WHEREAS by section 8, subsection (1), of the Prisons Act, 1903-18, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare any Lock-up to be a Police Gaol: and whereas it is deemed expedient that the Lock-up (previously the Gaol) at Broome should be declared a Police Gaol: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said Lock-up (previously the Gaol) at Broome shall be a Police Gaol within the meaning of the Prisons Act, 1903-18.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941, that for the purposes of the said Act the word "Town," or "Townsite" means and includes, *inter alia*, any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered to declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas all that land, being the whole of the territory comprising the Gosnells Road District, is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land, being the whole of the territory comprising the Gosnells Road District, shall be a Townsite, to be known as "Gosnells," within the meaning and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1941.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, that the closing time for all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and except registered small shops) shall be in every week, on one week day, one o'clock; on the five other week days, six o'clock; and that all shops (except as aforesaid) shall be closed on those days not later than the hours mentioned above, which shall be the hours after noon in each day, and shall continue closed until eight o'clock, or such earlier hour as may from time to time be fixed by Proclamation (in respect either of all shops affected or of any class or classes of such shops) in the morning of the week day next following: And whereas similar provision was made by section 4 of the Early Closing Act, 1902, as amended by the Early Closing Act Amendment Act, 1911, which last-mentioned Acts were repealed by the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937: And whereas, under the said last-mentioned Acts, Proclamations were issued and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of February, 1912, and the 25th day of January, 1918, respectively, and are still in force, the effect of which, taken together is to permit butcher shops, wheresoever situate, to open at six o'clock in the morning of each week day (other than Saturday) and at five o'clock in the morning of each Saturday: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to cancel and revoke the said Proclamations and in lieu thereof to issue this Proclamation making other provisions, as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby cancel and revoke the two Proclamations hereinbefore mentioned, which were issued under the Early Closing Act, 1902, as amended by the Early Closing Act Amendment Act, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of February, 1912, and the 25th day of January, 1918, respectively, and also in lieu thereof do hereby fix the hour of six o'clock in the morning of each week day (other than Saturday) and five o'clock

in the morning of each Saturday in both cases instead of 8 o'clock in the morning, as the hour until which butchers' shops which are situated more than 25 miles in a direct line from the General Post Office at Perth shall continue closed under and in accordance with section 100 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1937, aforesaid.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, has been pleased to approve of the amendment by the Mount Magnet Hospital Board of Management of its by-laws for the control of the Medical Fund of the Mount Magnet Hospital, as set out in the resolution contained in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule—Resolution.

The by-laws for the control of the Medical Fund of the Mount Magnet Hospital as made by the Mount Magnet Hospital Board of Management under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of August, 1941, are amended as follows:—

By-law 9 is amended by deleting therefrom the words "Major operations, with the exception of urgent operations (an urgent operation is one where the postponing of the operation for more than twenty-four hours after the decision to operate has been made, would in the opinion of the Medical Officer be detrimental to the health of the patient)," where they appear in lines 12 to 18 of the said by-law, and inserting in lieu thereof the following words "Dental operations and major surgical operations. (Fees for all operations to be subject to private arrangement between the member and the Medical Officer.) The following surgical procedures, if performed without a general anaesthetic, shall be deemed minor operations, and be free of charge:—Opening boils, abscesses, suturing wounds, setting fractures, and such minor operations."

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

Leonora District Hospital.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 37 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, the Governor may make regulations for the purpose of the Act and may thereby formulate Model By-laws for the guidance of Boards in respect of all or any of the matters regarding which Boards may make by-laws; and whereas the Governor in Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the said section, has formulated Model By-laws as contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940; and whereas a Board may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: Now, therefore, Leonora District Hospital Board, being a Board within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, doth hereby adopt the Model By-laws contained in regulation 10 of the regulations made under the Hospitals Act, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1940, subject to the modifications described in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

Schedule of Alterations and Additions to Model By-laws.

Rule No. 16 to read as follows:—

Public Wards	13s. 6d. per day.
Public Wards (children under 13 years)	9s. 0d. per day.
Workers' compensation cases—As stipulated by Workers' Compensation Act.	
Parent or other person accompanying patient (breast-fed baby excluded)	6s. 0d. per day.
Babies born in Hospital and detained after discharge of mother	6s. 0d. per day.
Aboriginals and half-castes indentured or in employment	5s. 0d. per day.
Theatre fee—Minor operations	10s. 6d.
Theatre fee—Major operations	£1 1s. 0d.
X-ray screenings	7s. 6d.
X-ray filmings	12s. 6d.

Rule 21 to be added:—Audits shall be conducted monthly and years ending 30th June. The auditor shall be paid at the rate of £1 1s. each monthly audit. He shall be elected by the Board and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

At a meeting of the Board of Management of the Leonora District Hospital on the sixteenth day of April, 1942, the following resolution was passed:—Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund the object of which shall be to secure for its

subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits; and may, by by-laws, provide for the regulation and control of such Fund, and whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management at the Leonora District Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927, do hereby make by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

By-laws for the Control of Medical Funds, under section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927.

1. The term "subscribers" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges, and shall include, so far as benefits are concerned, the dependants of the subscriber.

2. The subscription shall be that sum of money which is determined by the Leonora District Hospital Board and shall be payable monthly, quarterly, or yearly.

3. The word "dependant" shall mean the wife, parents, and grand-parents of a subscriber, the sons, daughters, brothers, and sisters not over sixteen years of age of a subscriber and who are not in receipt of twenty shillings per week, who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the date of the illness or accident which the Medical Officer is required to treat.

(b) If the Medical Officer is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant, he may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

4. Every subscriber and his dependants shall, if required, submit to a medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Fund before he is accepted as a subscriber.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to medical and hospital treatment as an indoor or outdoor patient and to medicine, dressings, and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws, for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.

6. Subscribers employed by any mining company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of the employment: Provided the Mine Management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.

7. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—

- (a) Incurable diseases.
- (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for a benevolent institution.
- (d) Venereal disease.
- (e) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (f) Dentistry.
- (g) Insanity.
- (h) Accouchements (abortive or otherwise).
- (i) Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (j) Sera and vaccines.
- (k) Pathological examination fees.
- (l) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants unless the Board decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed by the Medical Officer must be paid for by the subscriber at a price to be fixed by the Board.

8. Subscribers and their dependants requiring outpatient attendance shall attend at the Medical Officer's surgery between such times as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time. In the event of their not being able to attend, a message should be left at the Medical Officer's surgery or residence before 9 a.m.

(b) The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at his surgery for treatment of subscribers at hours fixed by the Board.

9. When a subscriber, residing outside a radius to be fixed by the Board, requires the services of a Medical Officer, he shall pay the Medical Officer mileage at such rates as shall be arranged between the Fund and the Medical Officer.

10. The doctor shall keep such records as the Board may determine from time to time.

FIRE BRIGADES ACT, 1916-1941.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to section 38 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1916-1941, has been pleased to amend the Fire Brigades Act Regulations, made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of July, 1935, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time thereafter, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

(1) Regulations 73 to 98, inclusive, are repealed and new regulations are substituted in lieu thereof as follows:—

Offences.

73. No officer or fireman shall—

- (a) accept or engage in any employment for reward other than in connection with his duties: Provided that the foregoing shall not prevent any officer or fireman from—
 - (i) becoming a member or shareholder only of any incorporated company, or of any company or society of persons registered under any Statute;
 - (ii) holding any office in any society founded under the law relating to friendly societies;
- (b) accept any money, gifts or addresses for services rendered at a fire without permission of the Board;
- (c) supply information to the Press;
- (d) take orders at fires from citizens;
- (e) wear his uniform when off duty, unless when proceeding to or from duty;
- (f) absent himself while on duty from a station to which he is attached, without permission of the officer in charge;
- (g) indulge in gambling in or about the premises of a station;
- (h) take or cause to be taken any intoxicating liquors into the premises of a station without the consent of the Chief Officer;
- (i) otherwise conduct himself in a manner whereby the discipline, good order, or reputation of the Brigade may be imperilled.

74. (a) The Chief Officer may, on his own initiative or on receipt of a complaint in writing, suspend any officer or fireman.

(b) The Chief Officer shall be empowered to inquire into all alleged offences not involving suspension and to take such action as he may deem fit.

75. (a) When an officer or fireman is suspended and summoned to appear before the Chief Officer to answer a charge, he shall be so informed in writing at least 48 hours before the hearing thereof, and copies of all documents in connection with such charge shall be forwarded at the same time.

(b) He may have an advocate from his association or union, as the case may be, present at the inquiry and shall be allowed to call evidence and to hear all evidence and to interrogate any witness. It shall be mandatory for the person making the charge to be present and to give oral evidence. The Board shall provide a stenographer to fully report the proceedings, and shall subsequently provide a copy of the report to the Chief Officer and to the officer or fireman charged.

76. The Chief Officer shall report each alleged offence and his decision to the Board at its next meeting after an inquiry.

77. Any officer or fireman may appeal to the Board against a decision of the Chief Officer, and the Board may affirm, annul, or vary such decision.

78. Any officer may appeal against a decision of the Board to an Appeal Board constituted of one representative of the Board, one representative of his association, and a Stipendiary Magistrate (or some other person appointed by the Court) as chairman.

General.

79. Any officer or fireman desiring to terminate his service (unless under special circumstances) must give at least seven clear days' notice in writing, addressed to the Chief Officer. Any officer or fireman resigning or discontinuing his duties without such notice, or without special permission, shall be liable to forfeit all pay due to him, and to be formally dismissed.

80. Any married officer or fireman having quarters in a station shall be held responsible for any wilful damage during the occupancy of such quarters. The quarters shall be subject to inspection by the Chief Officer and by the officer in charge of the station, and when vacated must be left clean and in good order.

81. In the event of the Board sustaining any financial loss through misappropriation or through wilful damage to any property of the Board by an officer or fireman, the amount so misappropriated and/or the amount of the wilful damage so done may be deducted from any moneys due to such officer or fireman then or thereafter.

82. Any change in an officer's or fireman's marital condition shall be notified in writing to the Chief Officer.

83. Any communication which an officer or fireman may desire to place before the Board must be sent in writing through the Chief Officer.

84. When an officer or fireman is ordered to move from one station to another, the Board shall pay all reasonable expenses of removal, except when such removal be ordered by way of punishment, or is granted at the request of the officer or fireman.

85. Long service medals will be issued to an officer or fireman on the completion of 15 years' service with good conduct, and will not be liable to forfeiture. The medal must be worn on the right breast of tunic.

(2) Regulation 171B (*Gazette* 4th November, 1938) is repealed and a new regulation substituted in lieu thereof as follows:—

171B. (a) The owner and/or occupier of any yard or vacant land situate in any fire district to which the Act applies shall cause such yard or vacant land to be kept at all times free of inflammable matter (including trees, crops, grasses, and weeds) of any nature or quantity which may be, or cause, or be likely to become, either directly or indirectly a danger by fire to life or property.

(b) For the purposes of this regulation:—

“Owner” means the person for the time being receiving or entitled to receive the rents and profits of land, whether on his own account or as agent, trustee, or attorney for another person or who, if the land were let to a tenant at a rent, would be entitled to receive the rent as aforesaid.

“Occupier” means the inhabitant occupier of any land or, if there is no inhabitant occupier, the person entitled to the possession thereof.

“Person” includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate.

THE GOVERNMENT STOCK SALEYARDS ACT, 1941.

Department of Agriculture,

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, acting pursuant to section 8 of the Government Stock Saleyards Act, 1941, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder, under and for the purposes of the said Act.

Schedule.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE GOVERNMENT STOCK SALEYARDS ACT, 1941.

1. In these regulations—

“Act” means the Government Stock Saleyards Act, 1941.

“Controller” means the officer in control of saleyards appointed under the Act.

“Minister” means the Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of the Act.

“Officer” means an officer appointed under this Act and includes the Controller.

"Officer in charge" means the person appointed by the Controller or otherwise as foreman of a saleyard, and acting under the direction of the Controller.

"Owner" includes any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, or person in possession or in charge of any stock, or any agent of such owner or consignee, and includes the occupier for the time being of any portion of a saleyard.

"Saleyard" has the meaning prescribed by the Act.

"Stock" means all classes of livestock.

"Stock Agent" means any person licensed by the Minister to sell stock at the saleyards and authorised by an owner or consignee to sell stock on his behalf and includes a firm or body corporate.

2. Saleyards shall be open for the reception of stock on such days and at such hours as the Controller may from time to time determine.

3. Any person placing or causing to be placed stock in a saleyard shall place them in such pens or yards as the officer in charge may direct, and shall in all matters relating to the reception, yarding, removal, and delivery of such stock carry out the directions of the officer in charge in regard thereto.

4. Any person placing or causing to be placed any stock in a saleyard shall immediately furnish to the officer in charge a true statement of the number of stock so yarded.

5. Every person who shall bring stock to a saleyard and keep same therein for more than twenty-four hours shall provide them with food. It shall be competent and lawful for the officer in charge to move or remove such stock from the saleyard to any other part of the Government's property and to recover from the owner any expenses incurred in so doing.

6. All stock brought to a saleyard for sale shall be in the care of the stock agents to whom the same shall be consigned.

7. The Minister will not be responsible for any injury or damage to or for the death or escape of any stock brought or delivered to a saleyard.

8. Sales by auction shall be held in the saleyards, on such days and at such hours, between sunrise and sunset, as shall be determined from time to time by the Controller in conjunction with stock agents.

9. No person shall sell any stock in a saleyard unless he has obtained a license so to do from the Minister. Licenses shall be issued annually and the fee payable for a license shall be twenty shillings. A license issued to a firm shall entitle any member thereof, who is the holder of an Auctioneer's License, to sell stock. Any clerk of a licensee, if he is the holder of an Auctioneer's License, may sell for such licensee in the saleyard while the license issued to his employer under this regulation remains unrevoked.

10. The order of priority in which stock agents shall sell stock on authorised sale days shall be determined by the stock agents. Stock agents shall, thirty-six hours at least prior to each sale day, furnish to the officer in charge, a statement in writing containing particulars of the approximate numbers of each class of stock that such stock agent will offer for sale on such sale day.

11. A draw slip shall be posted in the saleyard by the officer in charge, setting forth the order of priority in which the stock agents shall offer stock for sale, the numbers of each class of stock such stock agent shall offer, and particulars of the pens allotted to such stock agents.

12. No stock agent shall delay or cause any delay in the sale of stock. If any stock agent is not ready immediately he is called upon, he shall be deemed to have lost his order of priority for that round.

13. Subject to the provisions of regulation 26 of these regulations, no stock received for sale by auction and placed in pens for sale shall be offered for private sale without first being submitted to auction.

14. Every stock agent who shall sell any stock at a saleyard shall, forthwith after the sale thereof, deliver to each purchaser an order in writing, signed by him or on his behalf, directed to the officer in charge authorising the purchaser to take delivery of the stock therein mentioned. Such order shall be delivered up to the officer in charge before such stock shall be removed from the saleyards. Provided that this regulation shall not apply to any stock purchased for delivery by rail.

15. No stock shall be removed from a saleyard, other than by rail, until the numbers thereof have been checked by the officer in charge or his representative, with the delivery order issued to the purchaser concerned.

16. The following dues and fees shall be paid in respect of all stock yarded for sale, whether sold or not, that is to say—

For every ox, bull, cow, heifer, and yearling	9d.
For every calf under the age of one year	6d.
For every sheep, lamb or goat	1½d.
For every pig of the value of £1 or over	3d.
For every pig under the value of £1	1d.
Cattle-dipping charge, per head	6d.
Sheep-dipping charge, per head	3d.
For every horse offered for sale	1s.
For every vehicle offered for sale	1s.

17. Yard dues shall be charged only once for any lot or stock resubmitted for sale on the same day by the stock agent responsible for the first offering.

18. When any lots passed in or sold by stock agents are transferred to another stock agent and again submitted for sale on the same day, yard dues shall be charged on both transactions.

19. When any lot of stock is resubmitted for sale, the original pen number shall be shown against the second entry of sale.

20. Yard dues shall be levied on all runs given from stock yarded for sale on the day prior to sale day.

21. Yard dues shall be levied on all runs given on day of sale.
22. Any person taking stock to a saleyard for consignment by rail shall notify the officer in charge, who shall direct such person where such stock shall be placed.
23. Yard dues shall not be payable on any stock passing through a saleyard for retruckering or delivery to the Abattoirs.
24. Every stock agent shall furnish to the officer in charge a true statement in writing, setting out the total number of each class of stock yarded by him in a saleyard in respect of each sale day and remit all dues and fees thereon within seven days after sale. The Controller shall have power to inspect any books necessary to verify such statement.
25. Any stock dying in a saleyard or arriving dead shall be taken possession of and treated by the Controller.
26. Any stock arriving in a saleyard in a crippled or disabled condition shall not be offered for sale by auction. Stock agents shall arrange with the officer in charge for the removal of all disabled stock to the Abattoirs for immediate slaughter.
27. Stock upon which all market dues and fees have been paid may be yarded free for a period of twenty-four hours from the time of sale, if the consent of the officer in charge be obtained. If such stock be not despatched from the saleyard at the expiration of such period, the yarding fees to be paid upon such stock for every day or part of a day that such stock remain yarded shall be as follows:—

28. The owner of stock shall, if so directed by the officer in charge, cause such stock to be removed from the saleyard at a specified time following the day upon which such stock have been submitted to auction.
29. No person shall release or remove any stock from any pen situated in any lane or section of a saleyard whilst a sale is taking place. Upon release or removal after the completion of the sale the owner shall place such stock in such yards or portion of the yards as the officer in charge shall direct.
30. The owner or person having the control of any dog in a saleyard shall tie or secure such dog, when the same is not working therein, in such a manner as to prevent such dog from running about the saleyard or interfering with any stock therein. Any dog, while not tied up, shall be muzzled. No owner or person having the charge or control of any mangy or diseased dog shall take the same into a saleyard or permit or suffer it to enter therein. The officer in charge may destroy any such dog found in a saleyard.
31. No person shall ride or drive any animal, whether attached to any vehicle or not, at more than a walking pace, within the precincts of a saleyard, except in such places as shall be allotted for the purpose.
32. No person in a saleyard shall—
- behave in a disorderly or indecent manner; or
 - commit any act of theft or dishonesty therein; or
 - be or remain in the saleyard, if he has no legitimate business therein, or if he has at any time committed a breach of paragraphs (a) or (b) of this regulation.
33. The officer in charge may exclude from a saleyard any person whom such officer in charge considers to be an undesirable character.
34. No person shall put or place any sign, advertisement, or notice on any part of a saleyard, except with the written consent of the officer in charge.

VICTORIA PLAINS VERMIN BOARD.

PURSUANT to powers conferred upon it by the Vermin Act, 1918, the Victoria Plains Vermin Board hereby makes the following Order:—

(a) The respective occupiers and, where no person is in actual possession, the owners of all holdings within the Victoria Plains Vermin District shall commence the work of destroying rabbits on such holdings and upon roads bounding or intersecting the same not later than the 1st day of August, 1942, and shall continue and systematically carry out such work until the 30th day of September, 1942.

(b) The means which shall be adopted for carrying out the said work shall be either or both of the following methods, to be carried out to the satisfaction of the Board's Vermin Inspector:—(i) the destruction of rabbit warrens by plunging in; (ii) the destruction of rabbits by fumigation.

Any person failing to comply with the requirements of this Order will be liable to prosecution under section 97 of the Act without further notice.
