WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. [L.S.] over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Constitution Act, 1889, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 30th day of July, 1942.
