PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
GOV. GEN. } K.O.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and
JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (2) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the day on which all shops, except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops, shall close at one o'clock, shall be Saturday: Provided that the Governor may by Proclamation at any time, and from time to time on the petition (according to the form in the Sixth Schedule) of the majority of the keepers of such shops in any district or specified locality not within the district, substitute in that district or locality for Saturday any other week day, and may at any time, on the like petition, revoke any such substitution: And whereas in subsection (5) of the said section it is provided that it shall be lawful for shops to which the section applies to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week and that in the absence of a determination by the Governor as provided therein the day shall be Friday: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me in that behalf by subsections (2) and (5) of section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, do hereby repeal and revoke the Proclamations issued under the said section in respect of shops in the Corrigin Shop District and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th day of May, 1921, declaring Wednesday to be the day on which such shops should close at one o'clock and Saturday to be the day on which such shops should remain open until nine o'clock in the evening.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

(No. 21 of 1939.)

Between the Coastal Food Manufacturers and Wholesale Mixing and Packing Establishments Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Mills and Ware, Limited, and Hunts, Limited, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

Award.

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed by the employers following the vocations mentioned in clause 20 of this Award: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935: Provided further, that this Award shall be limited in its application to establishments which are engaged in biscuit, cake, and sponge manufacturing for resale by another business and icing sugar crushing for use by the employer and/or for resale by another business.

2.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty (20) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

3.—Term.

This Award shall apply for a period of three (3) years from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty (1940), subject to the right of any party to amend same in pursuance of the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935.

4.—Contract of Service.

One (1) week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct.

5.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the union shall be permitted to interview the workers, during the recognised meal periods, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer more than once in any one week.

6.—Posting Award and Union Notices.

The shop steward shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Award or any notice of the union, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches, in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the union. Failing agreement in this connection the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award or the said notice shall be posted.

7.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked, at the option of the employer, in five (5) or five and a half (5½) days, between Monday and Saturday, inclusive.

(b) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.

8.—Shift Work.

(a) "Shift worker" shall mean a worker whose shifts rotate fortnightly.

(b) No worker under sixteen (16) years of age shall be employed as a shift worker.

(c) No female worker shall be employed on a shift which commences before 6 a.m. or on a shift which finishes after 11 p.m.

(d) The provisions of this clause and of subclause (f) of clause 20 shall operate during the period of the war and for three (3) months thereafter.

9.—Meal Money.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

10.—Working during Meal Hour.

If a worker is required to work during his usual meal period so that the commencement of such meal period is postponed for more than one (1) hour, such worker shall receive payment at double time rates until he or she gets a meal.

11.—Overtime.

(a) Except as provided in subclauses (d) and (e) of this clause, all work performed before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time, or beyond forty-four (44) hours in any one week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work performed on Saturday afternoon and Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) All work performed on any of the holidays specified in clause 12 hereof shall be paid for at ordinary rates, in addition to the weekly wage.

(d) Any adult worker, other than a shift worker, called upon to commence work between 12 o'clock midnight and 6 a.m. on operations which must necessarily commence between those times, shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate.

(e) Any junior worker, other than a shift worker, called upon to commence work between 12 o'clock midnight and 6 a.m. on operations which must necessarily commence between those times, shall be paid at the rate of 13 per cent. in addition to the weekly rate prescribed in clause 20.

12.—Holidays.

The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed and paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

13.—Annual Leave.

(a) A holiday of one (1) week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays, in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a worker dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

(b) Any worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall lose all rights under this clause.

14.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(b) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

15.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record containing the following particulars:—

- (a) The name of each worker.
- (b) The class of work performed.
- (c) The hours worked each day.
- (d) The wage (and overtime, if any) paid.
- (e) The ages of junior workers.

Such record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the union.

16.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (b) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (c) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

17.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

18.—Change and Mess Room.

A suitable change and mess room shall be provided in all establishments.

19.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate whilst so employed.

20.—Wages.

(f) Shift workers provided for in clause 8 hereof, other than when on day shift, shall be paid the sum of two shillings (2s.) for each shift in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein.

21.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (1) Name in full;
- (2) Age and date of birth;
- (3) Name of each previous employer and length of service with such employer;
- (4) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer, upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age in the above certificate he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

22.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

23.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

In witness whereof this Award has been signed by the President of the Court, and the Seal of the Court has been hereto affixed this 25th day of November, 1941.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 2 of 1942.)

(Reg. 15/1/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 6th day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two (1942), between the West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the union"), of the one part, and Dalgety & Company, Limited; Elder, Smith & Co., Limited; The Westralian Farmers, Limited; Goldsbrough, Mort and Company, Limited; and the W.A. Wool Merchants Association (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part: Witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

Wool Store Section.

1.—Definitions.

(1) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave his employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that—

- (a) a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one day;
- (b) where a casual hand is dismissed, the wages due to him shall be paid in cash on the termination of his employment, but where a casual hand is dismissed for cause, the wages due to him shall be paid not later than the next pay day;

(c) any worker who is taken on between the 1st March and the 31st August, inclusive, and who is not kept on for four (4) consecutive weeks, shall be regarded as a casual hand and shall be paid the casual rate prescribed herein.

(2) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side: Provided that:—

- (a) any worker who is taken on between the 1st September and the 28th February in the following year, inclusive, shall be regarded as a casual hand and paid the rate prescribed for a casual hand;
- (b) if a worker is engaged prior to the 1st September and his engagement is terminated by his employer on or before the 28th February in the following year, he shall be regarded as a casual hand and paid the rate prescribed for a casual hand from the 1st September;

(c) any worker who is in the employ of the employer prior to the 1st September and who is kept in his employment up to and including the 28th February in the following year, shall be regarded as a weekly hand and paid the rate prescribed for a weekly hand for any work performed prior to the 1st September and after the 28th February in the year following; (Such worker shall, however, receive five per cent. (5%) in addition to the prescribed rate for the period between the 1st September and the 28th February in the year following.)

(d) casual rates shall not be paid to any worker who, being in the employ of the employer prior to the 1st September is transferred from his employer's Wool Store to do work in his Hide and Skin Store, or *vice versa*, during the period between the 1st September and the 28th February in the year following inclusive, unless such worker's services are terminated by his employer on or before the 28th February, in which case the worker shall be paid the prescribed casual rate only for the time he has been employed in the Wool Store: Provided that, if the total time worked in the Wool Store and the Hide and Skin Store be less than four (4) consecutive weeks, the worker shall be paid the rate prescribed for a casual hand for the work performed in both stores.

(3) "Head classer" shall mean a worker in charge of other workers who classes wool for export or packs for appraisement auction sales or shipment and takes over country consignments.

(4) "Assistant classer" shall mean a worker who classes for export, auction sales, appraisements or shipments, which work shall not include the work usually performed by a piece picker as defined in subclause 6 of this clause.

(5) "Assistant storeman" shall mean a storeman in charge of a branch store separated from the main place of business, or a storeman who is working in a similar capacity in the main store under the man in charge of the Wool Store.

(6) "Piece picker" shall mean a worker—

- (a) separating the clean from the dirty;
- (b) separating the large and longer staple pieces and bellies from the short;
- (c) taking the rough and stains from cleaner pieces and separating for colour.

(7) "Leader of gang" shall mean a worker who is placed in supervision over other storemen, notwithstanding that he may himself be under the supervision of the head classer or man in charge. If he be so employed, he shall be paid one shilling (1s.) in addition to his ordinary wage for that day. When working overtime as leader of gang he shall be paid overtime rates as prescribed, plus threepence (3d.) per hour for being leader of gang.

2.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on Saturday.

3.—Meal Hours and Meal Money.

One (1) hour shall be allowed for each meal. Meal hours shall be as under:—12 noon to 1 p.m.; 5 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 12 midnight to 1 a.m.; 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.

If any worker is required to return to work after 6 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, or after 12 noon on Saturday, he shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money. A worker shall also be entitled to one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money, if he is required to work after 12 o'clock midnight.

Should a worker who has worked during the night up to breakfast time in the morning be required to continue working after 8 a.m., he shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money: Provided that such payment shall not be made in the case of a worker who starts work at 7 a.m.

Meal money shall be paid to the worker not later than 5 p.m. on the day that he is required to return to work overtime.

4.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(b) Overtime rates shall be:—

- (i) For work performed up to 10 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive—time and a half;
- (ii) For work performed after 10 p.m. and until the starting time next day, Monday to Friday, inclusive—double time;

(iii) For work performed during a meal hour, or on Saturday after 12 o'clock noon, or on Sunday, or on any of the holidays prescribed by this Agreement—double time.

5.—Smoke-ohs.

If any worker is required to work beyond 9 p.m. and/or 3 a.m., he shall be allowed an interval of fifteen (15) minutes for smoke-oh.

7.—Duties of Junior Weekly Hands.

If any junior weekly hand is called upon to do any work other than the following, namely:—Marking, branding, working lift, cleaning up, sweeping, sewing (other than sewing up), elementary classing, driving hoist, winch or stacking machine, or any light work ordered by the storeman, he shall be paid the minimum adult rate.

8.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

The number of junior workers shall not exceed the proportion of one (1) junior to every four (4) adult workers covered by this section of the Agreement.

9.—Engagement.

All labour required in the Wool Stores for the day shall be engaged between 7.30 a.m. and 8 a.m., but in the event of sufficient men not being available between these times, the employer shall have the right to engage

other labour which may report later in the day. Provided that workers shall be entitled to payment only as from the time at which they are told to report for work.

Hide and Skin Store Section.

10.—Definitions.

(1) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker who is engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave his employer's service at any moment without notice. Provided that—

(a) a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four (4) hours in any one day;

(b) where a casual hand is dismissed the wages due to him shall be paid in cash on the termination of his employment, but where a casual hand is dismissed for cause, the wages due to him shall be paid not later than the next pay day.

(2) "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker who is engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side: Provided that any worker who is employed for less than four (4) consecutive weeks shall be classed as a casual hand and paid the rates prescribed for a casual hand.

(3) "Head classer" shall mean a worker in charge of other workers and who classes skins and hides for export and packs for appraisement, auction sales, shipment, or takes over country consignments.

(4) "Assistant classer" shall mean a worker who assists in classing for export, packs for appraisement, auction sales, and takes over country consignments.

(5) "Head storeman" shall mean a worker in charge of other storemen and who also sorts skins and hides.

(6) "Assistant storeman" shall mean a worker who assists the head storeman or takes charge of a branch store.

(7) "Assistant storeman handling hides" shall mean a worker in charge of a hide store and/or hide floor.

(8) "Skin sorter" shall mean a worker who merely sorts skins for auction sales or sorts country consignments.

11.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday: Provided that the working days and starting and finishing times of workers employed at the abattoirs at Midland Junction or Fremantle shall be mutually arranged in writing between the employers and the union: Provided that the hours worked in each shift shall be continuous. Forty-four (44) hours shall also constitute a week's work at these abattoirs.

12.—Meal Hours and Meal Money.

One (1) hour shall be allowed for each meal. Meal hours shall be as under:—12 noon to 1 p.m.; 5 p.m. to 6 p.m.; 12 midnight to 1 a.m.; 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.

If any worker is required to work after 6 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive, or after 12 noon on Saturday, he shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money. A worker shall also be entitled to one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money if he is required to work after 12 o'clock midnight.

Should a worker who has worked during the night up to breakfast time in the morning be required to continue work after 8 a.m., he shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money: Provided that such payment shall not be made in the case of a worker who starts work at 7 a.m.

Meal money shall be paid to the worker not later than 5 p.m. on the day that he is required to return to work overtime.

13.—Overtime.

(a) Except as provided in clause 11, all time worked prior to the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(b) Overtime rates shall be:—

(i) For work performed up to 10 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive—time and a half;

(ii) For work performed after 10 p.m. and until the starting time next day, Monday to Friday, inclusive—double time;

(iii) For work performed during a meal hour, or on Saturday after 12 o'clock noon, or on Sunday, or on any of the holidays prescribed by this Agreement—double time.

(b) Junior Casual Hands:—Any junior worker employed for less than four (4) consecutive weeks shall be paid at the rate prescribed in sub-clause 2 (a) of this clause plus one penny half-penny ($1\frac{1}{2}$ d.) per hour.

15.—Duties of Junior Weekly Hands.

If any junior weekly hand is called upon to do any work other than the following, namely marking, branding, working lift or hoist, cleaning up, sweeping, sewing up, handling skins, elementary classing or sorting, or any light work ordered by the storeman or head classer, he shall be paid the minimum adult rate.

The minimum adult rate shall be paid to any junior worker who is required to handle hides or wet painted skins.

16.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

The number of junior workers shall not exceed the proportion of one (1) junior to every four (4) adult workers covered by this section of the Agreement.

17.—Changing Time.

The employer shall provide a suitable place and shall allow time for changing of clothes.

18.—Engagement.

All labour shall be employed as required by the employer.

19.—Smoke-Ohs.

If any worker is required to work beyond 9 p.m. and/or 3 a.m., he shall be allowed an interval of fifteen minutes for smoke-oh.

20.—Leggings and Aprons.

The employer shall provide leggings and/or aprons, if required.

General Clauses (applicable to both sections).

21.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the Post Office, Fremantle.

22.—Term.

The currency of this Agreement shall be for three (3) years from the date hereof: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve (12) months from such date, the Court may alter or amend same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

23.—Holidays.

The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be observed as holidays and, so far as weekly workers are concerned, paid for, namely—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

24.—Annual Leave.

Each weekly worker, after completion of each year's continuous employment as a weekly worker, shall be entitled to one (1) week's annual leave on full pay.

Provided that a weekly worker not completing a full year's service shall be granted pay in lieu of leave after the first month in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

25.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work for which a higher rate is prescribed in this Agreement than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

26.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing:—

- (a) the name of each worker to whom this Agreement applies;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the hours worked each day by him;
- (d) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him;
- (e) the ages of junior workers.

Such book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the union between the working hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

27.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage, as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

28.—Pay Day.

Wages shall be paid on any one of the first five (5) days of the week: Provided that, when overtime is worked on pay day, workers shall be paid in time to enable them to leave their work by 5 p.m.

29.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board of Reference.

The Board shall consist of a chairman and two representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There shall be assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
- (b) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (c) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

30.—Gong.

The employer shall provide a gong and all work shall start and finish with the gong.

31.—Travelling Time.

When a worker is required during his ordinary working hours to work outside his usual place of employment, or is transferred from one job to another, the employer shall provide the necessary means of transport or pay the worker any reasonable expenses incurred.

32.—Basic Wage Variations.

The hourly rates set out in clauses 6 (1) (b) and 14 (1) (b) are subject to adjustment in accordance with any variation of the basic wage which may be ordered by the Court from time to time.
