NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY)
REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia.
*Control and Regulation of certain Trotting Race
Meetings.*

WHEREAS by regulation 26 of the Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations it is provided that the Premier of the State may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the State control or regulate the holding of any race meeting: And whereas the Fremantle Trotting Club Incorporated is authorised by license issued by the West Australian Trotting Association Incorporated under and in accordance with the provisions of the Racing Restriction Act, 1917, to conduct trotting race meetings within the Fremantle district in any year: And whereas, on account of war conditions, it is impossible for such race meetings to be conducted within the Fremantle district as aforesaid: And whereas, subject to this Order, the West Australian Trotting Association Incorporated has agreed to issue a license permitting and authorising the Fremantle Trotting Club Incorporated to conduct trotting race meetings at Gloucester Park, within the metropolitan area: Now, therefore, I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting by virtue of the power conferred by regulation 26 of the said Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations do hereby order as follows:

From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia, and while this Order remains unrevoked, it shall be lawful for the Fremantle Trotting Club Incorporated to conduct trotting race meetings at Gloucester Park, within the metropolitan area, under and in accordance with the license issued by the West Australian Trotting Association Incorporated.

By-law No. 50—Dogs.

P.W. 1272/30.

A by-law of the Municipality of Northam, made under section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1941, and Numbered 50, for regulating the Keeping of Dogs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Northam order as follows:—

No person shall cause or suffer any dog, of which he is the owner, or of which he has the custody or control, to go or be upon Fitzgerald street, between Gairdner street and Peel terrace, or any Public Reserve, in the Municipality of Northam, unless such dog is in the immediate charge of some person and is held on an efficient leash.

Penalty for a first offence not more than two pounds and for a second or subsequent offence not more than five pounds.

By-law relating to Blasting, Quarrying, and Excavations.

P.W. 1078/35.

THE Bayswater Road Board, in pursuance of the above Act and the 2nd Schedule of the Town Planning and Development Act, and of every other authority enabling it, do hereby make and publish the following by-law:—

1. Clause 1 of By-law P.W. 1078/35, gazetted on 28th June, 1940, is repealed as from the date of publication hereof and the following is substituted:—

2. No person, company, or corporation shall directly or indirectly:—

(a) Quarry or permit quarries or excavations for stone, gravel, sand, or other material, or do any act or thing, for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand, or other material whereby an excavation is created or enlarged, without a license from the Board in writing first had and obtained: Provided that, in the classified residential area, any person may excavate in such area for foundations, wells, post-holes, septic tanks, reservoirs, air-raid shelters, according to the plans and specifications

submitted to the Board upon the granting of a building permit. The owner (as shown by the Rate Book), the registered proprietor, the purchaser under contract of sale, the occupier and/or any person removing or assisting in removing any such material without a license having been granted in respect thereof, shall be liable as if such person were actually quarrying.

B. Where board and lodging is provided, which includes facilities for laundry:—

Persons 12 years of age and over—2s. 10d. per day.

Persons 9, 10, and 11 years of age—2s. 4d. per day.

Persons 6, 7, and 8 years of age—1s. 11d. per day.

Persons under 6 years of age—1s. 8d. per day.

The above scales do not purport to provide any allowance towards rent, or any profit.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 15 of 1940.

Between Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Chairman and members of the Dundas Road Board and Leslie F. Hill, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Definitions.

(a) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker employed for less than five (5) consecutive working days, where a five-day week is worked, or for less than six (6) consecutive working days, where a six-day week is worked. This shall not apply to workers mentioned in clause 6 (b).

(b) "Wet ground" shall mean ground in which in the opinion of the Chief Executive Officer or such other person as may be authorised by him it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet.

(c) "Concretor" shall mean any worker engaged in mixing, wheeling, or packing concrete, including machine mixing.

(d) "Permanent yard or depot" shall be deemed to mean and include a permanent place wherein are stored or kept plant, equipment, and materials, or a place where vehicles are parked. The expression shall also be deemed to mean and include a place wherein are stored plant, equipment, and materials, or where vehicles are parked away from a permanent yard or depot, when workers are engaged on work which necessitates their camping on the job.

(e) "Road board worker" shall, for the purpose of clause 6, and without limiting the rights of the parties under clause 15 (a) (ii) in respect of any class of worker which is not now existing in the industry, mean a worker engaged in all or any of the following classifications:—

- (1) Scoopmen.
- (2) Rubbish-tip men.
- (3) Wood kerber.
- (4) Stone kerber.
- (5) Concrete slab layer.
- (6) Concrete kerb layer.
- (7) Concrete slab or kerbmaker.
- (8) Concrete pipemaker.
- (9) Concrete slab, kerb, or pipemaker's assistant.
- (10) Roadmen, forming or constructing roads and street surfaces, including footpaths.
- (11) Hammer and gadmen and hammer and drillmen.
- (12) Spallers and knappers on roads.

- (13) Stone pitchers.
- (14) Men screening gravel or metal.
- (15) Men throwing material over six feet up into truck or vehicle.
- (16) Spallers (quarries).
- (17) Quarry jumpermen.
- (18) Gravelpit men.
- (19) Sandpit men.
- (20) Drainage workers.
- (21) Pipe jointers.
- (22) Tree pullers.
- (23) Bridge builders.
- (24) Culvert builders.
- (25) Grave diggers.
- (26) Poison carter.
- (27) Axemen (sapping, falling, or lopping, not grubbing, unless such grubbing entails the cutting of roots of over 12 inches in diameter), where the major portion of the bush to be cut is more than 12 inches in diameter.

2.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers eligible to belong to the applicant union and employed in any of the classifications mentioned in clause 6 hereof.

3.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within that portion of the State outside the South-West Land Division over which the Dundas Road Board has local governing authority.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for one (1) year as from the first day of May, 1942.

5.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service of all workers in clause 6 shall be a daily one.

Should any worker not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next day, he shall be paid for that day, if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time: Provided that, if he cannot be employed on account of wet weather, he shall be notified accordingly, and shall be entitled to two hours' pay. The decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the Chief Executive Officer, or such other person as may be authorised by him.

7.—Conditions.

(i) One shilling (1s. 0d.) per day extra shall be paid to the following workers:—

- (a) Casual workers.
- (b) Concretors, other than slab, kerb or pipemakers.
- (c) Men engaged on tar or bitumen work and who come into contact with the tar or bitumen.
- (d) Men working in wet ground.
- (e) Men camped on the job—maximum 6s. 0d. per week.

(ii) Three shillings (3s. 0d.) extra per day shall be paid to workers cleaning bitumen tank or boiler, when so employed: Provided that such worker shall not be entitled to be paid in addition the allowance prescribed by clause 7 (i) (e).

(iii) Leading hands in charge of not less than three (3) other workers shall:—

- (a) where the leading hand is himself performing the work of a "road board worker," be entitled to be paid at the rate of fifteen shillings (15s. 0d.) per week in addition to the rate prescribed for a "road board worker."
- (b) Where the leading hand is himself performing any class of work other than that of a "road board worker" be entitled to be paid at the rate of six shillings (6s. 0d.) per week in addition to the rate prescribed for the class of work he is performing.

8.—Payment of Wages.

(a) When a worker has been discharged or has resigned before the usual pay day, he shall be paid all wages due within twenty-four (24) hours of the time when he has been discharged or has resigned.

(b) Payment of wages shall be made once weekly or once fortnightly, at the discretion of the employer.

(c) No employer shall keep more than two (2) days' pay in hand.

9.—Special Provisions.

(a) Camping on the job—

(i) On work which necessitates camping on the job, all reasonable goods and camping outfits to be collected at the depot and returned to the depot on completion of the job.

(ii) Shifting camp:—All shifting of camp to be done in the employer's time.

(b) Travelling:—Where workers are engaged on a job which is more than one and a half (1½) miles from a permanent yard or depot, such workers shall be provided with travelling facilities or reimbursed any fares necessarily incurred.

(c) Sanitary arrangements:—Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job for the convenience of all workers.

(d) Supplying tools:—All tools required by the worker in the performance of his work shall be supplied without charge by the employer.

(e) Workers working in isolated places:—A driver of a roller grader or tractor shall not work alone on construction work in isolated places.

(f) Medicine chest and first-aid equipment:—

(i) When workers are engaged on work which necessitates camping on a job, a medicine chest and first-aid equipment shall be supplied by the employer.

(ii) First-aid equipment shall be kept in a permanent yard or depot.

10.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers, to be worked in five and one-half (5½) days, except in the case of workers mentioned in clause 6 (b), when the forty-four (44) hours shall be worked as mutually agreed between the employer and the workers concerned: Provided that this subclause shall be deemed to have been complied with if an eighty-eight (88) hours fortnight is worked: Provided further, that the eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight referred to herein shall only be applied after written permission to work same has been granted by the union.

(b) By agreement between the employer and the workers employed in any particular establishment, a week's work may be worked in five (5) days.

(c) The daily spread of hours shall not exceed ten (10), inclusive of not more than one (1) hour for a meal.

(d) All time worked to make up the hours of duty on any one day shall be worked in a continuous shift.

(e) The hours of work of all workers whose ordinary duties are carried out during daylight hours shall be performed between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.; Provided that these hours may be varied by agreement between any employer and the union.

(f) A driver required by the employer to drive any vehicle from or to any permanent yard or depot shall be paid for such time as he is actually driving.

11.—Overtime.

(a) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, or on any of the named holidays prescribed in clause 12, or on Sundays, he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at penalty rates.

(b) If a worker who is required to work during the recognised meal period does not in consequence obtain during the shift a full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained, or any portion lost.

(c) All time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half.

(d) Any worker called upon to work on any of the holidays mentioned in clause 12 shall be paid at the rate of double time, except where the employer and the worker mutually agree that any of such days shall not be observed as a holiday, in which case work may be done at ordinary rates, and an extra day added to the annual leave, as prescribed by clause 13 for each day so worked.

(e) All work performed on Sunday, except in the case of sanitary employees, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(f) Any sanitary work performed on Saturday night shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(g) When computing overtime, the district allowance shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

12.—Holidays.

Subject to clause 11 (d) the following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be paid holidays, namely:—Labour Day, New Year's Day, and Christmas Day.

13.—Annual Leave.

(a) In addition to the holidays prescribed in clause 12 hereof, two (2) weeks' leave on full pay shall be allowed to all workers on completion of each twelve months' continuous service: Provided that, should the period of continuous service be less than twelve months the worker shall be entitled to pay in lieu of leave in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.

(b) Where practicable, annual leave shall be granted at Christmas time.

(c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with clause 14, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

(d) This clause does not apply to casual hands.

14.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker, other than a casual hand, shall be entitled to payment for non attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days (one (1) week's pay) in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course

of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

15.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint, for the purpose of this Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.

16.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

17.—Record.

(a) A readily intelligible record shall be kept by each employer, containing the following particulars:—

- (i) The name of each worker.
- (ii) The time he starts and finishes work each day.
- (iii) All overtime worked.
- (iv) The total number of hours worked.
- (v) The wages (and overtime, if any) paid to each worker.
- (vi) The amount of fares and special allowances (if any) paid.

(b) Such record shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection, during office hours, by the secretary or accredited representative of the union, and such person may take extracts therefrom.

18.—Posting Copy of Award and Union Notices.

The accredited union representative shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Award, or any notice of the union, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches, in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the union. Failing agreement in this connection, the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award or the said notice shall be posted.

19.—Leave of Absence.

For the purpose of this Award, leave of absence from duty, without prejudice, shall be granted to the president of the union or the president or secretary of any branch of the union, or any steward duly authorised by the union, without pay: Provided that they shall first find satisfactory substitutes, if so required by the employer.

20.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for the time so employed.

21.—District Allowance.

In addition to the wages prescribed in clause 6 of this Award, an allowance of five shillings (5s. 0d.) per week shall be paid to all workers.

22.—No Reduction.

Nothing in this Agreement shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

23.—Terms of Award.

It is understood that all the terms of this Award have been arrived at in view of all the circumstances surrounding this dispute, and are not to be regarded as a precedent for this or any other industry.

I certify pursuant to section 63 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia.

Lighting Restriction Order.

WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 35A of the National Security (General) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule 1941 No. 287) that the Premier of any State may, after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security, or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorised by that Minister, to act on his behalf, and with the Commandant of a military district, or an officer authorised by the Minister of State for Defence, or the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such Commandant, by Order—

- (a) direct any total or partial "black out," and may prohibit or regulate the display of lights of any description within the State; and
- (b) make such provision as he deems necessary to protect the persons and property of the civil population in that State or any part thereof in case of emergency

and that all persons within such State or part thereof (as the case may be) to which any such Order shall apply shall comply with the requirements of that Order: Now, therefore I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, being of the opinion that an emergency exists, and having duly held the consultation aforesaid, and acting pursuant to the said regulation 35A, do hereby make the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Lighting Restriction Order.

2. In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—

"Armed Forces" means any of the Armed Forces of His Majesty the King or of any Power which is allied or associated with His Majesty in any war in which His Majesty is engaged.

"Civil Defence Council" means the Civil Defence Council in Western Australia as constituted by the Civil Defence (Emergency Powers) Act, 1940, of that State.

"Commissioner of Police" means the Commissioner of Police of Western Australia.

3. This Order shall not apply to—

- (a) any light displayed by any member of the Armed Forces acting in the course of his duty as such;
- (b) any light displayed with the consent of the Naval Board from a lighthouse or other structure on shore, or from a light vessel or other floating structure, being a light provided solely for the guidance of shipping;
- (c) navigation lights displayed on ships under the instructions or with the consent of the Naval Board; and
- (d) navigation lights displayed on aircrafts or other lights displayed at aerodromes in accordance with instructions given by or on behalf of the Minister of State for Air.

4. In the event of hostile attack or the apprehension of hostile act, the display of any light the display of which would otherwise be lawful under the provisions of this Order may be, and, if so requested by the Civil Defence Council, shall be prohibited or restricted by the Commissioner of Police, or any member of the Police Force of Western Australia acting under his general or special direction; and it shall not be lawful for any light to be displayed in contravention of any such prohibition or restriction.

5. Subject to clauses 7 and 8 of this Order, during the period between sunset and sunrise, a person shall not cause or allow—

- (a) any light to be emitted from or by any fire, lamp, sign, or other device which is not inside any enclosed building; or
- (b) any light to be emitted from any enclosed building situated in any of those parts of the State described in the First Schedule to this Order, or, when so directed by me as such Premier aforesaid, by notice under clause 12 of this Order, from any enclosed building situated in any other part or parts of the State specified in such notice.

6. Subject to clauses 7 to 11, both inclusive, of this Order, during the period between sunset and sunrise, and in any of the parts of the State described in the Second Schedule to this Order, a person shall not cause or allow—

- (a) any light to be emitted from or by any fire, lamp, sign, or other device which is not inside any enclosed building;
- (b) any light to be emitted from any shop window or any window in which are shown goods for display or sale to the public or any window which may be or is generally used to show goods for display or sale to the public; or
- (c) any light inside any building to be displayed, unless—
 - (i) the blinds, curtains, or shades in all windows, doors, skylights, and other openings of the room or part of the building where the light is displayed are fully drawn over such windows, doors, skylights, or other openings; or
 - (ii) such windows, doors, skylights, and other openings are otherwise obscured so as to prevent the display of the light through the same; or
 - (iii) such light, including any glass forming portion of such light or portion of the fitting surrounding such light is screened so as to prevent the display of the light through any of the windows, doors, skylights, and other openings aforesaid—

and, in any case, so that no direct light is shown outside the building and the light emitted from the building is not visible at a distance of three hundred yards in any direction from the building.

7. The provisions of clauses 5 and 6 of this Order shall not apply to—

- (a) public lighting;
- (b) lights on vehicles, except when such vehicles are inside an enclosed building;
- (c) lights which in the opinion of the Commissioner of Railways in the State are necessary for the safe working of the Government Railways or of the Government Tramways;
- (d) lights which are essential for the purposes of—
 - (i) the loading and unloading of ships;
 - (ii) rescue, demolition, fire fighting, first aid work, or any civil defence service;
 - (iii) repair work carried out by or on behalf of any public authority—

Provided such lights, in any case aforesaid, are screened as far as is practicable so that no direct light is cast above the horizontal, and they do not emit light of an intensity, measured at ground level, greater than 0.002 foot candles;

- (e) any light displayed in and for the purpose of any illuminated sign indicating the position or direction of a police station, fire station, first aid post, hospital, or of a depot or building used by a civil defence service, or of a public air raid shelter: Provided that in any case the sign is screened so that no direct light is cast above the horizontal and the light is so dimmed that, while clearly legible at a distance of 100 feet, the sign is not visible at a distance of 250 feet.

8. The following lights may be displayed for the guidance of traffic on roads:—

- (a) a light in a traffic signal, provided it is screened to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police;
- (b) red lights indicating an obstruction or excavation upon or near a road, provided each light is of a candle power not exceeding 1.0 and the lights are screened so that no direct light is cast above the horizontal and no appreciable illumination is produced upon the ground;
- (c) lights for the illumination of any road, provided each lighting fitting complies with the requirements of the British Standard Specification No. BS./ARP37, or with such alternative requirements as may be approved from time to time by the Civil Defence Council.

9. (1) Light may be displayed from hand lamps or hand torches if and so long as—

- (a) the light is displayed from a hand lamp which complies with the requirements of the British Standard Specification No. BS./ARP 3; or
- (b) the light emitted from the hand lamp or torch is dimmed by a sheet of newspaper or its equivalent; and
- (c) the aperture through which the light is emitted does not exceed one inch in diameter; and
- (d) the light emitted is white and is at all times directed downwards.

(2) Light may be displayed from a hurricane lamp, provided the lamp is so screened that no light is emitted upwards and no more light is emitted in any other direction than is reasonable necessary.

10. A person shall not, during the period between sunset and sunrise, operate any tram or trolley bus or omnibus on any road or in any part of the State described in the First or Second Schedule to this Order unless the lights in such tram, trolley bus, or omnibus comply with such conditions as are laid down or specified from time to time by the Civil Defence Council.

11. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this clause, during the period between sunset and sunrise, a person shall not in any factory situate in any part of the State described in the First or Second Schedule to this Order cause or allow any light to be emitted from or by any fire, lamp, sign, or other device from which any light whatsoever can be seen from outside the factory.

(2) The Civil Defence Council, or any inspector or officer of the Civil Defence Council, authorised by it in that behalf, may grant permission for the display at any factory of such lights as are necessary for the performance of urgent work in connection with the prosecution of the war.

(3) The Civil Defence Council may give directions as to the type, kind, and arrangement of lights to be used in any factory or class of factory which is affected by this clause; and any inspector or officer appointed by such Council may enter into and inspect any factory to ascertain whether or not such directions are being complied with.

(4) The owner and occupier of any factory shall cause the standard of ventilation in that factory to conform with the minimum adequate standard of ventilation prescribed in the Emergency Report No. 1, Industrial Health in War, published by His Majesty's Stationery Office, London, 1940.

(5) In this clause the term "factory" shall have the same meaning as that assigned to it in the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, of the State of Western Australia.

12. A person shall not, during the period between the sounding of the "air raid warning" signal and the "raiders passed" signal cause or allow any light to be emitted from any enclosed building.

13. (1) Whenever I, the said Premier, by a notice in writing shall direct that during any period and in any part or parts of the State specified in such notice no light shall be emitted from any fire, lamp, sign, or other device, whether the same is not inside or is inside any enclosed building, and while such notice remains unrevoked, a person in any enclosed building affected by such notice shall not cause or allow any light to be emitted from such enclosed building contrary to the requirements of such notice.

(2) Any notice referred to in paragraph (1) of this clause shall operate as from the date specified therein for the coming into operation thereof.

(3) Every such notice shall be deemed to have been published sufficiently for the information of the public when it is published in the *Government Gazette* or in any newspaper circulating in the part or parts of the State specified in the notice, or is broadcasted by means of wireless transmission.

(4) Every such notice may be directed to the public generally or to a particular person or to particular persons.

Provided that, when a notice is directed to a particular person or to particular persons, the notice may be served upon him or them by delivering the same personally or by sending it by post to the last known place of abode of the person or persons concerned, in a prepaid addressed envelope.

(5) The production of any *Gazette* or newspaper in which a notice has been published, or of a certificate signed by the manager of the broadcasting station over which the notice has been broadcasted, or of a copy of the notice as given under this clause shall be *prima facie* evidence of the giving of such notice and the publication thereof in accordance with the provisions of this clause.

14. This Order shall come into operation and have effect as from the date upon which publication thereof is made in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

First Schedule.

PART 1.

Woodman Point—Trigg Island.

The area bounded by lines starting at a point on the coast south of Woodman Point, at the intersection of the southern boundary of Woodman Point Explosive Reserve and the coast line of Jervoise Bay; thence easterly for about three miles to the western boundary of Jandakot Agricultural Area Lot 250; thence northerly along said boundary and continuing along the western boundaries of Jandakot Agricultural Area Lots 252, 253, 256 to the Jandakot Railway; thence in a north-north-westerly direction about four miles to the intersection of High road and Stock road; thence northerly along the eastern side of Stock road to where it meets the Swan River foreshore; thence across the said river to the intersection of Adelma road and the river foreshore; thence northerly along the eastern sides of Adelma road and Vincent street to the Stirling highway and continuing northerly along the eastern side of Broome street to the Karrakatta Cemetery; thence about two miles in a north-north-easterly direction crossing the Karrakatta Cemetery to the intersection of Alderbury street and Selby street; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Selby street across Herdsman Lake to the Scarborough Beach road; thence westerly along the north side of the said road to Oswald street; thence northerly along eastern boundary of said street to Hertha street; thence westerly along north side of said street to Government road (No. 5); thence northerly along the eastern side of said road to a point about three miles due west from Trigg Island; thence due west to Trigg Island.

PART 2.

Trigg Island—Little Island.

Starting in the north-west corner of the area as defined in the *West Australian* of the 11th day of March 1942, at Trigg Island; thence northerly along the coast at high-water mark to the intersection with the prolongation west of the south boundary of Swan Location E1; thence due east along the said boundary three miles; thence southerly to the north-east corner of the area as defined in the *West Australian* of the 11th day of March, 1942; thence about three miles due west along the north boundary of the said area to the starting point.

PART 3.

Albany District.

Commencing at a point at the intersection of the western boundary of Quarantine Reserve 2903 and the coast line, bounded by the Southern Ocean; thence northerly along the western boundary of said Reserve to its north-western corner; thence continuing northerly across Pine Plantation and Common Reserve 13773, to the south-western corner of Plantagenet Location 33; thence continuing northerly along the western boundary of said location, to and across the Perth-Albany Railway line to the north-western corner of Plantagenet Location 33; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said location to the south-western corner of Gledhow Townsite; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Plantagenet Location A6 to its north-eastern corner, thence easterly along the southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 4889 to the eastern side of Perth-Albany highway; thence south-easterly along the eastern side of said highway to the north-western corner of Plantagenet Location 238; thence in a generally easterly direction along the southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 4741 to the western boundary of Plantagenet Location 441; thence northerly and easterly along the western and northern boundaries of said Location 441 to the south-eastern corner of Location 557; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of said location to the south-western corner of Location 462; thence easterly along the southern boundary of said location and continuing easterly along the southern boundary of Location A73 to the Albany-Kalgan road; thence following the northern side of said road in a north-easterly direction across the King River to Kalgan Townsite; thence northerly and easterly along the boundaries of the said townsite to the south-western corner of Plantagenet Location 3112; thence northerly along the western boundary of said location

and continuing along the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of Kalgan Town-site to the north-eastern corner of Plantagenet Location 2666; thence southerly along its eastern boundary to the south-eastern corner; thence easterly along Road No. 4007 to the south-eastern corner of Plantagenet Location 2795; thence in a southerly direction to the north-eastern corner of Plantagenet Location 3598; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of said location to its south-eastern corner; thence continuing southerly to the north-eastern corner of Location 3942; thence southerly and westerly along the eastern and southern boundaries respectively of said location to a point in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of Plantagenet Location 918; thence southerly, crossing the road and following the eastern boundary of said location to the coast line of Taylor Inlet; thence westerly along the coast line of King George Sound to a point due east of Emm Point; thence due west to Emm Point; thence along the coast line in a south-westerly direction to King Point; thence continuing along the coast line of Princess Royal Harbour and Frenchman Bay to Bald Head; thence westerly along the coast line bounded by the Southern Ocean to the point of commencement.

Second Schedule.

All portions of the State, except—

- (a) those portions described in the First Schedule to this Order; and
- (b) those portions eastward of a line drawn from the Town of Albany to the Town of Merredin, and from the Town of Merredin to the Town of Mt. Magnet, and southward of a line drawn easterly from Mt. Magnet aforesaid to the eastern boundary of the State of Western Australia,—

and including the Town of Esperance.

NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia.

Lighting of Motor Vehicles Order.

WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 35A of the National Security (General) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule 1941 No. 287) that the Premier of any State may, after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security, or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorised by that Minister to act on his behalf, and with the Commandant of a military district, or an officer authorised by the Minister of State for Defence, or the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such Commandant, by Order—

- (a) direct any total or partial "black out," and may prohibit or regulate the display of lights of any description within the State; and
- (b) make such provision as he deems necessary to protect the persons and property of the civil population in that State, or any part thereof, in case of emergency—

and that all persons within such State or part thereof (as the case may be) to which any such Order shall apply shall comply with the requirements of that Order: Now, therefore I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, being of opinion that an emergency exists, and having duly held the consultation aforesaid, and acting pursuant to the said regulation 35A, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Lighting of Motor Vehicles Order.
2. This Order shall operate and have effect throughout the State of Western Australia.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Armed Forces" means the Armed Forces of His Majesty the King or of any power which is allied or associated with His Majesty the King in any war in which His Majesty the King is engaged.

"Approving authority" means the Commissioner of Police in the State of Western Australia.

"Authorised dual-purpose lamp" means a lamp with one or more globes or filaments, the power of which lamp may either exceed or not exceed seven watts, emitting a white light to the front of the motor vehicle and vehicle, emitting a white light to the front of the vehicle and complying with the following conditions—

- (a) the front of the lamp shall be fitted with a mask which allows light to be emitted through more than one aperture;
- (b) one of those apertures shall be circular and one inch in diameter.
- (c) the brightness of the last-mentioned aperture shall not be more than twenty candles per square foot, when the higher degree of power is employed in the lamp, and the light emitted through such aperture, when the lower degree of power is employed in the lamp, shall be clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards but not visible at a distance of three hundred yards;
- (d) the lamp shall be such that, if the said aperture were totally obscured and the higher degree of power were always employed in the lamp, the lamp would comply with the definition of an authorised head lamp herein; and

(e) no light shall be emitted from the lamp except through the mask.

The term also includes any other lamp which in the opinion of the approving authority complies substantially with the foregoing requirements of this definition.

“Authorised front lamp” means an authorised dual purpose lamp, an authorised indicating lamp, an authorised head lamp, or an authorised parking lamp.

“Authorised head lamp” means a lamp with a filament of a power exceeding seven watts, emitting a white light to the front of the motor vehicle and complying with the following conditions—

- (a) The front of the lamp shall be fitted with a mask which allows light to be emitted through one or more apertures;
- (b) Except, in the case of an omnibus, no light shall reach the ground at any point nearer than ten feet from the lamp or five times the height of the bottom of the lamp above ground level, whichever is the less;
- (c) No light shall be projected above the horizontal when the motor vehicle is standing on a level surface;
- (d) The light emitted shall be diffused by the insertion in the mask of a screen of some diffusing material or by other similar means;
- (e) The intensity of illumination on a vertical surface at any point ten feet from the lamp shall not exceed 2.5 foot candles;
- (f) No light shall be emitted from the lamp except through the mask; and
- (g) Any mechanical or electrical device for moving the head lamp shall be rendered inoperative.

The term also includes any other lamp which in the opinion of the approving authority complies substantially with the foregoing requirements of this definition.

“Authorised lamp” means an authorised dual purpose lamp, an authorised head lamp, an authorised indicating lamp, an authorised parking lamp, an authorised stop lamp, or an authorised tail lamp.

“Authorised indicating lamp” means a lamp with a filament of a power exceeding seven watts, emitting a white light to the front of a motor vehicle, and complying with the following conditions—

- (a) The front of the lamp shall be fitted with a mask which allows light to be emitted through more than one aperture;
- (b) One of these apertures shall be circular and one inch in diameter;
- (c) The brightness of the last mentioned aperture shall be not more than twenty candles per square foot;
- (d) The lamp shall be such that if the said aperture were totally obscured the lamp would be an authorised head lamp; and
- (e) No light shall be emitted from the lamp except through the mask.

The term also includes any other lamp which in the opinion of the approving authority complies substantially with the foregoing requirements of this definition.

“Authorised parking lamp” means a lamp with a globe of a power not exceeding seven watts which—

- (a) emits a white light to the front of the motor vehicle through a single aperture of one inch in diameter in such a way that the light emitted is clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards but is not visible at a distance of three hundred yards; and
- (b) does not emit any light in any direction from any other aperture.

“Authorised stop lamp” means a lamp with a globe of a power not exceeding seven watts which—

- (a) emits a red or amber light displayed for the purpose of intimating the intention of the driver to stop or slow down the motor vehicle on which it is fitted;
- (b) emits that light to the rear of the motor vehicle through a single aperture of one inch in diameter in such a way that the light emitted is clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards but is not visible at a distance of three hundred yards;
- (c) does not emit any light in any direction from any other aperture.

“Authorised tail lamp” means a lamp with a globe of a power not exceeding seven watts which—

- (a) emits a red light to the rear of the motor vehicle through a single aperture of one inch in diameter in such a way that the light emitted is clearly visible at a distance of thirty yards but is not visible at a distance of three hundred yards; and
- (b) does not emit any light in any direction from any other aperture.

Provided that a lamp shall not be deemed to be other than an authorised tail lamp by reason only that it is combined with an authorised stop lamp.

"Bicycle" includes a tricycle drawn or propelled or capable of being propelled by human power, and any mechanically propelled bicycle the cylinder capacity of the engine of which does not exceed 200 c.c., unless it is fitted with an authorised head lamp, an authorised dual purpose lamp, or an authorised indicating lamp.

"Constable" includes any member of the Police Force of the Commonwealth, any member of the Police Force of Western Australia, and any Peace Officer appointed in pursuance of the Peace Officers Act, 1925, of the Commonwealth.

"Motor cycle" means any motor vehicle having only two wheels.

"Motor vehicle" means any vehicle propelled or capable of being propelled or drawn along a road or on rails by electricity, steam, gas, oil or internal combustion or by any means other than human or animal power, and includes any trailer, fore-car, side-car or other vehicle or device attached thereto or drawn thereby, but does not include any train, tram, trolley bus, or bicycle.

"Public place" includes—

- (a) any public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, motor drive, or thoroughfare, notwithstanding that it is formed on private property;
- (b) any park, garden, foreshore, reserve, place of public resort or open space; and
- (c) any pier, jetty, or wharf.

(2) In this Order—

- (a) any reference to lamps of a particular wattage shall be deemed to include references to lamps which are not electric but emit the same amount of light as an electric lamp of that wattage; and
- (b) any reference to legibility, visibility, or inconspicuousness shall be construed as a reference to legibility, visibility or inconspicuousness in the dark, in the absence of moonlight, fog, mist, or rain, and with all lights in the vicinity extinguished.

4. A person shall not in any public place, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, drive or be in charge of any motor vehicle which is equipped with any lamp fitted on the exterior of such vehicle other than an authorised lamp, unless the globe or other source of illumination has been removed from that lamp.

5. A person shall not at any time in any public place drive or be in charge of any motor vehicle which is equipped with a lamp having on it a mask which does not conform to a sample which has been approved by the approving authority.

6. (1) A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise, drive any motor vehicle unless that motor vehicle carries and displays—

- (a) two authorised dual purpose lamps; or
- (b) (i) two authorised head lamps; and
- (ii) two authorised parking lamps.

Provided that this subparagraph shall not apply to any motor vehicle carrying and displaying authorised head lamps fitted with masks approved by the approving authority and manufactured at the date when this Order comes into operation; or

- (c) two authorised indicating lamps together with two authorised parking lamps to be used only when so required by clause 8 or clause 12 of this Order; and
- (d) one authorised tail lamp.

Provided that if any motor vehicle is required under the Traffic Act, 1919-1941, of this State to display any light by reason of the fact that the motor vehicle is carrying an overhanging or projecting load, it may display one or more additional authorised tail lamps to indicate the rear extremity of the projecting load.

(2) A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise, drive any motor cycle unless that motor cycle carries and displays—

- (a) one authorised dual purpose lamp; or
- (b) one authorised head lamp fitted with a mask approved by the approving authority and manufactured at the date when this Order comes into operation; and
- (c) one authorised tail lamp.

7. A person shall not drive or be in charge of any motor vehicle on which more than two authorised tail lamps and two authorised stop lamps are alight at any one time.

8. A person who is in charge of a motor vehicle shall not, except—

- (a) while the motor vehicle is in motion; or
- (b) while the motor vehicle is stationary, owing to the exigencies of the traffic, or in order to comply with any traffic signal or direction, or for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers—

cause or permit any light to be displayed from any authorised head lamp or authorised indicating lamp, or the higher power to be used in an authorised dual purpose lamp.

9. (1) A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise, drive or be in charge of any motor vehicle, other than an omnibus, which displays in its interior any light which is visible outside the motor vehicle, unless the motor vehicle is in an enclosed building.

(2) The interior of an omnibus may, between sunset and sunrise, be illuminated by such lighting as is approved by the Commissioner of Police or any constable acting under his general or special direction.

10. (1) The Commissioner of Police, or any constable acting under his general or special direction, or any Commonwealth officer (as defined in the National Security Act, 1939-1940), may give directions prohibiting or restricting the movement of any motor vehicles or class of motor vehicles to, from, or in any part of the State, or may direct the removal of any motor vehicle or class of motor vehicles from any part of the State.

(2) The driver or person in charge of any motor vehicle affected by any direction given in pursuance of this clause shall comply with such direction.

11. The Commissioner of Police, or any constable acting under his general or special direction, or any Commonwealth Officer aforesaid may, and shall, if requested so to do by the Civil Defence Council in this State, in the event of hostile attack or the apprehension of hostile attack, give directions prohibiting or restricting the display of any light on any motor vehicle the display of which would otherwise be lawful under the provisions of this Order.

12. A person in charge of any motor vehicle which is in any public place shall, during the period between the sounding of the "air raid warning" signal and the sounding of the "raiders passed" signal—

- (a) extinguish and keep extinguished the authorised front lamps on that motor vehicle; and
- (b) cause the vehicle (not being an essential service vehicle within the meaning of clause 14) to remain stationary in a position in such public place which is least likely to render that motor vehicle an obstruction to traffic in such public place.

13. Any constable may take into custody any motor vehicle which in his presence displays or emits any light in his opinion contrary to this Order, and may keep such motor vehicle in his custody until the condition leading to the breach of this Order has been remedied.

Provided that—

- (i) the vehicle shall be released by the constable as soon as is convenient to him after the vehicle can lawfully be driven without lights; and
- (ii) the detention of a motor vehicle under this clause shall not exceed sixteen hours in any one occasion.

14. (1) While a motor vehicle is being used as an essential service vehicle—

- (a) subject to the approval of the approving authority, there may be displayed in or on the vehicle as a sign indicating the purpose for which the vehicle is being used, and through a circular aperture one inch in diameter, an orange light the colour of which conforms to British Standard Colour No. 57 orange, but so that such light is just visible at a distance of fifty yards;
- (b) there may be used in or on the vehicle in addition to or in substitution for the sign or light mentioned in subparagraph (a) hereof any sign indicating the character of the vehicle which a vehicle of that type ordinarily carried in peace time, but so that the illuminated portion of the sign is just legible at a distance of fifty yards;
- (c) notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Order, where the vehicle is equipped with authorised dual purpose lamps, the orange light mentioned in subparagraph (a) hereof may be displayed through the circular aperture in such lamps in lieu of the white light as specified in the definition of authorised dual purpose lamp in clause 3 of this Order:

Provided that in such case the brightness of such orange light shall be such that it is visible at a distance of thirty yards and not visible at a distance of three hundred yards when the higher power in the lamp is used.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (1) of this clause "essential service vehicle" means a police vehicle, a post office vehicle, a fire service vehicle, an ambulance vehicle, or a vehicle used for any civil defence purpose, or any public utility vehicle.

(3) A person shall not have in his possession or control or use or enter or occupy any motor vehicle upon which is displayed any light or sign mentioned in paragraph (1) of this clause, or any light or sign resembling such light or sign, unless the vehicle belongs to or is appropriated for the use of any of the civil defence services and is being used with due authority for official purposes.

15. A light may be displayed in a taximeter cab for the purpose of an illuminated sign indicating that the vehicle is a taximeter cab plying for hire, but so that such light shall be just visible at a distance of one hundred feet.

16. (1) A person shall not manufacture, and no such person shall sell or offer for sale, any mask or type of mask which makes or purports to make, or may reasonably be assumed to purport to make any lamp comply with the provisions of this Order regarding an authorised dual purpose lamp, an authorised indicating lamp or an authorised head lamp without the written consent of the approving authority, which consent may be withdrawn by the approving authority at any time, and may be subject to such conditions as the approving authority specifies.

(2) Every mask so manufactured, sold, or offered for sale, shall have shown thereon in a clear and indelible manner—

- (a) the name or trade mark of the manufacturer; and
- (b) the month and year of manufacture.

17. (1) A person shall not display or cause or allow to be displayed upon any motor vehicle, except a motor vehicle belonging to or appropriated for the use of the Armed Forces, the Defence Services Identifying Light as hereinafter defined, or any light so resembling such light as to be likely to deceive.

(2) A person shall not have in his possession or control or use, or enter or occupy any motor vehicle upon which is displayed the Defence Services Identifying Light, or any light resembling such light, unless such vehicle belongs to or is appropriated for the use of the Armed Forces and is being used with due authority for official purposes.

(3) The Defence Services Identifying Light means a circular azure light one inch in diameter the colour of which conforms to the British Standard Colour No. 4 azure.

18. (1) A person shall not drive, be in charge of, or leave any motor vehicle in any public place not being formed on private property, between sunset and sunrise, unless it has white paint or other white material not less conspicuous than white paint applied or affixed in a strip of an even width of not less than three inches along the bumper bars, running boards, and the lower edges of the mudguards. Where the vehicle has bumper bars, running boards, and mudguards the paint or other material shall be applied or affixed thereto. Where the vehicle has no bumper bar or running board or mudguard, the paint or other material shall be applied or affixed in a position on such vehicle approximating as nearly as possible to that of bumper bars, running boards, and mudguards.

(2) Any such white paint, white material, or white surface aforesaid shall be maintained in a clean condition and unobscured.

19. A person shall not, between sunset and sunrise, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding twenty miles per hour: Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply to a motor vehicle which is being used by a constable or Commonwealth Officer or a member of the Civil Defence Forces, or a person engaged in any civil defence service in the exercise of his duty.

20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any law of the Commonwealth of the State of Western Australia, or any regulations made under any such law providing for the lighting of motor vehicles, no person in charge of, driving, riding, propelling or using a motor vehicle in any part of the State shall be guilty of an offence in respect of the lighting of such vehicle, if the lights carried thereon are not in accordance with the requirements of any such law or regulation by reason only of the fact that they are screened or dimmed in the manner and to the extent required by this Order.

21. (1) Any constable may by notice in writing addressed to an owner of any motor vehicle require that owner to produce the vehicle at the police station nearest to his place of abode, or at such other place as is specified in such notice, at the time mentioned in such notice, for the purpose of having the lighting of the vehicle tested in order to ascertain whether it complies with the provisions of this Order, and the owner shall, on service of such notice, comply with any requirement contained therein.

(2) A notice issued in pursuance of this clause shall be deemed to have been served on the owner if the notice is delivered to him personally or posted to him at his last known place of abode in a prepaid addressed envelope.

22. (1) Where any motor vehicle is alleged to have been concerned in the commission of any contravention of this Order, the owner of the vehicle, or the person in whose name the vehicle is registered, or the person having custody of the vehicle, shall give such information as he is required to give by any constable as to the identity of the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time of his alleged contravention.

(2) It shall be sufficient defence in proceedings against any person for failure to comply with the requirements of this clause if that person proves to the satisfaction of the Court that he did not know and could not with reasonable diligence have ascertained who was the driver or person in charge at the time when the alleged contravention was committed.

23. Any direction which any person is authorised to give in pursuance of this Order—

- (a) may be given, either verbally or in writing, by telephone, telegraph, or in such other manner as that person deems sufficient to bring the direction to the notice of any person affected thereby;
- (b) may be given so as to operate for any period or periods, or for any time or times, or in any part or parts of the State; and
- (c) may contain such incidental and supplementary directions as appear to the person giving the direction to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the direction.

24. Any certificate signed or purporting to be signed by the approving authority to the effect that any type of mask has or has not been approved by him or that he has or has not given his consent to the manufacture, sale, or offering for sale by any person of any mask or type of mask shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated therein.

25. Nothing in this Order shall apply to any motor vehicle while it is being used for the purposes of the Armed Forces, and any such vehicle while it is driven by or is in charge of a member of the said Armed Forces may display any light required or authorised to be displayed by the Naval Board, the Military Board, or the Air Board, as the case may require.

26. This Order shall come into operation on the day upon which publication thereof is made in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.
