WHEREAS it is provided by the Game Act, 1912-1913, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State, or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1924, it is provided that the portions of the State and localities defined in the Schedule thereto shall be a Reserve for Grey Kangaroos, known scientifically as *Macropus giganteus*: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation a defined locality: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, exempt from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation, and the declaration contained therein, all those localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto as from the 1st day of May, 1942, until the 31st day of October, 1942:—

### Schedule.

All that area of the State lying to the eastward of a straight line drawn from Lake Magenta, in the Roe Land District, to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird, or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals, birds, or insects the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State, to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the name of the birds, commonly known as "Black Cockatoos," shall be added to the Third Schedule to the said Act, so that the said birds shall be vermin within the Preston Vermin District, for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the said Act, do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the Vermin Act, 1918-1938, the name of the birds commonly known as "Black Cockatoos," so that such

birds shall be "Vermin" for the purposes of the said Act, but I declare that the operation of this Proclamation shall be restricted to the Preston Vermin District and shall have effect therein only.

## FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with section 7, subsection (1) of the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934, which reads as follows:—

## INDUSTRIES ASSISTANCE ACT, 1915-1940.

The Treasury,

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 29 of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915-1940, has been pleased to amend the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 23rd day of April, 1915, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of November, 1915, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

## Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by adding thereto further regulations as follows:—

8. (1) This regulation is made for the purposes of subsection (6) of section 14 of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915-1940, and shall apply only in respect of advances made or commodities supplied after the commencement of the Industries Assistance Act Amendment Act, 1940 (No. 42 of 1940), and only in respect of such advances or commodities when the same are made out of or supplied with moneys in the hands of the Commissioners of the Agricultural Bank of Western Australia other than moneys loaned to the State for purposes of drought relief under the Commonwealth of Australia Loan (Drought Relief) Act, 1940 (No. 71 of 1940).

(2) Every application for an advance under the Act shall be addressed to the Industries Assistance Board and shall be lodged with the manager of the local branch of the Agricultural Bank.

(3) The provisions of regulations 2, 4, 5, and 6 of these regulations shall apply and be deemed to be incorporated in and form part of this regulation.

(4) Advances to which this regulation applies shall be repayable on demand, or by such periodical instalments and at such periods as the Board may from time to time determine.

(5) The rate of interest payable in respect of such advances shall be five pounds per centum per annum, or such other rate as may from time to time be fixed by the Board and notified in the *Government Gazette*.

(6) Interest shall be payable half-yearly in each financial year.

(7) Where in the opinion of the Board it is desirable to do so, the Board may at any time agree in writing with any applicant, or with any creditor of an applicant, for the waiver or postponement of any charge arising under the Act, either wholly or in part, or to any basis or method of application or division of the proceeds of the realisation of any property the subject of any such charge.

9. (1) This regulation is made for the purposes of subsection (6) of section 14 of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915-1940, and shall apply only in respect of advances made out of or commodities supplied with moneys in the hands of the Commissioners of the Agricultural Bank of Western Australia which have been loaned to the State by the Commonwealth for purposes of drought relief under the Commonwealth of Australia Loan (Drought Relief) Act, 1940 (No. 71 of 1940), after the commencement of the Industries Assistance Act Amendment Act, 1940 (No. 42 of 1940).

(2) Where applications are made under this regulation the advances shall be made or the commodities shall be supplied under the provisions of the Industries Assistance Act, 1915-1940, by the Commissioners of the Agricultural Bank of Western Australia for the purposes of drought relief out of the moneys referred to in paragraph (1) of this regulation.

(3) Every application for an advance under this regulation shall be addressed to the said Commissioners, and shall be lodged with the manager of the local branch of the Agricultural Bank.

(4) The provisions of regulations 2, 4, 5, and 6 of these regulations, with such adaptations as may be necessary, shall apply and be deemed to be incorporated in and form part of this regulation.

(5) The advance made or the moneys owing for the commodities supplied shall be repayable to the Commissioners in the following manner:—

(a) Where the Commissioners are of the opinion that the financial position of the borrower is satisfactory, and provided advances made from Commonwealth loan funds are repaid in full, the Commissioners may readvance the sum collected in respect of the advances made during the 1942-43 season, either wholly or in part, and spread repayments over the balance of the loan period, or may fund such debt under the Act and spread repayments over a period of years, or over the last three years, of the Commonwealth loan period.

(b) In other cases the Commissioners may readvance the sum collected each year, together with further advances, where necessary, and such arrangement to continue until the borrower's financial position is such that moneys may be readvanced to the borrower and repayments in respect of such advances spread over a period or funded, under conditions as set out in the preceding paragraph.

(c) On application, the Commissioners may make advances to liquidate indebtedness due by a settler in respect of sheep to the bill of sale holder or hence, and/or for the purpose of restocking with sheep, and to spread the repayment of such advance over the balance of the Commonwealth loan period, or may fund such advance under the Act and spread repayments over a period of years or over the last three years of the Commonwealth loan period.

(6) The rate of interest payable in respect of advances made under this regulation shall be the same as that payable by the State in respect of the moneys loaned to the State by the Commonwealth as aforesaid.

(7) Interest in respect of advances made under this regulation shall be calculated as from the date when the advance is made, and shall be payable on the date when the advance or any part thereof is repaid: Provided that, insofar as any such advance was made prior to the 1st day of April, 1942, no interest thereon shall be assessed in respect of the period prior to the said date.

(8) Where in the opinion of the Commissioners it is desirable to do so, the Commissioners may at any time agree in writing with any applicant, or with any creditor of an applicant, for the waiver or postponement of any charge arising under the Act, either wholly or in part, or to any basis or method of application or division of the proceeds of the realisation of any property the subject of any such charge.

3. The secretary of the Board, or such other person as the Board may appoint, shall be the secretary of the Brigade.

4. The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain, where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the Equipment Officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal, and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board conjointly.

##### Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the Brigade whilst engaged in fire-fighting, and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant, and, in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the Brigade present at the fire, shall exercise all the power and duties of the captain. The captain shall, when so directed by the Board, instruct all owners or occupiers to plough a break or breaks on all cleared land or lands under pasture.

##### Membership of Brigade.

7. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following:—(a) Subscribing members; (b) fire-fighting members, and (c) associate members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who, being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates:—

(5) No fees or subscriptions shall be payable either by fire-fighting members or associate members, and the enrolment of persons as such members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Board.

(6) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a fire-fighting member.

##### Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the Board in purchase of equipment, etc., payment for services and generally for the purposes of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Board, but the secretary shall keep a separate record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

##### Meetings of Brigade.

9. Meetings of the Brigade shall be held as follows:—One annual meeting and at least one meeting prior to and one immediately after the bush fire season each year and other meetings, as the captain of the Brigade may deem necessary, shall be held and minutes of such meetings be recorded.

By-laws of the Mundaring Road Board relating to the Establishment, Maintenance, and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Road District of Mundaring.

#### Establishment of Brigade.

1. On the resolution of the Board to establish, maintain, and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the Brigade and application, accompanied by a copy of these by-laws, shall be made to the Minister for Lands for its registration accordingly.

The Board may appoint an Equipment Officer, who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Board for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the Captain where, if possible, motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there are more than one such depots in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Board shall appoint Bush Fire Control Officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act, shall be vested in the chairman and secretary of the Board jointly.

## Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Medical Register Regulations.

## Interpretation.

2. In these regulations—

"Act" means the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

"Committee" means the Medical Register Committee appointed under the Act.

“Practitioner” means a medical practitioner whose name appears on the Register.

“Register” means the Workers’ Compensation Medical Register established and kept under and in accordance with the Act and these regulations.

“Registrar” means the officer appointed under these regulations to carry out the duties of a registrar and secretary.

3. The Committee shall meet whenever the chairman so decides and at the times and places specified by notice from the chairman.

4. A quorum shall consist of the chairman and one of the representatives nominated by the Governor in Council and one of the practitioners appointed to the Committee.

5. Each member (including the chairman) shall have one vote and, in case of equality of voting, the chairman shall have a casting vote. All questions at any meetings shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members present.

6. No resolution passed or any act, matter, or thing done or authorised by or at any meeting shall be rescinded, amended, cancelled or revoked at any subsequent meeting unless prior notice of such intended rescission, amendment, cancellation, or revocation has been given in the notices convening the meeting.

7. The Committee shall have power to appoint and pay and dismiss an officer, hereinafter referred to as the Registrar, whose duties shall include those of a Registrar and a secretary. The Registrar shall establish and maintain the Register, keep minutes of meetings and generally perform all acts and functions necessary for otherwise carrying out these regulations and the directions of the Committee.

8. The conduct of every meeting shall be in the hands of the chairman, whose decision on all points of order or as to procedure shall be final.

9. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar and shall, when signed by the chairman, be binding and conclusive for all purposes.

#### Registration.

10. All practitioners whose names appear in the copy Register published by the Medical Board under and in accordance with the provisions of the Medical Act, 1894-1940, in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of January, 1942, shall have their names placed on the original register. Any person may, on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d., inspect the register between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., at the office of the Registrar, or (if there be no office) at the place where the Register is deposited for safe-keeping.

11. The Register shall be kept by the Registrar in the manner and form of the register published by the Medical Board, as aforesaid.

12. The Registrar shall from time to time strike off the names of all practitioners who have died and shall make such alterations and amendments in the Register as the Committee may from time to time direct, for the purpose of making the same an accurate record of the names and addresses of the practitioners for the time being. At the end of each quarter, the Registrar shall make inquiries from the Registrar appointed under the Medical Act, 1894-1940, and as a consequence of information so received shall add to or strike off the Register as the case may be, the names of practitioners who have been added to or struck off the Register kept by the Registrar appointed under the Medical Act, 1894-1940.

13. The name of any person registered under these regulations shall be struck off the Register, if such person is adjudged by the Committee, after due inquiry, to be guilty of any offence or conduct which justifies deregistration. Every practitioner who has been deregistered for a limited period may, upon the expiration of the period of deregistration, make application in Form A in the Schedule hereto, to have his name restored to the Register. The Registrar shall restore the name of any such practitioner to the Register, upon the direction of the Committee.

#### Complaints.

14. When a complaint concerning any practitioner is received by the Committee, such practitioner shall have served upon him personally or posted to him at his address in the Register, or if there be no such address to his last known address in Western Australia, a copy of such complaint and notice as in Form B in the Schedule hereto of the date (not being less than 14 days from such service or posting), when such complaint will be heard by the Committee and considered. The chairman may upon application of any such practitioner extend the time of hearing of the complaint.

15. At the meeting of the Committee at which a complaint is heard, the same may thereupon be dealt with forthwith, or the Committee may from time to time adjourn the hearing to such dates and hours and places, as may seem just.

16. Every practitioner who receives any notice of complaint aforesaid may apply to the chairman to have issued a summons for the attendance of any person or production of any documents whom or which it may be desired to call or produce.

17. The chairman, upon receipt of any such application, or upon the resolution of the Committee, shall summon by writing under his hand any person whose evidence shall, in the opinion of the practitioner charged, or the Committee, be material to the subject-matter of the complaint, to be investigated, to attend before the Committee at such time and place as shall be specified therein. Books, papers, writings, deeds, and documents of which any Court of law might compel the production, and which contain matter relevant to the complaint to be investigated, shall be brought before the Committee by the means aforesaid. Form C in the Schedule hereto may be availed of by the chairman as the occasion requires.

18. Any practitioner served with a notice under the provisions of regulation 14 and any person served with a summons under regulation 17 shall attend before the Committee at the time and place specified in such summons or notice and shall in all other respects comply with the requisitions of the notice or summons. Penalty £100.

19. All persons who appear before the Committee upon the hearing of any complaint may be examined upon oath or otherwise upon matters relevant to the complaint which the Committee is investigating.

(3) The terms "one acre" and "nursery" as used in paragraph (2) of this regulation have the same meanings respectively as those given to the said terms in subsection (3) of section 4 of the Plant Diseases (Registration Fees) Act, 1941, and the term "orchard" includes part of an orchard when in accordance with section 4 of the said Act a part of an orchard is required to be treated as a separate and distinct orchard.

(4) This regulation shall come into operation and take effect as from and including the 1st day of July, 1942.

## Regulation 8.—Medical Certificate for Winding Engine-drivers.

1. Every person in charge of a winding engine used for raising or lowering men or materials on any mine shall, within three months of the coming into force of this regulation, and thereafter at intervals of not more than one year, forward to the Inspector a certificate, in the Form No. 19 in the Schedule, provided by a duly qualified and registered medical practitioner stating that such person is not suffering from deafness, defective vision, epilepsy, disease of the heart, or other physical infirmity to any such extent as would or would be likely to render him unfit for his duties or liable to become suddenly incapable of controlling his engine.

2. Any engine-driver who in the opinion of a duly qualified medical practitioner is not in a fit state of physical health to have charge of a winding engine shall not take such charge, but may take charge of any other stationary engine, subject to the sanction of the inspector having been first obtained.

3. Any engine-driver who does not comply with or contravenes this regulation, and any manager who employs such engine-driver, shall each be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds.
