ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1939, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, to be named in the order, in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves Nos. 22353 and 22354 (near Beaufort Inlet), 22355 and 22356 (near Wellstead Estuary) should vest in and be held by the Gnowangerup Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation and Camping: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the Gnowangerup Road Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1937.

Leonora Road Board—Resolution.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 320 of the Health Act, 1911-1937, as reprinted pursuant to the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, that a local authority may make by-laws, and is thereby empowered to amend, repeal, or alter any by-laws so made: And whereas it is provided by section 321 of the said Act that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a local authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws, with or without modification: And whereas Model By-laws, described as Series "A," have been prepared in accordance with the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927; 20th day of October, 1933; 5th day of October, 1934; 1st day of February, 1935; 12th day of February, 1937; 2nd day of July, 1937; 22nd day of April, 1938; 3rd day of March, 1939; 29th day of September, 1939, and 18th day of July, 1941: And now, therefore, the Leonora Road Board, being the local authority for the Leonora Health District, doth hereby resolve and determine that all previous by-laws made by the Board for its purpose as the local health authority aforesaid be repealed and that in substitution thereof the whole of the said Series "A" Model By-laws be adopted, together with such other amendments as have from time to time been made by the Leonora Road Board as a local health authority, with the modification specified in the Schedule hereunder, for the Health District of Leonora.

Schedule.

By the addition to by-law No. 1 of section B, a new subsection, to be known as (j), reading as follows:—

1. (j) No person shall, on or after the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two, slaughter any animal for meat for human consumption in that locality of the Leonora Health District specified hereunder:—

2. All that land within a radius of ten miles from the Leonora Post Office, Lot 450, Tower street, Leonora.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

(No. 33 of 1941.)

Between the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Minister for Education and the Minister for Agriculture, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination: And whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference: And whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to declare the said agreement an Award: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 63 of the Act and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply throughout the State to all employees specified in clause 3 hereof engaged at Research Stations and/or on Experimental Farms owned by the West Australian Government (including the Muresk Agricultural College, the School of Agriculture, Narrogin, and Wokalup Farm).

2.—Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

3.—Wages.

(c) The deductions specified hereunder will be made in the case of married or single men for the following privileges when available:—

1. Married men—Not exceeding 20 per cent. of the male basic wage for quarters, use of milking cow under the existing arrangements.
2. Single men (including juniors)—Not exceeding 13 per cent. of the male basic wage for quarters.

(d) Where the use of cow is not available to the employee, as set out in (c) (1) the amounts obtained by the above deductions will be reduced by 2s. 6d. per week.

(e) The existing arrangements as regards the supply of milk and butter at Muresk Agricultural College and the School of Agriculture, Narrogin, shall continue.

(f) Employees provided with board and lodging for themselves only shall be charged an amount equal to 28 per cent. of the male basic wage.

(g) The deductions specified above shall be made from the wages set out in this clause.

4.—District Allowances.

A district allowance of 5s. per week shall be paid at Salmon Gums.

5.—Holidays.

Employees shall be entitled to two (2) weeks and four (4) days holiday per annum (equivalent to 120 working hours). When employed for a lesser period than twelve months, *pro rata* holiday pay shall be granted after one month's continuous service.

6.—Preference of Employment.

Preference of employment in respect of the classes of workers covered by this Agreement shall be given to financial members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers: Provided that any employee or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union, and who produces proof of such membership, shall be entitled to equal preference: Provided that such employee or applicant shall, within fourteen days of the expiry of his current ticket with the other union, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers.

7.—Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted by the Ministers in accordance with the conditions relating to full-time Government wages employees generally.

8.—Overtime.

All work done outside the daily spread or beyond forty-four (44) hours in any week shall be deemed to be overtime: Provided that any necessary attention to stock shall not be deemed overtime.

A worker required to attend to stock outside his regular working hours or outside the spread of shifts shall receive an allowance of 9s. per week of seven days: Provided this shall not apply to the duties of grooming and harnessing specified in clause 3 (b).

Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

9.—Spread of Shifts.

The daily spread of shifts shall mean the period between the time when the worker first commences work and the time he or she finishes work for the day.

The daily spread of shift shall not exceed twelve (12) hours.

10.—Lanterns, etc.

Kerosene lanterns shall be provided by the employer, when such are necessary, for the use of the employees in carrying out their work.

11.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every four or fraction of four adult male workers: Provided that any respondent shall have the right to apply to the Board of Reference for a greater proportion of juniors, and the Board of Reference may grant such respondent additional juniors where the respondent is able to justify his application before the Board.

The rates of pay for junior workers shall be as under:—

- 14 to 15 years—38 per cent. of male basic wage.
- 15 to 16 years—44 per cent. of male basic wage.
- 16 to 17 years—52 per cent. of male basic wage.
- 17 to 18 years—60 per cent. of male basic wage.
- 18 to 19 years—75 per cent. of male basic wage.
- 19 years—Full basic wage.

No deduction for quarters will be made from junior wages should it be possible for them to make arrangements for lodging as well as board with one of the married farm hands employed by the Department at the Research Station or Institution.

12.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for three (3) years from the date hereof.

13.—Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time;
- (c) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.

(2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.

14.

When the Muresk Agricultural College and the School of Agriculture, Narrogin, are in recess, and assistance is not available when required to enable the Poultry, Piggery, and Dairy Instructors to complete their work in ordinary working hours, necessitating these employees to attend stock outside their ordinary working hours, they shall be paid the stock allowance of 9/- per week of seven days.

15.

All workers shall be allowed one full day off each week, subject to the requirements of clauses 8 and 14.

16.—Casual Worker.

"Casual worker" means a worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive working days.

In the case of casual workers the contract of service shall be hourly.

The casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) over the rate provided for the particular worker's occupation.

17.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service.

(ii) The liability of the employer hereunder shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker.

(iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer, or his representative, of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.

(d) No payment will be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

18.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side.

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker fails to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness or is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Award.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

(1) Omit this subclause and insert in lieu thereof—

A "triennial period" shall be three (3) years preceeding the date of the commencement of absence through illness in respect of which leave is claimed.

(2) Add a new subclause as follows:—

(d) If sickness is due to the wilful neglect or default of the applicant, the proof whereof lies upon the employer, it shall, if granted, be without pay.

Clause 12.—Dismissals.

Subclause (b):—Add the following words—"and in the absence of such notice the employer may withhold holiday or other pay up to the amount of 14 days' wages: Provided that this shall not apply in the case of a nurse who has received a summons for duty with any of the armed forces of Australia."

Clause 26.—District Allowances.

Subclause (a):—After the word "Carnarvon" add the words "Reedys, Big Bell, Yonambi."

Clause 48.—Salary Schedule.

Subclause (f):—After the words and figures "Third year . . . 50" insert the following—"Fourth year . . . 65" in the respective columns applicable.

NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY)
REGULATIONS.

State of Western Australia.

Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Order.

WHEREAS by regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule 1942, No. 132) it is provided, *inter alia*, that notwithstanding anything contained in the law of any State, where the Premier of the State is of opinion that it is in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the effectual prosecution of the war that limitations or restrictions on the sale, supply, disposal, possession, or use of intoxicating liquor in the State additional to or different from the limitations and restrictions prescribed by the laws of the State should be imposed, he may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the State prohibit, restrict, control, or regulate the sale, supply, disposal, possession, or use of intoxicating liquor in the State and that any such Order may be made so as to apply either throughout the State or to any area or premises therein, may make different provisions with respect to different classes of premises, may provide for exempting premises (either absolutely or conditionally) from any of the provisions of the Order, and may contain such incidental and supplementary provisions as appear to the Premier to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Order: And whereas I, John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting by virtue of the powers conferred by the said regulations by an Order made thereunder dated the 17th day of March, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the said State on the 18th day of March, 1942, and cited as the Hotels, Licensed Premises, and Registered Clubs (Closing Time) Order imposed in relation to the sale, supply, disposal, possession, or use of intoxicating liquor in the said State the limitations and restrictions stated in such Order and such Order is still in force: And whereas I, the said Premier, am of opinion that it is in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the effectual prosecution of the war that the said Hotels, Licensed Premises, and Registered Clubs (Closing Time) Order be revoked and that this Order be made in lieu thereof: Now, therefore I, the said John Collings Willcock, M.L.A., as such Premier aforesaid, acting by virtue of the authority conferred by regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Intoxicating Liquor (Restriction) Order No. 1.

2. The Hotels, Licensed Premises, and Registered Clubs (Closing Time) Order heretofore issued under the said regulations, dated the 17th day of March, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 18th day of March, 1942, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order shall apply to and shall operate and have effect in that portion of the State comprised within an imaginary circle having a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office at Perth as the centre of such circle, hereinafter referred to as the metropolitan area.

4. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“The Act” means the Licensing Act, 1911-1939 of Western Australia.

“Public place” means any theatre, dance hall, place of entertainment or amusement, restaurant, eating house or place where meals are obtainable by the public, building, premises, park, reserve, street, road or place (whether enclosed or not) to which the public resort or are admitted, whether on payment of a fee for admission or not.

The expressions “license,” “licensee,” “licensed premises,” “intoxicating liquor,” and “registered club” shall have the same meanings as those given to the said expressions in sections five and one hundred and eighty respectively of the Act.

5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Act and while this Order remains in force—

(1) No licensee of any licensed premises situate within the metropolitan area shall—

(a) have or keep his licensed premises open for the sale of intoxicating liquor; or

(b) sell any intoxicating liquor, or permit or suffer any intoxicating liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises

at any time before ten o'clock in the morning or after six o'clock in the evening upon any day in the week, except under the authority of an occasional license.

(2) (a) Every registered club within the metropolitan area shall be closed for the sale of intoxicating liquor at the hour of six o'clock in the evening and shall continue so closed until the hour of ten o'clock the following morning upon every day, except under the authority of an occasional license.

(b) If any registered club is kept open for the sale of intoxicating liquor in contravention of this Order the secretary or other person in charge of such registered club shall be deemed to be the occupier of the said club for the purpose of paragraph (7) of regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations.

(3) A person shall not sell or supply to any female person or permit or suffer any female person to obtain any intoxicating liquor in any public bar of any licensed premises situate within the metropolitan area: provided that this shall not apply to the sale of liquor in bottles in bottle departments.

(4) A female person (other than a child or employee of the licensee employed in selling or serving intoxicating liquor) shall not be in any public bar of any licensed premises to which paragraph (3) hereof applies, for the purpose of obtaining intoxicating liquor: provided that this shall not apply to the sale of liquor in bottles in bottle departments.

6. Subject as hereinafter provided, a person shall not—

(a) take into any public place or have in his possession in any public place for the purpose of consumption, either by himself or any other person, any intoxicating liquor; or

(b) consume or otherwise dispose of any intoxicating liquor in any public place; or

(c) being the occupier of a public place, permit or suffer any person to bring into or have in his possession in such public place or consume therein any intoxicating liquor in contravention of paragraph (a) hereof.

Provided that—

(i) paragraph (a) shall, subject to paragraph (iii) of this proviso, apply only to a public place which is conducted and by members of the public resorted to as a theatre, dance hall, place of entertainment, or amusement or as a restaurant or eating house or place where meals are obtainable by the public;

(ii) paragraph (b) shall, subject to paragraph (iii) of this proviso apply to every public place;

(iii) paragraphs (a) and (b) shall not apply to any public place of any of the classes mentioned in proviso (i) when intoxicating liquor is taken into or found or consumed therein during a time when such public place is being used for any private purpose and is not open to members of the public;

(iv) nothing in this clause shall affect the sale, disposal of, or consumption of intoxicating liquor in licensed premises when such sale or consumption is permitted by the law of the State and is not expressly prohibited by this Order.

7. (1) A person shall not consume in any vehicle or permit or suffer any other person to consume in any vehicle any intoxicating liquor whilst such vehicle is within half a mile of any public place of entertainment or public place of amusement or recreation or any dance hall and whilst any entertainment or amusement or recreation or any dancing is being conducted or carried on or is taking place in such public place or dance hall aforesaid.

(2) The term "vehicle" as used in paragraph (1) hereof shall include any vehicle, whatever the motive power may be, and every vehicle shall be "premises" within the meaning and for the purposes of paragraph (5) of Regulation 45 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations.

(3) Notwithstanding any law or contract to the contrary, a person in charge of a vehicle used as a taxi-cab or for the carriage of passengers for hire or reward shall not be obliged to carry in such vehicle any person who consumes intoxicating liquor therein in contravention of this Order, and shall be entitled to eject any such person from such vehicle.

8. This Order shall operate and have effect as from the date of publication of the same in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.
