WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-13, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to

Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus giganteus*: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation certain defined localities: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation and the declaration contained therein, all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the 1st day of January, 1942, until the 31st day of March, 1942, inclusive:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 82 of the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921, that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council make regulations for any of the matters specified in the said section: And whereas the Governor in Council, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of July, 1922, made regulations under the said Act which have subsequently from time to time been amended: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient further to amend the said regulations in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, hereby further amends the regulations made under the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of July, 1922, and subsequently amended from time to time in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Perth Road Board—By-laws.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1937, a local authority may make by-laws: Now, therefore, the Perth Road Board, being the local authority for the Perth Road District Health District doth hereby make the following by-laws:—

1. No person shall erect, rebuild, maintain, or use any dwelling-house without providing for the same one sanitary convenience or privy in respect of each dwelling-house. Where any dwelling-house is let or occupied in flats or tenements each flat or tenement shall be deemed to be a separate dwelling-house.

2. No person shall erect or commence to erect or do any work preparatory to the erection of any building without providing a temporary earth closet on the land upon which the building is to be erected, and maintaining the same clean and in a proper condition during the course of the building operations. Such earth closet shall be constructed of wood or iron walls and otherwise shall comply with the conditions of Clause 1 of Part I. of the Model Health By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* dated the 8th April, 1927.

1. Regulation 2 is amended by adding definitions as follows:—
 "Branch organisation" means any branch of any War Fund approved as such by the Trustees.
 "Executive officers," when used in reference to any branch organisation of any War Fund, includes the Trustee, Chairman, President, Director, Committee Member, Secretary, or Treasurer or any other person holding any executive position by whatsoever name same is called.
2. New regulations, to stand as regulations 5B and 5C, are inserted after regulation 5A as follows:—

Delegation of Authority.

5B (1) The Trustees of any War Fund, or any two executive officers of any branch organisation of such War Fund (hereinafter called the delegator) may by notice of delegation in writing in accordance with Form No. 8 in the Appendix hereto, delegate to any person or body (hereinafter called the delegatee), the right of collecting for or in aid of the funds of such War Fund by means of some specific method or function, to be stated in the prescribed form of delegation.

(2) No delegatee shall in any circumstances whatsoever delegate to any other person or body the rights and powers conferred on such delegatee by the original notice of delegation.

(3) Every delegatee shall, within seven days from the occasion of the approved specific collection or function, submit to the delegator a return in accordance with Form No. 9 in the Appendix hereto.

Penalty—Twenty pounds.

(4) Every delegator shall, within seven days from the occasion of the approved specific collection or function for which a form of delegation was granted, obtain from the delegatee a return in accordance with Form No. 9 in the Appendix hereto.

Penalty—Twenty pounds.

(5) Any delegatee who does or performs any action or matter referred to in paragraphs (a), (b), or (c) of section 4, subsection (1) of the Act, save and except an action or matter which such delegatee is expressly empowered to do or perform by the prescribed notice of delegation, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

Information to be Disclosed.

5C. Any War Fund shall, if so required by the Council, provide all requisite information with respect to any branch or branches of such War Fund, including the names and addresses of the executive officers of any such branch or branches, and the date of creation of such branch or branches.

3. Regulation 6 is amended by adding after paragraph (2) thereof a new paragraph to stand as paragraph (3) as follows:—

(3) A return, in accordance with Form No. 10 in the Appendix hereto, showing the operations of every branch organisation of any War Fund shall be submitted by the Executive officers of every such branch to the Trustees of such War Fund within 14 days from the close of each and every month.

Penalty—Twenty pounds.

4. A new regulation, to stand as regulation 9, is added after regulation 8:—

9. (1) The Auditor General, or an officer appointed by him, may inspect, examine, and audit the accounts of any War Fund, branch organisation, or delegatee, and may investigate and examine all documents and vouchers connected with such accounts.

(2) For the purpose of the preceding subregulation all relevant books, papers, or documents shall be produced upon demand, and any person refusing or failing to comply with any such demand or obstructing in any way any inspection, examination, audit, or investigation shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting in exercise of the power conferred by section 46 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1935, has been pleased to amend the Traffic Regulations, 1936, made under and for the purposes of the said Act and amended from time to time thereafter in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

The Traffic Regulations, 1936, are amended as follows:

1. Regulation 23 is amended by inserting in paragraph (1), after subparagraph (c) thereof, a new subparagraph, to stand as subparagraph (d) as follows—

(d) Whenever a number plate or plates issued in respect of a vehicle is mutilated to such an extent as to interfere with its legibility, or has become dilapidated, the owner of such vehicle shall return such plate or plates to the Licensing Authority, together with the license of the vehicle, and pay to the said Licensing Authority the sum required by the said Licensing Authority, not exceeding five shillings, and the Licensing Authority shall issue another number plate or other number plates in substitution of the damaged or dilapidated number plate or plates.

2. Regulation 29 is amended by numbering the existing provisions as paragraph (1) and adding a new paragraph, to stand as paragraph (2), as follows:

(2) No person shall use or permit to be used on a road any vehicle that has a number plate or plates attached thereto which has or have been painted or otherwise interfered with, after having been issued by the Local Authority.

The lamps shall be so fixed as to show the width of such vehicle hereinafter-mentioned and to give an unobstructed view of the light to other users of the road.

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to that type of motor wagon commonly known as a utility truck.

(b) whenever any person as principal or agent disposes of any licensed vehicle, he shall forthwith hand to the purchaser the license for such vehicle, for the purpose of transfer to the purchaser.

AGREEMENT No. 1 of 1942.

(Reg. 6/1/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this eighth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, between the Coastal Dock, Rivers, and Harbour Works Union of Workers, Western Australia (hereinafter called "the union"), of the one part, and the Adelaide Steamship Company, Limited; Melbourne Steamship Company, Limited; McIlwraith, McEaehern, Limited; Petterson and Company, and The Swan River Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part.

The parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the coastline of the State from a point 20 miles north of Geraldton to a point 20 miles east of Albany and for a distance of 20 miles inland therefrom.

2.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the employment of casual workers only and not to the employment of permanent hands doing maintenance work.

N.B.—A casual worker is one for whom work over a period of 12 consecutive working days, not including holidays, is not provided by the employer.

3.—Working Hours.

The ordinary working hours shall be:—Mondays to Fridays (inclusive), 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Saturdays, 8 a.m. to 12 noon.

4.—Meal Hours.

Breakfast—7 a.m. to 8 a.m.; dinner—12 noon to 1 p.m. (except during slipping or unshipping operations, when the time may be extended to any one hour between 12 noon and 2 p.m.); tea—5 p.m. to 6 p.m.; supper—12 midnight to 1 a.m.

5.—Rates of Pay.

Basic wage—£4 10s. 5d. per week of 44 hours; margin—£2 1s. 7d. per week of 44 hours.

(a) Cleaning, chipping, scraping, cementing, applying asbestos, canvassing steampipes, coating with paint, tar, oils, compositions, limewash, cement wash, slip eradle men, men assisting shipwright on slipway, men working with hot tar, tar tank attendant, spraying or spreading hot tar—3s. per hour.

(b) Cleaning, chipping, scraping, cementing, applying asbestos, canvassing steampipes, coating with paint, tar, oils, compositions, limewash, cement wash, and boiler scaling in or about confined places, as defined in clause 11—2d. per hour extra.

(c) Men who are employed for scrubbing and cleaning, to have preference for painting.

(d) Rigging, fitting, making, dismantling, and repairing all standing rigging and running gear, and all palm and needle work incidental thereto, stepping and unstepping masts and crossing of yards, shipping and unshipping booms and derricks on all vessels, overhauling, making, fitting, repairing, and dismantling all wires and ropes on all vessels, lacing defence boom nets, rigging, fitting, repairing and dismantling all wires and ropes required for naval and merchant service work,

making and repairing all nets, puddings, fenders, mats and grumnets, making wire or rope ladders, bending sails, overhauling boat's gear and all ship's gear, rigging, fitting and repairing all wire or rope for any other purpose not included herein, leather work on davits—3s. 2d. per hour. (All work usually done by waterside workers on cargo gears or stages excluded.)

(e) Heat money—if the temperature is raised by artificial means and exceeds 120 degrees Fahrenheit—3d. per hour extra.

(f) Brushing down of back ends oil fuel fired Boilers—4d. per hour extra.

(g) Working in oil tanks, having been immediately previously used that purpose—4d. per hour extra.

(h) Gangers and leading hands—1s. per day, in addition to the foregoing rates.

(i) Shifting ship—When men are employed to shift a vessel to or from a slip and employed for that job only, they shall be paid a minimum rate of three (3) hours; but if men are taken off a job to shift a vessel they shall be paid at the rate of 3s. per hour for the ordinary hours and overtime rates for overtime hours.

(j) Wages to be paid according to the scale for time in respect of which they are payable, and any part of half an hour to be paid for as half an hour.

6.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of or outside the usual hours of labour or meal hours and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half up till midnight and double time from midnight to 7 a.m.

(b) For all work performed during meal hours, double ordinary basic time shall be paid and shall continue until the employee is discharged or has been allowed a full hour of leisure for a meal, except where the work commences at or during a meal hour.

7.—Sundays and Holidays.

For all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation of Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Picnic Day (if held on a day to be mutually arranged), double ordinary basic time rates shall be paid.

8.—Minimum Period of Engagement.

All men engaged for work shall receive a minimum of three hours employment or be paid for that time at the ordinary basic time rates, if not turned to work, except as provided for in clause 9.

9.—Waiting Time.

Waiting time (between 5 p.m. and 8 a.m.) to be paid for at ordinary basic time rates from the time the men are ordered for until actual commencement of work. Provided that if through any unforeseen circumstances it is found necessary to cancel the arrangements, three hours' waiting time, at ordinary basic time rates, shall be paid for attendance.

10.—Travelling Time.

All men who are engaged to work anywhere away from the place of engagement shall be paid for all travelling time at the rate fixed for the class of work they are engaged at. All fares shall be paid by employers, if men sent to work anywhere away from the place of engagement.

11.—Confined Places.

Confined places shall mean:—Ballast tanks, fresh water, and other tanks, airtight compartments, refrigerating chambers (when under power), bunkers, boilers, under boilers, and between boiler and the ship's side, tunnels (except workshops), bilges, chain lockers, peaks, and caissons.

12.—Wet Work.

(a) Any worker working in water or "wet places" shall be paid an extra allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day or part of day.

(b) "Wet places" shall mean places where in performance of the work the splashing of water and mud saturates the worker's clothing, or where protection is not provided to prevent splashings or drippings sufficient to saturate his clothing, and shall include wet material or wet ground in which it is impracticable for the workers wearing ordinary working boots to work without getting his feet wet: provided this clause shall not apply to men working on natural surfaces made wet by rain.

13.—Lighting and Ventilation.

The employer shall provide an efficient system of lighting and ventilation on all jobs, where necessary.

All manhole doors to be removed from tanks and boilers while men are working in them.

14.—Engagement of Labour.

The places at which men may be engaged for work shall be:—Fremantle—Adjacent to the present site of the Fremantle Harbour Works office; North Fremantle or Rocky Bay Slip—At the job.

Provided that, where practicable, the employer shall advise the secretary of the union on the day previous when men are required for work at the Rocky Bay Slip, together with the approximate number required.

15.—Wages.

(a) All wages shall be paid weekly and on board the vessel on which the work is performed, when practicable.

(b) Where a man is discharged on any day other than the usual pay day, he shall be paid his wages up to the time of his discharge and within four hours of the office of the employer being open for the usual transaction of business. Such pay shall be available during office hours of the day following (Thursdays excluded), and if not collected shall wait until the usual pay-time on Friday.

16.—Ships' Crews.

Bona fide members of the ship's crew, or other permanent employees, shall not be debarred from carrying out any duties in connection with cleaning, chipping, painting, or scraping of any vessel above light float line that they have hitherto been accustomed to perform.

17.—Discrimination.

The employers undertake not to discriminate in the selection of employees against members of the Coastal Dock, Rivers, and Harbour Works Union of Workers of Western Australia on the ground of such membership.

18.—Term.

The currency of this Agreement shall be two (2) years from the date hereof.
