WHEREAS it is enacted by section 116 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the expression "Public holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 26th day of January, 1942, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

Darling Range Road Board.

By-laws Relating to Excavations.

P.W. 2043/23.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1939, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Darling Range Road Board, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid of the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of any other authority enabling it in that behalf doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. No person shall, within the limits of the Darling Range Road Board District, on land other than Crown land—

- (a) quarry for stone, gravel, or other material; or
- (b) carry on, for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, or other material, any operation whereby an excavation is created or enlarged,

without the license of the Board first had and obtained.

2. No quarrying, for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand, or other material shall be done or

created on, within 440 yards, measured at right angles on each side of any road set out in the Schedule hereto attached.

3. Any excavation made for quarrying of stone, gravel, sand, or other material shall be kept free of stagnant water.

4. Where quarrying is carried on for the purpose of recovering sand or other loose material, the excavation shall be securely fenced and the gateways locked, so as to permit only authorised persons to enter the enclosed excavation.

5. Licenses issued by the Board shall operate under the conditions set out in these by-laws, and any non-compliance therewith shall render any such license null and void.

6. These by-laws shall apply to all Townsites in the Road Board area and shall also apply to any future Townsites that may be gazetted or extensions thereof.

These by-laws shall also apply to the prescribed areas recorded in the Schedule immediately hereunder.

Welshpool road, Hale road, Hawtin road, Kalamunda road, Gooseberry Hill road, Belmont road, Canning road, Wheelwright road, Lesmurdie road, Pickering road, Mundaring road, Repatriation road, Forrest road, Glenisla road, Aldersyde road.

If any person shall, either by act or omission, contravene these by-laws, or, being the owner or occupier of property within the Darling Range Road Board District, shall knowingly permit any act or omission on any property owned or occupied by him in contravention of these by-laws, he shall be guilty of an offence under these by-laws, and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
