Corr. No. 330/42.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of subleasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 22351 (near Lake Campion) should vest in and be held by Messrs. Alexander James Reid, Norman Fernie, and Harry Bowley in trust for Workers' Cottages: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by Alexander James Reid, Norman Fernie, and Harry Bowley in trust for Workers' Cottages with power to the said Alexander James Reid, Norman Fernie, and Harry Bowley to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease.

ORDER UNDER REGULATION 4 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by regulation 4 of the National Scennity (General) Regulations it is provided (amongst other things) that if it appears to the Minister to be necessary or expedient in the interests of the Defence of the Commonwealth or the efficient prosecution of the war, or for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, that special precautions should be taken for the seemity of any place, he may by Order declare that place to be a prohibited place, either generally or during such hours or during the existence of such circumstances as are specified in the Order for the purposes of the regulations: And whereas by Instrument of Delegation dated the Seventh day of May, 1942, made in pursanaec of section 17 of the National Security Act, 1939-1940, John (butin, the Minister of State for Defence, delegated to every officer who should at any time during the continuance of the delegation be holding the office or performing the duties of the office of Communder of a Lines of Communication Area the powers and functions conferred upon the said Minister by Regulation 4 of the National Security (General) Regulations in relation to that Lines of Communication Area: And whereas by regulation 4(6)(b) of the National Security (General) Regulations it is provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, in any Order made under subregulation (1) of this regulation or by separate Order, authorise any officer or person to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over or he in or in the neighbourhood of a prohibited place. And whereas by regulation, or by separate Order, specify an officer or person to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer or person in charge of any prohibited place for the purposes of these regulations: And whereas it appears to me, Oswald Vick Hoad, Colonel Communding Western Australia Lines of Communication Area; how, therefore I, the said Oswald Vick Hoad, acting in pursuance of the said regulation and Instrument of Delegation do hereby order as follows:—

- (1) That the places described in the Schedule hereto are declared to be prohibited places generally for the purpose of the National Security (General) Regulations from the date of the making of this Order:
- (2) That Captain Colin Ednie Brown (W.4), General Staff, W. Anst. L. of C. Area, is authorised to issue permits to enter, approach, inspect, pass over, or be in or in the neighbourhood of the said prohibited places:
- (3) That Captain Joseph George Frederick Senior, M.C. (W. 237570), Western Command Section Intelligence Corps, is specified as the officer to exercise and perform the powers and functions of the officer in charge of the said prohibited places for the purpose of these regulations

WORKERS' HOMES ACT, 1911-1941.

Schedule.

The regulations made under the Workers' Homes Act, 1911-1941, as published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of June, 1938, and the 19th day of January, 1940, are amended as follows:

- (1) Regulation 28 (Gazette 3/6/1938) is repealed and a new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:
- 28. (1) The rent to be paid in accordance with paragraph (a) of section 11 of the Act in respect of leases granted after the 15th day of January, 1942, shall be an amount per annum equal to four pounds ten shillings per centum of the amount of the appraisement or reappraisement, as the case may be, mentioned in the said paragraph (a).
- (2) The rate of interest to be paid in accordance with paragraph (b) of section 11 of the Act shall be five pounds ten shillings per centum per annum in lieu of five per centum as provided in the said paragraph (b).
- (3) The rate of interest with which excess instalments remaining in The Advance Instalments Deposit Fund shall be credited in accordance with section 45A of the Act shall be at the same rate per centum per amum as that payable by the lessee purchaser, or mortgagor on the capital or principal debt owing by him to the Board.
- (2) Form No. 2 in Appendix A is amended by deleting the words "equal to three pounds per centum" in line 26 of the said form and inserting in lieu thereof the words "assessed at the rate prescribed from time to time."

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor in Council, acting under the provisions of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909, has been pleased to approve of the amendment by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the by-laws made by the said Minister pursuant to section 146 of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of January, 1939, and amended by notice published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of May and the 15th day of November, 1940, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

The abovementioned by laws are amended as follows:-

- (1) Amend by-law 270 by adding at the end thereof the following:-"The provisions of this by-law shall not apply to any apparatus referred to in by-law 277(A).
 - (2) A new by-law is inserted, to stand as by-law 277(A):-
- 277(A) (a) Any apparatus in which water is used for cooling purposes, including refrigerating equipment or machinery, or any apparatus or system used for the cooling of roofs, or for any form of air conditioning or temperature control, or in connection with any form of hydraulic ejector or hydraulic apparatus for power purposes, shall be deemed to be an apparatus within the meaning of this by-law.
- (b) The use of water for any such apparatus shall be subject to the conditions and charges as set out in this by law.
- (c) From and after the commencement of this by-law, no apparatus shall be installed or used, and no apparatus previously installed shall be used in, on, or in connection with any property, land, or tenement unless the Minister shall have first consented thereto in writing.
- (d) Applications for consent to instal or use such apparatus shall state the make and type, the minimum and maximum requirements, and any other information the Minister may require.
- (e) If water used for or in the operation of any apparatus under full output exceeds the following quantities-

(f) The quantity of water run to waste shall be limited to the quantity specified in the Minister's consent. - (g) The owner or occupier or other person supplied by the Minister with water as aforesaid shall, at his own expense, make any alteration to the existing water service necessary in order that the subservice can be separately metered, and shall also pay the cost of removing the meter and disconnecting the subservice, if not further required, and during the continuance of the service shall keep or cause to be kept such apparatus, and all pipes in connection therewith, in a proper state of
- (h) In any case where the occupier or owner desires to draw the supply direct from the Minister's main through an additional service, such additional service shall, at the discretion of the Minister, be installed upon such occupier or owner depositing in advance the amount of the estimated cost of installation, in addition to the amount of the estimated cost of affixing a meter, and paying on completion of the work the actual costs thereof, whether they amount to more or less than the estimates. He shall also pay meter rent and bear the expense of maintaining the service and of having it disconvented when we larger received. service and of having it disconnected when no longer required.
- (i) Any owner, occupier, or other person who is supplied with water by the Minister aforesaid, who shall fail to comply with this by-law, or who shall otherwise commit a breach of its terms, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence hereunder, and shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £10 and to a further penalty not exceeding £2 for each day the offence continues after notice thereof from the Minister from the Minister.
