WHEREAS by section 11 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in section 29 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 68/2058, as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph (b) of section 29 of the said Act, that is to say, for Government Requirements (Wheat Storage): Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 68/2058 (for the purpose aforesaid).

#### Schedule.

That portion of Roe Location 1666 (Conditional Purchase Lease 68/2058), containing about 1 acre 3 roods, bounded by lines starting from the westernmost corner of the said location and extending northward along its western boundary for a distance of about 250 links; thence eastward parallel to its south boundary for a distance of about 700 links; thence southward parallel to its west boundary about 250 links, and thence westward along its southern boundary to the starting point, subject to survey.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1337/37.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments: And whereas

it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Departments of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department) should be vested in W. L. Green, and that the power vested in H. C. Trigg should be revoked: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in W. L. Green, and any person appointed to act temporarily in his place, the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages; and doth hereby revoke the power placed in H. C. Trigg.

The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section: And whereas Whittaker Bros., Ltd., of Hay street, Subiaco, being an employer subject to the provisions of the said section 10 and having duly made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act for exemption from the operation of the said section 10 has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability aforesaid as an employer, and that it has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a fixed deposit receipt for five thousand pounds, given by the Union Bank of Australia, Ltd., of St. George's terrace, Perth, charged with all payments to become due by the said Company under its said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, doth hereby exempt Whittaker Bros., Ltd., of Hay street, Subiaco, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of twelve months commencing on the 12th day of March, 1942.

## HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

## Black Range District Hospital Board.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, the Governor may make regulations for the purpose of the Act and may thereby formulate Model By-laws for the guidance of Boards in respect of all or any of the matters regarding which Boards may make by-laws: And whereas the Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the said section, has formulated Model By-laws, as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under

the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940: And whereas a Board may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: Now, therefore, Black Range District Hospital Board, being a Board within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, doth hereby adopt for the whole of such Model By-laws as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940.

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Black Range Hospital on the 11th day of June, 1941, the following resolution was passed:—

Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits; and may, by by-laws, provide for the regulation and control of such Fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Black Range Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

#### Schedule.

By-laws for the Control of Medical Funds under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

1. The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

2. The subscription to be paid by the subscriber shall be 10s. 6d. per quarter or £2 2s. per annum, as the subscriber may elect.

3. The word "dependant" shall mean the wife, parents, and grand-parents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers, and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.

(b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant, he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

4. Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to medicines and dressings.

6. Subscribers employed by any mining company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment: Provided that the Mine Management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.

7. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—

- (a) Incurable diseases
- (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for a benevolent institution.
- (d) Venereal disease.
- (e) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (f) Dentistry.
- (g) Insanity.
- (h) Accouchements (abortive or otherwise).
- (i) Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (j) Sera and vaccines.
- (k) Pathological examination fees.

- (l) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.

8. The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised public hospital by subscribers or their dependants who are temporarily outside the district, and who suddenly become seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this, charged as fees by the other hospital, will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases.

A BY-LAW of the local authority in and for the Health District of Fremantle, made under section 167, subsection (4) of the Health Act, 1911 (now section 191, subsection (4) of the Health Act, 1911-1937) made and passed by the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle on the 17th day of July, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th September, 1911, is hereby amended as follows:—

Clause 4 of the by-law is repealed and in lieu thereof the following clause shall become part of the by-law:—

The fee for every such inspection shall be 4% of the value of such fish, calculated at the average wholesale price obtained for similar fish at the latest local public auction sale: Provided always, that in respect to any fish sold in the market no inspection fee shall be charged.

## BUSH FIRES ACT, 1937.

By-laws of the Upper Chapman Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Upper Chapman.

## Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws, shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the road district or for any specified area thereof; Provided that, unless the resolution of the Board establishing a Bush Fire Brigade specifies therein only a part of the district as the area for which such Brigade is established, the Brigade shall be deemed to be established for the whole of the said road district.

## Appointment of Officers.

2. The Board shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant, and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade, and who in the Board's opinion have the necessary qualifications and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

## Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire-fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by

the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all land owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or lands under pasture.

#### Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

(i) Owner or occupier of land within the Brigade Area—minimum subscription of .. .. .	10	0
(ii) Other persons—a minimum subscription of .. .. .	5	0

(3) Fire-fighting members shall be those persons, being able-bodied men over 18 years of age who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the First Schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Associate members shall be those persons who are willing to supply free motor transport for fire-fighters or equipment, or are prepared to render other approved assistance, and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Second Schedule to these by-laws.

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

#### Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in the purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

#### Meetings of Brigade.

9. Meetings of the Brigade shall be held in conjunction with ordinary meetings of the Road Board, that is to say, on the second Thursday of each month, and at such other times as may be considered necessary.

These by-laws under the Bush Fires Act, 1937, were passed by a resolution of the Upper Chapman Road Board (a local authority under the provisions of such Act) at a meeting held at Nanson on 11th January, 1940.

## ELECTRICITY ACT, 1937.

Department of Public Works,  
Perth, 6th April, 1942.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 25 of the Electricity Act, 1937, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of December, 1939, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

## Schedule.

The Electricity Act Regulations, 1939, are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 2 is amended by inserting after line 5 the following words and figures:—

PART VI.—OVERHEAD LINE WORKING SAFETY REGULATIONS (rr. 205-243).

2. A new Part is inserted after Part V., to stand as PART VI. and containing regulations 205 to 243, as follows:—

## PART VI.—OVERHEAD LINE WORKING SAFETY REGULATIONS.

205. Employers who employ persons to work on or about overhead lines and/or apparatus for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy shall provide such safety equipment, appliances, or materials, as may be required, to comply with the provisions of these regulations.

206. Employers shall take all practicable steps to ensure that all employees working on or assisting in work on electrical apparatus are instructed in the method of resuscitation from apparent death due to electric shock, and every such employee shall keep himself familiar with the method.

207. A first aid outfit shall be kept at each depot, attended substation, workshop and camp, and also on each motor truck attached to a party in the field.

208. It shall be the duty of every person working on electrical apparatus to use in a proper manner the safety equipment provided.

209. No employee shall use any safety equipment that is not in good condition. Employees shall notify the employer of all defects in safety equipment of which they become aware.

210. Employers shall issue all safety equipment in good order. Provision shall be made by the employer for the periodic inspection of all safety equipment and any such equipment found to be defective shall be withdrawn from service and suitable measures shall be taken to ensure that upon withdrawal such equipment shall not be returned to service whilst so defective.

211. Any person, before ascending a pole or structure or part thereof, which is subject to decay or deterioration, shall satisfy himself that there is no danger of the pole, structure, or part thereof, collapsing. If such a danger exists, the pole or structure shall be effectively secured before an ascent is made.

212. Either one-piece or extension ladders may be used for work on overhead lines. All ladders shall be made from first-class timber free from flaws and defects. All ladders that may be used against poles shall be provided with a pole-strap fixed to the top of the ladder.

213. Ladders with stiles reinforced longitudinally with wire or other metal reinforcement may be used, provided the reinforcement does not reach within four feet of either end of the ladder, but shall not, in themselves, be regarded as insulated ladders for the purpose of these regulations.

214. When in use the distance between the foot of the ladder and the pole or structure shall not exceed one quarter of the length of the ladder. Except in cases of emergency two ladders are not to be joined together when one ladder is of insufficient length, but when so used the ladders shall overlap at least one-fifth of the length of the longer and shall be securely lashed together.

215. The provisions of regulations 208, 209, and 210 shall apply to ladders.

216. Linesmen's safety belts shall be provided by the employer and shall be worn and used when engaged in work in elevated positions, except on guarded platforms, or where special circumstances pertaining to the work may render their use unnecessary or undesirable.

217. Before new apparatus or apparatus which has been out of service is made alive, it shall be the responsibility of every person in charge of works on that apparatus to satisfy himself personally that all persons under his charge are clear of and that all earthing equipment and other plant and material used by him have been removed from the apparatus.

218. Before carrying out or issuing instructions for the necessary switching, the authorised operator who is responsible for the switching shall satisfy himself by personal inspection, or, where this is not possible, by information obtained from persons in charge of works that the apparatus is clear, as set out in regulation 217.

219. No person shall work on or within a distance of 30 inches of exposed conductors of live apparatus unless accompanied by another person, except in cases of emergency, or cases covered by regulation 224.

Provided that this restriction shall not preclude the carrying out by an authorised person, when unattended, of normal operations (switching, fuse replacements, and the like), and investigations of apparatus performance for which it is essential that the apparatus be alive.

220. For the sole purpose of this Part of the regulations low voltage conductors are to be considered as those which in normal service are alive at a voltage of 650 volts or less between conductors, and high voltage conductors are those which in normal service are alive at a voltage of more than 650 volts between conductors.

221. Low voltage and high voltage apparatus means electrical equipment such as transformers, switchgear, machine lines, and feeders of which low voltage and high voltage conductors respectively form an integral part.

222. Where persons are working in positions where they are liable to make accidental contact with live low voltage conductors, they shall protect themselves against such accidental contact by means of the safety equipment provided by the employer for the purpose.

223. Work on live low voltage conductors and apparatus may be carried out by authorised persons: Provided that persons so working are suitably insulated from the live conductor being worked on or from earth.

224. Notwithstanding the requirements of regulation 219, work on live low voltage apparatus may be carried out by an authorised person without the presence of an assistant: Provided that the work is confined to such items as installation and testing of meters, running maintenance on machines, maintenance of control circuits and equipment, and the connection and disconnection of services, with the further provision that, in overhead line work, the person does not place himself between or above bare line conductors.

225. No person shall perform any switching on high voltage apparatus unless he has been specially authorised for this purpose. No work shall be performed on or near high voltage apparatus without the knowledge of the officer controlling that apparatus.

226. No person shall make personal contact, either directly or through any conducting object, with any high voltage conductor believed to be dead, unless the conductor has been effectively earthed and short-circuited, as provided for in regulations 235, 236, and 237, with the exception that personal contact with such high voltage conductors may be permitted if the contacting person uses an insulated platform in accordance with the requirements of these regulations.

227. High voltage apparatus, on which work other than live work permitted by these regulations is to be carried out, shall be isolated from all possible sources of supply by opening appropriate circuit breakers and/or switches, or removing appropriate fuses so that the apparatus then is not and cannot be made alive from the high or low voltage systems. Warning against reclosing the circuit breakers, switches, or fuses so opened shall be given by danger notices suitably displayed.

228. Access to such circuit breakers, switches, or fuses by unauthorised persons shall be prevented by means of suitable locks where practicable.

229. Subsequent to isolation and prior to commencement of the work, the apparatus must be proved dead, discharged, and earthed and short-circuited as provided for in regulations 231, 232, 233, 235, 236, and 237.

230. Before beginning work on dead equipment which is adjacent to live conductors in substations and similar locations, suitable barriers must first be erected to prevent accidental contact with those conductors.

231. High voltage apparatus which is to be earthed and short-circuited shall be proved by suitable methods to be dead and safe for earthing and short-circuiting.

232. In addition to the other requisite conditions, no rotating machine, nor the circuits connected thereto, are to be considered dead while the machine is revolving.

233. Before touching, for the purpose of fitting an "earth and short circuit," any part of the apparatus normally alive, but made dead for the purpose of working thereon, the apparatus shall be discharged by connecting the conductors or terminals to earth by means of the standard equipment provided by the employer for the purpose, taking care to ensure good contact between the earthing wire and the conductors or terminals of the apparatus to be discharged.

234. Where there may be danger of induced potentials, discharging by this method does not ensure that the conductors are safe to touch, and the "earth and short circuit" referred to in regulations 235, 236, and 237 must in such cases be attached to the conductors by means of an insulating medium, or the discharging equipment must be left in position while the "earth and short circuit" is fitted.

235. After apparatus has been proved dead and has been discharged, earthing and short-circuiting shall be carried out by the parts normally alive being connected together and to earth.

236. No other apparatus other than that specially provided by the employer shall be used.

237. Earthing and short-circuiting shall be effected at or within sight of the work, except that when the nature of the apparatus, work or soil renders this impossible, the earth connection shall be placed as near as possible to the work.



238. When a line to be worked on is divided or has to be divided, both sides of the division shall be earthed and short circuited.

239. All persons working on any high voltage apparatus which has been earthed and short-circuited who for any reason leave the site during the progress of the work on such apparatus shall, on return to the site, ensure that the apparatus is still earthed and short-circuited before recommencing work.

240. Certain work on or near the conductors of live high voltage apparatus may be performed by authorised persons, provided either—

- (a) the work is performed through the medium of special appliances provided for the purpose; or
- (b) the persons so working are supported on insulated platforms, towers, or ladders, the design and construction of which has been approved by the Electricity Advisory Committee.

Provided that in every such case the person using such special appliances or insulated platforms, towers, or ladders has been personally instructed in the precautions to be taken with each specific class of work.

241. Rubber gloves shall not be used for handling by direct contact conductors carrying high voltage.

242. The safety equipment specified in these regulations and which must be provided by employers shall include:—

Linesmen's belts, rubber gloves, first aid outfit, suitable earthing equipment, approved insulating equipment for working on live low voltage conductors, approved insulating platforms.

243. A copy of this Part of the regulations shall be supplied to each worker engaged on work covered by this Part of the regulations and each employee shall make himself familiar with the requirements of the said part.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 30 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, that in case at any time there is in any district no Board or not sufficient members to form a quorum the Governor may by Order in Council appoint some fit and proper person to be Commissioner of such district: And whereas, in the Broome Road District, there is at present no Board or not sufficient members to form a quorum of the Board by reason of the resignation of all the members thereof, and in consequence it is deemed desirable and expedient that a Commissioner of such district be appointed: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby appoint Andrew Ogilvie Ferguson, of Broome, Fisheries and Pearling Inspector, to be Commissioner of the Broome Road District until it is otherwise ordered.
