### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,  
TO WIT, } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and  
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia  
Lieutenant-Governor. } and its Dependencies in the Common-  
{ U.S. } wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8 of the Prisons Act, 1903-1918, that the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, *inter alia*, declare any building, enclosure, or place to be a gaol, and by section 64A of the said Act that the Governor may by Proclamation, *inter alia*, set apart any suitable place to be a reformatory prison for the reception and detention of persons sentenced to be detained in or ordered to be transferred to a reformatory prison: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient to declare the land and premises hereinafter mentioned to be a gaol and to set apart the said land and premises to be a reformatory prison under and for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 8 and 64A of the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare all that piece of land, situate near Pickering Brook, being the subject of Saw Mill Site 59/33, comprised within State Forest No. 7, and all the buildings and premises erected or standing thereon and all the premises appurtenant thereto, commonly known as Barton's Mill, to be a gaol, and also do hereby set apart the said land, buildings, and premises to be a reformatory prison for the reception and detention of persons sentenced to be detained in or ordered to be transferred to a reformatory prison under and for the purposes of the Prisons Act, 1903-1918.

#### FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

#### ORDER UNDER REGULATION 68 AND SUBREGULATIONS (1) AND (1A) OF REGULATION 78 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

##### *Defence Quartering Order and Defence Quartering (Allied Forces) Order.*

WHEREAS by regulation 78 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, by Order, provide for the billeting or quartering of any persons as being either persons in the service of the King or the Commonwealth or persons who are in the service of a local governing authority and are engaged in the performance of essential services, and that any order under that regulation may provide for the provision of accommodation and feeding of animals or accommodation for vehicles or stores in the possession or under the control of any person billeted or quartered: And whereas by subregulation (1A) of that regulation it is provided (amongst other things) that the Minister may, in any Order made under subregulation (1) of that regulation, or by a separate Order, make provision for the billeting or quartering of any persons, being members of the Armed Forces of any power which is allied or associated with His Majesty in any war in which His Majesty is engaged: And whereas by Defence Quartering Order dated 15/12/41 and published in *Commonwealth Government Gazette* No. 264 of 17/12/1941 the District Commandant of a Military District may appoint areas within the District to be Quartering Areas and may appoint Quartering and Claims Officers for each Quartering Area: And whereas by Defence Quartering (Allied Forces) Order dated 18/12/41 and published in *Commonwealth Gazette* No. 269 of 19/12/41 any Defence Quartering Order so made as aforesaid shall apply in relation to members of the Armed Forces of any power which is allied or associated with His Majesty in any war in which His Majesty is engaged: Now, therefore I, Colonel Oswald Vick Hoad, Colonel Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area and Officer for the time being performing the duties of District Commandant of Fifth Military District, acting in pursuance of the said regulation and subregulations and Orders, do hereby order as follows:—

All that area of land within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the north-west corner of the Commonwealth Government Post Office Buildings, Forrest place, Perth, Western Australia, shall be a Quartering Area within the meaning of the said Defence Quartering Order and Defence (Allied Forces) Quartering Order as from 18/4/1942.



## Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 4 (*Gazette*, 16/6/1939) is amended by adding at the end thereof the words "Municipal Chambers, Wagin."

2. Schedule A (*Gazette*, 16/6/1939) is amended by adding thereto, under paragraph 3 thereof, a further brand as follows:—



1½ inches diameter.

3. Schedule B (*Gazette* 16/6/1939) is amended by adding thereto the words "Wagin Health District."

4. Schedule C (*Gazettes* 16/6/1939, 22/12/1939, and 3/5/1940) is amended by adding thereto a paragraph as follows:—

The following fees are payable at.....Wagin:—

For the carcase of every ox, cow, bull, heifer or steer .. .. .	1s. 6d.
For the carcase of every calf under 150 lbs. .. .. .	9d.
For the carcase of every sheep, lamb, or goat .. .. .	6d.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, the Governor may make regulations for the purpose of the Act, and may thereby formulate Model By-laws for the guidance of Boards in respect of all or any of the matters regarding which Boards may make by-laws: And whereas the Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the said section, has formulated Model By-laws, as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940: And whereas a Board may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: Now, therefore, the Wiluna District Hospital Board, being a Board within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, doth hereby adopt the whole of such Model By-laws, as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940.

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Wiluna District Hospital on the eighteenth day of May, 1941, the following resolution was passed:—

Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits; and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such Fund: And whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Wiluna District Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

## Schedule.

By-laws for the Control of Medical Funds under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

1. The term "subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

2. Any person who subscribes 2s. per week, or the sum of 26s. per quarter, or any male person under the age of 18 years or single woman or widows who subscribe the sum of 1s. per week, shall be termed a subscriber.

2a. The wife of any member of the Navy, Army, or Air Force serving at home or abroad who subscribes the sum of 1s. per week shall be termed a "subscriber."

3. The word "dependant" shall mean the wife, parents, and grand-parents of a subscriber, a female relative occupying the position as head of the household, brothers and sisters not over the age of sixteen years, and the sons and daughters who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the time of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.

(b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant, he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

4. Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or an outdoor patient and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws, for as long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.

6. Subscribers employed by any mining company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment: Provided that the Mine Management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.

7. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—

- (a) Incurable diseases.
- (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for a benevolent institution.
- (d) Venereal disease.
- (e) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (f) Dentistry.
- (g) Insanity.
- (h) Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (i) Pathological examination fees.
- (j) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants, unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Hospital Board.

(k) Accouchements or miscarriages.

Dental operations and major surgical operations.

The following surgical procedures, if performed without a general anaesthetic shall be deemed minor operations and be free of charge—opening boils, abscesses, suturing wounds, setting fractures and other such minor operations.

Fees for all operations to be subject to private arrangement between the member and the Medical Officer.

The Medical Officer is entitled to charge the usual professional fees for fractures requiring hospital treatment or complicated retention apparatus.

8. The Board shall have discretionary powers regarding the payment of hospital maintenance incurred in any subsidised public hospital by subscribers or their dependants who are temporarily outside the district, and who suddenly become seriously ill or meet with a serious accident which precludes their returning to the hospital covered by their Fund. In approved cases the Board will be responsible for payment to the other hospital concerned, at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day, for a period of not exceeding 60 days in any one year, but any amount in addition to this charged as fees by the other hospital will be a matter for settlement between the subscriber and the hospital concerned. The Board will not be responsible for any payment to doctors for treatment of such cases.

(b) If the Medical Officer of the Fund recommends the transfer of a patient to another hospital because he deems the appliances at hand inadequate for the proper treatment of such patient, then the Board will pay, for a period not exceeding 60 days in any one year, the hospital to which this patient is transferred at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day. The Board will not, however, be responsible for any fares or cost of transfer.

9. Subscribers and their dependants requiring out-patient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. In the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 10 a.m.

(b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at the hours fixed by the Board.

10. When a subscriber, residing outside the radius to be fixed by the Board, requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer.

11. The doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

The benefits of this by-law shall cease to apply upon the member being discharged from the said Forces, or after the lapse of twelve months from the termination of the war, whichever shall be the shorter term.

## AGREEMENT No. 9 of 1942.

(Reg. 9/4/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 9th day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, between the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Northam, in the State of Western Australia, and the Metropolitan and South-Western Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, whose registered office is situated at No. 17 Trades Hall, Perth, in the State of Western Australia of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

## 1.—Term.

This Agreement shall take effect from 9th February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, and shall continue in force for a period of three years.

## 2.—Wages.

Basic wage: £4 10s. 10d. per week.

Engine-drivers:	
Steam or internal combustion engine-drivers . . . . .	15 0
If an engine-driver also attends to an ammonia compressor, he shall be paid an additional sum of 1s. per shift.	
If an engine-driver also attends to an electric generator or dynamo, he shall be paid an additional sum of 1s. per shift.	
An engine-driver who is in charge of plant, and being the only person of his class employed on the plant and doing the general repair work of the plant, in addition to the work of engine-driving, but not when he merely assists the fitter or engineer to do such work, shall be paid 1s. per shift additional.	

## Firemen:

Firemen attending to steam boilers or suction gas generators . . . . .	12 0
Where two or more firemen are employed on one shift, one fireman shall be leading fireman and shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra.	

## 3.—No Reduction.

Nothing in this Agreement shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

## 4.—Hours of Duty.

- (a) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work.  
 (b) Provided that the provisions in this clause for a forty-four (44) hour week shall be deemed to have been complied with if an 88-hour fortnight (namely—one week of 40 and one of 48 hours) is worked.

## 5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the ordinary hours of duty on any one day shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at time and a half. All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. Sunday time to stand alone.

(b) Work done on Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be paid for at double time rates. Foundation Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, and Labour Day shall be paid for at time and a half.

## 6.—Holidays.

Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to fourteen days' annual leave each year on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employers.

## 7.—Casual Workers.

(a) A casual worker shall mean and include an employee competent to do the work he is engaged to do, who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or re-

fused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be) before the expiration of six days from and including the date he starts work.

(b) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. in addition to the rates set out above.

## 8.—Weekly Engagement.

Except as provided by clause 7 all employment shall be by the week.

## 9.—Rotation of Shifts.

Where an employee works afternoon or night shift only, or afternoon and night shifts in rotation, but does not work day shift one week out of three, he shall receive one shilling per shift in addition to the rates set out above.

If Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Sunday the following Monday shall be kept.

## 10.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from duty, except on account of sickness, in accordance with subclause (a) hereof.

## 11.—Definition.

"Engine-driver" means any person who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity, or any other motive power other than manual or animal power.

## 12.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the works of the Northam Municipal Council Electric Light and Refrigerating Station.

## 13.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all engine-drivers and firemen engaged in the production of electric current and refrigeration, within the area prescribed in clause (12) hereof.
