Land Drainage Act, 1925-41; Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912.

Lennox Drainage District—Busselton Drainage District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S 361/26.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, the Governor may abolish any District: And whereas, by section 3 of the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912, the Governor may dissolve the Board of any District: And whereas it is desirable that the Lennox Drainage District be abolished and the Board thereof dissolved: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby abolish the said Lennox Drainage District and dissolve

the Board thereof: And whereas, by section 11 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, the Governor may constitute any defined portion of the State a Drainage District, specify the boundaries of such district, and assign a name to such district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute a Drainage District, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto (and shown in red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 24565), and assign the name of the Busseilton Drainage District thereto.

The Schedule.

Commencing at low-water mark at a point in Dunn Bay in line with the north-west boundary of Location 170; thence south-westerly to and along the said boundary of Location 170 across Road No. 118; thence north-west along the south-west side of said road to its junction with Road No. 1791; thence south-westward along the southerly side of said Road No. 1791 to its intersection with the north boundary of Location 1346; thence eastward to the north-east corner of said Location 1346 on the west boundary of Location 738; thence southward along the west boundaries of the said Location 738 and Location 1043 to the intersection with the north-east side of Road No. 374; thence south-easterly along the north-east side of road to the intersection with the prolongation of the east boundary of Lease 1612/93; thence southward across Road No. 374 along said boundary for a distance of about one mile; thence westward for a distance of about 45 chains; thence southward for about 85 chains to the north-west corner of Location 539; thence eastward along the north boundary of the said Location 539 to its north-east corner and across Road No. 1789; thence south-westerly along the south-east side of the said Road No. 1789 to a point opposite the south-east corner of Location 546; thence continuing south-westerly along the south-east side of road (or proposed road) to the north side of road skirting the north boundary of Location 647 opposite the north-west corner of the said Location 647; thence easterly along the north side of said road to the intersection of the east side of a road near the north-east corner of Location 647; thence southward along the east side of the said road to the north corner of Location 466; thence south-westerly along the south-east side of Road No. 3227 to the north-west corner of Location 466; thence southward along the west boundary of Location 466 and its prolongation to the north corner of Location 2887; thence south-westerly along the south-east side of Road No. 3057 to the west corner of Location 2875; thence south-easterly along the south-west boundary of Location 2875 to the north-west corner of Location 2872; thence southward along the west boundary of Location 2872 to its south-west corner; thence easterly along the south boundary of Location 2872 with Location 2871 to its intersection with the prolongation of the west boundary of Location 1673; thence southward across the road and along said boundary to its south-west corner; thence eastward along its south boundary to the north-east corner of Location 1674; thence southward along the west boundary of Location 2587 for a distance of about 20 chains; thence eastward for a distance of 21 chains; thence southward about 40 chains to the intersection of the south side of Road No. 2591; thence westerly along the south side of said road to the north-west corner of Location 2588; thence south along the west boundary of said Location 2588 to its south-west corner; thence east and across road to the south-west corner of Location 2589; thence south-westerly along the east side of road to the north-west corner of Location 2592; thence easterly along the north boundary of said Location 2592 to intersection with the west boundary of Location 2591; thence southward along said boundary to the south-west corner of Location 2591; thence easterly along the north side of Road 3446 to its intersection with the east side of Road No. 330; thence southerly along the east side of said Road 330 to the north-west corner of Location 1696; thence east along the north boundary of the said Location 1696 to its north-east corner; thence south to its south-east corner; thence west to its south-west corner; thence southerly along the west boundary of Location 1697 to the north boundary of Location 1698 and westerly to the north-west corner of Location 1698; thence south about 44 chains to a corner of Location 1698; thence westward for 16 chains to the north-east corner of Location 2080; thence southward to the south-west corner of Location 1698; thence

eastward to the east side of road on south-west boundary of Location 1699; thence southward along east side of said road to the north corner of Location 2098; thence south-westward along the north-west boundary of said Location 2098 to its west corner; thence south-eastward along the south-west boundaries of Locations 2098, 2097, 1744, southward and eastward along the east and north side of road forming the east and north boundaries of Locations 1745 and 1731 to the south-west boundary of Location 2083; thence eastward along the south boundary of Location 2083 to the west boundary of Location 1743; thence southward to the south-west corner of said Location 1743; thence eastward along the south boundary of Locations 1743 and 1736 and continued eastward for a further distance of about $4\frac{1}{4}$ miles to the west boundary of Location 2930 about 15 chains from its north-west corner; thence northward along said west boundary and its prolongation for a distance of about $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles to intersect with a westward prolongation of the north-boundaries of Locations 752 and 761; thence eastward to and along the north boundaries of Locations 752 and 761 to the north-east corner of Location 761; thence north-easterly to the south-east corner of Location 3039 (late 708); thence northward along the east boundary of said Location 3039 to its north-east corner; thence northward along the prolongation of the said east boundary for about 12 chains; thence easterly on a prolongation of the south boundary of Location 696 to the south-east corner of said Location 696; thence northward along the east boundary to a prolongation of the south boundary of Location 855; thence eastward along this line to the south-east corner of the said Location 855; thence north-easterly on a bearing of 38deg. for a distance of 1 mile 45 chains. From this point the boundary follows a bearing of 112deg. for a distance of about 6 miles; thence a bearing of 37deg. and a distance of about 4 miles 60 chains to the south-east corner of Location 973; thence northward along east boundary and across to the north side of Road No. 114; thence eastward along the north side of said road to the south-east corner of Location 960; thence northward along the east boundary of the said Location 960 for a distance of about 25 chains; thence eastward across the Jarrah-wood-Nannup Railway near the 162 $\frac{3}{4}$ -mile post, across Location 1262 and Lease 145/113 to the eastern boundary of said Lease 145/113 about 57 chains south of north-east corner of said lease; thence northward along the east boundary and its prolongation for a distance of about 3 miles 7 chains; thence westward for a distance of two miles; thence northward about 306 chains to the south-west corner of Location 2499; thence westward for a distance of about 2 miles 30 chains; thence northward about 246 chains to the south-west side of Road No. 705; thence north-westerly along the south-west side of said Road No. 705 to the north boundary of Location 2065; thence westerly along the north boundary of the said Location 2065 to its north-west corner; thence along the south side of Road No. 3888 to the west boundary of Location 1124; thence northward along the west boundary of the said Location 1124 to the north-east corner of Location 1129; thence westward along the north boundary of Location 1129 and its prolongation to the east boundary of Location 1613; thence northward along the east boundary of Location 1613 and 1816/93 to its north-east corner; thence westward along the north boundary of said 1816/93 to the east boundary of Location 498; thence northward to the north-east corner of said Location 498; thence westward along the north boundary of the said Location 498 and prolongation of same crossing Road 4644, a total distance of about 40 chains; thence southward to the north boundary of Location 848; thence westward along said boundary to the eastern-most boundary of Location 2054; thence northward to the north-east corner of the said Location 2054; thence westward along north boundary of said Location 2054 to its north-west corner and across Road No. 3927 to its west side; thence northward along the west side of Road No. 3927 to the south-east corner of Location 1091; thence westward along the south boundary of said Location 1091 and its prolongation to the south-east boundary of Busseilton Railway; thence south-westward along said boundary to the prolongation eastward of the south boundary of Reserve 390; thence westward along said prolongation and south boundary of Reserve 390 to the north-west corner of Location 2722 crossing the railway line; thence south-westward along the north-west

boundaries of Locations 2722, 1276, 1133 to the south-west corner of Location 1133; thence westward to south-east corner of Location 74 and along the south boundary of same to the north-west corner of Location 93 and across the Road No. 49; thence northwards on the west side of Road No. 49 to the south-east corner of Location 2939; thence north-westward along the south-west side of Road 1292 through Location 2939 and Location 2324 to the east corner of Location 116; thence south-westward along the south-east boundary of the said Lot 116 to its south corner; thence north-west along the south-west boundary of the said Lot 116 to its west corner; thence north-eastward along the north-west boundary of Lot 116 to the south corner of Location 146; thence north-west along the south-west boundary to its west corner; thence north-westward along the prolongation of the said boundary through Locations 172, 52, and 53 to low-water mark Geographie Bay; thence westward along coast at low-water mark to the point of commencement as shown in red on P.W.D., W.A. 24565.

A By-law to Provide for the Numbering of Houses.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Second Schedule to the Road Districts Act, 1919-1933, the Mundaring Road Board hereby makes the following by-law with respect to the numbering of houses:—

In this by-law "The Board" means the Mundaring Road Board.

"District" means the Mundaring Road District.

"Secretary" means the secretary of the Board.

The Board may allot a number to any house fronting or abutting on any street, road, or lane in the district and may reallocate another number in place of the old one as often as it may deem necessary.

The Board may serve an order on the owner or occupier of such house, under the hand of the secretary or any other officer of the Board appointed for the purpose, to affix the number allotted to the house from time to time on such portion of the house, fence, or other part of the premises as may be deemed necessary by such secretary or officer. Such order may specify the particular position on the premises in which the number is to be affixed and the time within which it is to be affixed.

Any person served with an order as herein prescribed shall affix the number at his own expense, and shall keep it continually affixed in the position ordered.

The house number shall be supplied by the Board at cost price, and only the number supplied by the Board shall be affixed.

No person shall remove, deface, or damage in any way any number duly fixed in compliance with the by-law.

Any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

AGREEMENT (No. 12 of 1942).

(Reg. 27th July, 1942.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this thirtieth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, between The Kalgoorlie Brewing and Ice Company, Limited (hereinafter termed the employers), of the one part, and whose Registered Office is situated at Brookman street, Kalgoorlie, and The Eastern Goldfields Breweries Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, being a union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935 (hereinafter termed the union), of the other part, and having its Registered Office at the Trades Hall, Kalgoorlie: Whereby the said parties are mutually agreed as follows:—

Interpretation.

(a) "Casual hands" shall mean any person who is employed for not more than 44 hours ordinary working hours 7.30 a.m. to 4.20 p.m. The number of casual hands shall not exceed one in every ten permanently employed, or portion of the first ten, by the said Company.

(b) "Cellarman," whenever used in this Agreement, shall mean a worker who is generally employed at a majority of the undermentioned occupations, namely—filling, preparing, carbonising, and racking beer from storage tanks and/or tends filter, and shall not mean any employee who is casually employed in any one of the last-mentioned processes.

(c) "Bottle washer" shall mean any person employed washing bottles by hand or machinery.

(d) "CO₂ bottler" shall mean any person employed in bottling CO₂ gas.

(e) "Leading hands" are employees who are in charge of and responsible for the work of others.

(f) "Motor drivers"—Motor drivers shall not include one who drives a motor vehicle for the removal of refuse, slops, or other liquid waste.

(g) "Shiftmen" shall be applicable to topmen and cellarman.

1.—Schedule.

The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages payable for the following classes of work shall be:—

These rates are based on a basic wage of £5 5s. 7d. per week for males. It is hereby agreed between the parties for the period of this Agreement, that, in the event of the basic wage being increased or reduced in accordance with section 124 of the Arbitration Act, such increase or reduction shall not effect the rate of wages as set out in "1" Schedule of this Agreement: Providing always, should the increase in the basic wage exceed the minimum wage set out herein, such increase being one shilling or shillings, such increase shall be paid.

Storage tanks:—Reconditioning storage tanks, which shall include scraping, and/or cleaning and/or painting, shall be paid for at the rate of 4s. per hour.

Oilers and aprons:—Employers shall, for use in their work only, supply oilskin coats, cash and docket satchels, leather aprons, gaiters or leggings to motor lorry drivers free of cost.

Adult labourer:—The employer shall make it a condition of employment that all workers must be covered by this Agreement and shall be members of this union and shall become so immediately on their first pay day.

Boots:—The employer shall, for use during working hours only, supply suitable boots to those employed at the bottle-washing, at the tanks, at the tubs, at the filters, at the cask-washing shed, at the bottlers, and to any employees working in or about water, such boots to be supplied free of cost.

2.—Boys.

(a) The rate of wages for boys shall be:—

(b) The number of boys employed shall not exceed one in every ten men permanently employed or portion of the first ten men employed by each Company.

3.—Hours.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work for all employees. Employees shall begin at 7.30 a.m. and conclude work at 4.20 p.m., from Monday to Friday inclusive, with an allowance of one hour for meals, and shall commence work at 7.30 a.m. and conclude at 12.20 p.m. on Saturdays.

Shift cellarmen:—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work for shift cellarmen, and the hours to be worked shall be:—

- (a) Day shift:—8 a.m. to 4.20 p.m., with one hour off between 12 noon and 1 p.m. for lunch;
- (b) Afternoon shift:—4.20 p.m. to 11.40 p.m. on week days and 3 p.m. to 11 p.m. on Sundays, inclusive of thirty minutes each shift for crib.
- (c) Night shift:—11.40 p.m. to 7 a.m. on week days and 11 p.m. on Sundays to 7 a.m. on Monday morning, inclusive of thirty minutes each shift for crib time.

The luncheon hour on Saturday to be between 11.20 a.m. and 12.20 p.m.: Provided always, that the quick shift man shall not work on Sundays, and that the night shift man shall have at least one week on day shift in every four weeks.

Topmen shall mean two or three sets of men working 16 hours or 24 hours respectively by shifts of 7 hours 50 minutes straight out on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and a shift of 4 hours 50 minutes on Saturdays, one hour being allowed for luncheon, Monday to Friday, inclusive. The hours of labour shall be 44 hours per week; hours of starting, at the discretion of the brewer, for one man only, other men to start at 7.30 a.m.

4.—Overtime.

If any employee works earlier than his starting time or later than his ordinary quitting time, he shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half, each day to stand alone.

5.—Record Book.

Each Company shall keep a record of the time of each employee, of the time he starts and finishes each day, and of the total amount of hours worked, and of the wages paid to each employee. Such record shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of or any person appointed by the employees' union, during working hours. Each employee shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

6.—Sundays.

All work performed on Sundays by employees in any department (Shiftmen excepted) shall receive payment for the same at double time rates. Shiftmen when not on rotation Sunday shift shall be paid at double time rates.

7.—Holidays.

All work performed by employees in any department on holidays shall be paid for at double time rates, and, as far as is reasonably permitted, employees shall be employed on the holiday shift in their turn as holidays occur.

It is agreed between the employer and the union that, in the event of any driver being called upon to work on holidays, such driver is to be paid at double time rates per hour worked (a part of an hour to be paid for as a full hour) up to 10 a.m., and if such driver works after 10 a.m. he shall be paid for the full shift at double time rates. Any driver called upon to work on holidays after 10 a.m. shall be paid for the full shift at double time rates.

Any employee (excepting drivers) working any part of a shift on a holiday shall be paid for the full shift at double time rates; all holiday shifts to rotate. If no work be done the ordinary rate shall be paid for holidays. The days to be observed as holidays, according to the provisions of this Agreement are:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Union Picnic Day, Labour Day, Kalgoorlie Cup Day, Boulder Cup Day, New Year's Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, and Foundation Day. In case any of the above holidays fall on a Sunday, another day in lieu thereof shall be given, but such day shall be added to the annual holidays: Provided always that when Foundation Day

and/or King's Birthday fall on ordinary working days, work shall be performed on such days and two days will be granted in lieu thereof, which shall be added to the annual holidays: Provided always, that when Boxing Day falls on a Saturday all men required shall work on that day and another day shall be given in lieu thereof.

8.—Annual Holidays.

Twelve (12) days' annual leave on full pay shall become due to workers with twelve (12) months' service, such leave to be taken at times mutually agreed upon between the employer and the employees, between the 30th April, and the 30th September in each year, in addition to the holidays enumerated in clause 7 of this Agreement; temporary hands with less than twelve (12) months' service shall, on retirement, receive a proportion of the annual holidays in ratio to their service.

9.

Any employee, excepting those as herein provided, at the request of the employer starting work at a time during the day later than 7.30 a.m. shall continue his employment without a break, other than for meals, until he has completed on the first five days of each week a service of seven hours twenty minutes per day, and a term of five hours fifty minutes on the sixth day. During each shift so worked such employee, except those as herein provided, shall be paid overtime rates after 4.20 p.m.

10.

Any employee, excepting those as herein provided, on day shift who is required to work before 7.30 a.m. shall not be called upon by the employer to cease work until 4.20 p.m. and shall be paid overtime rates for the time worked previously to 7.30 a.m.

11.

No contract or piece-work shall be permitted.

All work of any employee in the capacity as mentioned in this Agreement in or about a Brewery or Bottling Works, or in connection with the business of brewing or beer bottling, shall be carried out departmentally by *bona fide* breweries' employees engaged and paid direct by the brewery proprietors and not by agents or contractors. This clause shall not apply to contractors erecting, repairing, or engaged for the delivery of goods other than beer or empties, as has been the practice or custom prior to this date. The employer agrees that such carriers employ only *bona fide* members of the Transport Workers' Union.

12.—Engagement.

The engagement between the employee and employer shall be weekly; one week's notice from either party to terminate same, except in the case of an employee absents himself from duty, not obeying lawful commands, or being guilty of misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped through fire or tempests, or damage by the King's enemies, when such Agreement shall be terminated immediately.

13.—Discharging and Re-engaging Hands.

The question of dismissals and re-engagement of union members shall be administered in a just and fair spirit, according to the seniority of service, but reserving to the employer the right to depart from the rule of seniority of service in circumstances where the employee is technically unqualified for the work, is incompetent or guilty of misconduct, or in the opinion of the employer inconvenience would be occasioned to the employer owing to the inclusion in the dismissals of some essential man, or the inability of the employer to re-engage some essential man.

This clause to apply only to men of at least one year's continuous service.

The following departments shall be considered as separate employment for the purpose of this clause:—(a) Bottle Department; (b) Brewery; (c) Delivery.

14.

No employee who has previously been in receipt of higher wages than arranged for in this Schedule shall be reduced in wages under his present employment, and shall receive a similar increase to all other employees.

15.

Any employee, being unable through sickness or accident to attend to his duties, shall notify his employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he absents himself from duty; he shall also satisfy the employer that he is unable to attend to his duties, and, if called upon, shall provide a medical certificate that he is unfit to perform his work through sickness.

16.

Any employee who considers himself unfit or not capable of earning the wages hereinbefore prescribed, may be paid such lesser wage as may be agreed upon between the employer and the secretary of the union. In default of such agreement being arrived at within twenty-four hours after application has been made in writing to the secretary of the union, the matter may be referred to the nearest Resident Magistrate for settlement. Any employee whose wage has been so fixed may work and be employed by any employer for such lesser wage for a period of six calendar months then next ensuing, and thereafter until fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given to such employee by the secretary of the union requiring his wages to be again fixed.

17.

All employees on day shift in or about a Brewery or Bottling Works shall, if required to work more than one hour overtime after 4.20 p.m., knock off between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. for refreshments.

18.

The employers shall make it a condition of employment that all workers covered by this Agreement shall be members of the Eastern Goldfields Breweries Employees' Industrial Union of Workers and/or become such within twenty-eight days of their employment under its terms.

19.

Where an employee is required to take a "leading position" he shall, during the time he occupies such position, receive the sum of ten shillings per week in addition to his ordinary rate of pay.

20.

This Agreement shall commence from the day of the date herein, and shall remain in force for the period of one year thence next ensuing, and thereafter until terminated by one month's notice of termination by either party to this Agreement. And shall apply to the Eastern Goldfields District, which district, for the purposes of this Agreement, shall mean that area enclosed by a circle drawn with a radius of 150 miles with the Kalgoorlie Post Office as the central point.
