ORDER UNDER REGULATION 4 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided (amongst other things) that if it appears to the Minister to be necessary or expedient, in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, that special precautions should be taken for the security of any place, he may, by order, declare that place to be a prohibited place, either generally or during such hours or during the existence of such circumstances as are specified in the order for the purposes of the Regulations: And whereas, by Instrument of Delegation dated the seventh day of May, 1942, made in pursuance of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, John Curtin, the Minister of State for Defence, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area, the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And whereas by regulation 4 (6) (b) of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation, or by separate Order, authorise any officer or person to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over or be in or in the neighbourhood of a prohibited place: And whereas by regulation 4 (6) (c) of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation, or by separate Order, specify an officer or person to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer or person in charge of any prohibited place for the purposes of these regulations: And whereas it appears to me, Oswald Vick Hoad, Colonel Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, necessary and expedient, in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth and the efficient prosecution of the war, that special precautions should be taken for the security of the places referred to in the Schedule hereto, being places situate within the said Western Australia Lines of Communication Area: Now, therefore I, the said Oswald Vick Hoad, acting in pursuance of the said regulation and Instrument of Delegation, do hereby order as follows:—

- (1) that the places described in the Schedule hereto are declared to be prohibited places generally for the purpose of the National Security (General) Regulations from the date of the making of this Order;
- (2) that Temporary Major Robert Montague Black (W. 237340), Intelligence Corps, is authorised to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over, or be in or in the neighbourhood of the said prohibited places;
- (3) that Temporary Captain John Salter, M.C. (W. 242887), Administering Command "M" Garrison Coy., Internment Camps, is specified as the officer to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer in charge of the said prohibited places for the purpose of these regulations.

The Schedule.

- (a) All that area of land known as Wungong Brook Catchment Area, more particularly described in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia dated the 17th August, 1923, and as shown coloured blue on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 3626.
- (b) All that area of land known as Victoria Reservoir Catchment Area, more particularly described in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia dated the 17th August, 1923, and as shown coloured yellow on Plan M.W.S.S. and D.D. W.A. No. 2040.
- (c) All that area of land known as Churchman Brook Catchment Area, more particularly described in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia dated the 23rd November, 1923, and as shown coloured green on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 2803.
- (d) All that area of land known as Mt. Eliza Reservoir Reserve, containing all that land within the fence surrounding Mt. Eliza Reservoirs in King's Park, commencing at a point about nine hundred feet west of the southern end of Bellevue terrace and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction for about seven hundred and thirty feet; thence south-easterly for about three hundred and fifty feet; thence easterly for about three hundred and fifty feet; thence north-easterly for about five hundred feet; thence north-westerly for about six hundred and fifty feet to the point of commencement, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (e) All that area of land known as Osborne Park Reservoir Reserve, containing all that land bounded by lines commencing at the south-western corner of Lot 956, Roberts street, and proceeding thence in a northerly direction along the Western boundary of Lot 956 to the southern boundary of Lot 978, McDonald street; thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundaries of Lots 978 and 979, McDonald street, and in a northerly direction along the western boundary of the said Lot 979 to McDonald street, thence in a westerly direction to the eastern boundary of Lot 983; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of Lot 983 to its south-eastern corner; thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundaries of Lots 983, 984, and 985, McDonald street, to the eastern boundary of Lot 947, Roberts street; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said Lot 947, Roberts street, to the south-eastern corner of Lot 947; thence in an eastern direction to the point of commencement, the south-western corner of Lot 956, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (f) All that area of land known as Osborne Park High Level Tank, containing the whole of the land in Lot 5, Villiers street, Osborne Park, and being portion of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1030, Folio 210, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. 6485.
- (g) All that area of land known as East Scarborough High Level Tank, containing the whole of the land in Lot 1076 at the intersection of Princess road and North Beach road, Scarborough, and being the whole of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1071, Folio 87, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. 6485.
- (h) All that area of land known as Scarborough Service Tank, containing the whole of the land within a radius of one chain of the Service Tank on Swan Location 1911, in the City Endowment Lands, near the junction of Brompton road and Scarborough road, the said Service Tank, being shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (i) All that area of land known as Mon Repos High Level Tank, containing the whole of the land within a radius of one chain of the High Level Tank situated near the junction of Hagan street and Wellington street on Reserve Number 1665, Mosman Park Road District, the said High Level Tank, being shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (j) All that area of land known as Buckland Hill Reservoir Reserve, containing the whole of the land fenced and comprising Reserve Number 13374, enclosing the obelisk on Buckland Hill, North Fremantle Municipality, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (k) All that area of land known as Richmond Reservoir Reserve, containing all that land bounded on the north by View terrace, on the east by the western boundaries of Lots 254 and 221, on the south by Pier street, and on the west by the eastern boundaries of Lots 222 and 253, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (l) All that area of land known as Melville Reservoir Reserve, containing all the land bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of Kitchener road and Prinsep road, proceeding thence southerly along Prinsep road to the deviated portion of French road; thence westerly and then northerly along the said deviated road to French road; thence westerly along French road to the south-eastern corner of Lot 996; thence northerly along the eastern boundaries of Lots 996 and 983 to Kitchener road; thence easterly along Kitchener road to the point of commencement, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (m) All that area of land known as Applecross Service Tank Reserve, containing all that triangular piece of land comprising Lot 6 and bounded by Duncraig road, Strome road, and Carron road, Applecross, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.
- (n) All that area of land known as Greenmount Reservoir Reserve, containing the whole of the land fenced and comprising Reserve Number 10481, situated near Greenmount Railway Station, Greenmount, and as shown coloured red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 6485.

DEFENCE QUARTERING ORDER.

IN pursuance of subregulation (2) of regulation 10 of the National Security (Military Forces) Regulations, and in pursuance of paragraph (3) of the Defence Quartering Order, I, Colonel Oswald Vick Hoad, the officer holding the office of Commander, Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, do hereby appoint the areas in the Schedule hereto to be Defence Quartering Areas from the date hereof:—

By-law Relating to Watercourses.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, the Road Board of any District is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act; and whereas the Preston Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of any authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-law:—

Watercourses.

No person shall cause or allow any obstruction in any watercourse, water channel, creek or other waters passing through or adjoining or abutting on his property, within the towns of Donnybrook, either by the construction of permanent or temporary weirs or dams, or by allowing any accumulation of rubbish, soil, sand, or dead or growing scrub or timber, and shall, at least once in every year, so clean and maintain such watercourses, water channels, or creeks so as to retain their full natural discharging capacity.

No person shall alter or deviate in any way the course of any watercourse, channel, or creek without first having obtained the permission of the Board in writing.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note:—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for two (2) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing in May, 1942.

2.—Wages.

(a) Basic wage—£4 10s. 10d. per week.

If an engine-driver also attends to an ammonia compressor, he shall be paid an additional sum of 1s. 0d. per shift.

If an engine-driver also attends to an electric generator or dynamo, he shall be paid an additional sum of 1s. 0d. per shift.

An engine-driver who is in charge of plant, and being the only person of his class employed on the plant and doing the general repair work of the plant, in addition to the work of engine-driving, but not when he merely assists the fitter or engineer to do such work, shall be paid 1s. 0d. per shift additional.

3.—No Reduction.

Nothing in this Award shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

4.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as agreed in writing between the parties from time to time. Failing agreement, the week's work shall be worked as follows:—

Five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours, and one (1) shift of four (4) hours:

(a) Provided, however, that this provision shall be deemed to have been complied with if the ordinary working hours do not exceed eighty-eight (88) hours per fortnight, to be worked in alternate weeks of forty-eight (48) and forty (40) hours respectively, each of such weeks to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours each: Provided, further, that such hours of work may be worked under a roster which shall provide for an average of forty-four (44) hours per week spread over a period of three (3) weeks.

(b) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires shall be included.

5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the daily hours as fixed in accordance with clause 4 (a) shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) Work done on Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. Foundation Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

6.—Holidays.

(a) Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to fourteen (14) days' annual leave each year on full pay; or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer.

(b) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under this clause.

(c) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

7.—Casual Workers.

(a) A casual worker shall mean and include an employee competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be), before the expiration of six days from and including the date he starts work.

9.—Rotation of Shifts.

If Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be kept.

10.—Definition.

'Engine-driver' means any person who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity, or any other motive power (other than manual or animal power) used for the purpose of generating electric current.

11.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the areas comprised within the Municipalities of Albany and Narrogin.

12.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all engine-drivers engaged in the production of electric current within the area prescribed in clause 11 hereof, but shall not apply to the driving of any internal combustion engine of 30 or less B.H.P.

13.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employers' machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

14.—Payment for Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-half (½) day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. (a) Where any single engine in the power-house exceeds 100 h.p.—Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as agreed in writing between the parties from time to time. Failing agreement, the week's work shall be worked as follows:—

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(No. 11 of 1942.)

(Reg. 11/5/42.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this sixth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, between the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, of the one part, and the Minister for Labour, the Commissioner of Railways, and the Commissioner of Main Roads (hereinafter referred to as "the employers") of the other part: Whereas under an Agreement between the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, and the abovenamed employers, dated the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, regulating and prescribing the conditions in connection with the employment of survey workers, provision is made in clause 3 of the said Agreement for work on Sundays to be paid at the rate of time and a half: And whereas at the date of the said Agreement the said Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, was not registered in the Court of Arbitration as an Association under the Act: And whereas the said union subsequently became registered in the said Court under the style or title of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the union"): And whereas the said union has applied to the employers for new conditions of employment including, *inter alia*, increased rates for Sunday work, to be prescribed in an Industrial Agreement or Award to be registered in the Court of Arbitration: And whereas correspondence and discussions have taken place between the union and the employers both prior to and subsequent to the tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two: And whereas the parties appeared before the Court of Arbitration on the thirtieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, and the union, by its advocate, and the employers, by their advocate, in consultation before the Court, and under the advice and assistance of the Court, have agreed that survey employees working on Sundays should be paid at the rate of double time instead of time and a half, as prescribed by the before recited Agree-

ment, except, however, in the case of employees whose wage covers a seven-day week: Now, therefore, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties as follows:—

1. The employees mentioned in the Agreement before-recited and employed as survey hands shall be paid, as from a date to be agreed upon between the union and the employers, at the rate of double time for Sunday work in lieu of time and a half, the rate heretofore obtaining.

2. This Agreement shall remain in force until altered, amended, or replaced by a subsequent agreement pursuant to the abovenamed Act or by an Award made between the parties: Provided that its term shall not exceed three years.

3. This Agreement is expressly made without prejudice to the rights of any of the parties as regards all other conditions and terms of employment now subsisting or hereafter to be substituted therefor by any Industrial Agreement or Award, such other conditions and terms of employment to be agreed between the parties and embodied in an Industrial Agreement or, if no agreement arrived at, to be fixed and determined by the Court of Arbitration as an Award pursuant to the provisions of the Act.
