WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared near Peak Hill: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of 10 acres, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

Erivilla (near Peak Hill), No. 22309 (Natives):— Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 15 chains west and 5 chains north from the Government Well on Reserve 6398 and extending west 10 chains, south 10 chains, east 10 chains, and thence north 10 chains to the starting point. (10 acres.)

WHEREAS by the Native Administration Act, 1905-1941, it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Jaurdi (near Calooli): Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of about fifty acres, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

Jaurdi (near Calooli), No. 22281 (Natives):— Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the west boundary of Reserve 10112 with the southern side of the surveyed road along the southern side of the Eastern Railway and extending south about 27 chains, west 20 chains, and north about 23 chains to southern side of road aforesaid; thence along same eastward to the starting point (about 50 acres).

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 3 of the Marketing of Eggs Act, 1938-1939, that the Governor may, whenever requested so to do by a petition signed by not less than fifty producers carrying on the business of producing eggs, issue a Proclamation fixing the day for the taking of a poll of the producers so carrying on business in Western Australia on the question whether a Board shall be constituted: And whereas I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, have, by a petition signed by not less than fifty producers carrying on the business of producing eggs, in accordance with the said section, been requested to fix the day for the taking of a poll of the producers so carrying on business in Western Australia on the question whether a Board shall be constituted: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby fix the 21st day of April, 1942, for the taking of a poll of the producers carrying on the business of producing eggs in Western Australia on the question whether a Board shall be constituted under and for the purposes of the Marketing of Eggs Act, 1938-1939.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 6th day of March, 1942, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section: And whereas the Bank of New South Wales, of St. George's terrace, Perth, in the State of Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the said Act, and having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act, has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employer it has established a fund for insurance against its liability aforesaid and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond of five thousand pounds, given by the said Bank, charged with all payments to become due and payable by the said Bank under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said Bank of New South Wales as such employer aforesaid from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of one year computed from and including the 31st day of March, 1942.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order, pursuant to section 20 of the abovementioned Act, amending the Second Schedule to the Act (Conditions relating to the receipt, handling, transport, and delivery of wheat) by inserting a further paragraph (g) at the end of Condition No. 2 in that Schedule:—

(g) Provided that, in respect of wheat coming within the description of Grade Western Australia No. 2 prescribed for the 1941-1942 wheat season, the following shall be the scale of dockages. Such dockages shall be made from the ruling price from time to time for the particular wheat:—

58 lbs. and over but less than 59 lbs.	Nil.
57 lbs. and over but less than 58 lbs.	1d.
56 lbs. and over but less than 57 lbs.	2d.

Dockages for barley, oats, drake, foreign grain, and hardball smut shall be on the same basis as in the preceding paragraph (c).

Provided that, whenever a lower maximum rate of speed is fixed under the authority of this regulation, the same shall not apply unless and until the fixing of such lower maximum rate of speed has been notified in the *Government Gazette*, and the Commissioner has installed and maintains at each end of the road or part of a road or of the bridge, causeway or viaduct in relation to which such lower maximum rate of speed is fixed and in a conspicuous place a sign or notice containing legible characters stating the lower maximum rate of speed which has been fixed as aforesaid.

- (a) a full description of the kind and number of the plants in respect of which the permit is required;
- (b) the place from which the plants are intended to be taken;
- (c) the place or places to which the plants are proposed to be taken;
- (d) the place at which the plants can be examined.

(b) by inserting after paragraph (2) a new paragraph as follows:—

(2a) The permit applied for and granted under paragraph (1) may be either—

- (i) a particular permit in respect of one particular consignment of plants only; or
- (ii) a general permit in respect of all consignments of plants which may be removed during the currency of such general permit, which shall remain in force for a period of twelve months from the date of the issue of the same, unless the permit is sooner cancelled, and which may be cancelled at any time within the said period of twelve months for any reason by the Under Secretary for Agriculture or other officer aforesaid by notice in writing of such cancellation given or sent by post to the holder of the permit.

(c) by inserting in paragraph (3) of the said regulation, after the word "plants" in line 3 of the said paragraph, the words "or premises."

THE BULK HANDLING ACT, 1935.

PURSUANT to section 41 of the Bulk Handling Act, 1935, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council hereby amends regulations dealing with the receipt, handling, and delivery of a grade of wheat, to be styled "Grade Western Australia No. 2, 1941-1942 Wheat Season," and prescribes a standard for that grade as follows:—

Grade Western Australia No. 2, 1941-1942 Wheat Season.

1. The company may receive wheat of the 1941-1942 wheat season which complies with the standard hereinafter specified.
2. All such wheat shall be handled separately from and binned separately from other wheat received by the company.
3. The following shall be a description of the standard:—
 - (a) Subject to the conditions hereunder, it will include wheat which is below the limits of variation allowed for other prescribed grades.
 - (b) The wheat shall be dry, free from weevils or other insects and free from smutty, musty, or other commercially objectionable smell.
 - (c) The bushel weight of the grain as received by the company will be less than 59 lbs., with a limit of variation to 56 lbs.
4. The company shall issue a distinctive warrant for every parcel of wheat received of this grade so that the wheat can be clearly distinguished from other grades prescribed.
5. The form of warrant may be the same as that issued for Western Australian Standard White, except that it shall have a distinct statement at the head of the warrant that the warrant is issued in respect of Grade Western Australia No. 2 wheat, and shall be on a different coloured form from that used for the 1939-1940 and 1940-1941 wheat seasons for Western Australian Standard White.
6. The dockages shall be as prescribed in the Act.
7. The company shall be entitled to make a charge to cover the actual cost of any extra railage reasonably incurred by reason of the special nature of the wheat; for example, by reason of the light weight of the wheat trucks cannot be loaded to their full capacity in weight.
8. For extra services occasioned by this grade of wheat, the company shall be entitled to make an additional charge of ¼d. per bushel.

9. The company shall not be bound to accept wheat of this standard at any particular siding where there is not sufficient quantity of the wheat offering to justify the company economically in receiving the wheat:

Provided that any person aggrieved by reason of the refusal of the company to receive any wheat of this standard at any particular siding for reasons stated in this regulation may appeal within fourteen days after such refusal to the Minister, whose decision shall be final.

10. Delivery of wheat of this grade shall be made only at the port in the zone in which it was delivered, unless the grower has declared some other destination upon delivery of such wheat, or unless the company can conveniently arrange delivery at some other destination.

CIVIL DEFENCE (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACT, 1940.

Department of Mines,
Perth, Western Australia, 12th March, 1942.

THE Civil Defence Council, acting pursuant to regulation 67 of the Civil Defence Regulations 1941 (as amended), and for the purposes of regulation 66 of the said regulations relating to measures to be taken for the protection of the public from flying glass, hereby declares that in that portion of the city of Perth more particularly defined and described in the Schedule hereunder the measure which is approved by the Civil Defence Council for the protection of the public from flying glass is the following: The complete removal of all glass from windows, show windows, display cases and mirrors, doors, screens, partitions, and other structures where such glass is on the basement or ground floor storeys and is adjacent to or abutting on a street, right-of-way, arcade, or passage over or through which the public has a right of way or which is commonly used by the public or to which the public has access: Provided that, where in relation to any internal sector or building situated in that portion of the city of Perth aforesaid the controlling authority thereof has, prior to the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* adopted any measure, other than the measure abovementioned, for the protection of the public against flying glass which the officer or person appointed for the purpose by the Civil Defence Council is satisfied and so certifies is sufficient for the purpose of protecting the public from flying glass, such controlling authority shall not be required to adopt the measure hereby notified as approved by the Civil Defence Council while he or it continues to maintain the other measure previously adopted by such controlling authority as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

City of Perth.

The area bounded by lines starting at a point on the intersection of Pier street and Wellington street; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern side of Pier street to the southern side of St. George's terrace; thence in a westerly direction along said terrace to Barrack street; thence along the eastern side of said street to the Esplanade; thence along the south side of the Esplanade, diagonally across William street to the S.E. corner of Mount's Bay road; thence continuing westerly along south side said street to Spring street; thence in a north-westerly direction along the western side of Spring street across Mount street; thence in an easterly direction along Mount street diagonally across St. George's terrace and in a northerly direction along the western side of Milligan street across Wellington street; and thence in an easterly direction along the north side of Wellington street back to the starting point.
