# PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

P.W. 706/42.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, that for the purposes of the said Act the word "Town," or "Townsite" means and includes, *inter alia*, any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered to declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas all that land, being the whole of the territory comprising the Gosnells Road District, is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land, being the whole of the territory comprising the Gosnells Road District, shall be a Townsite, to be known as ''Gosnells,'' within the meaning and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 4 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS. WHEREAS by regulation 4 of the National Scenrity (General) Regulations it is provided (amongst other things) that if it appears to the Minister to be necessary or expedient in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, that special precantions should be taken for the scenrity of any place he may by order declare that place to be a prohibited place, either generally or during such hours or during the existence of such circumstances as are specified in the Order for the purposes of the regulations: And whereas by Instrument of Delegation dated the seventh day of May, 1942, made in pursuance of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, John Curtin, the Minister of State for Defence, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the Office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And whereas by regulation 4 (6) (b) of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any Order made nucler subregulation (1) of this regulation, or by separate Order, authorise any officer or person to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over or be in or in the neighbourhood of a prohibited place: 

- (1) that the places described in the Schedule hereto are declared to be prohibited places generally for the purpose of the National Security (General) Regulations from the date of the making of this Order;
  (2) that Temporary Major Robert Montagne Black (W. 237340), Intelligence Corps, is authorised to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over, or be in or in the neighbourhood of the said prohibited places;
  (3) that Temporary Captain John Salter, M.C. (W. 242887), Administering Command "M" Garrison Coy., Intermnent Camps, is specified as the officer to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer in charge of the said prohibited places for the purpose of these recentlations. regulations.

#### The Schedule.

The Schedule. All that area of land, being portion of Avon Location M, the subject of L.T.O. Diagram 12004 (area 313 acres 1 rood 4 perches), being more particularly described as follows:--All that area of land contained within the boundaries described as starting at a point on the east side of a public road opposite to the sonth-cast corner of Spring Hill Siding and proceeding in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of said public road on a bearing of 6deg. 22min. for a distance of 1093.2 links; thence on a bearing of 338deg. 46min. for a distance of 968.1 links; thence on a bearing of 332deg. 2min. for a distance of 44.6 links to the north-west corner of the area; thence on a bearing of 73deg. 3min. 30secs. for a distance of 3582.7 links; thence on a bearing of 356deg. 33min. for a distance of 4242 links; thence on a bearing of 58deg. 32min. for a distance of 2162 links; thence on a bear-ing of 135deg. 28min. for a distance of 4428 links; thence on a bear-ing of 135deg. 28min. for a distance of 2462 links; thence on a bear-ing of 360.5 links; thence on a bearing of 250.6 links; thence on a bearing of 232deg. 18min. for a distance of 3686.5 links; thence on a bearing of 252deg. 33min. for a distance of 3805.9 links to the point of commencement. #### ORDER UNDER REGULATION 4 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided (amongst other things) that if it appears to the Minister to be necessary or expedient in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, that special precantions should be taken for the security of any place he To be the way, or for maintaining simplifies and services essential to the fire of the community, that special precantions should be taken for the security of any place he may by order declare that place to be a prohibited place, either generally or during such hours or during the existence of such circumstances as are specified in the Order for the purposes of the regulations: And whereas by Instrument of Delegation dated the seventh day of May, 1942, made in pursuance of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, John Curtin, the Minister of State for Defence, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the Office of Commander of a Lines of Communication Area the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And whereas by regulation 4 (6) (b) of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any Order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation, or by separate Order, authorise any officer or person to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over or be in or in the neighbourhood of a prohibited place: And whereas by regulation 4 (6) (c) of the National Security (General) Regulations, it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any Order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation, or by separate Order, specify an officer or person to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer or person in charge of any prohibited place for the purposes of these regulations: And whereas it appears to une, Oswald Vick Hoad, Colonel Commanding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area, necessary and expedient, in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth and the efficient prosention of the war, that special precantions should be taken for the security of the places referred the war, that special precautions should be taken for the scennity of the places referred to in the Schedule hereto, being places situate within the said Western Anstralia Lines of Communication Area: Now, therefore I, the said Oswald Vick Hoad, acting in pursnance of the said regulation and Instrument of Delegation, do hereby order as follows:

- (1) that the places described in the Schedule hereto are declared to be prohibited places generally for the purpose of the National Security (General) Regulations from the date of the making of this Order;
  (2) that Temporary Major Robert Montague Black (W. 237340), Intelligence Corps, is authorised to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over, or be in or in the neighbourhood of the said prohibited places;
  (3) that Temporary Captain John Salter, M.C. (W. 242887), Administering Command ''M'' Garrison Coy, Internment Camps, is specified as the officer to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer in charge of the said prohibited places for the purpose of these regulations.

#### The Schedule.

All that area of land and ocean contained within the boundaries described hereunder:—Starting at a point in the Indian Ocean at a distance of two (2) miles due west of Separation Point and proceeding from thence along a line running due east through Separation Point to a spot twenty (20) miles inland and due east of Separation Point; thence in a south-easterly direction along a line running parallel to and at a distance of twenty (20) miles from the coast to a spot due east of the mouth of the Moore River; thence westerly from this point along a line passing through the mouth of the Moore River to a point in the Indian Ocean two (2) miles distant from the coast; thence in a north-westerly direction along a line running parallel to and at a distance of two (2) miles from the coast to the point of commencement.

#### Western Australia.

INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1937-1940.

#### Income Tax-Notice to make Returns.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1940, and the regulations thereunder, I hereby require returns of all income derived during the year of income ended 30th June, 1942 (or the accounting period, if any, adopted under the Act in lieu of that year), to be furnished to me at the Office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth, in such of the forms provided for the purpose as is applicable, containing the information and particulars mentioned or referred to in the form and verified by declaration as therein set forth, and accompanied by all such balance sheets, profit and loss accounts, statements, and other documents as are mentioned in the form or as are requisite, on or before the dates hereinafter stated.

On or before the 31st July, 1942:-

 (a) by every person resident in Western Australia who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and by every married woman whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was not less than £100, and by every married man resident in Western Australia whose total income, from all sources, was not less than £200, derived exclusively under one or more of the following headings, viz., remuneration as an employee, stipend, interest, annuities, dividends from any company, whether incorporated in the State or not, and whether paid out of income derived from sources in or outside the State, or any other sources (not being a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term).

On or before the 31st August, 1942:---

- (b) by every person resident in Western Australia who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and by every married woman whose total income from all somees in Western Australia was not less than £100, and by every married man resident in Western Australia whose total income from all sources was not less than £200, derived wholly or partly from a source which is a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term, including a professional business;
- (e) by every company deriving income in Western Australia whose total income from all sources in Western Australia was £1 or more;
- (d) by every non-resident person whose total income derived from all sources in Western Australia was £1 or more.

Every person or institution holding money lodged at interest in Western Australia is hereby required to furnish a statement showing the names and addresses of depositors to each of whom interest in excess of £25 was paid or eredited during the year ended 30th June, 1942, and the amount of interest paid or credited to each.

A return of the total income of every partnership is hereby required to be furnished by the partners resident in Western Australia or by any one of them. Where there is no partner resident in Western Australia the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Western Australia for the partnership. Each individual partner who is not married, i.e., bachelor, spinster, widower, widow, or divorced person, and every married woman whose total income from all sources was not less than £100 and every married man whose total income from all sources was not less than £200 is also required to furnish a return.

A return of the total income derived in Western Australia by every trust is hereby required to be furnished by the trustees resident in Western Australia or by any one of them. Where there is no trustee resident in Western Australia, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Western Australia for the trustees.

Every owner or charterer of ships whose principal place of business is ont of Australia, who had amounts paid or payable to him in respect of the earriage of passengers, livestock, mails, or goods shipped in Western Australia is hereby required to make and furnish a return of the amount so paid or payable.

Every agent for a principal, whether resident or non-resident, is hereby required to furnish a return demanded of his principals.

Every company is hereby required to furnish, in addition to the return of income, separate statements to accompany the return showing:---

 (a) the names and addresses of all shareholders and the amount of dividend (if any) paid to each shareholder during the year ended the 30th June, 1942;

- (b) the names and addresses of all persons to whom interest in excess of £25 was paid or eredited during the year preceding the year of tax and the amount so paid or eredited to each person during the year ended the 30th June, 1942;
- (e) the total amount of interest paid or eredited during the year ended the 30th June, 1942, to depositors and debenture holders, who are not residents of Australia, on money secured by debentures of the company and used in Western Australia or used in acquiring assets for use or disposal in Western Australia, and on money lodged at interest in Western Australia with the company, after deducting (unless the Commissioner otherwise directs) interest paid or credited to a company not a resident of Australia but which has a public officer duly appointed under the Act;
- (d) the total amount of interest paid or credited during the year of income, in respect of debentures payable to bearer, the names and addresses of the holders of which are not supplied to the Commissioner by the company;
- (c) the names and addresses of all holders of debentures payable to bearer which the company is in a position to furnish (whether residents or non-residents), together with the amount of interest paid or credited during the year ended the 30th June, 1942, to each of such holders of debentures.

Every employer of labour is hereby required to furnish on or before the 31st August, 1942, a statement showing:----

- (a) the names and addresses of all persons employed by him during the year ended the 30th June, 1942;
- (b) the capacity in which each person was employed;
- (e) the total amount of remuneration earned by each person during that period;
- (d) the value of board, residence, or other allowance made to each person during that period.

The statement is required to show the actual amount earned during the period from 1st July, 1941, to 30th June, 1942, even though the employer's return is made up for a different period. Remuneration to persons at a rate less than \$100 per annum should be shown in one total.

The attention of all persons is drawn to the fact that all the returns and statements required by the foregoing notice to be furnished to the Commissioner are returns under the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1940, and are required to be furnished when called for. Failure to duly furnish them renders the persons concerned liable to a penalty fixed by section 211 (1) of the Act, viz., a penalty of not less than £2 or more than £100, as may be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

The returns, as required above, shall, where the person is also liable to furnish returns under the Commonwealth Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936-1940, be in a combined form for Commonwealth and State purposes.

# HOSPITAL FUND ACT, 1930-1937.

#### Notice to make Returns.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1937, and the regulations thereunder, I hereby require returns from persons liable to taxation under the said Act, personally or in any representative capacity, of all income derived during the year ended the 30th June, 1942, to be furnished on the prescribed form to me at the Office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth.

On or before the 31st August, 1942:---

(a) by every person who has not furnished an Income Tax return under the provisions of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937-1940, and whose gross income from all sources, other than from salary or wages, during the year mentioned was not less than £52.

The attention of all persons is drawn to the fact that the returns required by the foregoing notice to be furnished to the Commissioner of Taxation are returns under the Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1937, and are required to be furnished when called for.

Failure to furnish these returns renders the persons concerned liable to the penalties fixed by section 18 of the Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1937, viz., penalty for the first offence  $\pounds 20$ ; for any subsequent offence  $\pounds 100$ , as may be determined by a Court of competent jurisdietion.

The abovementioned Civil Defence Regulations, 1941, are amended as follows:----1. Regulation 19 (Gazette 17/10/1941) is amended by adding thereto a new paragraph as follows:-

(c) (i) In particular, the Council may by resolution appoint a subcommittee, to be known as the "Priority Subcommittee," and to consist of such number of members as the Council shall from time to time determine.

(ii) The primary function of the Priority Subcommittee shall be to determine and direct the order in which necessary works in relation to the repair or restoration of the supply of any utility or public service or any civil defence purposes essential for the convenience or protection of the civil population shall be undertaken and carried out, including the supply of plant and material and the employment of labour in relation to such works.

(iii) Where in the opinion of a majority of the Priority Subcommittee it is necessary for securing the public safety and order, or for securing and regulating the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, light, heat, power or other neces-sities, or for maintaining, controlling and regulating the means of transit, transport, sities, or for maintaming, controlling and regulating the means of transit, transport, navigation, locomotion or other services, or for the repair or restoration or for preparation for the repair or restoration of the supply of any utility or public service or any eivil defence purposes, the Priority Subcommittee may, by notice declared or given by the chairman or, in his absence, the deputy chairman of the Subcommittee, at any time and from time to time take, requisition, purchase, or otherwise acquire any article or thing or any plant, material, or equipment, and subject to any Commonwealth haws or regulations, may require any person whom-soever and wheresoever employed to work or otherwise render personal service in or in connection with any works or undertakings required in relation to any other in connection with any works or undertakings required in relation to any of the purposes hereinbefore mentioned.

(iv) Any person who refuses duly to comply with any notice or direction given to him under subparagraph (iii) hereof shall be guilty of a contravention of these regulations within the meaning of section twelve of the Act.

(v) Where any person makes or renders personal service pursuant to any notice or direction given to him under subparagraph (iii) hereof, and whilst he is so working or rendering personal service, he shall be entitled to receive from and be paid by the person, body or anthority on whose behalf the works, on which he is employed are being carried ont, salary, wages, or other renuncration, at the rate fixed by any award or industrial agreement which is applicable, or failing any such award or industrial agreement, at the rate nsually in operation in relation to the class of work which he performs for the said person, body, or authority; and such salary, wages, or other remuneration, until paid, shall be a debt due and payable to such person by the person, body, or authority aforesaid
