FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

Resolution—Municipality of the City of Fremantle.  
WHEREAS under the provisions of section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of the Act: And whereas a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws, with or without modification: And whereas Model By-laws, described as Series A, have been prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, the Municipality of the City of Fremantle, being a local authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted, with or without modification, the Model By-laws made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette*, with the exception of the amendment published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of July, 1941, doth hereby resolve and determine that the amendment of the said Model By-law published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of July, 1941, shall be adopted without modification.

#### THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Gnowangerup Local Health Authority—Resolution.  
P.H.D. 383/18.

WHEREAS by section 321 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as printed under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), it is enacted that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such Model By-laws: And whereas pursuant to the said section 321, the Governor caused to be prepared Model By-laws entitled "Model By-laws, Series A," which were published in the *Government Gazette*, and have since been amended from time to time in accordance with notices published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927; the 20th day of October, 1933; the 5th day of October, 1934; the 1st day of February, 1935; the 12th day of February, 1937; the 2nd day of July, 1937; the 22nd day of April, 1938; the 3rd day of March, 1939; the 29th day of September, 1939, and

the 18th day of July, 1941: And whereas by resolution made on the 9th day of October, 1935, and notified by publication in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of November, 1935, the Gnowangerup Road Board, being a local authority within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, adopted with certain modifications Series "A" of the Model By-laws prepared under the Health Act, 1911-1937: And whereas such by-laws, as adopted, have been added to and amended by resolution of the said local authority: Now, therefore, the Gnowangerup Road Board, as such local authority aforesaid doth hereby deem it desirable and expedient that the Model By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of February, 1935; the 12th day of February, 1937; the 2nd day of July, 1937; the 22nd day of April, 1938, and the 29th day of April, 1938, shall be and are hereby adopted as the by-laws of the said health authority for the said Gnowangerup Health District, and that the fees to be specified in Schedule "D" of Part IX. as the fees to be paid upon application for registration of Offensive Trades premises shall be as follows:—

Offensive Trades—10s. per annum; Food Vendor's License—5s. per annum.

## THE CEMETERIES ACT, 1897.

By-laws—Gnowangerup Public Cemetery.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

7880/08.

Perth, 26th February, 1942.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following by-laws for the control and management of the Gnowangerup Public Cemetery.

## GNOWANGERUP GENERAL CEMETERY.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Board of Gnowangerup General Cemetery, the said Board makes the following by-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Board as set forth in Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

2. Any person desiring to enter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained Schedule B.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Board in such time as to allow at least eight working hours' notice being given to the officer at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

4. The Board shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required.

5. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inserted in legible character thereon. No coffin not complying with this by-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

6. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave less in depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and certified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered or a Coroner's order for the burial is handed to the secretary, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representatives be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—Week days—from 8 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.; Sundays—from 2 p.m. to 5.30 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Board.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

11. If for any reason the funeral shall, on arrival at the entrance gates of the Cemetery remain there for more than 15 minutes prior to proceeding to the graveside, undertakers responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

12. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Board, from the time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

13. If application be made to the Board to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or of his family, an order from the Governor, authorising the

Board to permit of the exhumation, must be attached to the application form.

14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

16. No dogs shall be permitted into the cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, or flower, border, grave, or any erection or in any way infringing these by-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

18. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Board for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Board or their representatives.

19. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flowers growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

20. No person shall remove or carry out of or attempt to carry out of the cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, or flower without a written authority of the Board or their representative.

21. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without a written consent of the Board, and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

22. No person employed by or under the Board shall be permitted to accept gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the Board, and such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

23. Subject to the by-laws, and to the directions of the Board, the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

24. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Board, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in each case submitting plans and specification of the proposed work. Such applications shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to enter therein.

25. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Board may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "C" in the Schedule.

26. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Board may, if and when such work is done to their satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the form prescribed.

27. Every such grant shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Grant" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the consent of the Board.

28. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and any space surrounding such coffin to be filled in with charcoal, dry earth, or other suitable material, and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Board.

29. In the event of such an exemption being obtained from the Board, each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly lead-lined and hermetically sealed.

30a. If application be made for an "interment" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, in the Form of Schedule G, together with the "Grant of Right of Burial."

30b. Application for the transfer of a "Grant of Right of Burial," shall be made in the Form of Schedule D, accompanied by the "Grant" of such right.

31. Should the grantee be unable to produce the "Grant of Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be re-opened, for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, in the Form of Schedule E, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule A, before the interment takes place.

32. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to, any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Board and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23). Application for such consent shall be made in the Form of Schedule F.

33. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

34. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the superintendent or other officers appointed by the Board, and any material rejected shall immediately be removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall immediately be removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

35. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, the person shall be required to leave the work neat and in safe condition, to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

36. Monumental masons and any other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Board, the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the preceding by-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the superintendent.

37. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 in. broad, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

38. No catacomb shall be allowed.

39. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the Cemetery during other than hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days (Saturdays and Sundays excepted), when no work is to be done from noon Saturday to the opening gates on the Monday morning, without the written permission of the Board.

40. Subject to the approval of the Board, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from the date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Board to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

41. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

42. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the superintendent.

43. All workmen, whether employed by the Board or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the secretary or superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with the directions of the said secretary or superintendent, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

44. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Board in the Form contained in Schedule H; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of July.

45. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material, removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the superintendent.

(c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the superintendent.

(d) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

46. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Board an annual fee of £1 ls. and shall at the time of payment give his assent in writing to such conditions, as the Board may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit" to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

47. The Board may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantee to do so. If the grantees do not desire the Board to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Board for that purpose.

48. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Board, or those licensed by the Board, shall be permitted to decorate the grave.

49. If for the purpose of reopening a grave the Board find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc., from the graves, the person so ordering the reopening shall pay to the Board the charges laid down in Schedule A.

50. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.

51. Free ground may be granted, if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Board—

(a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries he received in the late war, and

(b) that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances: Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the conditions that only the remains of the deceased soldier shall be interred in the grave.

52. The Board may maintain the graves of the deceased soldiers, free of cost for a term of seven years.

53. Any person committing any breach of any of these by-laws and regulations or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Board, or superintendent, and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly.

54. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situations and number of grave, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial" shall be kept at the office.

The foregoing by-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Gnowangerup Road Board held on 17th October, 1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve the Regulations for the Examination and Registration of Licensed Surveyors under section 26 of the Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909-1940, as set out hereunder, such regulations to come into force as from the date of the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*.

LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1909-1940.

*Regulations for the Examination and Registration of Licensed Surveyors.*

Regulations heretofore approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council and in operation are hereby repealed and the following regulations are substituted therefor:—

Interpretations.

In the interpretation of these regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall have the meaning set against each respectively:—

“The Act”—The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909-1940, and such amendments thereto as may be enacted from time to time.

“Real Property Acts”—The Transfer of Land Act, 1893, and such amendments thereto as may be enacted from time to time.

“Board”—The Land Surveyors Licensing Board constituted under the Act.

“Reciprocating State”—Any State, Colony, or Dominion within His Majesty's Dominions with which reciprocal arrangements have been made by the Board for recognition of the status of surveyors.

“Reciprocating Board”—The duly constituted Board in a reciprocating State.

- “Registered Surveyor”—Any person who is a licensed surveyor under the Act and any person who is registered by a reciprocating Board as a licensed, qualified, registered, authorised or certificated surveyor.
- “Pupil”—A person who, under articles registered with the Board or with a reciprocating Board, is serving with a registered surveyor for the purpose of receiving instruction and experience in the principles and practice of surveying.
- “Articles”—An indenture or writing containing a contract, or an agreement for tuition in land surveying made between a registered surveyor and a person seeking to qualify himself for registration as a land surveyor.
- “Secretary”—The secretary appointed under the provisions of the Act.
- “University”—The University of Western Australia or a University recognised by such University.
- “Technical College”—The Perth Technical College or any public educational institution affiliated with it or recognised by it as being of equal status.
- “The examination”—The examination conducted by the Board of a person seeking to obtain a certificate of competency in surveying.
- “Register”—The Register of Licensed Surveyors directed by the Act to be kept.

#### Articles.

1. Subject to the exemptions set out in regulations 11 and 12 hereof, no person shall be admitted as a candidate for the whole or final portion of the examination unless he has attained the age of 20 years and has served under articles, registered with the Board, as a pupil with a licensed surveyor or surveyors for a period of not less than four years, not less than three of which must have been in service in the field.

2. (1) Each candidate for the whole or final portion of the examination shall produce evidence that during his professional service in the field he has had at least six months’ practice in rural surveying and also at least six months’ practice in urban surveying.

(2) When the Board considers that a candidate has not received sufficient training and gained sufficient experience in the profession of surveying, it may require that such candidate obtain such further training and experience as it deems necessary. Unless the Board so directs, such additional service need not be under Articles.

(3) Except as provided by regulation 11 (e) hereof, each candidate shall have had at least two years’ instruction and experience in land boundary definition.

3. All articles shall be drawn in a form satisfactory to the Board and the Board may, for sufficient cause, direct that articles be made explicit in any particular.

4. Before entering into Articles, a candidate for a certificate of competency in surveying must produce evidence that he has passed:—

- (a) a University matriculation examination; or
- (b) an examination accepted by a University as being equivalent to such matriculation examination; or
- (c) the Leaving Certificate examination conducted by a University or by the Department of Education of New South Wales; or
- (d) in five subjects of such Leaving Certificate Examination or corresponding examination, as the case may be.

Provided that the examination passed by the candidate shall include a pass in English, Algebra, Geometry, and Trigonometry.

5. (1) The Articles, duly completed and containing a statement of the date of commencement of the period of instruction, and such evidence as the Board may require that the pupil has attained the educational requirements in regulation 4 hereof, and accompanied by evidence of date of birth of the pupil, shall, within three months after the commencement of the term of the articles, be forwarded to the secretary by the licensed surveyor who is a party thereto. Similarly, notification of transfer of articles shall within three months after the date of execution of the transfer be forwarded to the secretary by the licensed surveyor to whom the articles are transferred.

(2) In all cases articles or notices of transfer of articles shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in the Second Appendix hereto.

(3) A pupil may serve under articles outside the State or Dominion of the Board by which he is registered: Provided that the necessary certificates are satisfactory and that the Board is satisfied with the experience gained by him.

6. (1) The Board shall refuse to register any Articles if in the opinion of the Board such Articles do not sufficiently provide for instruction and training of the pupil in the profession of surveying, or if the surveyor who is a party to the articles has another registered pupil with less than two and a half years’ service under Articles: Provided that in special cases the Board may register an additional pupil for a period not exceeding six months.

(2) This regulation to be subject to any adjustment found necessary by reason of the requirements of or regulations under the Public Service Act, 1904-1935.

7. In any special case arising, in the opinion of the Board, from inadvertence or accident, the Board may authorise registration of Articles or transfers forwarded after the expiration of the period prescribed in regulation 5 hereof.

8. The Board may annul the registration of any Articles if in its opinion such registration has been obtained consequent on any misrepresentation of fact.

9. During the currency of his Articles the Board may require any pupil to produce such evidence as it deems necessary that he is receiving instruction and gaining experience satisfactory to the Board in all branches of the profession of surveying.

10. Subject to the direction of the Board, the secretary shall, as soon as possible after the receipt of any Articles or any notice of transfer thereof, record the same in the Register of Pupils kept in accordance with regulation 32 hereof, and may retain any Articles or transfers or authenticated copies thereof with the records of the Board.

## Exemption from Service under Articles.

11. (1) If a pupil produces documentary evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that he possesses the qualifications or experience detailed hereunder, he may, subject to regulation 2 hereof, be granted exemption to the extent and in the circumstances following:—

- (a) An experience of not less than 12 months in the field under the supervision of a Civil Engineer approved by the Board—An exemption of six months' professional service in the field.
- (b) A certificate or diploma in surveying granted after an examination of a standard approved by the Board or by the reciprocating Board of the State where the examination is held, and at which a person appointed or approved by the Board or by such reciprocating Board is a coexaminer—An exemption of nine months' office experience.
- (c) A certificate by a University upon passing an examination consequent upon completing a special course of surveying within the University—An exemption of nine months' office experience.
- (d) A degree or diploma granted by a University upon passing an examination consequent upon completion of a course which, in the opinion of the Board, necessitates a sufficient instruction and training in the principles and practice of the profession of surveying—An exemption of twelve months' professional service in the field and twelve months' office experience.
- (e) A degree or diploma granted in accordance with paragraph (d) hereof by a University, where a representative of the Board, or of a reciprocating Board, acts as a coexaminer in those subjects relating to surveying—An exemption of eighteen months' professional service in the field and twelve months' office experience.

(2) For the purpose of this regulation "office experience" shall be deemed to mean service under Articles spent on office work of a nature appertaining to the practice of the profession of surveying.

Provided that:—

- (i) a candidate shall not be granted an exemption under subparagraph (d) or subparagraph (e) of paragraph (1) hereof, unless he serves the period of his apprenticeship under articles with a registered surveyor engaged primarily on land boundary surveys, and satisfies the provisions of regulation 16; and
- (ii) no person shall be granted an exemption under more than one of subparagraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of paragraph (1) of this regulation; and
- (iii) a candidate producing a University certificate showing that he has obtained a pass in the subjects prescribed for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th years in the Degree Course in Surveying at the University of Western Australia, will be granted exemption similar to that provided under subclause (d) or (e), as the case may be. This applies in the State of Western Australia only.

12. Any pupil who produces evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that he has enlisted or been called up for defence service shall, subject to the requirements of regulation 2 hereof, be granted concessions as follows:—

- (a) if for service abroad, credit for the period of such service up to a maximum of two years;
- (b) if for service at home—(i) for service on survey work to the approval of the Board—credit up to a maximum of two years; (ii) for service on non-survey work—credit for half the period of such service up to a maximum of two years;
- (c) if for service at home or abroad—an additional period for completion of his examination equal to the period of such service;
- (d) if for service abroad, after he has completed two years under registered articles—permission to present himself at any examination for any subject other than subjects 11 to 14, inclusive, prescribed in regulation 25 hereof.

13. The Board shall conduct examinations of candidates, for certificates of competency in surveying, in the month of March in every year and at such other times as the Board deems necessary.

14. Notice of the date fixed for the commencement of the examination shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least fourteen days before the date fixed by the Board for the examination.

15. Each candidate shall forward an application in writing for permission to present himself for the examination, to the secretary so as to reach him not less than ten days before the date notified for the commencement of the examination. His application shall be accompanied by a certificate or certificates of professional service, and such certificates of professional service in the Form No. 1 in the First Appendix hereto shall be furnished by each surveyor under whose supervision the pupil has served under Articles. There shall be attached thereto detailed statements of the classes of professional work in which the pupil has been engaged during the period of the Articles. Such certificate or certificates must cover the periods prescribed in regulations 1 and 2, if the candidate is taking the whole examination, or the period prescribed by regulation 26, if he is taking less than the whole examination, subject in either case to any reduction to which he may be entitled under regulations 11 and 12. Two recent testimonials of character from approved persons shall also be furnished by the candidate.

16. Each candidate shall furnish to the Board with his application to present himself for that part of the examination embracing subjects 11 to 14 prescribed in regulation 25, a certificate, in the Form No. 1 in the First Appendix to these regulations, signed by a registered surveyor to the effect that the candidate is in his opinion fully competent to effect surveys on his own responsibility. In the absence of such a certificate the candidate shall not be permitted to proceed to the examination.

17. The examination fee prescribed in the Second Appendix hereto must be paid to the secretary before the date of commencement of the examination.

18. A candidate shall be allowed to sit for examination in a State other than that in which he is registered and has served under Articles: Provided that the Boards in both States are satisfied as to the character and length of service under Articles, and provided he submits himself to all written papers and the usual practical test and *viva voce* as to the practice in the State in which he desires to sit.

19. The Board may, for sufficient cause, permit a candidate to withdraw his application to present himself for examination and may direct the refund of the whole or part of any fee paid by the candidate.

20. Where the Board declines to permit a pupil to present himself for examination, the Board shall direct the refund of any fees paid by him.

21. Each candidate shall provide himself with a nautical almanac for the year in which he presents himself for examination, a book of mathematical tables approved by the Board (Shortreides, Bagays, Vega and Chambers tables are allowed), a set of standard scales, a parallel ruler (15 in. preferred), a planimeter, a protractor, and other necessary appliances for plan drawing, other than paper. The use of traverse tables will be permitted, but the use of calculating machines, other than slide rules, will not be allowed.

22. The Board shall determine the place or places at which the examination is to be conducted and shall appoint a supervisor to conduct the examination. Any member of the Board or the supervisor shall have the right, during the currency of the examination, to require the production for inspection of any book of tables or papers used by a candidate, and for sufficient cause may refuse to permit a candidate to use any book at the examination.

23. The Board may refuse a candidate the right to continue with the examination if in the opinion of the Board his conduct during the progress of the examination is deemed to be inconsistent with generally accepted ethical standards.

24. The secretary shall allot each candidate a distinguishing number, and each candidate shall place this number on each page of all workings or plans or papers submitted by him, and shall not otherwise reveal his identity on such workings or plans or papers.

25. Subjects of Examination—The examination shall embrace the following subjects:—

#### *A—Written Section.*

##### (1) Physics, Geology, and Forestry—

Physics.—The subject generally, as contained in any good elementary text-book, with a more detailed knowledge of the laws underlying the construction and use of surveying instruments, e.g., the pressure of liquids and gases as affecting the barometer, thermometer, and level. The allowance to be made for the effects of heat in the practical work of the surveyor. The reflection and refraction of light, lenses, mirrors, etc. Terrestrial magnetism and variation of the compass.

Geology.—The subject generally as contained in any good elementary text-book, with special reference to the classification of areas of land, according to their formation, rocks, soils, etc., and their adaptability for industrial purposes (specimen of rock may be submitted for classification and description).

Forestry.—The distribution of native timbers; their economic values; the influence of forestry on climate, water supplies, and soil erosion; the principles of afforestation; the measurement of logs and sawn timbers; destructive agents and pests.

##### (2) Plotting and Plan Drawing—

The plotting and drawing of plans from field notes and official data of surveys for titles; the plotting of sections and contours; the determination of areas by mechanical means; the technical description of boundaries; the enlargement and reduction of plans; lettering on maps and plans; and use of conventional signs.

##### (3) Computations A—

Problems regarding standardisation of steel tapes, determination of working tension, sag and temperature corrections. Reduction of traverses and co-ordinates. Calculation of areas by double longitude and offset areas. Calculations in connection with areas and dimensions of figures having rectilinear or curved boundaries. Calculations in connection with setting out of circular and parabolic curves. Mensuration of surfaces and solids. All classes of road secants.

##### (4) Computations B—

Computations connected with triangulation surveys. Three point and similar problems. Calculations of heights and distances. Calculations in connection with mine surveying. Adjustment of discrepancies in surveys. Problems connected with setting out of areas, etc. Simple adjustment of figures.

#### *Elementary Problems in Aerial Surveying.*

##### (5) Engineering Surveying—

Method of determination of mean tidal levels on the coast; barometric measurement of heights; levelling, contouring, stadia surveying, tachemetry and preparation of relevant plans and sections. Location, grading and setting out of roads, railways, irrigation works, drainage and water supply channels; setting out of banks, cuttings, and other earthworks, setting out vertical curves (parabolic and circular) at change of grades, calculation of quantities and volumes. Gauging of streams, rivers and other waterways, and the use of current meters for determining velocity of current and discharge of rivers; elementary theory of hydraulics; hydraulic terms and constants; the use of pipe, channel, and mean flow velocity formulae. Calculation of run-off and flood discharge. Determination of waterways for bridges and culverts. Simple problems relating to irrigation, reclamation and land drainage. Harbour and river surveys. Hydrographic Surveying.



## (6) Town Planning—

The elementary principles of regional planning and of town planning; zoning; communications and transport, the design and allocation of open spaces and recreation areas; by-laws; public services; amenities; preparation of civic survey and scheme plans inclusive of details of town design.

## (7) Laws and Regulations affecting surveys—

The Acts and Regulations relating to—

- (a) Surveys of land for purposes of title; the subdivision of land; opening and closing roads and rights-of-way; the taking of land for special purposes.
- (b) Surveys of mines, both surface and underground.
- (c) Identification surveys.

## (8) Astronomy—

Astronomy, spherical trigonometry, azimuth, altitude, hour angle, right ascension, declination and the relations between them; use of the nautical almanac; time; corrections to star or sun observations, effect of errors of adjustment of instruments; determination of latitude, longitude, azimuth and time.

Geodesy.—The figure of the earth; reduction of length to sea level, correction for curvature and refraction, trigonometric height of stations, spherical excess; computation of geodetic positions, formulae for difference of latitude, longitude, reverse azimuth and convergence of meridians; laying down parallels of latitude.

Elementary theory of projection of maps and charts.

Special formulae in geodesy and mapping will be given.

## (9) Land Surveying Design—

The design of areas, not included in the planning of towns, such as suburban, industrial or country lands, subdivisions, access, reservations for public needs and amenities. Generally the application of planning principles to design for subdivisions.

## (10) Preparation of Field Notes—

The taking and recording of observations and notes in the field for the purpose of preparing plans for title surveys, underground, engineering, topographical, trigonometrical and standard traverse surveys.

## (10A) Principles of Land Valuation and Land Classification—

A general knowledge of the following will be required:—

Classification of soils according to productivity and stock-carrying capacity in the agricultural areas in Western Australia.

Cost of development of various types of country and methods of valuing all improvements on properties in those areas.

Methods of valuing the interests of lessors and lessees in land.

Valuation of residential buildings, roads, drains, clearing and earthworks in subdivisions of suburban areas.

Influence of existing laws on values of land and methods of estimating compensation for land resumed by the Commonwealth or State Governments.

*B—Oral and Practical Section.*

## (11) Field Practice—

The practice of surveying generally, in association with a knowledge of the Acts and regulations bearing thereon, together with a practical field test in surveying in the field involving measurement of a line or lines, reading of horizontal and vertical angles, re-establishment of a corner, and such further practical work as the Board may require.

## (12) Adjustment and use of Instruments—

The principles of construction and practical tests in the adjustment and use of all instruments required in modern field practice and office work.

## (13) Practical Field Astronomy—

Field Astronomy, practical determination of not less than two of the following: azimuth, time and latitude.

## (14) Practical levelling of a section of at least 20 chains in length.

*Order of Subjects.*

26. Any pupil who has completed to the satisfaction of the Board not less than the term of his Articles specified below, less any reduction granted under regulations 11 and 12 hereof, but with any additional service required under regulation 2 hereof added, may be permitted to sit for one or more of the subjects set alongside, numbered as in regulation 25 hereof:—

Term of Service—One year: Subjects 1 to 3.

Term of Service—Two years: Subjects 1 to 6.

Term of Service—Three years: Subjects 1 to 10.

Term of Service—Four years: Subjects 1 to 14.

Provided that, before being permitted to sit for any of the subjects numbered 11, 12, 13, 14, a candidate shall have—

(a) submitted to the Board satisfactory field notes and plans drawn therefrom—

- (i) of the survey of a country area of not less than 80 acres, at least one of the boundaries to coincide with and to be reinstated from previous surveys, and one of the remaining boundaries to be a watercourse or other natural feature, or an irregular road, together with essential calculations relevant thereto; and
- (ii) of the survey of a town lot with buildings on or near the boundaries, together with the technical description thereof as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Acts; and

- (iii) of a proposed road, railway, or drainage work, not less than ten chains in length, and with the requisite longitudinal and cross sections thereof.

Each plan shall bear the following certificate:—

"I hereby certify that this survey was made by me personally between the.....day of..... 19...., and the.....day of.....19...., and that this plan and the accompanying field notes are entirely my own work."

(Signed)

- (b) given to the Board such additional information with regard to professional service, field notes, and plans, as it may require;
- (c) received credit for a pass in all the subjects numbered 1 to 10 inclusive.

#### Examination Credits.

27. (a) In order to pass in any subject a candidate must obtain not less than 60 per centum of the marks in that subject.

(b) In the case of the subject—physics, geology and forestry, a candidate must obtain a pass in each of the three parts of this subject: Provided that a candidate who submits a certificate or diploma, satisfactory to the Board, from a University or from a Technical College recognised by a University, in respect of one or more of the separate parts of this subject, or a leaving certificate which includes one or more of the separate parts in this subject, shall be credited with a pass in that part or those parts, and shall be exempt from further examination therein.

(c) Any candidate who submits a degree or diploma granted by a University, and, after an examination, upon completion of a course which, in the opinion of the Board, necessitates sufficient training in the principles and practice of the profession of surveying, and in connection with which a representative of the Board or of a reciprocating Board was a co-examiner in the subjects relating to surveying, shall, without further examination therein, receive credit for a pass in such of the following subjects in which he passed the examination for the purpose of obtaining the aforesaid degree or diploma:—Physics, geology and forestry; plotting and plan drawing; computations A; computations B; engineering surveying; town planning; astronomy and geodesy.

(d) (i) Any candidate who passes in any subject shall be credited with a pass in that subject until five years after the completion of his Articles, or if he has passed in no subject during the period of his Articles, until five years after the first examination for which he sat after the completion of his Articles.

(ii) Unless he has passed in all subjects before the completion of the five years so specified, he shall lose all credits: Provided that any candidate who has passed in the subjects 1 to 10A, inclusive, within that period, shall not be required to again sit for examination in those subjects. He may enter for examination again but shall be required to pass in all the subjects within five years after the first date on which he again sits.

(iii) If the marks by a candidate at the examination indicate that the candidate has passed the examination with special merit and that he is possessed of special ability, the Board may declare him to have passed the examination with credit.

#### Certificates of Competency and of Registration.

28. (1) Each candidate who has been credited with a pass in all the subjects numbered 1 to 14, inclusive, shall be entitled to a Certificate of Competency in surveying in the Form No. 2 in the First Appendix hereto, and if he has attained the age of twenty-one years shall, upon payment of the prescribed fees as set out in the Second Appendix hereto, and upon making a statutory declaration in the Form No. 5 in the said First Appendix hereto, be entitled to be registered as a Licensed Surveyor in accordance with the provisions of the Act, and to a Certificate of Registration in the Form No. 3 in the said First Appendix.

(2) Every Certificate of Competency in Surveying and every Certificate of Registration as a Licensed Surveyor shall be signed by not less than two members of the Board and countersigned by the secretary.

#### Letter of Recommendation.

29. Upon application in writing, and either without further examination, or after such oral examination as the Board may deem necessary, the Board may grant a Letter of Recommendation, in the Form No. 4 in the First Appendix hereto, to any person to whom a Certificate of Competency in Surveying has been issued or to any person, who, being registered or qualified to be registered as a licensed surveyor in accordance with the provisions of the Act, desires to become licensed or registered or authorised as a surveyor in any reciprocating State. An application for a Letter of Recommendation must be accompanied by the prescribed fee, as set out in the Second Appendix hereto.

#### Registration upon Qualifications obtained in a Reciprocating State.

30. (1) A person who applies to the Board for a license without examination, on qualifications obtained in reciprocating State, shall submit:—

- (a) evidence that he holds a Certificate of Competency or a License issued by a reciprocating Board; and
- (b) evidence as to identity and character; and
- (c) a Letter of Recommendation, dated not more than twelve months previously, from the reciprocating Board which granted his Certificate of Competency or with which he was last registered.

(2) Subject to compliance with the foregoing provisions, after making the statutory declaration in the Form No. 5 in the First Appendix hereto, and after payment of the fee prescribed in the Second Appendix hereto, he shall be entitled to be registered as a licensed surveyor in the State of Western Australia.

(3) If the applicant, for any reason, is unable to produce a letter of recommendation as above, he shall pass such examination under these regulations as the Board may require.

Registration upon Qualifications obtained elsewhere than in a Reciprocating State.

31. (1) A land surveyor who applies to the Board to be registered on qualifications obtained in any other country, being part of the British Commonwealth of Nations, prepared to reciprocate in this particular with the reciprocating States, shall submit:—

- (a) his credentials or qualification as a land surveyor;
- (b) evidence that such qualification is still in force;
- (c) evidence as to identity and character;
- (d) evidence that he has completed not less than six months' professional service in the field with a practising registered surveyor in one of the reciprocating States; and
- (e) a certificate of professional service generally in or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the First Appendix hereto from that surveyor that the applicant is competent to effect surveys on his own responsibility.

(2) If the Board is satisfied with the evidence submitted and that the qualifications covered by the credentials are equivalent to those prescribed under these regulations, he shall pass such further examination as the Board may require, and after making the statutory declaration in the Form No. 5 in the First Appendix hereto, and after payment of the fee prescribed in the Second Appendix hereto, shall be entitled to be registered as a licensed surveyor.

#### Register to be Kept.

32. The secretary shall keep a register of—

- (a) the names and addresses of all articulated pupils who have complied with the requirements herein set forth, together with the names of the surveyors with whom they are articulated, and a complete record of all transfers of such articles;
- (b) the names, addresses, and qualifications of all persons to whom Certificates of Competency in Surveying have been issued, together with the dates of issue thereof;
- (c) the names and addresses of all persons registered by the Land Surveyors Licensing Board, together with the dates of issue of their Certificates of Competency in Surveying, and, where necessary, records of their careers as surveyors;
- (d) all letters of recommendation, with dates of issue thereof;
- (e) all charges that may be laid before the Board against any surveyor, together with the finding of the Board relative thereto.

#### Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by adding thereto after regulation 35 a new regulation as follows:—

#### Grading and Branding of Carcases.

36. (1) All lambs and hoggets slaughtered at the State Abattoirs shall be branded as such by an inspector at such abattoirs in ink or stain in letters not less than one-half inch in height, applied on the outer side of the carcase in a continuous series of words in two columns from neck to rump.

(2) The carcases of lambs shall be identified by having their temporary teeth intact.

(3) The carcases of hoggets shall be identified by the two central permanent incisors showing.

(4) The heads of lambs or hoggets must not be severed from the carcases until after the brand has been applied.
