PROCLAMATION

Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-
[L.S.] } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939, enacts, *inter alia*, that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit, except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into any specified portion of the State from any other specified portion of the State, any specified plant, fruit, or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease in such first-mentioned specified portion of the State: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to prohibit, except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into any portion of the State outside an imaginary circle having a radius of five miles from the Perth Town Hall as the centre from any nursery, orchard, or other place situate within that portion of the State comprised within the circumference of the imaginary circle aforesaid, any plant of any kind whatsoever which has packed therewith or adhering thereto any soil as being in the opinion of me the said Lieutenant-Governor likely to introduce into the portion of the State outside the imaginary circle aforesaid the disease of Argentine Ant (*Iridomyrmex humilis Mayr*): Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do hereby prohibit, except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into any portion of the State situate outside an imaginary circle having a radius of five miles from the Perth Town Hall as the centre from any nursery, orchard, or other place situate within the circumference of such imaginary circle aforesaid, any plant of any kind whatsoever which has packed therewith or adhering thereto any soil as being in my opinion likely to introduce the disease of Argentine Ant (*Iridomyrmex humilis Mayr*) into portions of the State outside the imaginary circle aforesaid: And I declare that the prohibition hereby imposed shall continue in operation until this present Proclamation is cancelled or revoked by a subsequent Proclamation issued under section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1939.

REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia.

Road Boards (Postponement of Election) Order.

WHEREAS by regulation 51 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule, 1942, No. 172) it is provided that the Premier of a State, if satisfied that it is desirable so to do in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the more effectual prosecution of the war, may make provision for the postponement of any election of any City Municipal District or Shire Council, or of any other local governing body in the State: And whereas I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, am satisfied that it is desirable, in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the more effectual prosecution of the war, that the annual election of members of every road board constituted under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, which ordinarily would be held on the third Saturday in April, 1942, shall be postponed: Now, therefore I, the said John Collings Willcock, acting pursuant to the said regulation 51, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Boards (Postponement of Election) Order.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, of Western Australia—

- (a) The annual election of members of every road board constituted under the said Act which ordinarily would be held on the third Saturday in April, 1942, is hereby postponed for a period of twelve months from the said third Saturday in April, 1942, and it shall not be necessary to hold the said election on the said third Saturday in April, 1942—

Provided that—

- (i) this Order may be revoked at any time during the said period of twelve months by a subsequent order made under regulation 51 aforesaid, and
- (ii) any subsequent Order made as provided for in paragraph (i) of this proviso may fix any date within the said period for the holding of the annual election which by this Order is ordered to be postponed.
- (b) Consequentially upon the operation of paragraph (a) of this clause, the terms of office of the members of every road board which would but for this Order expire by effluxion of time on the third Saturday in April, 1942, shall be and are hereby extended after the said date for a period ending on the date of the completion of the postponed annual election, when such is held, and such members shall continue to be members of the road boards of which they are now members accordingly.

Provided that—

- (i) nothing in this paragraph shall operate so as to extend the term of office of any other members of any road board who are not due to retire on the third Saturday in April, 1942; and
- (ii) the members of every road board shall elect from their numbers a member to be chairman and a member to be vice-chairman of the road board at their first meeting held after the third Saturday in April, 1942, who shall hold office until the first meeting of the road board held after the completion of the annual election which by this Order is postponed.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of lands, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with, or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer but not beyond judgment.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Mundaring Road Board—Resolution.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that a local authority may by by-law define localities in the district within which the keeping of swine or pigsty is forbidden: And whereas the Mundaring Road Board, being a local health authority in respect of the Health District of Mundaring within the meaning and for the purposes of the Health Act, 1911-1937, deems it desirable and expedient to define the localities in the district within which the keeping of swine or pigsty is forbidden: And whereas the Mundaring Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, by a resolution published in the *Government Gazette* of 4th April, 1930, adopted, with certain amendments, Series "A" of the Model By-laws prepared pursuant to section 295 of the Health Act, 1911-1926, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and has amended such by-laws by resolution published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Mundaring Road Board, as such local health authority aforesaid, acting pursuant to section 185 of the Health Act, 1911-1937 (as reprinted under the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938), that the said by-laws be amended by inserting in section C of Part IX. thereof, after by-law 1, as contained in the said section C, a new by-law, to stand as by-law 1A as follows:—

Prohibited Area for Keeping of Swine or Pigsty.

1A. Subject as hereinafter provided, on and after the 1st day of April, 1942, no person shall keep any swine or pigsty in that locality of the district specified hereunder:—

All the land within a radius of 70 chains from junction of Axford avenue and Great Eastern highway, Bellevue;

All the land within a radius of 60 chains from junction of Amherst and Morrison roads, Swan View;

All the land within a radius of 60 chains from southern corner of Welbourne Park, Greenmount;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from north-east corner of Lot 232 (Log Cabin), Greenmount Hill;

All the land within a radius of 20 chains of Boya Railway Station, Boya;

All the land within a radius of 50 chains from the Post Office, Darlington;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from Glen Forrest Railway Station;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from junction of Margaret road and Great Eastern highway, Glen Forrest;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from south-east corner of Part Lot 12, Mahogany Creek;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from the junction of Owen and Byfield roads, Parker-ville;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from Road Board Office on Lot 246, Mundaring;

All the land within a radius of 50 chains from the Sawyers' Valley Railway Station;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from junction of Walker and Evans streets, Mt. Helena;

All the land within a radius of 40 chains from the Railway Crossing on Old Northam road, Chidlow;

All the land within a radius of 30 chains from the Forestry Office, Mundaring Weir;

All the land within a radius of 20 chains from the Kardo-Morda Railway Station, Mundaring Weir;

All the land within a radius of five chains of the Great Eastern highway from the west corner of Sawyers' Valley Townsite to west boundary of Mundaring Road Board district.

Provided that—

(i) this by-law shall not apply in the case of any person who keeps not more than one pig, and that for no purpose of trade but only for his own use; and

(ii) no such pig shall be kept unless a permit has first been issued by the local authority; and

(iii) for such permit no charge shall be made.

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Westonia Hospital.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, the Governor may make regulations for the purpose of the Act and may thereby formulate Model By-laws for the guidance of Boards in respect of all or any of the matters regarding which Boards may make by-laws: And whereas the Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the said section, has formulated Model By-laws, as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940: And whereas a Board may of its own motion, by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: Now, therefore, Westonia Hospital Board, being a Board within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, doth hereby adopt the whole of such Model By-laws as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940.

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Westonia Hospital held on the 10th day of March, 1942, the following resolution was passed:—

Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be

to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits; and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such Fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Westonia Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

By-laws for the Control of the Westonia Hospital Fund, under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

1. The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

2. The subscription to be paid by a subscriber shall be 2/- per week or £1 6s. per quarter, as the subscriber may elect.

3. The word "dependant" shall mean the wife, parents and grandparents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident for which treatment is required.

(b) If the Matron of the Westonia Hospital is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant she may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

4. Every subscriber shall be entitled to the following benefits:—

(a) Treatment free of charge in the Westonia District Hospital for any period not exceeding three months.

(b) Treatment free of charge as an out-patient between the hours of 10 a.m. and twelve noon and 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., except in the case of emergency, when treatment may be obtained at any time.

(c) Provided that, in the event of the Matron in Charge advising the removal of any patient, who is entitled to subscribers' benefits, to the nearest hospital for treatment by a medical practitioner, the Board will pay up to ten pounds on the aggregate of the following accounts:—

1. Cost of transporting patient to nearest hospital or to nearest doctor.
2. Doctor's fees.
3. Hospital fees.
4. Drugs and dressings.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws.

- (l) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants, unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.

Mesh of Set Nets.

12A. (1) No person shall in any of the waters of the Swan River, Peel's Inlet (including Harvey Estuary), or Leschenault Inlet, or of any of their affluents or tributaries, use for the purpose of taking fish any set net having meshes less than two and one-half inches throughout.

(2) For the purpose of this regulation "set net" means a net which is set and left unattended.

Prohibited Method of Landing Nets.

12B. No person shall in any Western Australian waters draw ashore or on board any boat any net in such a manner that undersize fish in such net are or may be killed.

ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1941.

Denmark Road Board.

P.W. 591/38.

A by-law of the Denmark Road Board, made under section 204 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, for the general control, management, and preservation of public property, park lands, reserves, and other places the control of which is vested in the Board.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the members of the Road Board order as follows:—

Repeal:—Any previous by-law made for the management of reserves and public property is repealed.

By-law for Controlling Reserves and Camping.

Interpretation.—In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Board” means the Denmark Road Board.

“Camping area” means any land set apart or used by the Board from time to time for the purpose of accommodating camps or temporary shelters for encampment.

“Camp” means any tent, camp, building, bivouac, or temporary shelter of any kind or any caravan or vehicle adapted for camping.

“Camping” means the occupation of a site for a building or a camp.

“Occupier” means any person occupying a camping site for the time being, and includes any person in whose charge a camp is left during the absence of the holder of the camping permit.

“Family” means a group of relatives not exceeding ten (10).

“Officer” means secretary, health inspector, caretaker or any person appointed in writing by the secretary.

1. No person shall frequent or occupy any land the control or management of which is vested in the Board, for the purpose of camping or tarrying during any day or night or portion thereof, except upon camping areas designated as such and set apart for the purpose by the Board.

2. No person or family shall use any camping area for the purpose of camping, without first obtaining from the secretary or officer an official camping permit covering the period of occupancy and the payment in advance of such fees as may be prescribed by the Board from time to time. No person shall sublet any camp, or sell, give, or otherwise dispose of any permit to any person.

3. Camping permits may be issued subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) that no structure of any kind is to be erected without the written consent of the Board. Permanent structures will not be permitted;
- (b) that no person shall occupy the same site on a camping area for a period exceeding six weeks without the written consent of the Board or health inspector;
- (c) that no camp shall be erected within 15 feet of any water stand or within 30 feet of any public convenience, or upon any road or foot-path upon any camping area;
- (d) that at the request of an officer, an occupier of any camp shall remove such camp from any camping area or shall move such camp to another site on any camping area as directed by the officer;
- (e) that the secretary or officer may allot or define the area to be occupied by any camp, either upon the issue of a permit or during the currency thereof, and the occupier shall confine such camp within the limits defined by the officer;
- (f) that the decision of the secretary or officer shall be final as to the constitution of a family, group or camp and the number of camping permits required in respect thereof;
- (g) that no fires shall be lighted by any person on any camping area, except in places approved by the secretary or officer;
- (h) that no camp shall be erected of unsightly material or in a manner likely to be offensive or dangerous to occupiers of adjacent camping sites;

(i) that no insanitary practices are permitted upon any camping site and that occupiers use only such conveniences and utensils as are provided for the disposal of refuse, rubbish, and excreta;

(j) that no person suffering from or contracting any infectious disease be allowed or harboured in any camp;

(k) that camp sites are maintained in a cleanly and sanitary condition at all times during the period of occupancy. (Campers must keep the area, covered by their permit, in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. All rubbish capable of destruction by fire shall be burned by the occupier in the approved fire-place.)

(l) that no person or family using any camping area shall behave in a disorderly manner, or use indecent, profane or insulting language, or create or take part in any disturbance, or make harangues whereby a crowd is collected, or commit any act of indecency, or behave in any manner whatsoever which may be considered objectionable by other persons using any camping area;

(m) that all by-laws relating to health, and all directions which may be given by the Health Inspector from time to time for the good order and sanitation of camping areas are immediately complied with.

4. Any camping permit may be summarily cancelled by the secretary or officer, whose decision shall be final, if in his opinion any contravention of section 3 of this by-law has been committed by any person or persons using any camping area under such permit, or if in his opinion it is desirable that such permit shall be terminated.

In the event of any permit being cancelled under this section, any balance of fees paid in respect thereof shall be forfeited to the Board, and no compensation shall be paid for any loss, damage, or inconvenience sustained through the cancellation of such permit.

5. The Board or officer may refuse to grant any camping permit or renew any camping permit on its expiry, and no reason shall be given for such refusal.

6. Application for a renewal of any camping permit must be made prior to the expiry of such permit, and all fees in connection therewith shall be paid in advance before any camping permit may be renewed.

7. Any person or persons whose camping permit has expired or been cancelled, or who has been refused a camping permit, shall vacate any camping area within 12 hours, on notice being given verbally or otherwise by an officer, and non-compliance with such notice will be deemed to have committed an offence against this by-law.

8. Any person or persons using a camping area for the purpose of camping or tarrying, omitting to apply for a camping permit, or refusing to pay any fees in connection with the use of any camping area as shall be made on demand by the secretary or officer shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this by-law.

9. No person shall damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, tree-guard, wall, fence, building, seat, sanitary convenience, waterpipe, hose, or fitting, soil, or other property in any park land or public reserve.

10. No person shall climb or be upon any tree, shrub, tree-guard, wall, or fence, or upon the roof of any building in any park land or public reserve.

11. No person shall throw stones or other missiles in any park land or public reserve, or leave or bury therein any bottle, refuse or litter. No person shall place or break, or permit to be placed or broken, any glass, metal, bottle, or utensils on the reserve or the beach, and no person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind thereon, except in receptacles provided for that purpose.

12. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using indecent, profane, or insulting language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or making harangues whereby a crowd is collected, or committing any act of indecency in any park land or public reserve, may be forthwith removed from such park land or public reserve by any officer or servant of the Board, or by any member of the police force, and shall be, moreover, liable to prosecution for an offence against this by-law.

13. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse or cattle to be upon or to depasture upon any park land or public reserve without first having obtained the written authority of the Board to do so.

14. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall lead, ride, or drive any horse, cattle, bicycle, or vehicle upon or over any portion of any park land or public reserve, except upon a carriage way.

15. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon any park land or public reserve, except upon a carriage way or parking place.

16. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any park land or public reserve any goods or articles of any description, without having previously obtained the written permission of the Board.

17. No person shall light any fire within any park land or public reserve without the consent of the Board.

18. No person shall deface or write upon, or post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted or otherwise affix any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, writing or picture whatsoever upon any tree, building, fence post, gate, wall, flagging or path in or around any park land or public reserve without the written consent of the Board first obtained.

19. No person shall use any spring gun or catapult in any park or public reserve.

20. No person shall in any park land or public reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer or servant of the Board.

21. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats of any structure or erection within any park land or public reserve.

22. No person shall gamble or play pitch and toss or any other game of chance in any park land or public reserve.

23. No person shall bring, carry, or take into any park land or public reserve any fermented or spirituous liquors, nor shall any person consume or drink same therein, nor shall be found therein having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control, except with written permission of the Board.

24. No person or organised club shall practise or play at any game on any park land or public reserve, without having first obtained a written permit from the Board so to do.

25. No person or organised club having obtained any such permit as aforesaid shall practise or play at any game, except at such times and upon such portions of the park land or public reserves as shall be specified in such permit.

26. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant of the Board or any constable to remove from any park land or public reserve any child under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person.

27. No person shall erect or place within any park land or public reserve any tent, stall, platform, or table for public amusement or for any performance, whether for gain or otherwise, without the consent of the Board being first had and obtained.

28. No person shall commit a nuisance on or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room, or other building erected on any park land or public reserve.

29. No person shall preach or address an audience or public meeting on any park land or public reserve without first having obtained permission for that purpose from the Board.

30. No person or organised club shall use any dressing or training rooms erected on any park land or public reserve, without first having obtained permission for that purpose from the Board.

31. No person or organised club having obtained any such permit shall use any dressing or training room, except at such times and such dressing or training rooms as shall be specified in such permit.

32. The Board will not accept any liability or be held responsible for any accident or mishap whatsoever which may occur to any person, or any damage or loss sustained to any private property while on any park land or public reserve.

33. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Scale of Charges for Camping:—For parking of caravans—2/6 per caravan per week or part thereof; camps (4 beds)—4/- per day or 25/- per week. For camping in tent—2/6 per tent per week or part thereof to cover hire of tent poles and sanitary.
