made, would, in the opinion of the Medical Officer, be detrimental to the health of the patient.)
- (m) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants, unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.

8. The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised public hospital by subscribers or their dependants who are temporarily outside the district, and who suddenly become seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this charged as fees by the other hospital will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases.

(b) If the Medical Officer of the Fund recommends the transfer of a patient to another hospital because he deems the appliances at hand inadequate for the proper treatment of such patient, then the Board will pay, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, the hospital to which this patient is transferred, at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day. The Board will not, however, be responsible for any fares or cost of transfer.

9. Subscribers and their dependants requiring out-patient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. In the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 9 a.m.

(b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at the hours fixed by the Board.

10. When a subscriber, residing outside a radius to be fixed by the Board, requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage, at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer.

11. The doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

12. That in the event of special visits to out-centres beyond the three (3) miles radius from the doctor's residence, a special fee shall be paid by the Committee to the Medical Officer, such fee to be for medical services and apart from and in addition to any mileage fees that may be due; such special fee shall be a matter of special arrangement between the Committee and the Medical Officer.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned: Now, therefore, the Manjimup Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

Hawkers.

1. Interpretation:—

“Board” means the Manjimup Road Board.

“District” means the Manjimup Road District.

“Hawker” means any person who travels and trades and goes from place to place or to other men’s houses or places of business, solicit-

ing orders from or carrying to sell or exposing for sale any goods, wares, or merchandise to any person who does not in the ordinary course of business buy or sell or use the same: Provided, however, that, if the goods, wares, or merchandise consist of only one or more of the following namely:—Fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, butter, eggs, milk, or any victuals or books or newspapers, the term means any person who (or, if he is a servant, whose employer) does not carry on the business of selling or producing the same in a shop or permanent place of business, and who travels and trades and goes from place to place or to other men’s houses there soliciting orders for or carrying to sell or exposing for sale any such merchandise or articles.

The term “Shop or permanent place of business” in the foregoing definition of the word “Hawker” means an established or permanent place of business of substantial construction wherein goods, wares, or merchandise of the kind being hawked are made, produced, or sold, and when the article hawked is a primary product, includes the farm or place where the same was produced.

2. No person shall act or trade as a hawker in any part of the district without first having obtained a license from the Board and only during the currency of such license.

3. Every person desirous of being licensed as a hawker shall apply in writing in the Form No. 1 in Schedule A hereunder to the secretary of the Board stating the kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed.

The granting or refusing of a license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board, and, when granted, a license shall not be transferable. The Board may refuse to grant a license for any reason it may see fit.

4. A Hawker’s License shall be in the Form No. 2 in Schedule A hereto. A license shall remain in force for the period stated therein only.

5. The fee to be paid for a license issued to a hawker shall be as set forth in Schedule B hereto.

6. Every hawker, while hawking, shall carry his license with him, and shall at any time on demand produce the same to any officer of the Board or to any member of the Police force.

7. The secretary of the Board or other officer appointed by the Board, or any member of the Police force may demand from and require from any person committing or suspected of committing an offence against or breach of these by-laws, his name and address, and any person who shall refuse or neglect to give his name and address when required so to do shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

8. Any person who does any act contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits any breach or neglect thereof shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.
