AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 25th day of August, 1942, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10: And whereas Cuming Smith & Mt. Lyell Farmers Fertilisers, Limited, of 133 St. George's terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act and as such is subject to the provisions of the said section 10 and, having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act for exemption from the operation of the said section, has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act to pay compensation to all workers employed by it, and that it has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a fixed deposit receipt for five thousand pounds issued by the English, Scottish, and Australian Bank, Limited, at Perth, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 10, doth hereby exempt Cuming Smith & Mount Lyell Farmers Fertilisers, Limited, of 133 St. George's terrace, Perth, from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1941, for a period of two years computed from and including the first day of July, 1942.

NATIONAL SECURITY (GENERAL)  
REGULATIONS.

The State of Western Australia.

*Public Authorities and Corporations Powers Order.*

WHEREAS by regulation 35A of the Commonwealth National Security (General) Regulations (as amended by Statutory Rule 1941, No. 287) it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Premier of any State, after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorised by that Minister to act on his behalf, and with the Commandant of a Military District or an officer authorised by the Minister of State for Defence or the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such Commandant, may by Order make such provision as he deems necessary to protect the persons and property of the civil population in that State, or any part thereof, in case of emergency: And whereas I, John Collings Willecock, M.L.A., Premier of the State of Western Australia, acting under the authority of the said section 35A, issued an Order dated the 23rd day of February, 1942, which was published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the same date and therein is cited as the "Public Authorities and Corporations Powers Order": And whereas the said Order is still in force and it is deemed necessary or expedient to amend the same in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said John Collings Willecock, M.L.A., as such Premier aforesaid, acting by virtue of

the authority conferred by the said regulation 35A and after due consultation as aforesaid, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Public Authorities and Corporations Powers Order No. 2.

2. This Order shall be read as one with the Public Authorities and Corporations Order dated the 23rd day of February, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the same date, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by inserting in subparagraph (b) of paragraph (3) of clause 5 of the principal Order, after the word "any" in line three of the said subparagraph (b) the words "vacant block of land or any portion of a block of."
